GENERAL INFORMATION

General issues of the *Gazette* contain notices under the following headings: *Special information* (i.e. notices in connection with the Office of the Governor-General; the Federal Executive Council; the Parliament; the Judiciary; the Executive Government; and the honours, decorations and awards); *Proclamations*; *Legislation* (Acts of Parliament assented to; Statutory Rules; By-laws; Ordinances; Regulations); *Government departments* (i.e. notices not placed in other categories, alphabetically listed under departments administering particular legislation or functions); *Defence Force appointments, promotions, etc.*; *Commonwealth Teaching Service vacancies, promotions, etc.*; *Bankruptcy Act*; *Private notices*; *Tenders invited*; *Contracts arranged*. Copies of each week's Special issues are supplied with General issues which are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and sold at \$1.20 each plus postage or on subscription of \$71.50 (50 issues), \$36.50 (25 issues), or \$19.00 (12 issues). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Except where a standard form is used, all notices for publication must have a covering instruction setting out requirements. A typewritten original or good copies are to be provided, wherever possible double-spaced, with a margin surrounding the typewritten matter. Copy is to be confined to one side of the paper, sheets are to be of uniform size (preferably A4), numbered consecutively and fastened securely together. Dates, proper names and signatures particularly are to be shown clearly.

Copy will be returned unpublished if not submitted in accordance with these requirements.

CLOSING TIMES. Notices for publication should be lodged at the Gazette Office, unless otherwise specified, by the following times (except at holiday periods for which special advice of earlier closing times will be given).

Contracts arranged: Monday at 2 p.m. in the week before publication.

All other notices: Wednesday at 2 p.m. in the week before publication.

OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service and the Services of the Australian Postal Commission and Australian Telecommunications Commission. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and sold at \$2.00 each plus postage or on subscription of \$102.50 (50 issues), \$52.00 (25 issues), or \$26.75 (12 issues).

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Officers responsible for arranging the gazettal of urgent notices should refer to Gazette Office Circular of 18 April 1980 on this subject. Single copies are available on the day of issue and priced according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Unclaimed deposits and moneys; Australian Public Service Conditions of Entry and Advancement; Appointments to the Australian Public Service; Holders of Import Licences and Tariff Quotas. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain references to a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and sold at 25c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

SURVEY PRACTICE DIRECTIONS 1980

PURSUANT to Section 34A of the *Surveyors Ordinance 1967* the Surveyors Board of the Australian Capital Territory hereby issues the Survey Practice Directions 1980 as set out hereunder with respect to the practice to be followed by surveyors in making land surveys and preparing plans showing the results of such surveys, the purposes of which are contained in Section 34 of the *Surveyors Ordinance 1967*. The Survey Practice Directions 1980 are to come into effect on 1 August 1980 and the Survey Practice Directions 1976 as gazetted on 4 May 1976 and as amended by the Survey Practice Directions 1976 Amendment No. 1 as gazetted on 23 August 1977, the Survey Practice Directions 1976 Amendment No. 1 as gazetted on 25 September 1979 and the Survey Prac-

tice Directions 1976 Amendment No. 1 as gazetted on 15 April 1980 shall cease to be in force at midnight on 31 July 1980.

SURVEY PRACTICE DIRECTIONS 1980

Part 1—Preliminary

1. These Directions may be cited as the Survey Practice Directions 1980.
2. These Directions are divided into parts as follows:
 - Part I—Preliminary (Directions 1-3)
 - Part II—Supervision (Directions 4-5)
 - Part III—Survey Practice (Directions 6-17)
 - Part IV—Re-determination of boundaries (Directions 18-23)
 - Part V—Irregular Boundaries (Directions 24-25B)
 - Part VI—Nature and Position of Marks (Directions 26-28)
 - Part VII—Accuracy of Surveys (Directions 29-33)
 - Part VIII—Identification Surveys and Remarking (Directions 34-35)
 - Part IX—Field Notes (Directions 36-42)
 - Part X—Plans (Directions 43-49)
 - Part XI—Stratum Surveys (Direction 50).

3. In these Directions, unless the contrary intention appears:

'Appropriate' accuracy means such accuracy as is reasonably possible of attainment in any particular survey.

'Control mark' means a survey mark of a durable nature which forms part of a control survey placed and maintained by a government authority and shown on a plan signed by a registered surveyor and available from a government authority.

'Control survey' means a survey of either first order accuracy or a breakdown of a first order survey established for the purpose of setting out any other survey or to which any existing survey can be related and is shown on a plan signed by a registered surveyor and available from a government authority.

'Monument' means a natural or artificial object or point thereon or mark which object, point or mark is used for the purpose of locating or relocating a boundary or a point therein.

'Plan' means a representation or a drawing of land surveyed, prepared from particulars recorded in the field book of the survey and executed for delivery to or lodgment with any government authority or persons as evidence of survey.

'Reference mark' means a survey mark of a durable nature placed or situated near and connected by measurement to a corner, angle or tangent point of any survey.

'Co-ordinated reference mark' (CRM) means a reference mark installed and registered by the Australian Survey Office, connected to a control survey, with the co-ordinates derived from the control survey shown on the plan.

'Rural Survey' means a survey, other than an urban survey, of land in the Territory for a purpose specified in Section 34 of the Ordinance.

'Stratum' means a part of land consisting of a space of any shape below, on or above the surface of the land, or partly below and partly above the surface of the land, all dimensions of which are limited.

'Surveyor-General' means the person occupying the position currently designated by the Public Service Board as Commonwealth Surveyor-General.

'The Ordinance' means the Surveyors Ordinance 1967.

'Urban Survey' means a survey of land in the Territory for urban development for a purpose specified in Section 34 of the Ordinance and shall include leases for residential, commercial, industrial and special purposes of an urban character.

