OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and sold at \$2.00 each plus postage or on subscription of \$102.50 (50 issues), \$52.00 (25 issues), or \$26.75 (12 issues).

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day of issue and priced according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Unclaimed deposits and moneys; Australian Public Service Conditions of Entry and Advancement; Appointments to the Australian Public Service; Holders of Import Licences and Tariff Quotas. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain references to a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and sold at 25c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

SURVEY PRACTICE DIRECTIONS 1976

SURVEY PRACTICE DIRECTIONS 1976
AMENDMENT No. 1, 1980

Part 6-Nature and Position of Marks

Amend Direction 26 (h) as follows:

(h) All pegs are to be placed upright in the ground point downwards so that the top is not more than seventy-five millimetres above the ground level in the case of a rural survey and 20 mm above the ground level in the case of an urban survey and the surrounding earth shall be securely rammed.

PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS

DETERMINATION UNDER SECTION 93 OF THE NATIONAL HEALTH ACT

I, KENNETH WILLIAM EDMONDSON, First Assistant Director-General of Health (Therapeutics Division) and Delegate of the Minister of State for Health pursuant to the powers conferred by section 93 of the National Health Act 1953, hereby revoke all previous Determinations made pursuant to section 93 of the National Health Act and hereby determine that:

- (1) This Determination shall come into operation on the first day of April 1980.
- (2) The Pharmaceutical Benefits referred to in this Determination shall be those contained in the Schedule attached to this Determination.
- (3) A medical practitioner is authorised for the purpose of section 93 of the Act, to supply any of the pharmaceutical benefits obtained by him, or by another medical practitioner for whom he is temporarily acting as a locum, in pursuance of this Determination.
- (4) Subject to this Determination, the maximum quantity or number of units of a pharmaceutical benefit that may be obtained by a medical practitioner in any one month for the purpose of section 93 of the Act is the number or quantity specified in the Schedule to this Determination in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit.
- (5) Where a medical practitioner has obtained a pharmaceutical benefit for the purpose of section 93 of the Act, he is not entitled to obtain a further quantity or number of units of that pharmaceutical benefit for that purpose while he has in his possession a quantity or number of units of the pharmaceutical benefit obtained by him equal to or greater than the maximum quantity or number of units allowed for the pharmaceutical benefit by the last preceding clause.
- (6) A medical practitioner is not entitled to obtain a pharmaceutical benefit for the purpose of section 93 of the Act more often than twice in any two months.

PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS

DETERMINATION FOR THE PURPOSES OF SECTIONS 85 AND 854 OF THE NATIONAL HEALTH ACT

FOR the purposes of sections 85 and 85h of the National Health Act 1953 and the National Health (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations made under that Act, I, Kenneth William Edmondson, First Assistant Director-General of Health (Therapeutics Division) and Delegate of the Minister of State for Health, hereby make the following determination:

 - 'oz' means ounce of 437.5 grains;
 - 'S.C.' means subcutaneous;
 - 'Sch. 2' means the Second Schedule to this determination.
 - 'Sch. 3' means the Third Schedule to this determination.
- 4. Where the strength, type of unit, size of unit or other particulars of form are specified in the column headed 'Form' in the First Schedule to this determination in relation to a drug or medicinal preparation referred to in sub-section (2) of section 85 of the National Health Act 1953 the name of which is specified in that Schedule, those particulars refer to the form or forms of the drug or medicinal preparation that is or are allowable for the purposes of Part VII of that Act to the effect that the drug or medicinal preparation in that form or in each of those forms is a pharmaceutical benefit when prescribed by a medical practitioner.
- 5. Where the strength, type of unit, size of unit or other particulars of form are specified in the column headed 'Form' in the Third Schedule to this determination in relation to a drug or medicinal preparation referred to in sub-section (2) of section 85 of the National Health Act 1953 the name of which is specified in that Schedule, those particulars refer to the form or forms of the drug or medicinal preparation that is or are allowable for the purposes of Part VII of that Act to the effect that the drug or medicinal preparation in that form or in each of those forms is a pharmaceutical benefit when prescribed by a participating dental practitioner.
- 6. The purposes set out in the column headed 'Purposes' in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination are the only purposes for which a medical practitioner may prescribe the maximum quantities and number of repeats specified in that part in relation to those pharmaceutical benefits specified in that same part.

