General issues contain notices under the following headings: Spec.al information (i.e. notices in connection with the Office of the Governor-General; the Federal Executive Council; the Parliament; the Judiciary; the Executive Government; and honours, decorations and awards); Proclamations; Legislation (Acts of Parliament assented to; Statutory Rules; Ordinances; Regulations); Customs; Government departments (i.e. notices not placed in other categories, alphabetically listed under departments administering particular legislation or functions); Defence Force appointments, promotions, etc.; Teaching Service vacancies, promotions, etc.; Bankruptcy Act; Private advertisements; Tenders invited; Contracts arranged; Late notices. Copies of each week's Special issues are also attached. General issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and are sold at 65c each plus postage or on subscription of \$46.00 (50 issues), \$26.00 (25 issues), or \$13.00 (12 issues). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day of issue at various prices according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Australian Capital Territory Health Registers; Unclaimed moneys; Consolidated Customs by-laws, etc.; Consolidated notices of Australian Public Service appointment, recruitment and examination conditions; Appointments to the Australian Public Service. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the contents list of the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain an index of a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in the General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and are sold at 20c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

SUBSCRIPTIONS are payable in advance. Rates include surface postage in Australia and overseas. Other carriage rates are available on application.

Defence Act 1903-1975

AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section sixty-nine of the *Defence Act* 1903-1975 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Forces, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manoeuvres, or other naval, military or air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry, survey or use:

AND WHEREAS regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reason of any entry, survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall

be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of that occurrence of the damage or loss:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir John Robert Kerr, The Governor-General of Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby authorize such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Military District in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manoeuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Military District concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.

THE SCHEDULE

New South Wales

TIANJARA

During the period commencing on the fourteenth day of June 1976 and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1978.

All those pieces and parcels of land being crown allotments, private property, reserves, roads or otherwise in the county of St Vincent in the State of New South Wales in the parishes of Endrick, Little Forest, Sassafras and Tianjara described hereunder.

Exemption

PURSUANT to paragraph 11 of the Environment Protection Administrative Procedures, I, Kevin Eugene Newman, Minister for Environment, Housing and Community Development, hereby exempt from the requirements of the Environment Protection Administrative Procedures the negotiation, operation and enforcement of an agreement or arrangement proposed to be entered into by, or on behalf of, the Commonwealth with Mary Kathleen Uranium Limited for the purpose of facilitating the delivery to Commonwealth Edison Company of the United States of America of 45.4 tonnes of uranium oxide from sources in the United Kingdom in satisfaction of the contractual obligations of Mary Kathleen Uranium Limited to be performed during the 3rd quarter of 1976 under an agreement between those companies dated 5 August 1970, as varied by a supplementary agreement dated 24 September 1974.

Minister for Environment, Housing and Community Development Summary of Reasons for Exempting from the Requirements of the Procedures Proposed Action Concerning the Delivery by Mary Kathleen Uranium Ltd of Uranium Oxide to Commonwealth Edison Company.

My reasons for granting the exemption dated 6

My reasons for granting the exemption dated August 1976 are that:

- (a) it would be prejudicial to the interests of Australia; and
- (b) it would be otherwise contrary to the public interest, for the requirements of the Procedures to apply in relation to the proposed action referred to in the exemption.

In concluding that the exemption should be granted, I have had regard to the following amongst other matters—

- (1) that the supply contract under which the delivery is to be made was approved on behalf of the Commonwealth in 1970, that is to say, at a time before the Environment Protection (Impact of Proposals) Act 1974 and the Environment Protection Administrative Procedures entered into force;
- (2) that successive Governments have publicly stated that it is their policy to permit contracts of this kind to be honoured;
- (3) that, nevertheless, the Government would, if it is practicable, wish to have available the report of the Environment Inquiry on Uranium Development in the Northern Territory directed on 12 June 1975 before uranium oxide is exported from Australia in fulfilment of the contracts referred to above;
- (4) that the agreement or arrangement proposed to be entered into would permit the supply contract to be honoured and would also facili-

