Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day of issue at various prices according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Australian Capital Territory Health Registers; Unclaimed moneys; Consolidated Customs by-laws, etc.; Consolidated notices of Australian Public Service appointment, recruitment and examination conditions; Appointments to the Australian Public Service. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the contents list of the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain an index of a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in the General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and are sold at 10c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

SUBSCRIPTIONS are payable in advance and, unless otherwise requested, commence from the first issue of the month following the placement of an order. - (2) that this approval relates to the provision of accommodation for the sale of handicraft materials and goods by the Applicant, and the business shall operate only between the hours of 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., Thursday and Friday and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday;
- (3) that the Applicant will not employ any assistants for the purpose of conducting or carrying on the business on the land without the prior approval of the Minister;
- (4) that no person other than the Applicant will conduct or in any way carry on the business on the land without the prior approval of the Minister:

- (5) that the Applicant ensures that the conduct of the business does not cause an annoyance, a nuisance or a danger and is not offensive to any tenants or occupiers of the land or the tenants or occupiers of adjoining lands;
- (6) that the Applicant does not erect or permit or suffer to be displayed or erected upon the land or any building thereon, any advertising sign or hoarding whatever without the consent in writing of the National Capital Development Commission and the Building Controller;
- (7) that this approval will terminate on 1 May 1977.

Should there be any failure to comply with the foregoing conditions, the Minister may give notice to the Applicant requiring her to show cause within a period of fourteen (14) days why this approval should not be revoked.







TO ALL to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

WHEREAS by Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of Australia, bearing date at St. James's the fourteenth day of February 1975, We did establish a society of honour known as the 'Order of Australia' and made other provision with respect to membership and the Constitution of the Order:

AND WHEREAS We are minded to establish a new category of membership and a new award within the Order and to make further and other provision with respect to eligibility, membership and the Constitution of the Order:

KNOW YOU that We, by these Presents, declare Our pleasure that the above-mentioned Letters Patent of the fourteenth day of February 1975 be amended, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, as set out in the Schedule:

AND WE DO ordain that appointments to a category in the Civil Division of the Order made before the date of these Our Letters Patent shall be treated as having been made to that category in the General Division of the Order.

IN WITNESS whereof We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent.

SCHEDULE

AMENDMENTS OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE ORDER OF AUSTRALIA

- 1. Section 1 is amended-
- (a) by omitting 'Civil' (wherever occurring) and substituting 'General';

 - '(3) Appointments to the Order shall be as Knight or Dame, Companion, Officer, or Member.'; and

- (b) by omitting from paragraph (c) 'he' and substituting 'the Governor-General'.
- 5. Section 7 is revoked and the following section substituted:
- '7. The Governor-General may appoint such other officials for the Order as are, in the Governor-General's sole discretion, considered to be necessary for the purpose.'.
- 6. Section 8 is amended by omitting 'his' and substituting 'that person'.
- 7. Section 9 is amended by omitting 'to the Order' and substituting 'as members of the Order and awards of the Medal of the Order'.
- 8. The heading before section 11 is amended by omitting 'CIVIL' and substituting 'GENERAL'.
- 9. Section 11 is revoked and the following sections and heading substituted:
- '11. (1) Australian citizens, including members of the Defence Force, are eligible to be appointed to the Order as members in the General Division.

Order of Australia—Knights and Dames in the General Division

- '11a. (1) Appointments as Knights or Dames, or honorary Knights or Dames, in the General Division shall be made for extraordinary and pre-eminent achievement and merit in service to Australia or to humanity at large.
- '(2) Notwithstanding sub-section (1), a distinguished person who is not an Australian citizen may be appointed an honorary Knight or Dame in the General Division where it is desirable that the person be honoured by Australia.

- '11B. Where a person ceases to hold office as Governor-General, he or she shall continue to be a Knight or Dame, as the case may be, in the General Division.

Medal of the Order of Australia-Awards in the Military Division

- '23A. Awards of the Medal of the Order in the Military Division may be made for meritorious service or performance of duty.'.
- 24. Section 24 is amended by inserting after 'Division' in sub-section (1) 'and awards of the Medal of the Order in the Military Division'.