- 7. The manner, if any, in which a pharmaceutical benefit specified in the First and Third Schedules to this determination is to be administered in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit is set out in those Schedules in the column headed 'Manner of Administration'.
- 8. The maximum quantity or number of units of a pharmaceutical benefit that may, in one prescription, be directed to be supplied on any one occasion is:
 - (a) where the name of the pharmaceutical benefit is specified—
 - (i) in Part 1 of the First Schedule to this determination—the quantity or number, if any, specified in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit;
 - (ii) in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination and the pharmaceutical benefit is prescribed in accordance with the provisions of the column headed 'Purposes'—the quantity or number, if any, in that part of the Schedule in the columns headed 'Maximum Quantity' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or
 - (iii) if reference is made to the Second Schedule in the 'Maximum Quantity' column of the First Schedule the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in the Second Schedule to this determination in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit; or
 - (iv) in the Third Schedule to this determination —the quantity or number, if any, specified in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or
 - (b) in any other case—the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in that Second Schedule in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical henefit

 - (a) where the name of the pharmaceutical benefit is specified—
 - (i) in Part 1 of the First Schedule to this determination—the quantity or number, if any, specified in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or
 - (ii) in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination and the pharmaceutical benefit is prescribed in accordance with the provisions of the column 'Purposes'—the quantity or number, if any, in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or
 - (iii) if reference is made to the Second Schedule in the 'Number of Repeats' column of the First Schedule, the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in the Second Schedule to this determination in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit;

NOTICE is given that application has been made to me under the *Conciliation and Arbitration Act* 1904 for consent to an alteration of the rules of The Australian Institute of Marine and Power Engineers in so far as those rules relate to the conditions of eligibility for membership of the organization.

The alteration is sought from the following:

3 CONSTITUTION

The Institute shall consist of engineers, marine and power plant (hydraulic and electrical), stationary and self-propelled dredges, tug boats and pilots vessels, associate members, honorary associates and honorary members whose qualifications for each are as hereinafter defined.

Membership shall be divided into three sections—seagoing mechanical, seagoing electrical, and other than seagoing.

(i) Seagoing members (mechanical) shall be engineers who have passed the examination and are in possession of certificates recognised by the Ministry of Shipping and Transport or who have passed Part A of the Second Class Ministry of Shipping and Transport Certificate and/or the Leaving Certificate or its equivalent in New South Wales, or its equivalent in the other States of the Commonwealth, and who have served an apprenticeship.

- (ii) Other than seagoing members shall be engineers who are working ashore who have passed one or more of the abovementioned examinations or an examination equivalent thereto or who have served an apprenticeship and who can satisfy a branch that they are in possession of qualifications similar to those held by persons mentioned in paragraph (i) herein.
- (iii) The terms of apprenticeship (Mechanical) shall be understood to mean having worked for a period of not less than four years at the Engineering Trade as defined by the Ministry of Shipping and Transport Regulations, or served such apprenticeship as defined by Ministry of Shipping and Transport Regulations, or served such apprenticeship as is required for qualification in their respective callings, except apprentices, who in the last year of their time shall be eligible for membership.

Provided that the full term of a recognised apprenticeship in the Electrical Division or authorised apprenticeship as an Electrical Fitter or an Electrical Mechanic has been served.

The Register of the National Estate is an inventory of 'those places, being components of the natural environment of Australia, or the cultural environment of Australia, that have aesthetic, scientific or social significance or other special value for future generations, as well as for the present community'.

The Act provides that Commonwealth Ministers and Commonwealth agencies must not take any action which would adversely affect any place on the Register unless there is no feasible or prudent alternative, that damage is minimised where there is no such alternative, and that the Commission is informed and given time to comment. Registration has no legal effect on the actions of State Governments, Local Governments, or private individuals, corporations or institutions in the States.

The Commission has the following objectives for the Register:

- to make a comprehensive list of all the places in Australia which have heritage value;
- to educate Australians, by means of this list, about the natural and cultural history of their country;
- to give all decision makers, inside and outside government, objective information to help them make better decisions;
- to allow Commonwealth decisions and actions related to the National Estate to be taken as thoughtfully and carefully as possible.

A comprehensive Register will take many years to compile and will be a continuing process. All registrations will have the same status irrespective of the time of their entry. There are no gradings between different categories of places in the Register.
