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GENERAL INFORMATION

General issues of the *Gazette* contain notices under the following headings: *Special information* (i.e. notices in connection with the Office of the Governor-General; the Federal Executive Council; the Parliament; the Judiciary; the Executive Government; and the honours, decorations and awards); *Proclamations*; *Legislation* (Acts of Parliament assented to; Statutory Rules; By-laws; Ordinances; Regulations); *Government departments* (i.e. notices not placed in other categories, alphabetically listed under departments administering particular legislation or functions); *Defence Force appointments, promotions, etc.*; *Commonwealth Teaching Service vacancies, promotions, etc.*; *Bankruptcy Act*; *Private notices*; *Tenders invited*; *Contracts arranged*. Copies of each week's Special issues are supplied with General issues which are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and sold at \$1.20 each plus postage or on subscription of \$71.50 (50 issues), \$36.50 (25 issues), or \$19.00 (12 issues). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Except where a standard form is used, all notices for publication must have a covering instruction setting out requirements. A typewritten original or good copies are to be provided, wherever possible double-spaced, with a margin surrounding the typewritten matter. Copy is to be confined to one side of the paper, sheets are to be of uniform size (preferably A4), numbered consecutively and fastened securely together. Dates, proper names and signatures particularly are to be shown clearly.

Copy will be returned unpublished if not submitted in accordance with these requirements.

CLOSING TIMES. Notices for publication should be lodged at the Gazette Office, unless otherwise specified, by the following times (except at holiday periods for which special advice of earlier closing times will be given).

Contracts arranged: Monday at 2 p.m. in the week before publication.

All other notices: Wednesday at 2 p.m. in the week before publication.

OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service, Public Service of the Northern Territory, Australian Postal Commission and Australian Telecommunications Commission. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and sold at \$2.00 each plus postage or on subscription of \$102.50 (50 issues), \$52.00 (25 issues), or \$26.75 (12 issues).

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day of issue and priced according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Unclaimed deposits and moneys; Australian Public Service Conditions of Entry and Advancement; Appointments to the Australian Public Service; Holders of Import Licences and Tariff Quotas. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain references to a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and sold at 25c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

SEPARATE ARTICLES DIRECTION NO. 1 (1980)

I, RANSLEY VICTOR GARLAND, Minister of State for Business and Consumer Affairs, in pursuance of section 25 of the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered, and all other enabling powers, direct that the duty in respect of goods, being goods that consist of or are capable of being separated into separate articles, included in the following class of goods, that is to say, machinery incorporating a driving unit, not being machinery specified in the Schedule to this Direction, shall be such duty as would be payable if:

- each of the separate articles comprising the goods being articles specified in the Table hereunder; and
- the remainder of the goods,

had been imported separately.

THE TABLE

each driving unit
each apparatus for transmitting power from the driving unit to the machine
each device for regulating, starting or controlling the driving unit

2. In this Direction "Schedule 1" means Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered.

3. This Direction may be cited as Separate Articles Direction No. 1 (1980) and shall take effect on and from 16 January 1980.

4. Separate Articles Direction No. 4 (1979) published in *Gazette* No. S 269 dated 21 December 1979, is hereby revoked.

THE SCHEDULE

1. Machinery in which the driving shaft of the driving unit is common to the remainder of the goods.
2. Machinery in which the framework of the remainder of the goods is wholly or in part common to the driving unit.
3. Machinery in which the framework of the remainder of the goods is designed for the mounting of a flange mounted electric motor.
4. Machinery on which duty is payable under the provisions of Part IVA of the *Customs Tariff Act* 1966, as proposed to be altered, not being machinery to which item 19, 21, 22, 23 or 25 in Schedule 2 to the *Customs Tariff Act* 1966, as proposed to be altered, applies.
5. Machinery that is specified, and incorporates a driving unit that also is specified, in a by-law made pursuant to Part XVI of the *Customs Act* 1901.
6. Portable reciprocating or rotary air compressors and pumps of a capacity not exceeding 25 cubic metres of free air delivered per minute, in which the prime mover is an internal combustion piston engine direct coupled to the compressor, being goods of a kind to which sub-item 84.11.3 in Schedule 1 applies.
7. Parts for refrigerators and refrigerating equipment being parts to which sub-item 84.15.1 or paragraph 84.15.21 or sub-item 84.15.9 in Schedule 1 applies.
8. Loaders and unloaders of the self-propelling kind to which sub-item 84.22.5 in Schedule 1 applies.
9. Rotary clothes drying machines to which paragraph 84.40.21 in Schedule 1 applies.
10. Laundry washing machines to which paragraph 84.40.22 in Schedule 1 applies.
11. Sewing machines to which item 84.41 in Schedule 1 applies, being goods that incorporate a driving unit the produce or manufacture of Australia.
12. Electrically operated machines to which item 84.51 in Schedule 1 applies.
13. Pneumatically operated control valves to which sub-item 84.61.9 in Schedule 1 applies.
14. Safety controls of a kind used solely or principally with gas cooking appliances, being controls to which sub-item 84.61.9 in Schedule 1 applies.
15. Liquid slip regulators and time switches.
16. Thermometers and pyrometers operating by any of the following methods:
 - (a) mercury in a steel bulb;
 - (b) a gas filled bulb;
 - (c) a vapour bulb; or
 - (d) a bi-metallic strip,
 to which sub-item 90.23.9 in Schedule 1 applies.
17. Machinery to which an item in Chapter 89, 91 or 92 in Schedule 1 applies.
18. Vehicles to which an item in Chapter 97 in Schedule 1 applies.
