Commonwealth of Australia Gazette is published sectionally in accordance with the arrangements set out below:

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and are sold at \$1.60 each plus postage or on subscription of \$86.50 (50 issues), \$44.00 (25 issues), or \$22.75 (12 issues).

General issues contain notices under the following headings: *Special information* (i.e. notices in connection with the Office of the Governor-General; the Federal Executive Council; the Parliament; the Judiciary; the Executive Government; and honours, decorations and awards); *Proclamations*; *Legislation* (Acts of Parliament assented to; Statutory Rules; Ordinances; Regulations); *Government departments* (i.e. notices not placed in other categories, alphabetically listed under departments administering particular legislation or functions); *Defence Force appointments, promotions, etc.*; *Commonwealth Teaching Service vacancies; promotions, etc.*; *Bankruptcy Act*; *Private notices*; *Tenders invited*; *Contracts arranged*. Copies of each week's Special issues are supplied with General issues which are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and are sold at 95c each plus postage or on subscription of \$60.50 (50 issues), \$31.00 (25 issues), or \$17.25 (12 issues). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day of issue at various prices according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Unclaimed deposits and moneys; Australian Public Service—Conditions of Entry and Advancement; Appointments to the Australian Public Service; Holders of Import Licences and Tariff Quotas. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain an index of a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in the General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and are sold at 25c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription. **SUBSCRIPTIONS** are payable in advance. Rates include surface postage in Australia and overseas. Other carriage rates are available on application.

Migration Act 1958

INSTRUMENT OF EXEMPTION UNDER SUB-SECTION 11C (1)

WHEREAS sub-section 11c (1) of the *Migration Act 1958* provides that the master, owner, agent and charterer of a vessel on which a person (not being an Australian citizen) is brought into Australia on or after the commencement of section 11c are each guilty of an offence if the person on his arrival in Australia:

- (a) is not in possession of a visa or return endorsement applicable to his travel to Australia on that occasion; and
- (b) is not exempt, by instrument under the hand of the Minister, from the requirements of Division 1A of Part II of the Act or included in a class of persons who are so exempted.

NOW THEREFORE I, Michael John Randal MacKellar, Minister of State for Immigration and Ethnic Affairs acting in pursuance of sub-section 11c (1) of the *Migration Act 1958* hereby:

(1) EXEMPT the following persons and classes of persons from the requirements of Division 1A of Part II of the *Migration Act 1958* relating to visas and return endorsements:

- (a) Members of the British Royal Family, members of their staff and official parties including media representatives accompanying the official party;
- (b) An official guest of the Government of the Commonwealth, his accompanying spouse and dependent relatives, and members of his staff and the official party including media representatives accompanying the official party;
- (c) A person who is the holder of a passport issued by a country specified in Schedule One, or by the Republic of Ireland, which identifies the holder as a diplomatic or consular representative, member of Parliament, or other government official of that country, travelling in an official capacity;
- (d) A person who is the spouse or dependent relative of a person referred to in paragraph (c) above provided that his passport identifies him as a person accompanying or joining a person referred to in paragraph (c) above in Australia;
- (e) A citizen of New Zealand;
- (f) A citizen of any country specified in Schedule One not otherwise referred to in this instrument, or of the Republic of Ireland who has been granted permission to reside other than for a specified period only in New Zealand upon travel to Australia direct from New Zealand;
- (g) A citizen of any country specified in Schedule One not otherwise referred to in this instrument, or of the Republic of Ireland who has been granted permission to remain in Australia other than for a specified period only, upon return travel to Australia direct from New Zealand;

- (h) A member of the armed forces of any country specified in Schedule One, his accompanying or joining spouse or dependent relative, travelling to Australia in the course of his duty, provided he holds a movement order or a certificate of his status;
- (i) A person who is, for the purpose of the Agreement between Australia and the United States of America concerning the status of United States Forces in Australia signed on 9 May 1963—
 - (i) a member of the United States Forces or a member of the civilian component; or
 - (ii) a dependant of a person referred to in sub-paragraph (i);provided he holds a movement order or a certificate of his status;
- (j) A person who is, for the purposes of the Agreement between Australia and Papua New Guinea regarding the Status of Forces of each country in the territory of the other country signed on 26 January 1977—
 - (i) a member of the Visiting Force of Papua New Guinea or a member of the civilian component; or
 - (ii) a dependant of a person referred to in sub-paragraph (i);provided he holds a movement order or a certificate of his status;
- (k) A person included in the complement of a vessel of the regular armed forces of a government recognised by the Commonwealth;
- (l) A person who is travelling to Australia in the course of his employment and who is a passenger on an aircraft and who will be departing Australia as a member of the crew of an aircraft provided he holds a letter from his employer certifying his status and purpose of travel;
- (m) A member of the crew of a vessel;
- (n) A passenger aboard a vessel other than an aircraft, who will depart Australia by the same vessel on which he will arrive in Australia in the course of the same voyage except for a citizen of a country referred to in Schedule Two, or a stateless person, or a resident of Zimbabwe Rhodesia, or a member of a South African sporting team;
- (o) A passenger aboard an aircraft passing through Australia in direct transit to another country and who holds a ticket for his onward journey except for a citizen of a country referred to in Schedule Two, or a stateless person, or a resident of Zimbabwe Rhodesia, or a member of a South African sporting team;
- (p) A person who returns to Australia within the prescribed time after the date on which he left Australia, in the vessel in which he left Australia, after having remained at all times during his absence from Australia, a passenger in that vessel. For the purposes of this sub-paragraph 'prescribed time' means—
 - thirty days; or

— where, at the time when that person left Australia, there was in force an instrument under the hand of an officer authorised by the Minister to exercise powers under paragraph (b) of sub-section 5 (5) of the *Migration Act 1958* approving a longer time as the prescribed time in the case of that person or class of persons in which that person was included—that longer time;

DETERMINATION OF MAINTENANCE COSTS UNDER SUB-SECTION 21A (7)

WHEREAS Sub-section 21A (7) of the *Migration Act 1958* provides that where a person in respect of whom a deportation order has been made is kept in custody in a State or Territory under the *Migration Act* pending his deportation from Australia, the person is liable to pay the Commonwealth, in respect of the cost to the Commonwealth of keeping and maintaining him while he is so kept in custody, for each complete day in the period during which he is so kept in custody, an amount equal to the amount

determined by the Minister, by notice published in the *Gazette*, to be the daily maintenance amount in respect of that State or Territory.

AND WHEREAS Sub-section 21A (9) of the Act provides that in making a determination under Sub-section 21A (7) in respect of a State or Territory, the Minister shall have regard to the cost to the Commonwealth of persons kept in custody in that State or Territory on behalf of the Commonwealth.

NOW THEREFORE I, Michael John Randal MacKellar, Minister of State for Immigration and Ethnic Affairs, hereby determine that for each complete day during the period in which a deportee is kept in custody pending his deportation, the daily maintenance amount for keeping and maintaining the deportee in custody in the following States and Territory is:
