OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day of issue and priced according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Unclaimed deposits and moneys; Australian Public Service Conditions of Entry and Advancement; Appointments to the Australian Public Service; Holders of Import Licences and Tariff Quotas. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain references to a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and sold at 25c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

This by-law does not apply to: (a) Chassis frames fitted with any attachment or component other than mounting brackets; or (b) Cabs other than bare cabs or, whether imported separately or otherwise: (c) Tyres; (d) Tubes (inner); (e) Accumulators (batteries) and parts therefor; or (f) Radios and magnetic sound reproducers whether combined or not, and parts therefor.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 63AA (1)

CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY STANDARD PORTABLE FIRE EXTINGUISHERS STANDARD

WHEREAS it is provided by section 63AA (1) of the Trade Practices Act 1974 that the Minister may by notice under his hand published in the Gazette, declare that, in respect of goods of a kind specified in the notice, a particular standard, or a particular part of a standard, prepared or approved by the Standards Association of Australia or by a prescribed association or body, or such a standard or part of a standard with additions or variations specified in the notice, is a consumer product safety standard for the purposes of section 62 or a consumer product information standard for the purposes of section 63.

AND WHEREAS the said Minister by such a notice under his hand dated 24 October 1978 published in *Gazette* No. G 43 dated 31 October 1978 declared a consumer product safety standard or standards in respect of certain portable fire extinguishers in pursuance of section 63AA of the said Act.

NOW THEREFORE I, Ransley Victor Garland, the Minister of State for Business and Consumer Affairs hereby—

- (i) revoke the said notice; and
- (ii) declare that, in respect of goods specified in Division 1 of the Schedule to this Notice, the standard specified in Division 2 of the Schedule, as varied by the variation specified in Division 3 of the Schedule, is a consumer product safety standard for the purposes of section 62 of the Trade Practices Act 1974.

SCHEDULE 1

By-law No. F1430

I, RANSLEY VICTOR GARLAND, Minister of State for Business and Consumer Affairs, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI of the Customs Act 1901, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-law set out in the Schedule hereto.

In a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto a reference to:

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of that description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the Customs Tariff Act 1966, as proposed to be altered, that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the Customs Tariff Act 1966, as proposed to be altered, that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.

THE SCHEDULE By-law No. F1430

Sub-item 40.08.1

- This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. F1430.
- This by-law shall take effect on and from 7 March 1980.
- 3. For the purposes of sub-item 40.08.1 'natural rubber in sheets' means:

Natural rubber sheets produced by adding vulcanising agents directly to fresh field latex before coagulation, containing not less than 90 per cent natural rubber hydrocarbons.

Soldier and public servant; arrived Sydney 1818 in command of a detachment of the 48th Regiment; appointed commandant and magistrate of Port Macquarie, 1821; retired on half pay in 1824, appointed commandant at Newcastle; took up land grant near Muswellbrook, 1825; established a property 'Rathluba', near Maitland 1828; appointed police magistrate at Illawarra in 1834 and at various places until 1836; magistrate at Berrima, commissioner of court records 1843.

BISDEE PLACE

John Bisdee (1796-1862)

Farmer and public servant; arrived Hobart Town 1821; granted 700 acres at Bothwell which he exchanged for better land near Jericho; appointed governor of the Hobart Town gaol, chief constable for he district of Murray and keeper of the Hobart pound 1822; ran a nursery garden; made a J.P. 1833; occupied 10 000 acres of pasture land by 1847.

COLLICOTT CIRCUIT

James Thomas Collicott (c. 1788-1840)

Postmaster; arrived in Sydney 1816; grant 200 acres at Five Islands which he leased in 1819; took a position with a Hobart Town Merchant; general storekeeper, estate agent and general appraiser, 1823; an original proprietor of the Bank of Van Diemen's Land; postmaster at Hobart 1822-40.

COLLITS PLACE

Perce Collits (c. 1769-1848)

Settler and innkeeper; transported in 1801; joined his wife who was granted 70 acres on the Nepean, 1803; granted conditional pardon 1811; chief constable at Evan 1815; poundkeeper and inspector of cattle, 1820; granted 50 acres at Prospect 1820; member of the Evan District Committee of Emancipated Colonists, 1821; settled in the Valley of Clwydd, where he built his Famous Collits Inn, The Golden Fleece; received grants of 200 acres 1825, 150 acres 1830 and 317 acres 1833.

DE GILLERN PLACE

William De Gillern

Soldier and settler; arrived Van Diemen's Land 1823; received 1500 acres at Jericho; began the Constantia distillery on New Town Rivulet, 1824 but this failed due to increased excise; bought the 'Glen Ayr' property at Richmond 1825; superintendent of the Rocky Hills Probation Station 1843; summoning officer to the Longford Court of Requests 1850; became J.P. 1856; first sergeant-at-arms when the Tasmanian House of Assembly met, 1857.

GUEST PLACE

George Guest (1767-1841)

Convict and settler; transported in the First Fleet; arrived Norfolk Island 1790; after expiry of sentence, became a settler there; granted fourteen acres 1796; left Norfolk Island and settled at the Derwent, Van Diemen's Land, 1805; first settler to introduce sheep into Van Diemen's Land; granted 24 acres near Macquarie's Point 1806.

MACVITIE PLACE

Thomas Macvitie (1781-1833)

Merchant and banker; arrived New South Wales with a cargo of merchandise and set himself up as a merchant, 1816; original share-holder Bank of New South Wales; elected to Board of Directors in 1821 and 1823; resigned in 1826 when he was elected managing director of the new Bank of Australasia; vice-president of the Benevolent Society, trustee of Scots Church.