Part II—Supervision

4. No requirement of these Directions shall be construed as to prevent any survey being made under the supervision of a surveyor.

5. The character and extent of supervision to be exercised by a surveyor over a survey made under his supervision shall be as follows:

He shall personally attend on the ground for such time during the making of a survey and shall exercise such immediate oversight and personal direction of the work as shall ensure that the survey is carried out in accordance with these Directions.

Part III—Survey Practice

6. Where a surveyor undertakes to make a survey he shall in accordance with these Directions:

- (a) (i) make and where required, mark the same;
- (ii) locate or relocate with appropriate accuracy the boundaries of the land surveyed;
- (iii) ascertain with appropriate accuracy the positions of monuments relevant to the survey including where applicable connections to kerbs as laid;

(b) make complete field notes of the survey; and

(c) if so required prepare a plan of the land surveyed.

7. A surveyor shall procure all information accessible to him necessary to locate or relocate the boundaries of any land he surveys.

8. Where a surveyor makes a survey he shall ensure that the theodolite and steel or invar band or other distance measuring equipment used are in accurate adjustment, standardised and properly calibrated. Such measuring bands and distance measuring equipment shall be regularly checked against a standard established by and under the control of the Surveyor-General.

9. (a) Before adopting a line as the datum line for the azimuth of a survey, a surveyor shall specially determine the position of the marks defining such line.

(b) Whenever possible the defining marks shall be contained within a single survey which has been lodged with and approved by the government authority.

(c) The bearing of the azimuth line shall:

- (i) be taken from the datum survey either directly or by calculation from stated dimensions, or
- (ii) be calculated from datum co-ordinate values if the defining marks are CRMs or control marks; or
- (iii) be obtained from astronomical observations.

10. If the land being surveyed is not connected by survey with a control survey a surveyor shall connect the survey with a control mark by either direct measurement or well conditioned bearings if such a control mark is within reasonable access of such land.

11. A surveyor shall measure all boundaries and lines by the most direct method that is reasonable and practicable.

12. If a survey embraces only part of the land in a document of title the surveyor shall connect such part by actual measurement to a monument or point having a known relation to a corner of the land in the document.

13. Where a survey includes land which is or is to be subject to or which has or is to have as appurtenant a right of way or other easement, the site of the right of way or other easement shall be connected by the surveyor by measurement to essential relevant monuments and where reasonably practicable to corners of the parcel in which the site is, and he shall show in the plan the essential dimensions of the site, and shall note it thereon as 'site of easement' or 'site of proposed easement', as shall be appropriate, provided that the essential dimensions to be shown on the plan need not be determined by measurement of the boundaries of the right of way or easement unless the circumstances so require.

14. Where a surveyor makes any survey other than those specified in Directions 34 and 35 he shall wherever possible firmly mark each corner thereof (including corners of each parcel of land in a subdivision) with a peg or mark of the nature prescribed in Direction 26. Provided that where it is not practicable to place such peg or mark where existing structures would render such peg or mark of little value for fencing or building purposes such peg or mark need not be placed for any specific corner if a line peg or mark of the nature prescribed in Direction 26 is situated or placed along a boundary or its prolongation as near as practicable to that corner and its position shown on the plan.

15. Where a surveyor makes an urban survey, other than those specified in Directions 34 and 35, and the land surveyed abuts or comprises a road or street or other public place:

(a) in which intended CRMs have been installed adjacent to the survey, the surveyor shall:

- (i) connect the subject land to each such reference mark by closed traverse which shall include a control mark; and

- (ii) record the derived co-ordinate values of such reference mark on the plan of survey
- (b) in which CRMs have not been installed the surveyor shall place reference marks in accordance with the next succeeding Direction.
16. (a) Where a surveyor makes an urban survey for the purpose of any disposition of land or of any interest in land or for an acquisition or resumption of land under the authority of any Act or Ordinance or for the purpose of subdividing the surveyed land into parcels of land or blocks and the land surveyed:
- (i) abuts a road or street in which, within the limits of the frontage of the land surveyed, reference marks have not been placed, or have been disturbed, the surveyor shall:
- place a reference mark near each extremity of the boundary of the land where it abuts on the road or street, and
- place reference marks at intervals of not more than two hundred metres throughout the length of the frontage of the land surveyed.
- Provided that where the road or street frontage is less than fifty metres one reference mark only need be placed if an azimuth line of not less than fifty metres is shown from that reference mark to some other suitable reference mark or control mark or suitable fixed object, otherwise a second reference mark shall be placed not less than fifty metres from the first reference mark.
- (ii) does not front a road or street the surveyor shall place two reference marks suitable for azimuth.
- (b) Where a surveyor makes an urban survey solely for the establishment or redefinition of a road or street and reference marks have not been placed, or have been disturbed, the surveyor shall:
- (i) place a reference mark near each extremity of the survey and on one side of the road or street, and
- (ii) place reference marks at intervals of not more than two hundred metres throughout the length of the road or street surveyed, and
- (iii) in addition, place reference marks at all intermediate angles or tangent points provided that any such intermediate mark may be omitted if it would be less than twenty five metres from any other reference mark.
17. Where a surveyor makes a rural survey he shall:
- (a) mark definitely and durably all lines which form or are to form the boundaries between parcels held by different owners and between parcels held by the same owner in different rights:
- (i) with a peg or mark of the nature prescribed in Direction 26 together with lockspits cut in the direction of each unfenced boundary from each corner and angle, and
- (ii) on unfenced boundaries, with pegs or marks and lockspits of the nature prescribed in Direction 26 placed at intervals of not more than two hundred metres;
- (b) (i) where the land surveyed is not being subdivided, place two reference marks in selected positions suitable for redefinition of the survey
- (ii) where the land surveyed is being subdivided into separate parcels of less than four hectares, place at least one reference mark in respect of each such parcel
- (iii) where the land surveyed is being subdivided into separate parcels of four hectares or more, place at least two reference marks in respect of each such parcel
- (iv) where a boundary other than a road frontage exceeds two thousand five hundred metres, place additional reference marks or mark additional reference trees or objects at intervals of not more than one thousand five hundred metres; and
- (v) where a boundary required to be marked in accordance with these Directions is a road frontage, place pairs of reference marks suitable for azimuth at intervals of not more than one thousand metres along such boundary and one reference mark at each extremity thereof;
- (c) where the land is being surveyed for a reserved road:
- (i) measure and mark definitely and durably all lines which are to form the boundary of one side of the reserved road with pegs or marks and lockspits of the nature prescribed in Direction 26 placed at each angle along the surveyed boundary and at intervals of not more than two hundred metres along the surveyed boundaries in excess of two hundred metres between angles provided that where the marks are intervisible the interval should not be more than three hundred metres;
- (ii) mark with pegs or marks of the nature prescribed in Direction 26 each angle of the unsurveyed boundary; and
- (iii) place pairs of reference marks suitable for azimuth at intervals of not more than one thousand metres along the surveyed boundary and one reference mark at each extremity thereof.

