- 9. a report is submitted to the Tribunal within 60 days of the end of the first six monthly period of the financial year setting out for that period the information referred to in (a) below and a further report is submitted to the Tribunal within three months of the end of the financial year, setting out cumulatively for the financial year as a whole, the following information:
 - (a) in respect for the operations of the Companies in each geographical area and, where stated, in the merchandise classifications referred to in 1. (a) above:
 - (i) net sales for each of the nominated merchandise classifications;
 - (ii) total net sales;
 - (iii) actual gross profit percentage yield to net sales for each of the nominated merchandise classifications;
 - (iv) total actual gross profit percentage yield to total net sales;
 - (v) a reconciliation between the estimated gross profit percentage for the merchandise classifications in each geographical area and the total gross profit earned including details of the mark downs from the selling prices as originally set by the application of the initial mark-up of gross profit percentage on cost of purchases and the actual selling prices achieved together with details of inventory shrinkage to determine the gross profit declared for both the individual merchandise classifications and the total gross profit declared;
 - (vi) details of actual expenses which were deducted from gross profit to arrive at operating profit before tax, and
 - (vii) net operating profit before tax, and
 - (b) the information supplied pursuant to (a) above is supplemented by a report showing:
 - (i) for the Companies, the actual consolidated operating profit;

- (ii) for the Companies, the actual consolidated non-operating income and actual consolidated non-operating expenses, and
- (iii) the actual consolidated net profit before tax for Charles Moore (Aust.) Ltd and Burton Stores Ptv Ltd:
- 10. the information supplied pursuant to 9. above is accompanied by:
 - (a) a statement certifying that the Companics have not, except as provided for in 6. and 7. above:
 - (i) increased the maximum percentage mark-up on cost of purchases relating to any individual product beyond the maximum percentage mark-up on cost of purchases relating to the product group for that product as advised under 1. (a) (vi) above, or
 - (ii) increased the charges for any services provided by the Companies, and
 - (b) a statement by the Principal Accounting Officer certifying that the information contained in such reports was arrived at by using the procedures normally followed by the Companies;
- 11. the Tribunal is advised, as soon as practicable before the effective date of any variations in prices by suppliers, and
- 12. audited financial statements of the Companies are forwarded to the Tribunal annually

Provided further that in relation to this exemption:

- (a) 'cost of purchases' means the supplier's invoice price plus related external into store transport and external ancillary charges where applicable;
- (b) 'maximum percentage mark-up on cost of purchases' means the difference between the cost of purchases and the selling price receivable expressed as a percentage of cost of purchases;
- (c) 'gross profit' means the difference between aggregate net sales and the aggregate cost of goods sold, with the cost of goods being defined as the value of opening stock p!us cost of purchases less the value of closing stock;
- (d) 'mark down' means the difference between the initial or subsequent target selling prices and the actual selling price obtained;
- (e) 'inventory shrinkage' means the difference between the theoretical stock value of the respective merchandise classifications and the actual value of that physical stock valued at identical 'cost of purchases' prices;
- (f) 'operating profit' means the net profit before tax including:
 - (i) profit from providing service and credit facilities in conjunction with retailing or wholesaling activities;
 - (ii) profit from promotional activities or advertising, and
 - (iii) the adding back of any depreciation charges in excess of normal depreciation charges allowed by the Commissioner of Taxation;

- (iv) income from outside investments, and
- (v) profit derived from other than retailing or wholesaling activities (for example from the sale of fixed assets), and

(g) 'consolidated net profit before tax' means the consolidated net profit before tax of Charles Moore (Aust.) Ltd and Burton Stores Pty Ltd including income from investments and the adding back of any depreciation charges in excess of normal depreciation charges allowed by the Commissioner of Taxation but excluding losses and profits incurred in the sale of fixed accets
