Australian Government Gazette is published sectionally in accordance with the arrangements set out below:

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and are sold at 95c each plus postage or on subscription of \$58.00 (50 issues), \$32.00 (25 issues), or \$16.00 (12 issues).

General issues contain notices under the following headings: *Special information* (i.e. notices in connection with the Office of the Governor-General; the Federal Executive Council; the Parliament; the Judiciary; the Executive Government; and honours, decorations and awards); *Proclamations; Legislation* (Acts of Parliament assented to; Statutory Rules; Ordinances; Regulations); *Customs; Government departments* (i.e. notices not placed in other categories, alphabetically listed under departments administering particular legislation or functions); *Defence Force appointments, promotions, etc.; Teaching Service vacancies, promotions, etc.; Bankruptcy Act; Private advertisements; Tenders invited; Contracts arranged; Late notices.* Copies of each week's Special issues are also attached. General issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and are sold at 65c each plus postage or on subscription of \$46.00 (50 issues), \$26.00 (25 issues), or \$13.00 (12 issues). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day of issue at various prices according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Australian Capital Territory Health Registers; Unclaimed moneys; Consolidated Customs by-laws, etc.; Consolidated notices of Australian Public Service appointment, recruitment and examination conditions; Appointments to the Australian Public Service. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the contents list of the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain an index of a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in the General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and are sold at 20c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

SUBSCRIPTIONS are payable in advance. Rates include surface postage in Australia and overseas. Other carriage rates are available on application.

WHEREAS it is provided by section fifteen of the *Customs Act* 1901 that the Governor-General may by proclamation appoint wharves and fix their limits:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir John Robert Kerr, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby—

- (a) appoint as a wharf all the wharf premises known as Northern Woodchips Wharf containing an area of 2.997 hectares at Longreach, on the Tamar River, in the State of Tasmania, as defined on plan 4757 filed and registered in the office of the Director of Lands at Hobart; and
- (b) fix as the limits of that wharf, the bounds thereof as shown in the said plan.

THE NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA*Crown Lands Ordinance***PROCLAMATION**

Commonwealth of Australia

By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia

WHEREAS by section 111 of the *Crown Lands Ordinance* of the Northern Territory of Australia, it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, constitute and define the boundaries of new counties, hundreds and towns:

AND WHEREAS it is further provided by the said section that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, set apart as town lands any Crown land within the boundaries of a town:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to constitute and define the boundaries of a new town, the site for which has been given the name of Kalkaringi:

NOW THEREFORE I, SIR JOHN ROBERT KERR, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby, from the date hereof—

- (a) constitute the town of Kalkaringi and define the boundaries of the said town to be in accordance with the Schedule hereto; and

- (b) set apart as town lands all the Crown land within the boundaries of the said town.

THE SCHEDULE

All that piece of land near Wave Hill in the Northern Territory of Australia: Commencing at the southern corner of former Northern Territory Portion 973 as shown on survey plan O.P. 1478; thence southeasterly by the southeasterly prolongation of the southwestern boundary of the said former portion to its intersection with the centreline of the Victoria River; thence generally northeasterly by the said centreline of the said river to its intersection with the prolongation southeasterly of the most easterly north-eastern boundary of former Northern Territory Portion 973; thence northwesterly by the said prolongation to the eastern corner of the said former portion; thence by lines bearing 315 degrees 52 minutes 129.7 links; 360 degrees 7810.05 links; 270 degrees 9600 links; thence by a line south to its intersection with a northern boundary of Pastoral Lease 805; thence easterly, southerly and southeasterly by part of a northern boundary, an eastern boundary and northeastern boundaries of the said Pastoral Lease to the point of commencement.

I, SIR JOHN ROBERT KERR, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of my powers under section 103 of the *Crown Lands Ordinance* of the Northern Territory of Australia, do hereby reserve the land described in the Schedule hereto for public parks.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section 13 (1) of the *Quarantine Act* 1908, that the Governor-General may, by proclamation, amongst other things, declare any ports in Australia to be first ports of entry for overseas vessels:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section 13 (1A) of that Act that the power to declare first ports of entry shall extend to authorize the declaration of a port to be a first port of entry for all overseas vessels, or for overseas vessels from any particular place, or for any class of overseas vessels:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section 26 (2) of that Act that the Governor-General may by proclamation fix the position of the quarantine line for any port:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by section 26A of that Act that the master of a vessel subject to quarantine (not being a vessel used in navigation by air) shall, forthwith on arrival at or near a port, bring the vessel to a place appointed by the Governor-General by proclamation to be a mooring ground in relation to the port for vessels subject to quarantine or, with the approval of a quarantine officer authorized in writing by the Director of Quarantine to grant approvals under that section and on payment of any fee that is payable under the regulations in respect of the approval, to such place as is specified in the approval:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to declare by proclamation the port at Gove Harbour established as a port under section 15 of the *Customs Act* 1901 to be a first port of entry for overseas vessels:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to fix by proclamation the position of the quarantine line for that port:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to appoint by proclamation a mooring ground in relation to that port for vessels subject to quarantine:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir John Robert Kerr, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council—