Part IV—Re-determination of Boundaries

18. Where a surveyor makes a resurvey of land in a Crown Grant or Crown Lease or part thereof he shall adopt the boundaries as originally marked on the ground as the true boundaries, though the bearings and lengths appearing in a relevant plan or document do not agree with those between the corresponding monuments.

19. Where a corner peg and reference mark or control mark are found a surveyor shall determine the bearing and distance between them, and if a difference from the original reference is disclosed he shall decide from other evidence which of the monuments to adopt, and shall note details of such evidence and such difference on the plan.
20. Where monuments of an original survey are missing, a surveyor shall determine the boundaries and corners of the land of which he is making a survey by measurement in correct relation to boundaries of adjacent parcels of land and parcels of land on opposite sides of roads, and to fences, and to such other evidence of correct location as may be found after full investigation and inquiry.
21. Where a measurement discloses a boundary of land surveyed to be longer than is indicated in the document of title to such land the surveyor shall verify the length of such boundary and make appropriate entries in his field note, and show in such notes and in any plan of the survey the monuments adopted. In the absence of monuments defining the land surveyed he shall indicate whether there is sufficient land available to permit the adoption of such measurement without causing any encroachment upon any road street or land or upon any adjoining or adjacent parcel of land.
22. A surveyor shall indicate in his field notes and in any plan of the survey the nature and position of all monuments found by him. A monument shall not be recorded as missing, lost, or destroyed unless a thorough search for it has been made, and when it is so recorded measurements to its probable site shall be entered in the field notes. Where a surveyor ascertains during the making of a survey that control marks or reference marks are missing, disturbed or likely to be disturbed he shall report the fact to the Surveyor-General.
23. (a) Where since the date of any survey there has been a change in the position of any non-tidal stream forming a boundary of land to be surveyed caused otherwise than by gradual and imperceptible accretion or erosion, then in any subsequent survey, the position of such bank as it was immediately before such change shall be relocated after examination of all relevant accessible information.
- (b) The middle line of a stream shall not be determined by offsets nor marked unless the purpose for which the survey is made so requires.
- (c) Where since the date of any survey there has been a change in the position of high-water mark forming a boundary of land to be surveyed caused otherwise than by gradual and imperceptible accretion or erosion, then in any subsequent survey the position of mean high-water mark as it was immediately before such change shall be relocated after examination of all relevant accessible information.
- 24A. Notwithstanding the provisions of Direction 11, the Surveyor-General may authorize the determination of natural boundaries by photogrammetric methods.
25. (a) Where a crooked fence must be used to define a boundary a surveyor shall carefully traverse it and place the angle points of the boundary in such a way that the boundary shall not leave the material of the fence at the surface of the ground.
- (b) Angle points shall be substantially marked by him, and the nature thereof shown on the plan.
- (c) He shall connect corners or angles placed within a post to the centre of such post as at the surface of the ground and shall note the measurement on the plan.
- 25A. (a) High-water mark in a document relating to land shall, unless a contrary intention appears, be taken to mean the line of mean high-tide, between the ordinary high-water spring and ordinary high-water neap tides. The boundary of land abutting on tidal water shall, unless a contrary intention appears, be taken to be the mean high-water mark.
- (b) Where it is not reasonably practicable for a surveyor to determine an inaccessible or irregular high-water mark, he may determine it approximately by reference to regular or approximately regular curves, or to right lines or to any combination thereof, and, in these circumstances, it shall not be essential to place marks on the mean high-water mark.
- 25B. The area of land abutting on a non-tidal stream or on tidal water shall be ascertained by the surveyor, and shall include all lands to the bank or the high-water mark as the case may be.

Part VI—Nature and Position of Marks

26. (a) Where any line or corner of any portion of a survey is required to be marked in accordance with these Directions, the points to be marked shall be firmly marked with a peg, drill hole in rock, concrete, or other similar material, a chisel mark or nail in fixed timber, or otherwise suitably marked.
- (b) In surveys of blocks of five thousand square metres or more, all pegs shall be of sound durable wood at least three hundred and fifty millimetres long and not less than seventy-five millimetres by seventy-five millimetres section at the top end.
- (c) In surveys of blocks of less than five thousand square metres all pegs shall be of sound durable wood at least three hundred millimetres long and not less than seventy-five millimetres by forty millimetres section at the top end.
- (d) Angles and tangent points along road or street frontages shall be marked with pegs of sound durable wood at least three hundred and fifty millimetres long and not less than seventy-five millimetres by seventy-five millimetres section at the top end.