- '(2) A Knight or Dame of the Order is entitled to use the title "Sir" or "Dame", as the case may be, before his or her name.
- (3) A Companion or honorary Companion of the Order is entitled-
 - (a) to have the letters "A.C." placed after his or her name on all occasions when the use of such letters is customary; and
 - (b) to wear as a decoration the prescribed insignia for Companions of the Order.
- '(4) An Officer or honorary Officer of the Order is entitled-
 - (a) to have the letters "A.O." placed after his or her name on all occasions when the use of such letters is customary; and
 - (b) to wear as a decoration the prescribed insignia for Officers of the Order.
- '(5) A Member or honorary Member of the Order is entitled-
 - (a) to have the letters "A.M." placed after his or her name on all occasions when the use of such letters is customary; and
 - (b) to wear as a decoration the prescribed insignia for Members of the Order.
- '(6) A person who has been awarded the Medal of the Order is entitled-
 - (a) to have the letters "O.A.M." placed after his or her name on all occasions when the use of such letters is customary; and
 - (b) to wear as a decoration the prescribed insignia for holders of the Medal or the Order.'.
- 28. Section 28 is amended by omitting sub-section (2) and substituting the following sub-section:
- '(2) Where a person ceases, otherwise than by death, to be a member of the Order or to be a holder of the Medal of the Order, that person shall forthwith return to the Secretary of the Order the insignia of the Order.'.

AMENDED CONSTITUTION OF THE ORDER OF AUSTRALIA

he Order of Australia

- 1. (1) The Order of Australia (hereinafter called 'the Order') shall consist of a General Division and a Military Division.
- (2) A person appointed to the Order shall be appointed in the General Division or in the Military Division.

- (3) Appointments to the Order shall be as Knight or Dame, Companion, Officer, or Member.
- (4) Every Australian citizen appointed to the Order shall be a member of the Order, and every other person appointed to the Order shall be an honorary member of the Order.
- (5) There shall be a Medal of the Order called the 'Medal of the Order of Australia'.

Officers and Council of the Order of Australia

- 2. The Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia shall be the Chancellor of the Order and the Principal Knight or Dame, as the case may be, in the General Division.
- 3. The Chancellor is charged with the administration of the Order.
- 4. (1) There shall be a Council for the Order, hereinafter called 'the Council', which shall consist of--
 - (a) the Chief Justice of Australia;
 - (b) the Vice-President of the Federal Executive Council;
 - (c) the Secretary to the Department of Administrative Services or, if another office is prescribed for the purpose of this paragraph, the person occupying the office so prescribed;
 - (d) the officer of the Defence Force occupying the office of Chief of the Defence Force Staff or, if another office is prescribed for the purpose of this paragraph, the officer of the Defence Force occupying the office so prescribed;
 - (e) not more than nine persons appointed by the Governor-General of whom not more than six shall be persons nominated by the States of the Commonwealth of Australia.
- (2) A member of the Council referred to in paragraph (1) (e) shall hold office for a period of two years from the date of appointment and is eligible for re-appointment.
- (3) The Governor-General shall appoint one of the members of the Council to be Chairman of the Council and another member of the Council to act as Chairman in the event of the Chairman being unavailable to act in the office.
 - 5. The Council shall-
 - (a) consider nominations of Australian citizens for appointment to the Order and for the award of the Medal of the Order:
 - (b) make recommendations to the Governor-General in relation to those nominations; and
 - (c) advise the Governor-General on such other matters concerning the Order as the Governor-General may refer to the Council for consideration.
- 6. (1) There shall be a Secretary of the Order who shall be appointed by the Governor-General.
- (2) The Secretary shall maintain the records of the Order and of the Council, and shall perform such other functions in respect of the Order as the Governor-General directs.
- 7. The Governor-General may appoint such other officials for the Order as are, in the Governor-General's sole discretion, considered to be necessary for the purpose.
- 8. A person is not a member of the Order by reason only of that person being a member of the Council or an official of the Order.

APPOINTMENTS AND AWARDS

- 9. Appointments (including honorary appointments) as members of the Order and awards of the Medal or the Order shall be made, with the approval of the Sovereign, by Instrument signed by the Governor-General and sealed with the Seal of the Order and shall have effect from the date of the affixing of the Seal or, if a later date is specified in the Instrument, from that date.
- 10. Nothing in this Constitution limits the right of the Governor-General to exercise all powers and authorities of the Sovereign in respect of the Order.

GENERAL DIVISION

Eligibility for Appointment

- 11. (1) Australian citizens, including members of the Defence Force, are eligible to be appointed to the Order as members in the General Division.
- (2) Persons other than Australian citizens are eligible to be appointed to the Order as honorary members in the General Division.
- (3) The Medal of the Order in the General Division may be awarded to Australian Citizens and other persons.

Order of Australia-Knights and Dames in the General Division

- 11a. (1) Appointments as Knights or Dames, or honorary Knights or Dames, in the General Division shall be made for extraordinary and pre-eminent achievement and merit in service to Australia or to humanity at large.
- (2) Notwithstanding sub-section (1), a distinguished person who is not an Australian citizen may be appointed an honorary Knight or Dame in the General Division where it is desirable that the person be honoured by Australia.
- 11B. Where a person ceases to hold office as Governor-General, he or she shall continue to be a Knight or Dame, as the case may be, in the General
- 11c. The Governor-General may appoint to be Knights and Dames in the General Division, other than honorary Knights and Dames, not more than two persons in any calendar year.