- tate the achieving of the Government's desire referred to in (3) above;
- (5) that the United States of America is a Party to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons done at London, Moscow and Washington on 1 July 1968;
- (6) that officers of the Australian Atomic Energy Commission have advised that stringent controls will apply under relevant law in the United States of America in relation to the accountability for, and the conversion and use of, the uranium oxide and derivatives therefrom, and in relation to the storage and disposal of waste material resulting therefrom;
- (7) that, in the circumstances, a default by Mary Kathleen Uranium Limited under its agreement with Commonwealth Edison Company would be prejudicial to Australia's international trading reputation and to the possible successful establishments of an Australian uranium industry, should the Government decide, in the light of the report of the Environmental Inquiry on Uranium Development in the Northern Territory, to support the development of such an inquiry;
- (8) that, in the circumstances, for the present Government not to take all reasonable steps to facilitate the honouring of the contract would be prejudicial to the international credibility of Australian Governments.

DETERMINATION FOR THE PURPOSES OF SECTION 85 OF THE NATIONAL HEALTH ACT

FOR the purposes of section 85 of the National Health Act 1953 and the National Health (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations made under that Act, I, David de Souza, First Assistant Director-General of Health (Therapeutics Division) and Delegate of the Minister of State for Health, hereby make the following determination:

- 1. This determination shall come into operation on the first day of August 1976.
- 2. The determinations of 1 April, 1 May, 1 June and 1 July 1976 made under section 85 of the National Health Act are revoked.
 - 3. In the Schedules to this determination: 'amp.' means ampoule;
 - 'fl oz' means fluid ounce of 480 minims;
 - 'g' means gram;

 - 'I.M.' means intramuscular; 'I.V.' means intravenous;
 - 'kg' means kilogram;
 - 'lb' means pound of 16 ounces;
 - 'M.' means million of organisms; 'mg' means milligram; 'ml' means millilitre;

 - 'oz' means ounce of 437.5 grains;
 - 'S.C.' means subcutaneous;
 - 'Sch. 2' means the Second Schedule to this determination.
- 4. Where the strength, type of unit, size of unit or other particulars of form are specified in the column headed 'Form' in the First Schedule to this determination in relation to a drug or medicinal preparation referred to in sub-section (2) of section 85 of the National Health Act 1953 the name of which is specified in that Schedule, those particulars refer to the form or forms of the drug or medicinal preparation that is or are allowable for the purposes of Part VII of that Act to the effect that the drug or medicinal preparation in that form or in each of those forms is a pharmaceutical benefit.
- 5. The purposes set out in the column headed 'Purposes' in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination are the only purposes for which a medical practitioner may prescribe the maximum quantities and number of repeats specified in that part in relation to those pharmaceutical benefits specified in that same part.
- 6. The manner, if any, in which a pharmaceutical benefit specified in the First Schedule to this determination is to be administered in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit is set out in that Schedule in the column headed 'Manner of Administration'.
- 7. The maximum quantity or number of units of a pharmaceutical benefit that may, in one prescription, be directed to be supplied on any one occasion is:
 - (a) where the name of the pharmaceutical benefit is specified—
 - (i) in Part 1 of the First Schedule to this determination—the quantity or number, if any, specified in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; Ωr

- (ii) in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination and the pharmaceutical benefit is prescribed in accordance with the provisions of the column headed 'Purposes'-the quantity or number, if any, in that part of the Schedule in the columns headed 'Maximum Quantity' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or
- (iii) if reference is made to the Second Schedule in the 'Maximum Quantity' column of the First Schedule the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in the Second Schedule to this determination in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit; or
- (b) in any other case—the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in that Second Schedule in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit.
- 8. The maximum number of occasions, if any, on which the supply of a pharmaceutical benefit may, in one prescription, be directed to be repeated is:
 - (a) where the name of the pharmaceutical benefit is specified-
 - (i) in Part 1 of the First Schedule to this determination—the quantity or number, if any, specified in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or
 - (ii) in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination and the pharmaceutical benefit is prescribed in accordance with the provisions of the column 'Purposes'the quantity or number, if any, in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or
 - (iii) if reference is made to the Second Schedule in the 'Number of Repeats' column of the First Schedule, the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in the Second Schedule to this determination in relation to the form of the pharmaceut'c-1 benefit; or
 - (b) in any other case—the number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in that Second Schedule in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit.
- 9. The name of the manufacturer, or the names of manufacturers denoted, in accordance with the following table, by letters appearing in the column headed 'Brand' in the First Schedule to this determination in relation to a drug or medicinal preparation, the name of which is specified in that Schedule, is the brand or brands, under which the drug or medicinal preparation may be supplied under Part VII of the National Health Act 1953 as a pharmaceutical benefit:

PROHIBITION OF THE TAKING OF UNDERSIZED SCHOOL SHARK IN WATERS ADJACENT TO THE EASTERN AND SOUTHERN SHORES OF AUSTRALIA

IN the exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 8 of the Fisheries Act 1952-1975, I, Ian McCahon Sinclair, the Minister of State for Primary Industry—

 - (b) less than 27 inches when measured in a straight line from the middle of the posterior edge of the gill-slit nearest the tail to the end of the upper lobe of the caudal fin: or
 - (c) less than 20 inches when measured in a straight line from the middle of the posterior edge of the gill-slit nearest the tail to the ventral insertion of the caudal fin.

- (b) in accordance with paragraph 8 (1) (b) of that Act, the taking, from the area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 1, of fish included in the class of fish specified in Schedule 3 that have a dimension less than 45 centimetres when measured in a straight line from the middle of the posterior edge of the gill-slit nearest the tail to the ventral insertion of the caudal fin: and
- (c) in accordance with paragraph 8 (1) (c) of that Act, the taking, from the area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 1, of fish included in a class of fish specified in Schedule 2 or 3 by a gill or set net the size of the mesh of which, at any part of the net, is less than 15 centimetres when measured in accordance with the manner of measuring specified in Schedule 4 or 5.

 - (a) be directly below the upper;
 - (b) move freely in relation to the upper; and

- (c) have a weight of 3.175 kilogrammes acting on it.
- 3. The device shall be suspended in such a manner as to ensure that the upper edge shall remain in a fixed position and that the lower edge may move freely in relation to the upper edge, within the confines of the mesh to be measured.
- 4. The device shall be equipped with a scale from which the distance between the upper edge of the upper arm and the lower edge of the lower arm can be ascertained, at any time, to the nearest millimetre

Prices Regulation Ordinance 1949

PRICES ORDER No. 12 OF 1976

- JOHN CECIL McFARLAND, Controller of Prices, in pursuance of Section 20 of the Prices Regulation Ordinance 1949, hereby order as follows:
 - 1. This Order takes effect on 26 August 1976.
- 2. Prices Order No. 4 of 1976 dated the seventeenth day of February 1976 and notified in the Australian Government Gazette on 18 February 1976
 - 3. In this Order:
 - 'bread' means a product obtained by baking a yeast leavened dough prepared with flour and water with or without ingredients;
 - 'foil-wrapped' means in relation to the sale of any bread that such bread is fully enclosed prior to delivery to the place at which the bread is sold by retail, in aluminium or other foils, and that such bread was so enclosed when sold;
 - 'milk bread' means bread which is made into loaves and which contains not less than four parts per centum by weight of non-fat milk solids calculated on the water-free substance;
 - 'ordinary bread' means bread made into loaves other than starch-reduced bread, protein-increased bread or milk bread as defined in this order or fancy bread;
 - 'starch-reduced bread' or 'protein-increased bread' means bread which is made into loaves and which contains not less than two and seventenths parts per centum by weight of nitrogen calculated on the water-free substance;
 - 'toast-sliced' means in relation to the sale of any bread, foil-wrapped or wrapped bread which has marked on the wrapper enclosing the bread the words 'toast', 'toast-sliced', 'thick-sliced' or words of like effect;
 - 'wrapped' means in relation to the sale of any bread that such bread is fully enclosed prior to delivery to the place at which the bread is sold by retail, in waxed or grease-proof paper, cellulose film, polythene or other similar wrapping and that such bread was so enclosed when sold:
 - 'unwrapped' in relation to the sale of any bread means that such bread is not wrapped as defined in this Order.
- 4. The maximum price at which bread included in a category specified and described in the First Column of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in the Australian Capital Territory is fixed at and declared to be a price specified in the Second Column of that Schedule opposite and in relation to the description of the bread included in that category.