Part V—Irrregular Boundaries

24. Where the land surveyed has a irregular natural feature as a boundary a surveyor shall take such measurements as may be necessary to accurately determine each change of course or direction of the boundary.

- (e) Where it is not practicable to place a peg or mark for any specific corner and a line peg or mark is to be placed along a boundary or its prolongation as near as practicable to that corner the points to be marked shall be firmly marked with a peg of sound durable wood at least three hundred millimetres long and not less than fifty millimetres by fifty millimetres section at the top end, drill hole in rock, concrete, or other similar material, a chisel mark or nail in fixed timber, or otherwise suitably marked.
 - (f) All pegs shall be pointed for approximately two-thirds of their length and shall be bevelled at the top.
 - (g) The centre of the top of all pegs shall represent the survey point, provided that where conditions prevent the correct centering of pegs a tack shall be placed eccentrically to represent the survey.
 - (h) All pegs are to be placed upright in the ground point downwards so that the top is not more than seventy-five millimetres above the ground level in the case of a rural survey and 20 mm above the ground level in the case of an urban survey and the surrounding earth shall be securely rammed.
 - (i) Lockspits shall consist of trenches one point five metres long, two hundred millimetres wide at the surface and one hundred and fifty millimetres deep dug in the direction of the boundary lines and commencing three hundred millimetres from each peg or may consist of packed stones of similar dimensions.
 - (j) Where any corner or angle is marked with a drill hole, chisel mark or galvanised iron nail in fixed timber, where practicable wings shall be cut in solid rock, concrete or fixed timber seventy-five millimetres long, twenty millimetres wide and ten millimetres deep commencing fifty millimetres from the corner or where the surface renders it desirable lines may be painted at least three hundred millimetres long and twenty millimetres wide.
27. (a) Where a surveyor is required to place reference marks in accordance with these Directions they shall consist of:
- (i) a reinforced concrete block in the form of a truncated pyramid at least three hundred and seventy-five millimetres long one hundred and fifty millimetres square at the lower end and one hundred millimetres square at the upper end with a galvanised nail or other suitable metal plug not less than seventy-five millimetres long inserted therein, or
 - (ii) a galvanised iron pipe at least three hundred millimetres long and ten millimetres internal diameter with a wall thickness of not less than three millimetres, or
 - (iii) a galvanised iron spike at least one hundred millimetres long driven into fixed timber with a wing seventy-five millimetres long cut into the timber and directed thereto, or
 - (iv) a drill hole cut into a kerb or other substantial structure at least five millimetres in diameter and ten millimetres deep with a wing seventy-five millimetres long and directed thereto, or
 - (v) a drill hole at least ten millimetres in diameter and twenty-five millimetres deep cut into bedrock with a wing seventy-five millimetres long and directed thereto where such bedrock exists within three hundred millimetres of the natural surface of the ground, or
 - (vi) an appropriate chisel mark cut into the sound wood of a suitable tree, or
 - (vii) a mark of a durable character or a specific point on a permanent or substantial structure.
- (b) The marks referred to in sub-clauses (a)(i) and (a)(ii) of this Direction shall be placed vertically with the upper surface thereof at least one hundred millimetres below the natural surface of the ground, or where placed on a boundary upon which netting fence is likely to be erected, sufficiently deep to permit the erection of the fence without disturbance of the mark.
- (c) Where a surveyor is required to place a reference mark the requirement shall include the connection by measurement from the mark to the survey made by him.
- (d) Where a surveyor has placed or has found a reference mark referred to in sub-clauses (a)(i) and (a)(ii) of this Direction or a control mark substantially more than three hundred millimetres below the natural surface of the ground the depth shall be indicated on the plan.
- (e) An intended CRM shall be either:
- (i) a non-corrosive metal plaque set in a concrete kerb or other stable structure; or
 - (ii) a deep driven stainless steel rod; or
 - (iii) such other mark as approved by the Surveyor-General.
28. (a) Where these Directions require a surveyor to place reference marks he shall place them adjacent to the corner, angle or line mark, in selected positions designed to preserve them from disturbance, excepting that where a tree or monuments is used it should not be more than twenty-five metres from the corner, angle or line mark to which it is connected.
- (b) Where a reference mark is placed in a road it shall be placed at a suitable distance from the existing road boundary; such distance shall be determined at the discretion of the surveyor having regard to the existence of any water, lighting or other service for which provision is or has to be made.
- (c) Where an intended CRM is installed it shall be located in such a position that it is not more than 150 metres distant from at least one other CRM and shall have clear line of sight to adjacent CRMs.

- (d) Where an intended CRM is installed in such a position that it has, or the surveyor may have reason to consider that it may have in future, clear line of sight only to one other CRM then the surveyor shall place nearby a reference mark and shall connect the CRM to it by closed traverse.

Part VII—Accuracy of Surveys

29. Areas of land of irregular form shall be computed by the method of double longitudes. Where it is necessary to adjust the latitudes and departures for the computation of the area Bowditch's Rule shall be used.
30. A surveyor who makes a survey which exceeds a length of ten kilometres on level or undulating country, eight kilometres on steep country or six kilometres on mountainous country shall check his angular work by astronomical observations or by a complete angular close and shall not, for this purpose, interpolate any angular measurement made by another surveyor.
31. Wherever practical a complete angular close shall be obtained. The observed angular misclose shall not exceed 30 seconds plus $20\sqrt{n}$ seconds where 'n' is the number of traverse angular stations either for the whole surround or between and including stations at which astronomical observations for azimuth have been made; provided always that any misclose shall not exceed three minutes.
32. A surveyor shall check all measurements and where the nature of the survey permits the check shall be by the closure of the latitudes and departures of the lines in all surrounds in the survey computed to three places of decimals of a metre in the case of an urban survey or at least two places of decimals in the case of a rural survey. The accuracy of the survey shall be such that the ratio of the misclose to the perimeter shall not exceed for boundaries and parts of boundaries crossing:

- The misclose shall be determined as $\sqrt{(a^2 + b^2)}$ where 'a' is the error in latitude and 'b' is the error in departure.

