OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Advice of availability is given in the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain references to a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and sold at 25c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

Commonwealth of Australia ZELMAN COWEN Governor-General By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section 407B (1) of the Navigation Act 1912 that, if it appears to the Governor-General that the rules applied by a country other than a Commonwealth country with respect to the measurement of the tonnage of ships are substantially similar to regulations made by virtue of section 407A of that Act, the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, declare that country to be a country to which sub-section 407B (2) of that Act applies:

AND WHEREAS it appears to me, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, that the rules applied by Sweden (being a country that is not a Commonwealth country) with respect to the measurement of the tonnage of ships are substantially similar to the Navigation (Tonnage Measurement) Regulations, being regulations made by virtue of section 407A of that Act:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir Zelman Cowen, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia. acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby declare Sweden to be a country to which sub-section 407B (2) of the Navigation Act 1912 applies.

and thereunder:-

"HOWARD CLAIMS 'SNOOPERS" WILL CHECK ON PUBLIC"

in the following words:-

"Liberal Party planners said last night that the ALP is ready to form a royal commission into wealth with powers to investigate tax returns, bank accounts and other indicators of personal income if it wins the election. The powers the Liberals believe would be given to the inquiry are described in documents drawn up in the accord between the ALP and the trade-union movement, signed in August.

Few details have been openly discussed by Labor leaders in the election campaign. But they have confirmed that such an inquiry would be a major priority of a Labor government.

In its document, Relationships between the ALP and the Trade Unions, the ALP agreed to set up the inquiry into wealth and give it the power to subpoena anyone it wanted "so that it would not be frustrated in its endeavors by the uncooperative attitudes of those with something to hide."

The document adds: "The commission could hold special inquiries into various sensitive areas such as tax avoidance, capital gains, fringe benefits and professional fees."

The Liberals say this commitment, giving subpoena powers and specifically mentioning tax and fringe benefits, would mean people making available tax returns. Provisions in the Income Tax Act prevent such action at the moment.

"OVERTONES"

The first coalition attack on the wealth tax front was made by the Treasurer, Mr. Howard, yesterday.

He said the machinery the ALP would set up would probe the personal assets of most people. The commission had "sinister overtones" and would have the effect of snooping into people's assets and incomes

He said: "I can only see the inquiry into wealth as a punitive exercise against capital accumulation both large and small.

"The ramifications are that a very large number of ordinary Australians would be subjected to inquiry. It will put a lot of fear and concern into the minds of people who will wonder throughout the duration of the inquiry as to what is going to come out of it."

"I believe the real reason is that this is a commitment that the Labor Party has to make to placate the more radical elements in their ranks who believe there should be a radical redistribution of wealth in the Australian community."

He said he saw a natural evolution of such an inquiry as such the introduction of a capital gains and a wealth tax and probably some reintroduction of death duties or a combination of them.

"If they have a capital gains tax, will people have to put in their homes? Are they going to have to provide an inventory of their personal assets at the end of each year?"

The idea that capital gains and wealth taxes affected only a small part of the population was "for the birds", he said. "They would affect the capital transactions of hundreds of thousands of people who

would regard themselves as ordinary Australians who have been very thrifty and very careful in accumulating a certain amount of capital.

"It is that sort of group I believe has most to fear from an inquiry."

Meanwhile the Prime Minister, Mr. Fraser, switched his campaign attack to the associated inflationary impact of Labor's policies.

A confidential Liberal Party survey has revealed this is the most sensitive issue in the electorate. A national survey conducted last weekend confirmed the ALP's lead in a public opinion poll.

Liberal Party sources said although their poll confirmed Labor's popularity, it also reinforced the basic party strategy of fighting the election on the issues of economic responsibility, the effects of inflation and national security.

In Adelaide, Mr. Fraser made television commercials to run at the weekend which focus on the inflation issue.

Mr. Fraser quoted Mr. Hayden as saying: "We propose, without any apology at all, the introduction of a capital gains tax, resource rental tax and restructuring of the tax scale to raise more revenue."

