- (b) state in their report pursuant to sub-section 162A (1) or (2) of the Ordinance, particulars of this Order.

THE Industrial Property Advisory Committee is undertaking a comprehensive review of the Australian patent system. The broad thrust of the inquiry is to study, from the viewpoint of the Australian national interest, whether the Australian patent system as presently operating sufficiently advances Australia's technological development and whether there are ways in which it may be made to do so more effectively.

The terms of reference for the review, which was referred to the Committee by the Minister for Productivity in October 1979, are to examine:

- how the patent system can best contribute to the efficiency and progressiveness of the Australian economy and the adequacy of the system in meeting the needs of Australia with respect to the development and exploitation of new and existing technology.
- any changes required to legislation and administrative procedures to make the patent system less complex and more responsive to needs.
- how patent legislation can be co-ordinated with other industrial and economic policy measures.
- whether there are restrictive practices in the exercise and licensing of patents in Australia, whether it is desirable in the public interest to prohibit by law such practices, and whether the present legislation is adequate for that purpose.
- the conditions necessary for Australia to maximise benefit from participation in the international development of patent systems.
- the ways to maximise access to and utilisation of patent information including an assessment of how information sources can be co-ordinated with other sources of technological and business information.

Housing Ordinance 1928

AMENDMENT OF SCHEME FOR PROVIDING AND ASSISTING IN PROVIDING DWELLING HOUSES

IN this instrument 'the Scheme' means the Scheme for Providing and Assisting in Providing Dwelling Houses published in the Gazette on 31 July 1930 as varied by amendments published in the Gazette on 12 August 1948, 19 May 1955, 11 December 1958, 23 July 1959, 31 May 1962, 22 August 1968, 4 March 1971, 16 December 1971, 17 May 1973, 26 November 1974, 25 February 1977, 8 December 1977, 9 June 1978, 18 September 1978, 4 October 1978, 25 October 1978, 9 November 1978 and 4 January 1980.

- I, ROBERT JAMES ELLICOTT, Minister of State for the Capital Territory, in pursuance of section 3 of the *Housing Ordinance* 1928, hereby amend the Scheme as follows:
 - (a) by omitting Clause 6 of Part 1 of the Scheme and inserting the following clause in its stead—
 - '6. Subject to the provisions of Clause 8, the Borrower will pay interest on the amount of the loan for the time being unrepaid, at a rate to be fixed by the Minister, provided that the Commissioner may, from time to time, determine that a borrower may, subject to any conditions which the Commissioner may deem fit to impose, pay a lower rate or rates than that fixed by the Minister and payment at such lower rate or rates shall be a full and final discharge of the amount payable as interest for the borrower'; and
 - (b) by omitting from Clause 7 (a) of that Part the words 'the Minister fixes in accordance with' and inserting in their stead the words 'referred to in'.

CLOSED SEASON FOR THE TAKING OF ROCK LOBSTER FROM WATERS OFF THE WESTERN AND SOUTHERN COASTS OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA

- I, PETER JAMES NIXON, the Minister of State for Primary Industry, hereby—
 - (a) revoke Fisheries Notice No. 86 published in Gazette No. S 100 on 31 May 1979 in pursuance of section 8 of the Fisheries Act 1952; and
 - (b) in pursuance of paragraph 8 (1) (a) of that Act, prohibit the taking, during the period, in each year, commencing 1 July and ending on 14 November—
 - (i) from any area of proclaimed waters, of fish included in the following class of fish, namely *Panulirus cygnus* (commonly known as western rock lobster); or
 - (ii) from the area of proclaimed waters, specified in the Schedule, of fish included in the following class of fish, namely rock lobsters of any species.

SCHEDULE

Area of Proclaimed Waters

The area of proclaimed waters within the area of waters bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the intersection of the parallel 21° 44′ south latitude with the western shore of Australia at high water mark; thence west along that parallel to its intersection with the meridian 108° 40′ east longitude; thence south along that meridian to its intersection with the parallel 38° 30′ south latitude; thence east along that parallel to its intersection with the meridian 129° east; thence north along that meridian to the southern shore of Australia at highwater mark; thence following the southern and western shores of Australia at highwater mark generally westwards and northwards to the point of commencement.