33. (a) A surveyor shall in making a survey, measure all lengths to a degree of accuracy so that the probable error of such measurements shall not exceed, for lines crossing:

- (b) Where lines in a survey are so short that the above standard would demand precision ordinarily unattainable such lines shall be so measured as to maintain the best possible standard consistent with the nature of the land measured over.
- (c) For the purpose of this Direction and of Directions 30 and 32, country shall be deemed to be:

Part VIII—Identification Surveys and Remarking

34. (a) A surveyor may make:
- | |

| (i) a survey (commonly known as an Identification Survey) of a previously measured parcel of land for the purpose of re-identification of the boundaries thereof, or of its location in relation to adjoining interests in such a manner as may be required by the nature of such survey; |
| (ii) a survey requiring the remarking of a previously surveyed parcel of land in such a manner and with such marks in such position as may be specially required by the client, but such survey shall not include one required in connection with any disposition of land or of any interest in land. |
- (b) Where such a survey is made in accordance with this Direction, the provision of Direction 5 and of sub-clauses (ii) and (iii) of clause (a) and of clause (b) of Direction 6 and of Directions 33 and 36 to 42 both inclusive (but no other provision of these Directions) shall apply in respect thereof.
35. (a) A surveyor may make a survey for a purpose not requiring strict accuracy under arrangement made between himself and his client and in such a manner and with such marking as may be agreed upon between them. A sketch made in accordance with this Direction shall show monuments as approximately located.
- (b) The surveyor making such a survey shall endorse on the sketch a certificate in or to the effect of Form 2 in the Schedule to these Directions.
- (c) Where a survey is made in accordance with this Direction no other provision of these Directions shall apply in respect thereof.

Part IX—Field Notes

36. A surveyor shall make neat, precise, complete and readily intelligible field notes of every survey in accordance with the usage of surveyors. He shall show in a distinctive manner any supplementary information such as references to official documents and measurements not made by himself as he considers necessary for clarity. He shall use indices and cross-references in such a manner as would facilitate the preparation of a complete and accurate plan therefrom without reference to any additional records and without further explanation. No erasures shall be made. Amendment shall be initialled by the surveyor.
37. A surveyor shall record in the field notes all the facts, readings and observations immediately they are ascertained by him, together with coefficients of standardisation and calibration of measuring equipment.
38. A surveyor shall enter in the field notes the date, station and latitude thereof, and full particulars of all astronomical observations made in the course of the survey.

39. A surveyor shall clearly indicate in the field notes the datum line of the survey and the origin of the azimuth adopted by him.
40. A surveyor shall observe and record all angles or bearings in the field notes in degrees, minutes, and decimal parts of minutes or seconds of arc and all bearings shall be reckoned and expressed clockwise from zero to three hundred and sixty degrees.
41. A surveyor shall enter in the field notes the names of estates, houses, roads, streets, lanes, rivers, creeks, lakes and the like, and house numbers as far as material to the survey and ascertainable by him.
42. A surveyor shall sign as evidence that the work shown in the field book was performed by him or under his supervision as defined in these Directions, each page or sheet of the field notes in ink and shall indicate thereon the date on which the work recorded on such page was performed.

Part X—Plans

43. Standards and Specifications for Plans shall be approved by the Board and promulgated by the Surveyor-General.
44. A surveyor shall disclose any doubt, discrepancy or difficulty suggested by or encountered in a survey in the plan thereof or in an annexure thereto or in an accompanying report.
45. A surveyor shall show the datum line of the azimuth of a survey in the plan by distinguishing letters placed at the terminals thereof and the nature of the marks defining the datum line shall be noted therein.
46. A surveyor shall indicate on the plan:
 - (a) the nature of any corner, angle or line mark placed by him which is not a peg;
 - (b) the nature of any reference mark placed together with the essential measurements therefrom to such corner, angle or line mark;
 - (c) the nature of any reference mark or CRM found and connected to by him together with the essential measurements therefrom to such corner, angle or line mark.
47. A surveyor shall show in a plan of a re-survey or of a subdivision:
 - (a) the nature of the boundaries at the time of the re-survey or the subdivision whether defined by marks, pegs, lockspits, lines, fences, roads, streets, lanes, ways, natural or artificial features, buildings or walls. If a wall is on a boundary, the boundary shall be described in the plan as 'face of wall' or 'passing through wall', or otherwise appropriately. A wall shall not be described as a 'party wall' except in accordance with Section 32 *City Area Leases Ordinance* 1936, and
 - (b) the width of all walls used in common and the position of the boundary therein, and
 - (c) offsets to all physical objects relevant to the survey and within three metres of the boundaries.
48. (a) Where a surveyor furnishes a plan of a survey made by him or under his supervision, he shall endorse thereon a certificate in or to the effect of Form 1 in the Schedule to these Directions.

- (b) Such certificate may be incorporated in any certificate required by Regulation made under any other Ordinance to be endorsed on such plan.

49. On receipt of a requisition from the Surveyor-General or the Registrar of Titles to amend a survey plan or to supply information concerning a survey or plan and which amendment or information is necessary to complete the plan in terms of these Directions, the surveyor concerned shall promptly comply with the requisition.