"BANK ACCOUNTS ... HOME VALUES ... TAK
RETURNS ..."

and with heavy large print:-

"LABOR PLANS SNOOP ON YOUR MONEY" with the following words:—

"Bank and other savings accounts, tax returns and other personal financial details, including home values, would be investigated by an enquiry planned by the Labor Party.

The enquiry which will be set up if Labor wins the October 18th Federal Election would have the power to subpoena anyone.

It would affect millions of Australians. The Member for Sturt Mr. Ian Wilson, today described the planned enquiry as a gross invasion of privacy.

POWERS

And he said Labor had given no indication the information it collected would remain confidential.

An A.L.P. document entitled 'Relationships Between the A.L.P. and the Trade Unions' says the A.L.P. has agreed to set up the enquiry with special powers so it would not be frustrated by "uncooperative attitudes" of people with something to hide."

And continuing on page 2:-

"I can see the enquiry into wealth only as a punitive exercise against capital accumulation both large and small" Mr. Howard said. (Referring to the Honourable the Treasurer John Winston Howard M.H.R.)

"The ramifications are that a large number of ordinary Australians would be subject to enquiry."

He believed the real reason was to placate the more radical elements of the Labor Party, who believed there should be a radical distribution of wealth in Australia.

Mr. Howard said a natural evolution of such an enquiry was the introduction of capital gains or wealth tax, and probably some reintroduction of death duties.

ASSETS

It was possible, with the introduction of a capital gains tax, people would have to declare the value of their homes.

It also was possible people would have to provide an inventory of personal assets at the end of each year.

The A.L.P. document setting out guidelines for the inquiry into wealth says the commission could hold special inquiries into various sensitive areas, such as tax avoidance, capital gains, fringe benefits and professional fees.

Labor has announced its intention to hold the inquiry, but so far few details have been discussed openly by Labor leaders.

Mr. Wilson said, "The whole focus of the scheme is one of intrusion, invasion of privacy and of disclosure of this information.

"What they are going to set up is an inquisitive government. Having been inquisitive, it will make public the information it has gathered about citizens in the community.

"It is quite clear the A.L.P. wants the income and wealth of every individual to be available to the government.

INTRUSION

"If one looks at their proposal for family allowances, a mother must disclose all her other income and that of her husband, if she wishes to gain further assistance.

"The A.L.P. does not regard anything in the way of an individual's income or assets as a private affair.

"And it will not be simply community leaders they would focus on. Their real desire is to know the position of every citizen.

"Their whole approach is for a more public disclosure of this information."

"Thousands of ordinary Australians could be slugged by the Labor Party's 'wealth' tax plan.

Although Mr. Hayden has tried to defuse the issue by backing down on introducing the tax if he won the October 18 election, the Opposition Leader says he would "put it to the people at the 1983 election". Several months ago, the Labor Party dumped a plan to introduce a capital gains tax on amounts of \$200,000.00 or more—promising instead, to launch an enquiry into all forms of wealth.

But Labor's primary industry spokesman, Mr. Walsh, let the cat out of the bag this week by revealing that the Party is looking at a new "wealth" tax or the re-introduction of probate. With inflation running at only a moderate rate, these proposed gold mines could send nearly everyone broke within a few years.

Mr. Hayden is promising tax cuts which will amount to somewhere around \$1,500 million (depending on whose electronic calculator one believes).

Mr. Walsh has given an indication of how Labor would overcome that payout.

With good reason the Labor Party doesn't want to discuss those proposals while the electorate still has time to think about them. However, the Party's early plans give an indication of what could happen. Mr. Hayden estimates a capital gains tax on amounts of more than \$200,000 would send about \$300 million a year into Canberra's coffers.

Since housing prices are reasonable in this part of the country, Adelaide residents would not be badly affected for some time. But such attacks could hit Sydney and Melbourne people—even those in staunch Labor electorates. It could slug also the thousands of Australians who have had the good sense to invest in early maturing insurance policies or superannuation schemes

In some depressed areas of Sydney, housing prices have jumped from \$35,000.00 to more than \$160,000.00 in the past five years

Many ordinary homes in the inner areas have soared above \$200,000.00 and continue to rise in price by about \$12,000.00 a year.