Order of Australia-Companions in the General Division

- 12. (1) Appointments as Companions or honorary Companions in the General Division shall be made for eminent achievement and merit of the highest degree in service to Australia or to humanity at large.
- (2) Notwithstanding sub-section (1), a distinguished person who is not an Australian citizen may be appointed an honorary Companion in the General Division where it is desirable that the person be honoured by Australia.
- 14. The Governor-General may appoint to be Companions in the General Division, other than honorary Companions, not more than twenty persons in any calendar year.

Order of Australia—Officers in the General Division

- 15. (1) Appointments as Officers or honorary Officers in the General Division shall be made for distinguished service of a high degree to Australia or to humanity at large.
- (2) Notwithstanding sub-section (1), a distinguished person who is not an Australian citizen may be appointed an honorary Officer in the General Division

where it is desirable that the person be honoured by Australia.

16. The Governor-General may appoint to be Officers in the General Division, other than honorary Officers, not more than fifty persons in any calendar year.

Order of Australia-Members in the General Division

- 17. (1) Appointments as Members or honorary Members in the General Division may be made for service in a particular locality or field of activity or to a particular group.
- (2) Notwithstanding sub-section (1), a person who is not an Australian citizen may be appointed an honorary Member in the General Division where it is desirable that the person be honoured by Australia.
- 18. The Governor-General may appoint to be Members in the General Division, other than honorary Members, not more than one hundred and twenty-five persons in any calendar year.

Medal of the Order of Australia—Awards in the General Division

18a. Awards of the Medal of the Order in the General Division may be made for service worthy of particular recognition.

Nominations

19. Any person or organization may submit to the Secretary of the Order for consideration by the Council a nomination of an Australian citizen for appointment to the Order as a member in the General Division or a nomination of a person for the award of the Medal of the Order in the General Division.

MILITARY DIVISION

Eligibility for Appointment

- 20. (1) Members of the Defence Force are eligible to be appointed to the Order as members in the Military Division.
- (2) Members of the armed forces of a country other than Australia are eligible to be appointed to the Order as honorary members in the Military Division.
- (3) In any calendar year, the number of appointments, other than honorary appointments, to the Military Division shall not exceed one-tenth of one per cent of the average number of persons who were members of the Defence Force on each day of the immediately preceding year.
- (4) The Medal of the Order in the Military Division may be awarded to members of the Defence Force.

Order of Australia—Companions in the Military Division

- 21. (1) Appointments as Companions or honorary Companions in the Military Division shall be made for eminent service in duties of great responsibility.
- (2) The Governor-General may, in any calendar year, appoint as Companions in the Military Division, other than honorary Companions, a number of persons that is not greater than the number of persons that most closely approximates to five per cent of the total number of persons who may be appointed under sub-section 20 (3) to all categories of membership, other than honorary membership, in the Military Division in that year.

Order of Australia-Officers in the Military Division

- 22. (1) Appointments as Officers or honorary Officers in the Military Division shall be made for distinguished service in responsible positions.
- (2) The Governor-General may, in any calendar year, appoint as Officers in the Military Division, other than honorary Officers, a number of persons that is not greater than the number of persons that most closely approximates to twenty per cent of the total number of persons who may be appointed under subsection 20 (3) to all categories of membership, other than honorary membership, in the Military Division in that year.

Order of Australia-Members in the Military Division

23. Appointments as Members or honorary Members in the Military Division may be made for exceptional service or performance of duty.

Medal of the Order of Australia-Awards in the Military Division

23A. Awards of the Medal of the Order in the Military Division may be made for meritorious service or performance of duty.

Nominations

- 24. (1) Upon the recommendation of the Minister for Defence, appointments as members of the Order in the Military Division and awards of the Medal of the Order in the Military Division shall be made, with the approval of the Sovereign, by Instruments signed by the Governor-General.
- (2) Upon the recommendation of the Minister for Defence, appointments as honorary members of the Order in the Military Division shall be made, with the approval of the Sovereign, by Instruments signed by the Governor-General.

TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP IN THE ORDER AND CANCELLATION OF AN AWARD OF THE MEDAL

- 25. (1) A person does not cease to be a member or honorary member of the Order by reason only of that person ceasing to be eligible to be appointed to the Order.
- (2) A person ceases to be a member or honorary member of the Order upon—
 - (a) the death of the person;
 - (b) the resignation of the person from the Order in writing, which resignation shall have effect from the day on which it is accepted by the Governor-General; or
 - (c) the termination of the appointment of that person to the Order by Ordinance.
- (3) An appointment that has been terminated may be restored by Ordinance.
- (4) An award of the Medal of the Order may be cancelled by Ordinance, but an award that has been so cancelled may be restored by Ordinance.

