General issues contain notices under the following headings: Special information (i.e. notices in connection with the Office of the Governor-General; the Federal Executive Council; the Parliament; the Judiciary; the Executive Government; and honours, decorations and awards); *Proclamations; Legislation* (Acts of Parliament assented to; Statutory Rules; Ordinances; Regulations); Customs; Government departments (i.e. notices not placed in other categories, alphabetically listed under departments administering particular legislation or functions); Defence Force appointments, promotions, etc.; Teaching Service vacancies, promotions, etc., Bankruptcy Act; Private advertisements; Tenders invited; Contracts arranged; Late notices. Copies of each week's Special issues are also attached. General issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and are sold at 65c each plus postage or on subscription of \$46.00 (50 issues), \$26.00 (25 issues), or \$13.00 (12 issues). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

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Index issues contain an index of a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in the General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and are sold at 20c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

SUBSCRIPTIONS are payable in advance. Rates include surface postage in Australia and overseas. Other carriage rates are available on application.

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The Gazette is also available for perusal at official Post Offices and public libraries.

Acts of the Australian Parliament, Statutory Rules, Australian Capital Territory Ordinances and Regulations, and other Australian Government publications may also be purchased at these addresses.

NOTICE OF DETERMINATION UNDER PART XVI

FISHERIES NOTICE No. 69

PROHIBITIONS RELATING TO SOUTHERN ROCK LOBSTER

I, IAN McCAHON SINCLAIR, the Minister of State for Primary Industry, hereby—

- (a) revoke Fisheries Notice No. 47 issued under section 8 of the Fisheries Act 1952 and published in the Gazette on 15 July 1974; and
- (b) in pursuance of sub-sections 8 (1) and (4) of
 - (i) prohibit the taking from the area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 1 of fish included in the following class of fish, namely female rock lobsters of the species Jasus novaehollandiae (commonly known as southern rock lobster), that have a total carapace length (being the minimum distance between the anterior surface of the median suture of the frontal tubercle and the mid point of the posterior edge of the dorsal region of the carapace) of less than 105 millimetres;
 - (ii) prohibit the taking from the area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 1 of fish included in the following class of fish, namely male rock lobsters of the species Jasus novaehollandiae (commonly known as southern rock lobster), that have a total carapace length (being the minimum distance described in sub-paragraph (i)) of less than 110 millimetres;
 - (iii) prohibit the taking from the area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 2 of fish included in the following class of fish, namely rock lobsters of the species Jasus novaehollandiae (commonly known as southern rock lobster), that have a total carapace length (being the minimum distance described in sub-paragraph (i)) of less than 98.5 millimetres: and
 - (iv) prohibit the cutting up or dismembering, on a boat in the areas of proclaimed waters specified in Schedules 1 and 2, of fish included in the following class of fish, namely rock lobsters of the species Jasus novaehollandiae (commonly known as southern rock lobster).

SCHEDULE 1

Area of proclaimed waters referred to in sub-paragraphs (b) (i), (ii) and (iv)

The area of proclaimed waters within the area of waters bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the intersection of the meridian 141° east longitude with the southern shore of Australia; thence in a straight line along that meridian to its intersection with the parallel 45° 6′ 15" south latitude; thence in a straight line to the intersection of the parallel 46° 40' south latitude with the meridian 143° east longitude; thence in a straight line to the intersection of the parallel 47° 20' south latitude with the meridian 147° 30' east longitude; thence in a straight line to the intersection of the parallel 45° 40' south latitude with the meridian 152° east longitude; thence in a straight line to the intersection of the parallel 37° 30' south latitude with the meridian 154° 49' 6" east longitude; thence along that parallel to its intersection with the eastern shore of Australia at high-water mark; thence following the eastern and southern shores of Australia at high-water mark to the point of commencement.

SCHEDULE 2

Area of proclaimed waters referred to in sub-paragraphs (b) (iii) and (iv)

The area of proclaimed waters within the area of waters bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the intersection of the meridian 141° east longitude with the southern shore of Australia at high-water mark; thence along that meridian to its intersection with the parallel 45° 6′ 15" south latitude; thence in a straight line to the intersection of the parallel 34° 57' south latitude with the meridian 130° 48' east longitude; thence in a straight line to the intersection of the parallel 38° 22' south latitude with the meridian 115° 8' east longitude; thence in a straight line to the intersection of the parallel 36° 10' south latitude with the meridian 111° 20' east longitude; thence in a straight line to the intersection of the parallel 32° south latitude with the meridian 110° 11' 6" east longitude; thence along that parallel to the western shore of Australia at high-water mark; thence following the western and southern shores of Australia at high-water mark to the point of commencement.