Under the original Labor plan, anyone who sold one of those houses would have to pay a capital gains tax on gains above \$200,000.00.

The same could apply to people who retire and are required to take their superannuation in a lump sum.

The rich got rich under Mr. Whitlam's 'socially-aware government for the working man' while inflation destroyed the buying power of the working man and woman, pensioners, and the middle-class.

A similar situation is likely to arise if probate is re-introduced and a "wealth" tax— an incentive disincentive— slapped on. It is disturbing that the A.L.P. has thrown a smoke screen around those tax proposals. They would have been left unpublicised if it were not for Mr. Walsh's faux pas. He has given the Liberals an issue to concentrate on and the Prime Minister, Mr. Fraser, has been quick to exploit the advantage.

In an exclusive interview yesterday, Mr. Fraser claimed the A.L.P.'s tax plans go a lot further than revealed by Mr. Walsh. He is concerned particularly by talk of a wealth tax.

Mr. Fraser said: "Mr. Bowen has said a wealth tax could raise \$1,500 million. It means adding up the assets of all Australian families — What is your house worth? What are the goods in that house worth? How much do you have in a savings bank or a building society?

You add all that together and then you get taxed on it every year. What happens to a farmer if he has a bad year and has no income? Does he have to sell a paddock to pay the tax? What happens to a small business man who has a bad year?

These measures would destroy initiative and enterprise. It's just another indication the Labor Party has no concern for all those things necessary to build a healthy economy"."

And under Labor's 20% inflation, they would soon become a target for Labor's "Wealth" Tax.

But it doesn't end there.

If you sell your house to buy another, even if your house has only increased by the value of inflation, then you would pay a Capital Gains Tax on that.

And what's finally left for your family after all the struggle would be a target for death duties.

"We're in the process of refining this proposal but I say quite bluntly that we won't retreat from it"—Mr. Hayden, referring to a Capital Gains Tax, speech to National Press Club, 15 March, 1979.

"Unequivocatingly, I have committed my organisation to a Capital Gains Tax . . . "—Mr. Hayden, interview in The Age, 31 December 1979.

These are but two of the many "blunt" and "unequivocal" commitments Mr. Hayden and other Labor spokesmen have made to taxes that could hit the savings of middle income earners. Now they seek to gloss over and delay their firm commitments to win your votes.

- 15. The commercial television station transmissions aforesaid are broadcast to and received by among other places all or substantially all households in the Electoral Division of Kingston aforesaid.
- 16. Each of the electoral advertisements and/or articles and/or broadcasts and/or notices set out in paragraph 9 (a) to (k) hereof contained untrue or incorrect statements intended or likely to mislead or improperly interfere with the electors of the Electoral Division of Kingston aforesaid in or in relation to the casting of their votes in

contravention of Section 161 (e) of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918 and each thereby constitute an illegal practise.

- 17. The aforesaid illegal practices and/or each of them were committed by the said Chapman and/ or with his knowledge and/or authority.
- 18. In the alternative the said illegal practices and/or each of them affected the result of the said election and/or the result of the said election was likely to have been affected thereby and it is just that the said Chapman should be declared not to be duly elected or that the election should be declared void.
- 19. Your petitioner prays that the following findings and declarations may be made in respect to the aforesaid matters.
 - (a) A finding that the said electoral advertisements and/or articles and/or broadcasts and/ or notices or each or any number of them constituted an illegal practise in contravention of Section 161(e) of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918.
 - (b) A finding that the said illegal practices or any number of them were committed by Chapman and/or with his knowledge and/or his authority.
 - (c) A declaration that Gun who was not returned as elected be duly elected pursuant to the power in Section 189 (i) (v) of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918.

The humble petition of Steve Cummings of 37 Blakesley Road, South Hurstville in the State of New South Wales, showeth as follows:-

- 1. Your Petitioner is a person who was qualified to vote at the election of one member of the House of Representatives for the Electoral Division of Barton in the State of New South Wales to serve in the Parliament of the Commonwealth which election was held on Saturday, 18th October 1980.
- 2. Your Petitioner says that James Mark Bradfield (hereinafter called Bradfield) was a candidate in the said election for the said Electoral Division of Barton. After distribution of preferences, the final woting figures were:-

Bradfield ... 32 739 Madgwick . 32,228 . .