DESIGNATIONS AND INSIGNIA

- 26. (1) A Knight or Dame, or honorary Knight or Dame, of the Order is entitled—
 - (a) to have the letters 'A.K.' or 'A.D.', as the case may be, placed after his or her name on all occasions when the use of such letters is customary; and
 - (b) to wear as a decoration the prescribed insignia for Knights of the Order, or Dames of the Order, as the case may be.

- (2) A Knight or Dame of the Order is entitled to use the title 'Sir' or 'Dame', as the case may be, before his or her name.
- (3) A Companion or honorary Companion of the Order is entitled—
 - (a) to have the letters 'A.C.' placed after his or her name on all occasions when the use of such letters is customary; and
 - (b) to wear as a decoration the prescribed insignia for Companions of the Order.
- (4) An Officer or honorary Officer of the Order is entitled-
 - (a) to have the letters 'A.O.' placed after his or her name on all occasions when the use of such letters is customary; and
 - (b) to wear as a decoration the prescribed insignia for Officers of the Order.
- (5) A Member or honorary Member of the Order is entitled—
 - (a) to have the letters 'A.M.' placed after his or her name on all occasions when the use of such letters is customary; and
 - (b) to wear as a decoration the prescribed insignia for Members of the Order.
- (6) A person who has been awarded the Medal of the Order is entitled—
 - (a) to have the letters 'O.A.M.' placed after his or her name on all occasions when the use of such letters is customary; and

- (b) to wear as a decoration the prescribed insignia for holders of the Medal of the Order.
- 27. When worn in Australia by an Australian citizen, the insignia of the Order shall be worn in the prescribed manner.
- 28. (1) Except as otherwise provided by Ordinance, the insignia of the Order shall remain the property of the Order.
- (2) Where a person ceases, otherwise than by death, to be a member of the Order or to be a holder of the Medal of the Order, that person shall forthwith return to the Secretary of the Order the insignia of the Order.

SEAL

29. The Governor-General shall have the custody of the Seal of the Order.

ORDINANCES OF THE ORDER

- 30. The Governor-General may make Ordinances, not inconsistent with this Constitution, prescribing all matters that are required or permitted by this Constitution to be prescribed or are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying out or giving effect to this Constitution, and, in particular, prescribing matters for or in relation to—
 - (a) the government of the Order;
 - (b) the insignia of the Order; and
 - (c) investitures.

Commonwealth of Australia

WHEREAS it is provided by section 8A of the Customs Act 1901-1975 that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, declare that, for the purposes of the administration of the Customs, a part of a State or Territory specified in the Proclamation is attached to an adjoining State or Territory so specified, and a part of a State or Territory so specified, and a part of a State or Territory so specified shall, for the purposes of that Act, be deemed to be a part of the adjoining State or Territory:

AND WHEREAS the Governor-General declared, by Customs Proclamation No. 1193 published in the Gazette on 27 June 1968, that, for the purposes of the administration of the Customs, the part of the State of Western Australia situated north of the parallel 18 degrees south latitude is attached to the Northern Territory of Australia:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to revoke that Proclamation and make other provision in its stead:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir John Robert Kerr, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby—

- (a) revoke Customs Proclamation No. 1193, published in the Gazette on 27 June 1968, declaring that, for the purposes of the administration of the Customs, the part of the State of Western Australia situated north of the parallel 18 degrees south latitude is attached to the Northern Territory of Australia; and
- (b) declare that, for the purposes of the administration of the Customs, the part of the State of Western Australia situated north of the parallel 19 degrees south latitude is attached to the Northern Territory of Australia.

HOUSING ORDINANCE

AMENDMENT OF SCHEME FOR PROVIDING AND ASSISTING IN PROVIDING DWELLING HOUSES

AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY

Housing Ordinance 1928-1969

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 3 of the Housing Ordinance 1928-1969, I, Anthony Allan Staley, Minister of State for the Australian Capital Territory, hereby amend the Scheme for Providing and Assisting in Providing Dwelling Houses notified in the Commonwealth Gazette on 31 July 1930, as varied by amendments notified in the Commonwealth Gazette on 12 August 1948, 19 May 1955, 11 December 1958, 23 July 1959, 31 May 1962, 22 August 1968, 4 March 1971, 16 December 1971, 17 May 1973, 14 November 1974, 25 February 1975 and 5 August 1975.

Section 1 of the scheme is amended by omitting paragraphs 3 and 4 and inserting in their stead the following—

3. An applicant for a loan will be required to lodge with his application fees in accordance with the following scale—

4. In the event of an application being granted for the purpose of building a house, the applicant will be required to pay a further fee of \$14.00 with each application for progress payment.

And I declare that I think the scheme as amended is fit for providing and assisting in providing dwelling houses.