- (a) declare, in pursuance of sub-section 13 (1) of the *Quarantine Act* 1908, the port at Gove Harbour in the Northern Territory of Australia, being the area of Melville Bay established as a port under section 15 of the *Customs Act* 1901 by Customs Proclamation No. 1276 published in the *Gazette* on 13 January 1972, to be a first port of entry for the following class of vessels, namely overseas vessels not being vessels used in navigation by air;
- (b) fix, in pursuance of sub-section 26 (2) of the *Quarantine Act* 1908, as the position of the quarantine line for the port at Gove Harbour the lines across Melville Bay that form the northern boundary of that area; and
- (c) appoint, in pursuance of section 26A of the *Quarantine Act* 1908, the area at Melville Bay, bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the parallel of south latitude 12° 11' 7.37" with the meridian of east longitude 136° 37' 30", continuing due north to the parallel of south latitude 12° 9' 35", continuing due east to the meridian of east longitude 136° 39' 36", continuing due south to the parallel of south latitude 12° 11' 7.37" and continuing due west to the point of commencement, to be a mooring ground in relation to the port at Gove Harbour for vessels subject to quarantine.

WHEREAS the Governor-General, by Quarantine Proclamation No. 46G published in the *Gazette* on 30 December 1957, declared under section 13 of the *Quarantine Act* 1908, amongst other things, certain ports, including the port situated at Busselton in the State of Western Australia, to be first ports of entry for overseas vessels, not being overseas vessels engaged in navigation by air:

AND WHEREAS it is no longer necessary that that port continue to be such a first port of entry:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir John Robert Kerr, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby revoke Quarantine Proclamation No. 46G in so far as it declares the port situated at Busselton in the State of Western Australia to be a first port of entry for overseas vessels, not being overseas vessels engaged in navigation by air.

AND WHEREAS by Quarantine Proclamation No. 9G published in the *Gazette* on 12 September 1935 the Governor-General fixed the position of the quarantine line for, amongst other ports, the port of Newcastle in the State of New South Wales:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to revoke that Proclamation in so far as it fixes the quarantine line for the port of Newcastle and to make other provision in its stead:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir John Robert Kerr, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby—

- (a) revoke Quarantine Proclamation No. 9G in so far as it fixes the position of the quarantine line for the port of Newcastle in the State of New South Wales; and

Award, 1973 shall be a common rule of the industry
of persons employed:

- (i) in hotels (licensed or private).
- (ii) in motels.
- (iii) in combinations of hotel-motel.
- (iv) in wine saloons or wine bars in or in connection with the selling of drinks.
- (v) in a cafe, restaurant or establishment in which food or drink is sold for consumption on the premises and where such food or drink is both ordered and served by table service.
- (vi) in guest houses and boarding houses.
- (vii) in clubs, incorporated under the Associations Incorporation Ordinance.
- (viii) in preparing and serving food and drinks, cleaning and attending to the premises and all other services associated with hotels, motels, combination hotel-motel, guest houses, boarding houses, cafes, restaurants, incorporated clubs or establishments.

The common rule shall be binding on all employers in the said industry in the Northern Territory in respect of the employment by them of employees in the classifications for which provision is made in the said award and shall also be binding on all such employees.

- (i) Commonwealth Hostels.
- (ii) The Australian Government in respect of employees under the *Public Service Act 1922-1975*;
- (iii) any employer in respect of employees covered by a determination made under the *Public Service Arbitration Act 1920-1973*.
- (iv) any employee covered by any award or agreement made under the *Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904*.

QUARANTINE PROCLAMATION No. 88 A

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (1) of section 13 of the *Quarantine Act 1908* that, amongst other things, the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, prohibit the importation into Australia of any articles likely, in his opinion, to introduce any infectious or contagious disease, or disease or pest affecting persons, animals or plants:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (2) of that section that the power of prohibition under that section shall extend to authorize prohibition generally or with limitations as to place and subject matter, and either absolutely or subject to any specified conditions or restrictions:

AND WHEREAS by Quarantine Proclamation No. 79A published in the *Gazette* on 28 March 1968 the importation into Australia of certain articles was prohibited with limitations as to place and subject to certain specified conditions or restrictions:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to revoke that Proclamation in so far as it relates to articles described in the first column of the Schedule to that Proclamation that are not being transported to Australia at the date of this Proclamation and to make other provisions in its stead:

AND WHEREAS I, Sir John Robert Kerr, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, am of the opinion that the articles described in Column 1 of the Schedule are articles likely to introduce an infectious or contagious disease, or disease or pest affecting animals, that is to say, foot and mouth disease:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir John Robert Kerr, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby—

- (a) revoke Quarantine Proclamation No. 79A in so far as it relates to articles described in the first column of the Schedule to that Proclamation that are not being transported to Australia at the date of this Proclamation; and
- (b) prohibit the importation into Australia of any article described in Column 1 of the Schedule (not being an article that is being transported to Australia at the date of this Proclamation) unless any limitation as to place, and any condition or restriction, specified in Column 2 of the Schedule opposite to the description of that article is complied with.

SOUVENIRS

THE QUEEN'S SILVER JUBILEE 1952-1977

1. His Excellency the Governor-General directs it to be notified for general information that Her Majesty The Queen has been pleased to approve of the rules governing the commercial use of Royal Photographs and Insignia being temporarily relaxed to allow the use, on Souvenirs of Her Majesty's Silver Jubilee, of the devices detailed in paragraph 3.

The Duke of Edinburgh has likewise approved of certain of His Royal Highness's personal Arms, Cypher and Portraits being similarly used.

2. *Souvenirs*

Souvenirs, subject to the limitations in paragraphs 4, 5, 6 and 7, are defined as articles of a permanent kind specifically designed to commemorate The Queen's Silver Jubilee and identified with the occasion by the incorporation of a phrase such as:

'The Queen's Silver Jubilee 1977'

'The Queen's Silver Jubilee 1952-1977'

To qualify for the privileges detailed in the circular such Souvenirs of The Queen's Silver Jubilee must be:

- (a) In good taste.
- (b) Free from any form of advertisement.
- (c) Carry no implication of Royal Custom or Approval.

3. The devices involved are:

- (a) The Royal Arms or component parts thereof (such as the Supporters or the Crown, etc.)
- (b) The Arms of The Duke of Edinburgh or component parts thereof
- (c) The Queen's Cypher
- (d) The Duke of Edinburgh's Cypher
- (e) Approved photographs of The Queen The Duke of Edinburgh

4. *Textiles*

Apart from headscarves or wall hangings, textiles are excluded from this definition of souvenirs and do not qualify for the privilege of using Royal Insignia.

5. *Containers or Receptacles of Merchandise*

As a special exception containers or receptacles of merchandise will, on this occasion, qualify as souvenirs provided that:

- (a) They are permanent in nature—i.e. metal-ware, ceramic or other semi-indestructible material and specially made for the occasion.

- (b) They comply with the requirements of Paragraph 2. With particular regard to Paragraph 2 (b) the name of the manufacturer and details of the contents may appear only on the under side or interior of the container or on the stopper.

The Royal Symbols that may be used on containers or receptacles are limited to:

- (c) Photographs of The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh.
- (d) The use of the Royal Crown in any attendant scheme of decoration.
- (e) The use of any of the Royal Arms or the Royal Cyphers is specifically disallowed except to holders of the Royal Appointment as Tradesmen. Nos 10 and 11 of the Royal Warrant Rules will apply in these cases.

6. *Medals*

As a special exception for this occasion medals are accepted as souvenirs and qualify for the concerned privileges on the general conditions herein.

7. *Limitations of Use*

- (a) The use of the devices listed in paragraph 3 is strictly limited to the souvenirs themselves and the devices may not appear on any container (save as allowed in paragraph 5) nor in any promotional advertising except incidentally to a photograph of the souvenir itself.
- (b) Souvenirs of The Queen's Silver Jubilee produced by authority of these instructions may not be sold to the public before 15 November 1976, nor manufactured after 1 October 1977.

8. *Decorations*

- (a) The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh have also been pleased to approve that reproductions of the devices mentioned in paragraph 3 may be used in any schemes of decoration celebrating the occasion during 1977, the Silver Jubilee Year.
The Royal Insignia must not be used in any way that might imply Royal Patronage or Royal approval of any firm or its products.
- (b) The Royal Standard as The Queen's Personal Banner may not be flown by anyone other than Her Majesty and shall not be incorporated in decorative schemes.
The same considerations affect The Duke of Edinburgh's Standard.

9. *Devices*

(a) *The Royal Arms*

Correct versions of the Royal Arms or of the Arms of The Duke of Edinburgh should be used. Examples may be authenticated on payment of the requisite fee by

application in writing to Garter King of Arms, College of Arms, Queen Victoria Street, London, E.C.4., or in Scotland, so far as the Royal Arms are concerned, to the Lord Lyon King of Arms, Register House, Princes Street, Edinburgh.