Your Petitioner craves leave to refer to the full voting figures as if set forth herein. The said Rodney Neville Madgwick was the candidate endorsed by the Australian Labor Party for the Electorate of Barton.

- 3. On the 29th October 1980 the Divisional Returning Officer for the Electoral Division of Barton Terry Banner declared that the said Bradfield had been elected and certified on the writ the name of Bradfield and has returned the writ through the Commonwealth Electoral Officer for the State.
- 4. Your Petitioner further says that Bradfield on, prior to and after the 11th October 1980 and at all material times was a member of the Liberal Party of Australia and was selected and endorsed by the said Liberal Party as its candidate for the said Electoral Division of Barton.

5. And your Petitioner further says that on, prior to and after the 11th October 1980 one T. Eggleton was the Federal Director of the Liberal Party.

6. And your Petitioner further says that prior to the 11th October 1980 an agreement or understanding was made between the said Bradfield and the said Eggleton and other officers of the Liberal Party that the said T. Eggleton, either alone or in association with others, would prepare and issue advertising material for publication on behalf of, inter alia, Bradfield in the Sydney daily and weekly newspapers, the Sydney television stations and the Sydney radio stations for circulation and dissemination, inter alia, on behalf of the Bradfield in the said Electoral Division of Barton.

7. And your Petitioner further says:-

- (a) The written document known as The Australian Labor Party Platform at the time of the advertisement and at all earlier relevant times contained under the heading "Taxation" the following reference to a Capital Gains or Wealth Tax:—
 - "5. Enhance the equity of the tax system by taxing large accumulations of personal capital gain above a floor level that is reviewed regularly and takes into account the special circumstances of farmers, small businessmen and aged people, and excludes the normal holdings assembled over a lifetime by persons and family units."
- (b) In some speeches including his reply on the Budget Speech of 1979, Mr. Hayden the Parliamentary Leader of the Labor Party quantified the qualification in the final words of the provision in the Platform by speaking of a threshhold of \$200,000 worth of assets in respect of which no capital or wealth tax would be payable.
- (c) In July 1980 Mr Willis, the Labor parliamentary spokesman on economic affairs announced that a Labor government would not levy a Capital Tax until a commission of inquiry had been held into income and wealth distribution in Australia.
- (d) The Labor party's Federal election campaign was opened on the 1st October 1980 by an address by Mr. Hayden, Leader of the Opposition. On page 20 of the written address towards the end of his speech Mr. Hayden moved, to what he described as his proposed "new revenue raising measures". He said:—

"At this stage, I intend to deal only with the new revenue raising measures we will adopt in government.

We have three proposals to implement:

A resource rent, or excess profits tax, on major resource development;

The abolition of the present government's investment allowance under which machines are replacing jobs;

And the abolition of tax avoidance.

All three measures, in a full year, will raise a minimum of \$1,000m in revenue."

There was no reference to any Wealth or Capital Gains Tax.

(e) On the 8th October 1980, Mr. Hayden stated that a Labor government would not introduce a Capital Gains Tax, a Wealth Tax, or reintroduce Death and Gift Duties within its first three year term. This announcement was noted, inter alia, on the front page of the Sydney Morning Herald of Thursday, 9th October 1980. On the 9th October 1980 a statement was issued and widely distributed by the Office of the Leader of the Opposition dated 9th October 1980 which included the two following paragraphs:—

"I have stated plainly that there will be no wealth or capital taxes introduced in the three year term of a Labor government election on October 18th.

If proposals for any such measures are developed, they will be made public in time for the electors to pass judgment on them at the elections in three years time."

Your Petitioner craves leave to refer to the said documents as if they had been fully set forth herein.

