PARTS DIRECTION No. 3 (1978)

I, WALLACE CLYDE FIFE, Minister of State for Business and Consumer Affairs, in pursuance of sub-section (1) and sub-section (3) of section 24 of the Customs Tariff Act 1966, as proposed to be altered, and all other enabling powers, direct that:

- (a) the rate of duty specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Direction applies for the purposes of sub-section (2) or sub-section (4), as the case π ay be, of that section, in relation to the class of goods specified in column 1 of that Schedule opposite that rate of duty;
- (b) the rate of duty specified in column 3 of Part 1 of the Schedule to this Direction applies for the purposes of sub-section (2) or sub-section (4), as the case may be, of that section, in relation to the class of goods, being goods the produce or manufacture of a Developing Country, specified in column 1 of that Schedule opposite that rate of duty:
- (c) the rate of duty specified in column 3 of Part II of the Schedule to this Direction applies for the purposes of subsection (2) or sub-section (4), as the case may be, of that section, in relation to the class of goods, being goods the produce or manufacture of New Zealand, specified in column 1 of that Schedule opposite that rate of duty; and
- (d) the rate of duty specified in column 4 of Part II of the Schedule to this Direction applies for the purposes of sub-section (2) or sub-section (4), as the case may be, of that section, in relation to the class of goods, being goods the produce or manufacture of Papua New Guinea, specified in column 1 of that Schedule opposite that rate of duty.
- 2. In this Direction 'Schedule 1' means Part II of Schedule 1 to the Customs Tariff Act 1966, as proposed to be altered.
- 3. In this Direction a reference to parts and textile fabric cut to shape or shaped for making up into garments shall not apply to:
 - (a) goods that are imported in an incomplete or in an unfinished state but have the essential character of the complete or finished garment; or
 - (b) goods that are imported in an unassembled or disassembled state but, if assembled, would be complete garments or have the essential character of complete garments.
- 4. This Direction may be cited as Parts Direction No. 3 (1978) and shall take effect on and from 16 August 1978.
- 5. Part I of the Schedule hereunder applies to goods as follows:
 - (a) to goods specified in column 1 having a rate of duty specified in column 2 being goods on which the duty is ascertained by application of Section 16 of the Customs Tariff Act 1966, as proposed to be altered;
 - (b) to goods specified in column 1 having a rate of duty specified in column 3 being goods the produce or manufacture of a Developing Country.
- 6. Part II of the Schedule hereunder applies to goods as follows:
 - (a) to goods specified in column 1 having a rate of duty specified in column 2 being goods on which the duty is ascertained by application of Section 17 of the Customs Tariff Act 1966, as proposed to be altered;
 - (b) to goods specified in column 1 having a rate of duty specified in column 3 being goods the produce or manufacture of New Zealand;
 - (c) to goods specified in column 1 having a rate of duty specified in column 4 being goods the produce or manufacture of Papua New Guinea.
- 7. Parts Direction No. 9 (1977) published in Gazette No. S281 dated 8 December 1977, is hereby revoked with effect on and from 16 August 1978.

SCHEDULE 2

By-law No. S2487

I, WALLACE CLYDE FIFE, Minister of State for Business and Consumer Affairs, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI of the *Customs Act* 1901, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-law set out in the Schedule hereto.

In a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto a reference to:

- (a) an item:
- (b) a sub-item:
- (c) a paragraph; or
- (d) a sub-paragraph

shall be read as a reference to that item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph, as the case may be, in Part II of Schedule 1 to the Customs Tariff Act 1966, as proposed to be altered.

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of that description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the Customs Tariff Act 1966, as proposed to be altered, that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the Customs Tariff Act 1966, as proposed to be altered, that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. \$2487.
- 2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 16 August 1978.

I, WALLACE CLYDE FIFE, Minister of State for Business and Consumer Affairs, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI of the Customs Act 1901, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-law set out in the Schedule hereto.

