Copies of each week's Special issues are supplied with General issues which are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and sold at \$1.20 each plus postage or on subscription of \$71.50 (50 issues), \$36.50 (25 issues), or \$19.00 (12 issues). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service and the Services of the Australian Postal Commission and Australian Telecommunications Commission. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and sold at \$2.00 each plus postage or on subscription of \$102.50 (50 issues), \$52.00 (25 issues), or \$26.75 (12 issues).

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Officers responsible for arranging the gazettal of urgent notices should refer to Gazette Office Circular of 18 April 1980 on this subject. Single copies are available on the day of issue and priced according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Unclaimed deposits and moneys; Australian Public Service Conditions of Entry and Advancement; Appointments to the Australian Public Service; Holders of Import Licences and Tariff Quotas. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain references to a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA

ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God, Queen of Australia and Her other Realms and Territories, Head of the Commonwealth:

To:

FRANCIS XAVIER COSTIGAN, Q.C., LL.B.,
GREETING:

WE DO by these Our Letters Patent issued in Our name by Our Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia on the advice of the Federal Executive Council and in pursuance of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the *Royal Commissions Act 1902* and other enabling powers, appoint you to be, on and from 1 October 1980, a Commissioner to inquire, for the purpose of the exercise and performance of the powers and functions of the Parliament and Government of the Commonwealth, whether the Federated Ship Painters and Dockers Union (hereinafter referred to as 'the Union') or any officer or member of the Union has engaged in illegal activities in relation to Shipping engaged in trade and commerce between Australia and places outside Australia or among the States or ships operated by, or on behalf of, the Commonwealth or in relation to any naval establishment within the meaning of the *Naval Defence Act 1910*:

AND, without restricting the scope of your inquiry, We direct you, for the purposes of your inquiry, to give particular attention to the following questions:

- (a) whether any executive, administrative or other body forming part of, or established by, the Union has been used, or is being used, for the purposes of illegal activities, other than activities involving only breaches of laws, whether of the Commonwealth or a State, relating to trade unions;
- (b) whether the Union or any of its officials or members has been or is engaged in demanding or receiving payments (other than payments of an ordinary commercial nature or payments in accordance with an industrial award or agreement in respect of work actually performed or to be performed) from employers or other persons in relation to ships engaged in trade and commerce between Australia and places outside Australia or among the States, in relation to ships operated by, or on behalf of, the Commonwealth or in relation to any naval establishment within the meaning of the *Naval Defence Act 1910* and, if any such payments have been made—
 - (i) the persons by whom and to whom any such payments have been made;
 - (ii) the reasons for, or the purposes of, any such payments;
 - (iii) the subsequent or proposed use or disposal of any such payments;
- (c) whether the Union or any officers or members of the Union have engaged in illegal activities in relation to the election or appointment of officers of the Union or the conduct or purported conduct of the Union's affairs;
- (d) if the Union or any officers or members of the Union have engaged in activities of any of the kinds referred to in this or the preceding paragraphs, whether the employment conditions

applying to the work of ship painters and dockers have contributed to the development of those activities:

AND We direct you to make such recommendations arising out of your inquiry as you think appropriate, including recommendations regarding the legislative or administrative changes, if any, that are necessary or desirable:

AND We further direct that any finding that the Union or any officer or member of the Union has engaged in conduct amounting to a criminal offence be made only on evidence, admissible in a Court of Law, sufficient to place the Union, officer or member on trial for that offence.

AND We further direct that, in making your recommendations, you have regard to the announced intention of the Government of the Commonwealth to introduce a system of reporting of demands for, and payments of, monies following the report of the Royal Commission into Alleged Payments to Maritime Unions by the Honourable Mr Justice Sweeney:

AND We declare that you are authorized to conduct your inquiry into any matters under these Our Letters Patent in combination with any inquiry into the same or related matters that you are directed or authorized to make by any Commission issued, or in pursuance of any order or appointment made, by any of Our Governors of the States:

AND We require you as expeditiously as possible to make your inquiry and—

- (e) not later than 31 March 1981, to furnish to Our Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia an interim report of the results of your inquiry; and
- (f) not later than 30 September 1981, or such later date as We may be pleased to fix, to furnish to Our Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia a report of the results of your inquiry and your recommendations.