Part XI—Stratum Surveys

50. Where a surveyor is required to prepare a plan of survey of a stratum he shall:
 - (a) mark at ground level the projection of the extremities of the block and relate it to existing boundaries and occupations, and
 - (b) define the stratum by dimensions of regular surfaces, and
 - (c) show on the plan elevations and sections sufficient to delineate the stratum using reduced levels based on the Australian Height Datum, and
 - (d) relate the reduced levels to a permanent survey mark, the reduced level of which is recorded in the office of the Surveyor-General, and
 - (e) show on the plan the reduced level of at least one permanent physical object adjacent to the stratum, and
 - (f) delineate on the plan any easement and fully describe its purpose and limitations.

Net of national income tax—25% payable in the currency of the duty station and the rest in a currency of the staff member's choice. Net base salary per annum: the equivalent of \$26299 (\$24298 if without dependants).

Post adjustment (cost of living, subject to change without notice), as of 1.2.80 the local equivalent of plus \$9380 (\$8667 if without dependants).

Assignment allowance: the local equivalent of \$2400 (\$1900 if without dependants).

Family allowances: each dependent child \$450 (if there is no dependent spouse, this indemnity is not payable for the first dependent child).

Travel is provided for the staff member and his family (spouse and recognised dependants). In addition, UNESCO contributes towards the cost of installation at the duty station and to the education of dependent children. On separation from UNESCO a repatriation grant is paid).

ANNEX

A. Background:

The system of education in Pakistan serves four Provinces and four territories whose total population is more than seventy million people. The system which is large and complex, was established long before Pakistan became an independent country. As the population continues to grow, the pressures on formal education have increased dramatically, and made it even more difficult to administer. It is clear that all administrative procedures and policies must be reviewed and reformulated to permit the Government to reach its objectives.

In response to this situation, the Bureau of Educational Planning and Management was established in 1974, within the Federal Ministry of Education. It was charged with responsibility for training programmes and research studies in educational planning and management. To date key persons engaged in educational planning have been trained through short courses and workshops, and several surveys have been carried out to guide planning and decision-making. Provincial planning units have been created and staffed, and the overall quality of planning has improved. However, many problems remain. The transformation of the Bureau into an Academy of Educational Planning and Management is designed to increase the capacity of the existing Bureau to provide a more complete range of services. It calls for closer links between training educational planners and the conduct of experiments and educational research.

The Academy will give more emphasis to educational administration and the daily operation of thousands of schools. New management techniques are needed to cope with new problems. Moreover, the Academy will co-ordinate more closely educational planning and management in the Provinces. Through conferences and seminars, for personnel at many levels, the Academy will seek to introduce new approaches and attitudes to planning and management.

The Academy will also serve as a National Centre for Current Documentation in Planning and Management. It will include a Centre where up to date journals, periodicals, and publications on educational research, planning and management can be found.

Improved supervision of instruction at all levels is a major objective of the Academy. Pre-service and in-service training will be organized and a nucleus of experienced supervisors developed to service all schools. This will be particularly useful for District Education Officers and Assistant DEO's. The Assistants are seen as the key persons in implementing educational reforms.

The Academy will effectively take over the training, research and evaluative functions of BEPM. Its programmes will be offered by three divisions, Educational Planning and Management, Supervision, and Research and Evaluation.

B. National character of the project:

Operational projects, benefiting from Unesco assistance, are national projects and it is up to the beneficiary country to assume responsibility for directing the project as well as ensuring its proper implementation.

The national authority will also be responsible for the utilization of equipment including supplies and vehicles, as far as the activities defined in the project document are concerned.

Consequently, the international specialists will carry out their mission under the guidance of the Director-General, Academy of Educational Planning and Management.

Under the supervision of the Chief Technical Adviser, the specialists, as staff members of Unesco, are placed under the authority of the Director-General of the Organisation and will answer to him for the manner in which they carry out their functions.

WHEREAS the Bye-laws of The Institution approved by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia on the third day of July 1969 were subsequently amended and approved by the Governor-General on the thirty-first day of March 1977.

AND WHEREAS the Bye-laws have been further amended as set out in the schedule below in accordance with the provisions of the Royal Charter by a resolution of not less than three-fourths of the Corporate Members present in person or by proxy and voting at a General Meeting of The Institution held on the sixteenth day of May 1979.

AND WHEREAS the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia has on the sixth day of June 1980 approved the amendments of the Bye-laws of The Institution as set forth in the schedule below.

THE SCHEDULE INTERPRETATION

Bye-law 1

(a) Delete the definition of 'Member of The Institution' and substitute the following:

'A "member of The Institution" means and includes Fellows, Senior Members, Members, Associates (Professional), Associates (Engineering), Associates (Technical), Companions, Senior Affiliates, Affiliates, Students, Honorary Life Members and Honorary Members.'

(b) Delete the figures (35) in the definition of 'the register' and substitute the figures (36).

MEMBERSHIP

Bye-law 2

Delete Bye-law 2 and substitute the following:

'Pursuant to clause 5 of the Charter there shall be 12 grades of membership of The Institution, namely Fellow, Senior Member, Member, Associate (Professional), Associate (Engineering), Associate (Technical), Companion, Senior Affiliate, Affiliate, Student, Honorary Life Member and Honorary Member, Fellows, Senior Members and Members shall be known as *Corporate Members*. Associates (Professional), Associates (Engineering), Associates (Technical), Companions, Senior Affiliates, Affiliates, Students, Honorary Life Members and Honorary Members shall be known as *Non-Corporate Members*.'

