I, JOHN WINSTON HOWARD, the Minister of State for Business and Consumer Affairs, in pursuance of the power conferred upon me under Regulation 17 of the Customs (Import Licensing) Regulations, do hereby:

(a) revoke all subsisting exceptions made in pursuance of that regulation; and

(b) except from the application of those regulations the goods specified in the Schedule of this Notice.

For the purpose of this Notice:

'Customs Tariff Act' means the Customs Tariff Act 1966 as amended or as proposed to be altered from time to time.

'Schedule I' means Part II of Schedule I to the Customs Tariff Act.

'Schedule 2' means Schedule 2 to the Customs Tariff Act.

'Thong sandals' means footwear, generically described as 'thongs', being footwear which consists of a sole having provision to secure the footwear to the foot by either or both of the following means and by no other:

- (a) one or two straps, cords, strips, or thongs, of any construction or material, secured to the sole and/or to an instep strap or band so that when worn, the strap, cord, strip or thong passes between the first and second toes;
- (b) a band or strap, secured to the sole so that when worn, the first toe only is inserted through the band or strap.

COMMON RULE re SICK LEAVE

The following order is published pursuant to Regulation No. 33 (3) of the Public Service Arbitration Regulations.

Order for a Common Rule

By virtue of the provisions of section 14 of the *Public Service Arbitration Act* 1920, I, the Public Service Arbitrator, declare that the proviso (a) to sub-clause (1) of clause 7 of Determination No. 10 of 1921, as varied by Determination No. 206 of 1976 shall be a common rule of that part of the Public Service consisting of persons permanently employed under the provisions of the *Public Service Act* 1922, the *Defence Act* 1903 or the *Naval Defence Act* 1910.

In pursuance of the foregoing, it is ordered that the common rule contained in Determination No. 119 of 1951 be varied by deleting proviso (a) to subclause (1) and by inserting the following proviso:

'(a) The Chief Officer may grant additional sick leave to a permanent officer, who, during his first ten years of permanent service exhausts his sick leave credit on full pay accrued on the basis of the foregoing provisions, to the extent of a year's credit in anticipation of his sick leave next accruing.

Additional sick leave granted in pursuance of this sub-paragraph shall be subject to the same conditions as are applicable to sick leave granted in accordance with an officer's normal sick leave credit.'

I further declare that this order shall come into operation on and from the date hereof and that it shall have effect on and from 26 April 1976.