- 8. Your Petitioner further says that prior to the 11th October 1980 the said T. Eggleton for and on behalf of the candidates endorsed by the Liberal Party including the said Bradfield prepared for publication and dissemination advertising material on the subject of "Labor's Wealth Tax".
- 9. Your Petitioner further says that on the authorisation of the said T. Eggleton on behalf of the said Liberal party candidates including the said Bradfield a full page advertisement entitled "Labor's 'Wealth' Tax Threatens the Unwealthy Family" was published inter alia in the following newspapers circulating extensively in the said Electoral Division of Barton:

Weekend Australian-11th/12th October, 1980

Sunday Telegraph—12th October, 1980

The Sun Herald-12th October, 1980

Each of the said advertisements bore the following heading which occupied at least one third of the page:—

"Labor's Wealth Tax Threatens the Unwealthy Family"

The bottom third of the advertisement was made up of a photograph of a number of domestic dwellings. In the middle part of each advertisement in significantly smaller lettering than the heading appeared the following statements:—

"Labor is committed to a new tax which would hit middle-income earners as violently as the wealthy.

This so-called "Wealth" Tax would steal the savings of people who, through superannuation, insurance policies and small investments have attempted to provide for their old age or their children

It would attack hundreds of thousands of Australian families who own modest homes, which have risen in value. And under Labor's 20% inflation, they would soon become a target for Labor's "Wealth" Tax.

But it doesn't end there.

If you sell your home to buy another, even if your house, has only increased by the value of inflation, then you would pay a Capital Gains Tax on that.

And what's finally left for your family after all the struggle would be a target for death duties.

Don't be taken in by the way Labor glosses over its commitment to new taxes. After all, where else would they get the money for all their schemes."

Your Petitioner craves leave to refer to all such advertisements when produced at the hearing.

10. Your Petitioner further says on the authority of the said T. Eggleton for and on behalf of inter alia the said Bradfield, advertisements on the subject of "Labor's Wealth Tax" between the 11th October 1980 and the 15th October 1980 were transmitted from and published by the Sydney television and radio stations, all of which are received by listeners and viewers in the Electoral Division of Barton. The text of the said advertisements were as follows:—

"Labor's Wealth Tax

Labor calls it the wealth tax, but it would really attack the unwealthy. Labor's so-called wealth tax would hit hundreds of thousands of Australian families who own modest homes which have risen in value.

Under Labor's 20% inflation they would become a target for Labor's wealth tax.

Labor's new taxes. Where else would they get the money for all their promises?

Lead on Liberal."

One such advertisement appeared on Channel 10 Sydney on 12th October 1980.

Your Petitioner craves leave to refer to the text and recordings of the said advertisements when produced at the hearing.

- 11. Your Petitioner further says that the said advertisements and each of them in paragraphs 9 and 10 contain untrue and incorrect statements. The said advertisements and each of them were intended to mislead the electors in the Electoral Division of Barton in or in relation to the casting of their votes. The said advertisements and each of them were likely to mislead the electors in the Electoral Division of Barton in or in relation to the casting of their votes.
- 12. Your Petitioner further says that in particular, without limiting the generality of the preceding paragraph, the said advertisements stated expressly or impliedly contrary to the truth, that the Labor party had at the time thereof a policy to introduce a wealth or capital gains tax within the life of the next parliament.
- 13. Your Petitioner further says that in particular, without limiting the generality of paragraph 11, the said advertisements states expressly or impliedly, contrary to the truth that there was a proposal by the Labor party to apply a capital gains tax or wealth tax to ordinary or modest domestic dwellings.
- 14. Your Petitioner further says that in particular, without limiting the generality of paragraph 11, the said advertisements states expressly or impliedly that, contrary to the truth, there was a Labor party taxation proposal which would steal the savings of people who through superannuation, insurance policies and small investments have attempted to provide for their old age or their children.
- 15. Your Petitioner further says that in particular, without limiting the generality of paragraph 11, the said advertisements stated or implied that the wealth tax would apply to hundreds of thousands of Australian families who owned modest homes.
- 16. Your Petitioner further says that the said advertisements were intended and likely to have and had a considerable influence upon the electors in the Electoral Division of Barton in the casting of their votes in the said election.
- 17. Your Petitioner further says that of the electors on the roll of the Electoral Division of Barton a substantial number own or are completing the purchase of the dwellings in which they live. The capital value of such private dwellings in the Electoral

Division of Barton have increased in value by at least 75% in the three years up to October 1980 of which the greater part occurred in the last year. Many electors in the Electoral Division of Barton have superannuation, insurance policies and small investments. Your Petitioner craves leave to refer to the full figures when produced as if they were fully set forth herein.