WITNESS His Excellency Sir Zelman Cowen, Knight of The Order of Australia, Knight Grand Cross of The Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of The Royal Victorian Order, (L.S.) Knight of the Most Venerable Order of The Hospital of Saint John of Jerusalem, one of Her Majesty's Counsel learned in the law, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia and Commander-in-Chief of the Defence Force.

PROCLAMATIONS

QUARANTINE PROCLAMATION No. 99A

Commonwealth of
Australia
ZELMAN COWEN

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section 13 (1) of the *Quarantine Act* 1908 that the Governor-General may, by proclamation, amongst other things, prohibit the importation into Australia—

(a) of any articles likely, in his opinion, to introduce any infectious or contagious disease, or disease or pest affecting persons, animals or plants; or

(b) of any animals or of any parts of animals:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section 13 (2) of that Act that the power of prohibition under section 13 of that Act shall extend to authorize prohibition generally or with limitations as to place and subject matter, and either absolutely or subject to any specified conditions or restrictions:

AND WHEREAS by Quarantine Proclamation No. 77A published in the *Gazette* on 28 July 1966 the importation into Australia of any article or of any part of an animal described in the first column of the Second Schedule to that Proclamation was prohibited unless—

- (i) any limitation as to place and any condition or restriction, specified opposite to the description of that article or part of an animal in the second column of that Schedule, were complied with; and
- (ii) that article or part of an animal was on arrival in Australia subject to such treatment (if any) as was prescribed by the Quarantine (Animals) Regulations for that article or part of an animal and the certificates, declarations, notices, permits and other documents (if any) required by those Regulations in respect of the article or part of an animal were furnished in accordance with those Regulations:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to vary Quarantine Proclamation No. 77A to permit the importation of bovine hides and skins from Solomon Islands if the conditions and restrictions referred to in paragraph (ii) are complied with:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir Zelman Cowen, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby vary Quarantine Proclamation No. 77A by omitting from the Second Schedule—

‘13. Hides and skins of bovine animals

1. The goods shall not be imported on an aircraft
2. The goods shall not be imported from a country other than Canada, Fiji, New Caledonia, New Hebrides, New Zealand, Norfolk Island, Ireland, the Territory of Papua, the Territory of New Guinea, Tonga, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the United States of America or Western Samoa
3. The goods shall not be imported unless the importer produces to a Chief Quarantine Officer a certificate certifying that the hides or skins were obtained from bovine animals slaughtered in one of the abovementioned

countries for the purpose of providing meat for human consumption, being a certificate signed by a veterinary surgeon employed by the Government of that country or by another person employed by the Government of one of those countries or by another person employed by that Government who is, in the opinion of a Chief Quarantine Officer, qualified to give the certificate’

and substituting—

‘13. Hides and skins of bovine animals

1. The goods shall not be imported on an aircraft
2. The goods shall not be imported unless they are imported from one of the following countries, namely Canada, Fiji, New Caledonia, New Zealand, Norfolk Island, Ireland, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Tonga, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the United States of America, Vanuatu and Western Samoa, and the importer produces to a Chief Quarantine Officer a certificate certifying that the hides or skins were obtained from bovine animals slaughtered in one of those countries for the purpose of providing meat for human consumption, being a certificate signed by a veterinary surgeon employed by the Government of that country or by another person employed by that Government who is, in the opinion of a Chief Quarantine Officer, qualified to give the certificate’.

SCHEDULE 2

By-law No. S2535

I, RANSLEY VICTOR GARLAND, Minister for State for Business and Consumer Affairs, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI of the *Customs Act 1901*, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-law set out in the Schedule hereto.

In a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto a reference to:

- (a) an item;
- (b) a sub-item;
- (c) a paragraph; or
- (d) a sub-paragraph

shall be read as a reference to that item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph, as the case may be, in Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered.

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of that description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered, that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered, that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S2535.
2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 1 October 1980.
3. Item 25 in Schedule 2 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered, applies to goods—
 - (a) (i) to which a tariff classification set out in the Table hereunder applies; or
 - (ii) of a kind to which the rate of duty that would, but for this by-law, apply to those goods by virtue of a provision in column 3 or 4 of the item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph, as the case may be, that applies to those goods, is a rate of duty specified elsewhere in column 3 or 4, as the case may be, of an item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph specified in the Table hereunder; and
 - (b) being goods that are included in a class of goods specified in column 2 of that Table opposite that tariff classification.