Bye-law 3

Delete Bye-law 3 and substitute the following:

'(3) FELLOW

(a) Fellows of The Institution shall comprise all persons appointed, elected or transferred into the grade of Fellow, while registered as such.

(b) A candidate for election or transfer into the grade of Fellow shall produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Council that he—

(i) (a) is at the time of application for election or transfer engaged in the profession; or

(b) has been previously engaged in the profession and that it is in the interest of the profession that he should be so elected or transferred;

and

(ii) is a Member or holds the qualifications necessary for Corporate Membership; and

(iii) has been engaged for at least five years in positions deemed by the Council to be of major responsibility in the design or execution of important or significant electronics engineering or scientific work, such engagement being in addition to the professional experience required under Bye-law (4) hereof.

- (c) Notwithstanding the foregoing requirements of this Bye-law, the Council may appoint to the grade of Fellow:

- (ii) persons of high educational qualifications who have in the opinion of the Council occupied prominent positions in the profession and who have made some noteworthy contribution to electronics engineering or science or have materially advanced the technical practice thereof.'

'(4) SENIOR MEMBER

- (a) Senior Members of The Institution shall comprise all persons elected or transferred into the grade of Senior Member, while registered as such.
- (b) Persons registered as Members at the date of approval of these Bye-laws shall be transferred (without prejudice to further elevation) to the grade Senior Member and registered as such.
- (c) A candidate for election or transfer into the grade of Senior Member shall produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Council that he:
 - (i) is, at the time of the application for election or transfer, engaged in the profession; and
 - (ii) is a Member of The Institution or has an examination qualification approved by the Council as satisfying its requirements; and
 - (iii) has attained experience (additional to that required under Bye-law (5) hereof) satisfactory to the Council in the practice of the profession.'

'(5) MEMBER

- (a) Members of The Institution shall comprise all persons elected or transferred into the grade of Member, while registered as such.
- (b) Persons registered as Associate Members at the date of approval of these Bye-laws shall be transferred (without prejudice to further elevation) to the grade of Member and registered as such.
- (c) A candidate for election or transfer into the grade of Member shall produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Council that he:
 - (i) is, at the time of application for election or transfer, engaged in the profession; and
 - (ii) has an examination qualification and experience approved by the Council as satisfying its requirements for Corporate Membership.'

'(6) ASSOCIATE (PROFESSIONAL)

- (a) Associates (Professional) of The Institution shall comprise all persons elected or transferred into the grade of Associate (Professional), while registered as such.

- (b) A candidate for election or transfer into the grade of Associate (Professional) shall produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Council that he—

- (i) is, at the time of application for election or transfer, engaged in the profession or in the technical application of electronics engineering or science; and
- (ii) has an examination qualification satisfying the requirements of the Council.'

Bye-law 7

Delete Bye-law 7 and substitute the following:

'(7) ASSOCIATE (ENGINEERING)

- (a) Associates (Engineering) of The Institution shall comprise all persons elected or transferred into the grade of Associate (Engineering), while registered as such.
- (b) A candidate for election or transfer into the grade of Associate (Engineering) shall produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Council that he—
 - (i) has at the time of application for election or transfer, been engaged in the technical application of electronics engineering or science for a period determined by and at a level or responsibility acceptable to Council; and
 - (ii) has an examination qualification satisfying the requirements of Council.

OR

- (c) A candidate for transfer into the grade of Associate (Engineering) shall produce evidence to the satisfaction of Council that he—
 - (i) was a Senior Affiliate of The Institution prior to the date of approval of these Bye-laws; and
 - (ii) is, or has been for at least ten years engaged in the technical application of electronics engineering or science in a capacity and at a level of responsibility acceptable to Council; and
 - (iii) has an examination qualification satisfying the requirements of Council.'

'(8) ASSOCIATE (TECHNICAL)

- (a) Associate (Technical) of The Institution shall comprise all persons elected or transferred into the grade of Associate (Technical) while registered as such.
- (b) Persons registered as Senior Affiliates and Affiliates of The Institution at the date of approval of these Bye-laws who are ineligible to transfer under Bye-law 7 (c) shall be transferred to the grade of Associate (Technical) and registered as such.
- (c) A candidate for election or transfer into the grade of Associate (Technical) shall produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Council that he—
 - (i) is, at the time of election or transfer, engaged in the technical application of electronics engineering or science; and

- (ii) has been engaged for a period determined by and in a capacity acceptable to the Council in the technical application of electronics engineering or science; and
- (iii) has an examination qualification satisfying the requirements of Council.'

'(9) COMPANION

- (a) Companions of The Institution shall comprise all persons appointed, elected or transferred to the grade of Companion, while registered as such.
- (b) A candidate for election or transfer into the grade of Companion shall produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Council that he—

- (i) (a) is, at the time of application for election or transfer, not eligible for a Corporate Membership grade of The Institution and is engaged in the control or management of significant activities based upon or contributory to or closely allied with electronics engineering or science; or
- (b) has been previously so engaged and that it is in the interest of the profession that he be so elected or transferred; and is a Senior Affiliate (after the date of approval of these Bye-laws) or holds qualifications satisfying the Council;

and

- (ii) has been engaged for at least five years in positions deemed by Council to be of major responsibility in significant activities based upon or closely allied with electronics engineering or science.'

'(10) SENIOR AFFILIATE

- (a) Senior Affiliates of The Institution shall comprise all persons elected or transferred into the grade of Senior Affiliate after the date of approval of these Bye-laws, while registered as such.
- (b) A candidate for election or transfer into the grade of Senior Affiliate shall produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Council that he—
 - (i) is, at the time of application for election or transfer, not eligible for a Corporate Membership grade of The Institution and is engaged in significant activities based upon or contributory to or closely allied with electronics engineering or science; and
 - (ii) has been so engaged for a period of at least three years; and
 - (iii) has an examination qualification acceptable to the Council.'