In a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto a reference to:

- (a) an item;
- (b) a sub-item;
- (c) a paragraph; or
- (d) a sub-paragraph

shall be read as a reference to that item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph, as the case may be, in Part II of Schedule 1 to the Customs Tariff Act 1966, as proposed to be altered.

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of that description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the Customs Tariff Act 1966, as proposed to be altered, that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the Customs Tariff Act 1966, as proposed to be altered, that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.

THE SCHEDULE

By-law No. S2485

Item No. 15 Schedule 2

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S2485.
- 2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 1 July 1978.
- 3. Item 15 in Schedule 2 to the Customs Tariff Act 1966, as proposed to be altered, applies to:
 - (A) Goods imported or despatched by persons stationed outside Australia and who are members of the Armed Services of Australia (including auxiliary services thereto) as follows:
 - (1) Souvenirs, gifts and other goods, not being goods that-
 - (a) are tobacco products or spirituous liquors or spirituous beverages;
 - (b) are intended for sale, exchange or trade; or
 - (c) are in excess of a value of \$50 per calendar year per person aforesaid stationed outside Australia
 - (2) Tobacco products not in excess of 2500 grams per calendar year per person aforesaid stationed outside Australia
 - (3) Tobacco products imported as personal baggage by a person aforesaid stationed outside Australia who has returned to Australia for authorised leave, not being tobacco products in excess of the lesser of the following two quantities:
 - (a) 250 grams of tobacco products for each week of authorised leave; or
 - (b) 2500 grams of tobacco products

For the purposes of this by-law, the term 'members of the Armed Services of Australia (including auxiliary services thereto)' means personnel of the Australian Defence Force on service under the terms of the Five Power Defence Arrangements (Department of Foreign Affairs Treaty Series 1971 No. 21).

- (B) Motor vehicles imported by a member of the Forces of Canada, New Zealand or the United Kingdom being goods as follows:
 - (1) a motor vehicle owned and used outside Australia by the member during the period of 6 months immediately preceding his first departure for Australia, provided that the motor vehicle remains in the use, ownership and possession of that member or, with the permission of the Collector, of another member during the period of 2 years immediately after the date of its importation, under security
 - (2) a motor vehicle for the personal use of the member, not being a motor vehicle of a kind described in the preceding paragraph, which is intended to be exported, provided that the vehicle is exported within 3 years from the date of its importation or within such extended period as may be approved by the Collector, under security. With the permission of the Collector, a motor vehicle imported under this paragraph may be transferred to another member provided that it is exported by the latter member within 3 years from the date of importation or within such extended period as may be approved, by the Collector, under security.
- 4. Customs By-law No. S2406 published in *Gazette* No. 53E dated 1 July 1974, is hereby revoked. Dated 3 July 1978.

AND WHEREAS I, ROBERT IAN VINER, the Minister of State for Aboriginal Affairs, am satisfied that—

- (a) a substantial majority of adult Aboriginals living in the areas specified in Schedule I, being areas wholly included in the area of the Northern Land Council, is in favour of the setting up of a new Land Council for those first-mentioned areas only; and
- (b) those first-mentioned areas are appropriate areas for the operation of a new Land Council:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Minister of State for Aboriginal Affairs, by this notice—

(a) in pursuance of sub-section 21 (3) of that Act establish an Aboriginal Land Council for the first-mentioned areas; and

- (b) in pursuance of sub-section 21 (4) of that Act—
 - (i) specify Tiwi Land Council as the name of the new Land Council; and
 - (ii) set out, in Schedule 2, the boundaries of the areas for which the new Land Council is established.

The boundaries formed by imaginary lines surrounding Bathurst Island, Buchanan Island, Melville Island and every island wholly within the distance of 5.56 kilometres of the mean low water line of Melville Island, being imaginary lines each of which commences at a point on the mean low water line surrounding one of those islands and thence follows the mean low water line surrounding that island to the point of commencement except that at estuaries, rivers and streams entering the waters surrounding that island the imaginary line is a straight line joining the seaward extremity of each of the opposite banks of those estuaries, rivers or streams.