18. Your Petitioner says in the Sydney Morning Herald on Wednesday, 15th October 1980 on page 7 there appeared an article by Ross Gittens headed "Wealth and Tax". In that article the author discussed the terms of the advertisements referred to in paragraph 9. In the last three paragraphs of the article the said Ross Gittens stated in respect of the said advertisements:—

"The Labor party has every reason to object to the claims the Liberals have been making about its capital tax intentions. It is the worst example of dishonesty and distortion in the campaign so far."

Your Petitioner craves leave to refer to the said article when produced at the hearing as if set out in full herein. Your Petitioner accepts that such of the electors in the Electoral Division of Barton who read the said article in detail would have had their misleading impressions obtained from the advertisements corrected by the said article. Your Petitioner contends that having regard to the wide dissemination of the said advertisements referred to in paragraphs 9 and 10, the number of electors in the Electoral Division of Barton who read the said article in detail would have been very much less than those who read, saw or heard the original advertisements and that the effect of the said article would not have been to diminish to any significant extent the widespread effect of the said advertisements.

- 19. Your Petitioner further says that at no time did Bradfield disassociate himself from the said advertisements referred to in paragraphs 9 and 10. Bradfield was aware of the said advertisements and took no steps to have them discontinued.
- 20. Your Petitioner further says that following a complaint to the newspapers, television and radio stations by Mr David Coombe, National Secretary of the Australian Labor Party, the said T. Eggleton authorised and had published on behalf inter alia of Bradfield certain altered advertisements in certain newspapers between the 15th and 18th October 1980. The said new advertisement was headed "Mr. Hayden "wont retreat" from Labor's "Wealth' Tax that Threatens the Unwealthy". The said advertisements contained certain other written material and also contained the same photograph of domestic dwellings previously referred to. The petitioner craves leave to refer to all such advertisements and the speeches referred to therein when produced at the hearing.
- 21. Your Petitioner further says that the said full page advertisements appeared inter alia in the following newspapers:—

The Sydney Morning Herald—15 October 1980 The Sydney Morning Herald—16 October 1980

The Sydney Daily Telegraph—15 October 1980

The Australian-15 October 1980

The Australian-16 October 1980

The Sydney Sun-16 October 1980

22. Your Petitioner further says that the said advertisements and each of them referred to in paragraphs 20 and 21 hereof contain untrue and incorrect statements. The said advertisements and each of them were intended to mislead the electors in the Electoral Division of Barton in or in relation

to the casting of their votes. The said advertisements and each of them were likely to mislead the electors in the Electoral Division of Barton in or in relation to the casting of their votes. Further, the said advertisement did not correct the advertisements referred to in paragraphs 9 and 10 hereof but continued the misleading effect thereof.

- 23. Your Petitioner claims that by reason of the matters hereinbefore mentioned illegal practices were committed in connection with the said election contrary to Section 161 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act. Your Petitioner further claims, and the fact is, that the said illegal practices were committed by Birney and the said T. Eggleton and each of them.
- 24. Your Petitioner further says that the said illegal practices were committed with the knowledge and authority of the said James Mark Bradfield.
- 25. Further, or in the alternative, your Petitioner says that the result of the election was likely to be affected by the advertisements (being or constituting illegal practices) hereinbefore referred to and each of them within the meaning of Section 191 (3) of the Commonwealth Electoral Act.
- 26. Your Petitioner further says that it is just that the said Bradfield should be declared not to be duly elected and that his said election should be declared void

Your Petitioner therefore prays:-

- That it may be declared that the said James Mark Bradfield was not duly elected and that his election be declared void.
- That it may be declared that the said Rodney Neville Madgwick was duly elected and ought to have been returned.
- 3. In the alternative, that it may be ordered that a new election be held.
- 4. That the said James Mark Bradfield be ordered to pay the costs of this Petition.
- That such further or other order may be made as the nature of the case may require.