(b) *Royal Cyphers*

Copies of the Royal Cyphers can be obtained on application from the Secretary, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St James's Palace, London, S.W.1.

(c) *Photographs of The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh*

Lists of suppliers of approved photographs can be had on application to the Secretary, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St James's Palace, London, S.W.1. Any question of copyright is one that must be settled between the applicant and the photographer.

(d) *Other Royal or National Devices*

Advice on approved versions is obtainable, on payment of the requisite fee, from Garter King of Arms or the Lord Lyon King of Arms as appropriate.

(e) *Emblem of The Queen's Silver Jubilee Appeal*

With The Queen's permission a design has been commissioned by the King George's Jubilee Trust (for Youth) from Mr Milner Gray for a device to be the emblem of the Jubilee Appeal and thereafter of the continuing Trust. Copies will be available from the Design Council, 28 Haymarket, London, S.W.1., from 1 March 1976 on payment of the requisite fee.

10. *Design Council Silver Jubilee Souvenir Exhibitions*

Exhibitions of well-designed souvenirs will be arranged by the Design Council at their London and Glasgow Design Centres during the early months of 1977. Selection will be made by a Special Committee.

Mr David Barnett, Head of Industrial Design, Design Council, 28 Haymarket, London SW1Y 4SU will provide full details on application and would like early notification from Manufacturers intending to submit souvenirs for consideration.

**VISIT OF THE QUEEN AND THE DUKE OF
EDINBURGH TO AUSTRALIA 1977**

1. His Excellency the Governor-General directs it to be notified for general information that, in connection with the Visit of Her Majesty The Queen and His Royal Highness The Duke of Edinburgh to Australia in 1977, the rules governing the use of Royal Emblems and Royal Photographs and Portraits will be temporarily relaxed to allow them, in accordance with the conditions set out hereunder, to be reproduced on Souvenirs and Displays commemorating the Visit.

2. (a) Souvenirs are defined as articles of a permanent kind specifically designed to commemorate the Visit and identified with it by a phrase such as:
'The Royal Visit 1977'
'The Queen's Visit 1977'
'Australia 1977'
- (b) Such souvenirs must:
 - (i) Be in good taste.
 - (ii) Be free from advertisement.
 - (iii) Carry no implication of Royal Custom or approval.
 - (iv) Not be used as a premium or selling aid.
3. The Royal Emblems and portraits mentioned in paragraph 1 are:
 - (a) *The Royal Arms or component parts thereof (such as the Supporters or the Crown).
 - (b) *The Arms of The Duke of Edinburgh.
 - (c) *Formal representations of the Royal Crowns.
 - (d) The Arms or National Flag of Australia.
 - (e) Photographs or portraits of The Queen and/or The Duke of Edinburgh.
* May not be used on Medals.
4. Textiles, apart from headscarves or wall hangings, are not regarded as souvenirs within the meaning of these rules.
5. Containers or receptacles of merchandise may qualify as souvenirs within the meaning of these rules, provided that:
 - (a) They are permanent in nature, i.e. of metal-ware, ceramic or other semi-indestructible material and specially made for the occasion.
 - (b) They comply with the requirement of paragraph 2 (b). The name of the manufacturer and content details should appear only on the underside or interior of the container or on the stopper.
 - (c) The Royal Emblems reproduced on such containers are confined to:
 - (i) Photographs or portraits of The Queen and/or The Duke of Edinburgh.
 - (ii) The Royal Crown but only in any attendant scheme of decoration.

Note: The Royal Arms or The Duke of Edinburgh's Arms may *not* be reproduced on containers.
6. Souvenirs may be sold at any time before the Visit of The Queen, during the Visit and for a period of three months after the end of the Visit.
7. Reproductions of the Royal Emblems and Portraits mentioned in paragraph 3 above may be used in schemes of decoration for the Visit, but not in any way which might imply Royal Patronage or Royal Approval of any firm or its products.
8. (a) The Royal Standard, The Duke of Edinburgh's Standard or The Queen's Personal Flag may not be flown by anyone other than Her Majesty or His Royal Highness and may not be reproduced on souvenirs or incorporated in any scheme of decoration.
- (b) The Royal Cyphers may not be reproduced on souvenirs or incorporated in any scheme of decoration.

9. Portraits of The Prince Andrew and The Prince Edward may not be used for commercial purposes or be incorporated in the design of souvenirs. They may, however, be sold as portraits or postcards and be reproduced on calendars and greeting cards.
10. The copyright in a portrait, picture or photograph and the ownership of a design are not affected by the foregoing and any question connected with it should be settled with the owner of the copyright or design.
