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Australian Government Gazette is published sectionally in accordance with the arrangements set out below:

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and are sold at 95c each plus postage or on subscription of \$58.00 (50 issues), \$32.00 (25 issues), or \$16.00 (12 issues).

General issues contain notices under the following headings: Special information (i.e. notices in connection with the Office of the Governor-General; the Federal Executive Council; the Parliament; the Judiciary; the Executive Government; and honours, decorations and awards); Proclamations; Legislation (Acts of Parliament assented to; Statutory Rules; Ordinances; Regulations); Customs; Government departments (i.e. notices not placed in other categories, alphabetically listed under departments administering particular legislation or functions); Defence Force appointments, promotions, etc.; Teaching Service vacancies, promotions, etc.; Bankruptcy Act; Private advertisements; Tenders invited; Contracts arranged; Late notices. Copies of each week's Special issues are also attached. General issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and are sold at 65c each plus postage or on subscription of \$46.00 (50 issues), \$26.00 (25 issues), or \$13.00 (12 issues). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day of issue at various prices according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celerants; Australian Capital Territory Health Registers; Unclaimed moneys; Consolidated Customs by-laws, etc.; Consolidated notices of Australian Public Service appointment, recruitment and examination conditions; Appointments to the Australian Public Service. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the contents list of the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain an index of a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in the General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and are sold at 20e each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

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The Gazette is also available for perusal at official Post Offices and public libraries.

Acts of the Australian Parliament, Statutory Rules, Australian Capital Territory Ordinances and Regulations, and other Australian Government publications may also be purchased at these addresses.

TIME STEP IN TELECOM AUSTRALIA TIME SCALES

IN accordance with international agreement, all Australian Telecommunication Commission time services will be retarded precisely one second by the insertion of a leap second preceding 1100 hours Australian Eastern Summer Time on Saturday, 1 January 1977. This means that the last minute prior to the above mentioned time will be 61 seconds long. The leap second, which will occur simultaneously throughout the world, finishes at 0000 hours Coordinated Universal Time (UTC) on 1 January 1977 which corresponds to the following Australian zone times:

0800 hours Western Standard Time in West Australia

0930 hours Central Standard Time in Central Australia

1000 hours Eastern Standard Time in Queensland 1030 hours Central Summer Time in South Australia

1100 hours Eastern Summer Time in New South Wales, Victoria and Tasmania on Saturday, 1 January 1977.

Hourly radio time signals generated by the Commission will be retarded by one second just prior to the sequence marking 1100 hours Eastern Summer Time (and the above equivalent times) on 1 January 1977.

Telephone time-of-day services (speaking clocks) operated by the Commission will be retarded by one second after the signal for 10 h. 59 min. 50 s. Eastern Summer Time (and other equivalent times) on 1 January 1977.

Radio VNG, Lyndhurst, Victoria, the Commission's standard frequency and time signal service in the high frequency band, will adjust its time signals accordingly. Long markers will be transmitted at each end of the leap second; the latter marker corresponding to 0000 hours UTC, i.e., 1100 hours Australian Eastern Summer Time on 1 January 1977.