'(11) AFFILIATE

- (a) Affiliates of The Institution shall comprise all persons elected or transferred into the grade of Affiliate after the date of approval of these Bye-laws, while registered as such.

- (b) A candidate for election or transfer into the grade of Affiliate shall produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Council that he—
 - (i) does not, at the time of application for election or transfer, possess the required qualifications for election or transfer into another grade; and
 - (ii) is engaged either full-time or part-time in the technical application of electronics engineering or science or in technical activities based upon or contributory to or closely allied with electronics engineering or science; and
 - (iii) has an examination qualification satisfying the requirements of Council.'

'(12) STUDENT

- (a) Students of The Institution shall comprise all persons elected into the grade of Student, while registered as such.
- (b) A candidate for election to the grade of Student shall produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Council that he is studying, either full-time or part-time, for a qualification which is acceptable to the Council.
- (c) In the case of candidates engaged in part-time study, the Council may also take into consideration whether the candidate is concurrently engaged in the technical application of electronics engineering or science.
- (d) A person studying for a qualification for entry into a higher grade shall not remain in the grade of Student for more than seven years.
Provided that:
- (e) (i) a person who has gained such a qualification shall normally be required to transfer to the appropriate higher grade.
- (ii) a person ceasing to study for such qualification shall cease to be a Student of The Institution.
- (iii) the Council may in its sole discretion extend the period during which a person may remain in the grade of Student to a total not exceeding ten years upon receipt of an application accordingly from that person supported by reasons satisfactory to the Council.'

'(13) HONORARY LIFE MEMBERS AND HONORARY MEMBERS

- (c) A candidate for Honorary Membership shall be proposed and seconded by Councillors at a Council Meeting prior to that at which such candidate might be admitted. The candidate's nomination shall be included in the notice paper convening the Council Meeting at which such candidate is to be considered for admission.
- (d) The Council may re-admit to Honorary Membership of The Institution for a period not exceeding one year persons who conform to the requirements of sub-clause (c) hereof who have been previously admitted to Honorary Membership.
- (e) Persons admitted to Honorary Life Membership or Honorary Membership shall not be required to pay entrance fees, subscriptions nor calls.
- (f) Honorary Life Members and Honorary Members shall not be entitled to be elected as Officers or Councillors of The Institution nor to nominate any person for any office or grade of membership and shall be entitled to vote according to By-law (27) hereof.

SCHEDULE 2

By-Law No. S2525

I, RANSLEY VICTOR GARLAND, Minister of State for Business and Consumer Affairs, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI of the *Customs Act 1901*, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-law set out in the Schedule hereto.

In the by-law set out in the Schedule hereto a reference to:

- (a) an item;
- (b) a sub-item;
- (c) a paragraph; or
- (d) a sub-paragraph

shall be read as a reference to that item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph as the case may be in Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered.

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of that description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered, that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered, that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.

THE SCHEDULE

By-law No. S2525

Item No. 36
Schedule 2

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S2525.
2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 1 July 1980.
3. Subject to paragraphs 4, 5 and 6 Item 36 in Schedule 2 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966* applies to handicrafts that the Collector is satisfied:
 - (1) are hand-made goods, that is to say, goods that have been made by one or more of the following processes:
 - (a) by hand;
 - (b) by tools held in the hand;
 - (c) by machines powered by foot or hand;
 - (2) are wholly or in chief part by weight of materials traditionally used in the production of handicrafts; and
 - (3) have attained, by reason of being hand-made, an artistic or decorative character generally comparable with traditional hand-made products of the country in which the goods were made.
4. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 3, this by-law applies to textile fabrics printed or dyed according to the traditional Batik method and handicrafts made up from such fabrics.
5. The incorporation or inclusion in goods of materials or components of a minor nature that—
 - (1) do not conform to the provisions of paragraph 3; and
 - (2) are essential to the assembly or normal operation of those goods, but do not contribute to the decoration, artistry or character of the goods,does not thereby exclude those goods from the provisions of paragraph 3.
6. This by-law does not apply to goods to which paragraph 3 would, but for this paragraph, apply that—
 - (1) are included in a class of goods specified in column 1 of the Table hereto; and
 - (2) are not included in the class of goods (if any) specified in column 2 of that Table opposite the class of goods in which those goods are included.

CLOSED SEASON FOR THE TAKING OF ROCK LOBSTER FROM WATERS OFF THE SOUTHERN COAST OF AUSTRALIA

I, PETER JAMES NIXON, the Minister of State for Primary Industry, hereby prohibit the taking from an area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 1, of fish included in the following class of fish, namely *decapod crustacea* of the family *Jasus novaehollandiae* (commonly known as southern rock lobster), during the period commencing at midnight 30 June 1980 and ending at noon 1 October 1980.

All that area of proclaimed waters contained within the area bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the southern coast of Australia at low-water mark with the meridian 139 degrees east longitude; thence proceeding southwards along that meridian to its intersection with the parallel 37 degrees south latitude; thence proceeding westwards along that parallel to its intersection with the meridian 138 degrees east longitude; thence proceeding southwards along that meridian to its intersection with the parallel 42 degrees 31 minutes 6 seconds south latitude; thence proceeding southwards along a straight line drawn to the point 141 degrees east longitude 45 degrees 6 minutes 15 seconds south latitude; thence proceeding northwards along the meridian 141 degrees east longitude to its intersection with the southern coast of Australia at low-water mark; thence following the southern coast of Australia at low-water mark generally westwards to the point of commencement.
