Australian Government Gazette is published sectionally in accordance with the arrangements set out below:

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and are sold at 95c each plus postage or on subscription of \$58.00 (50 issues), \$32.00 (25 issues), or \$16.00 (12 issues).

General issues contain notices under the following headings: *Special information* (i.e. notices in connection with the Office of the Governor-General; the Federal Executive Council; the Parliament; the Judiciary; the Executive Government; and honours, decorations and awards); *Proclamations*; *Legislation* (Acts of Parliament assented to; Statutory Rules; Ordinances; Regulations); *Customs*; *Government departments* (i.e. notices not placed in other categories, alphabetically listed under departments administering particular legislation or functions); *Defence Force appointments, promotions, etc.*; *Teaching Service vacancies, promotions, etc.*; *Bankruptcy Act*; *Private advertisements*; *Tenders invited*; *Contracts arranged*; *Late notices*. Copies of each week's Special issues are also attached. General issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and are sold at 65c each plus postage or on subscription of \$46.00 (50 issues), \$26.00 (25 issues), or \$13.00 (12 issues). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day of issue at various prices according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Australian Capital Territory Health Registers; Unclaimed moneys; Consolidated Customs by-laws, etc.; Consolidated notices of Australian Public Service appointment, recruitment and examination conditions; Appointments to the Australian Public Service. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the contents list of the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain an index of a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in the General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and are sold at 20c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

SUBSCRIPTIONS are payable in advance. Rates include surface postage in Australia and overseas. Other carriage rates are available on application.

I, SIR JOHN ROBERT KERR, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of my powers under section 103 of the *Crown Lands Ordinance* of the Northern Territory of Australia, do hereby reserve the land described in the Schedule hereto for the conservation of native flora and the protection or conservation of wildlife.

THE SCHEDULE

Reserve No. 1584

All that piece of land near Cape Hotham in the Northern Territory of Australia containing an area of 129 square kilometres more or less: Commencing at the southeastern corner of Reserve 1288 as notified in *Northern Territory Government Gazette* No. 19 of 13 May 1970; thence southwesterly by the southeastern boundary of the said Reserve to its intersection with the right bank of the Adelaide River; thence generally southerly by the said bank of the said river to its intersection with a northwestern boundary of Pastoral Lease 793 (Woolner); thence northeasterly and northerly by northwestern and western boundaries of the said Pastoral Lease to the high water mark of the seacoast of Chambers Bay; thence generally northwesterly by the said high water mark of the said seacoast of the said bay to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by section 111 of the *Crown Lands Ordinance* of the Northern Territory of Australia, it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, constitute and define the boundaries of new counties, hundreds and towns.

AND WHEREAS it is further provided by the said section that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, set apart as town lands any Crown land within the boundaries of a town.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to constitute and define the boundaries of the town of Top Springs and to set apart as town lands Crown lands within the boundaries of the said town.

NOW THEREFORE, I, SIR JOHN ROBERT KERR, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby—

- (a) Constitute the town of Top Springs and define the boundaries of the said town to be in accordance with Part 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (b) Set apart as town lands the Crown land within the boundaries of the said town described in Part 2 of the Schedule hereto.

PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS**DETERMINATION UNDER SECTION 93 OF THE NATIONAL HEALTH ACT**

I, DAVID de SOUZA, First Assistant Director-General of Health (Therapeutics Division) and Delegate of the Minister of State for Health pursuant to the powers conferred by Section 93 of the National Health Act 1953, hereby revoke all previous Determinations made pursuant to Section 93 of the National Health Act and hereby determine that:

- (1) This Determination shall come into operation on the first day of August 1976.
- (2) The Pharmaceutical Benefits referred to in this Determination shall be those contained in the Schedule attached to this Determination.
- (3) A medical practitioner is authorised for the purpose of Section 93 of the Act, to supply any of the pharmaceutical benefits obtained by him, or by another medical practitioner for whom he is temporarily acting as a locum, in pursuance to this Determination.
- (4) Subject to this Determination, the maximum quantity or number of units of a pharmaceutical benefit that may be obtained by a medical practitioner in any one month for the purpose of Section 93 of the Act is the number or quantity specified in the Schedule to this Determination in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit.
- (5) Where a medical practitioner has obtained a pharmaceutical benefit for the purpose of Section 93 of the Act, he is not entitled to obtain a further quantity or number of units of that pharmaceutical benefit for that purpose while he has in his possession a quantity or number of units of the pharmaceutical benefit obtained by him equal to or greater than the maximum quantity or number of units allowed for the pharmaceutical benefit by the last preceding clause.
- (6) A medical practitioner is not entitled to obtain a pharmaceutical benefit for the purpose of Section 93 of the Act more often than twice in any two months.

1. the prices of pharmaceutical products manufactured and supplied by the Company where such products are controlled by the Australian Department of Health under the administration of Part VII of the National Health Act;
2. the prices of goods and services (other than those referred to in 1. above) supplied by the Company where such prices are fixed pursuant to contracts entered into in writing following the submission of written tenders or written quotations made in competition with other suppliers of similar goods and services

Provided that where the goods and services so supplied are:

- (a) included in the Company's price list, or
- (b) goods customarily available from stock for general sale, or
- (c) goods manufactured to the Company's standard specifications, or
- (d) goods where the variation from the Company's standard specifications is of a minor nature not involving significant additional cost,

the prices of such goods and services do not exceed those prices which

- (i) have been approved by the Tribunal pursuant to the Prices Justification Act, or
 - (ii) are in accordance with exemptions granted to the Company pursuant to the said Act;
3. the prices of goods (other than those referred to in 1. above) that are manufactured and supplied by the Company to customers' individual specifications including goods supplied on a jobbing or commission basis, but not including:
- (a) goods the prices of which are covered by standard price lists, or
 - (b) goods that are customarily available from stock, or
 - (c) goods that are manufactured by the Company to the Company's standard specifications, or
 - (d) goods where the variation from the Company's standard specification is of a minor nature not involving significant additional cost;
4. increases in the prices of goods, other than those referred to in 1. above, manufactured and supplied by the Company where such increases are due entirely to and reflect not more than the money amount of increases in the into-store cost to the Company of raw materials used in the manufacture of such goods

Provided that:

- (a) if the into-store cost to the Company of the said raw materials is reduced, the prices charged by the Company for the said goods are reduced accordingly, and
 - (b) the Tribunal is advised, within 21 days of the effective date, of any increases in prices made by the Company pursuant to this clause, together with particulars setting out the basis of calculation for the said increases;
5. alterations in the prices of goods manufactured and supplied by the Company where such prices have changed solely by reason of conversion to metric sizes and the price per unit for such goods is not increased;
6. alterations in the prices of goods supplied by the Company pursuant to any promotional activity whereby the price is reduced and ultimately restored to its previous level;
7. increases in the prices of goods (other than those referred to in 1. above) supplied by the Company in the same condition as received from suppliers
Provided that there shall be no increase in the rate of mark-up applying to such goods at the date hereof without prior notification to and approval of the Tribunal;
8. the prices of goods (other than those referred to in 1. above) of a particular description not previously supplied by the Company

Provided that:

- (a) such goods are supplied in the same condition as received from suppliers, and

- (b) the rate of mark-up on such goods does not exceed that applying at the date hereof to goods of a similar description without prior notice to and approval of the Tribunal;
9. the prices of goods supplied to related companies where such prices are not greater than those charged to unrelated undertakings for the same goods;
10. the prices charged for food, beverages and miscellaneous items sold to employees of the Company through cafeterias and canteens operated by the Company provided that such prices are not in excess of normal retail prices;
11. the prices of used motor vehicles, used office equipment and other used or surplus fixed assets, not acquired for resale, disposed of by the Company, and
12. the prices of steam and laundry services supplied to adjacent manufacturers

Provided further that:

- (a) at six monthly intervals and within 90 days of the end of each such interval financial statements of the Company, together with detailed manufacturing, trading and profit and loss statements, are forwarded to the Tribunal, the first such statements to be in respect of the period ending 30 June 1976, and
- (b) audited financial statements of the Company are forwarded to the Tribunal annually.
