Copies of each week's Special issues are supplied with General issues which are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and sold at \$1.20 each plus postage or on subscription of \$71.50 (50 issues), \$36.50 (25 issues), or \$19.00 (12 issues). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service and the Services of the Australian Postal Commission and Australian Telecommunications Commission. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and sold at \$2.00 each plus postage or on subscription of \$102.50 (50 issues), \$52.00 (25 issues), or \$26.75 (12 issues).

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Officers responsible for arranging the gazettal of urgent notices should refer to Gazette Office Circular of 18 April 1980 on this subject. Single copies are available on the day of issue and priced according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Unclaimed deposits and moneys; Australian Public Service Conditions of Entry and Advancement; Appointments to the Australian Public Service; Holders of Import Licences and Tariff Quotas. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain references to a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and sold at 25c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

Schedule 2

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S2529.
2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 1 August 1980.
3. Item 2 in Schedule 2 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered, applies to goods, not being alcoholic liquors or tobacco products, being goods—
 - (a) that are the property of a body or authority specified in Column 1 of the Table hereunder; and
 - (b) subject to such exception, if any, as are set out in Column 2 of the Table opposite the body or authority.

THE SCHEDULE

By-law No. S2531

Item No. 35
Schedule 2

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S2531.

2. Item 35 in Schedule 2 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered, applies, subject to the next succeeding paragraph, to goods, being a consignment of goods the total value of which does

not exceed \$250 and in respect of which the combined duty and sales tax, if any, that would otherwise be payable thereon does not exceed \$5.

3. This by-law does not apply to—

- (a) goods imported by a passenger arriving in Australia from parts beyond the seas;
- (b) goods imported by a member of the crew of a ship or aircraft arriving from parts beyond the seas; or
- (c) goods forming part of a bulk order placed on the overseas supplier.

4. Customs By-law No. S2445 published in *Gazette* No. G 21, dated 3 June 1975 is hereby revoked.

THE Minister of State for Business and Consumer Affairs, the Honourable R. V. NORTHERN TERRITORY ELECTORAL REGULATIONS

NOTICE OF DETERMINATION OF DISTRICTS OF THE NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA

I, JOHN ELDEN McLEAY, the Minister of State for Administrative Services, hereby determine, for the purposes of regulation 11A of the Northern Territory Electoral Regulations, that the Districts into which the Northern Territory of Australia is divided are the Districts specified in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

District of Alice Springs

All that piece of land in the Northern Territory of Australia bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the northeastern corner of Town of Alice Springs Lot 943; thence southerly and westerly by an eastern boundary and part of the southern boundary of Town of Alice Springs Lot 943 to the centreline of the Todd River; thence generally southerly by that centreline to its intersection with the centreline of the Charles River; thence generally westerly by the centreline of the Charles River to its intersection with the northwesterly prolongation of the north-eastern boundary of Town of Alice Springs Lot 2665; thence southeasterly by that prolongation to the northern corner of Town of Alice Springs Lot 2665; thence southeasterly and southwesterly by the north-eastern and southeastern boundaries of that lot to the southeastern corner of that lot; thence southwesterly by the southeastern boundaries of Town of Alice Springs Lot 2666 and Town of Alice Springs Lot 429 to the southeastern corner of Town of Alice Springs Lot 429; thence southwesterly to the north-eastern corner of Town of Alice Springs Lot 2313; thence southwesterly by the southeastern boundary of the last-mentioned lot to the southeastern corner of that lot; thence southwesterly by part of the southeastern boundary of Town of Alice Springs Lot 914 to its intersection with the centreline of the Railway Trucking Yards shunting line; thence generally southeasterly by that centreline to its intersection with the centreline of the main line of the Central Australia Railway; thence generally southwesterly by the centreline of that main line to its intersection with an imaginary line bearing 108 degrees 30 minutes from Mount Gillen Trigonometrical Station (NTS045); thence by an imaginary line bearing 108 degrees 30 minutes to a point being 3000 metres West of a western boundary of Pastoral Lease 673 (Undoolya); thence northerly by an imaginary line being 3000 metres West of and parallel to a western boundary of that pastoral lease to a point East of the northeastern corner of Town of Alice Springs Lot 943; thence West to the point of commencement.

ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS

ORDERED BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

I, SIR ZELMAN COWEN, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby approve the following administrative arrangements in substitution for the arrangements in operation immediately before the date of this Order:

1. The matters dealt with by each Department of State include the matters specified in the second column of the Schedule to this Order opposite to the name of that Department in the first column of that Schedule and other matters arising under the enactments administered by the Minister of State administering that Department.

2.
