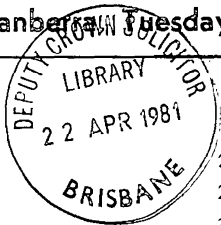

Copies of each week's Special issues are supplied with General issues which are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and sold at \$1.40 each plus postage or on subscription of \$79.00 (50 issues), \$41.00 (25 issues), or \$21.25 (12 issues). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Copy is to be confined to one side of the paper, sheets are to be of uniform size (preferably A4), numbered consecutively and fastened securely together. Dates, proper names and signatures particularly are to be shown clearly.

Copy will be returned unpublished if not submitted in accordance with these requirements.

**CLOSING TIMES.** Notices for publication should be lodged at the Gazette Office, unless otherwise specified, by the following times (except at holiday periods for which special advice of earlier closing times will be given).

*Contracts arranged:* Monday at 2 p.m. in the week before publication.

*All other notices:* Wednesday at 2 p.m. in the week before publication.

**PRIVATE NOTICES** are charged at the rate of \$5.00 for the first twenty words or less and 8c per word thereafter. Remittances may be forwarded with the copy for publication, otherwise payment is due immediately on presentation of invoice.

**SUBSCRIPTIONS** are payable in advance and are accepted for a maximum period of one year. All subscriptions are on a firm basis and refunds for cancellations will not be given. Rates include surface postage in Australia and overseas. Other carriage rates are available on application.

## OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

**Public Service** issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service and the Services of the Australian Postal Commission and Australian Telecommunications Commission. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and sold at \$2.30 each plus postage or on subscription of \$115.00 (50 issues), \$59.00 (25 issues), or \$30.25 (12 issues).

**Special issues** are made on urgent matters as required. Officers responsible for arranging the gazettal of urgent notices should refer to Gazette Office Circular of 18 April 1980 on this subject. Single copies are available on the day of issue and priced according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

**Periodic issues** contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Unclaimed deposits and moneys; Australian Public Service Conditions of Entry and Advancement; Appointments to the Australian Public Service; Holders of Import Licences and Tariff Quotas. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

**Index issues** contain references to a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and sold at 25c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

DRAWBACK NOTICE No. 1

#### NOTICE UNDER CUSTOMS REGULATION 131

IN pursuance of sub-regulation 131 (1) of the Customs Regulations, I, John Colinton Moore, Minister of State for Business and Consumer Affairs, hereby declare that the class of goods specified in the schedule to this notice is a class of goods to which regulation 131 of the Customs Regulations does not apply.

#### THE SCHEDULE

Imported paper which, in the form of—

- (a) off-cuts or trimmings resulting from a process or treatment to which the imported paper has been subjected; or
- (b) waste resulting from a process of manufacture in which the imported paper has been used, being a process the prime object of which is the production of goods which are not intended to be, and are not, exported,

**NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS UNDER PART XVI**

THE Minister of State for Business and Consumer Affairs, the Honourable J. C. Moore, in pursuance of Section 273b (2) of the *Customs Act 1901*, notifies that determinations have been made under Part XVI of that Act, as appended in the table hereto.

The Table specifies:

- (i) The tariff item normally applicable, except where a number of tariff items apply, in which case Var. (various) is stated;
- (ii) The kind(s) of goods to which the determination applies and, where applicable, the conditions specified in the determination;
- (iii) The date on or before which the goods shall be entered for home consumption, if such is a condition of the determination;
- (iv) The item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph, as the case may be, in Schedule 1, or the item in Schedule 2, to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered, which shall apply to the goods. Where 4 or more figures are shown it refers to Schedule 1 and where a 2 figure item is shown it is an item of Schedule 2;
- (v) The departmental file number (C).

All goods being machinery are, unless otherwise indicated, subject to the provisions of a direction (Separate Articles Direction) given under paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of Section 25 of the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered.

Manufacturers who consider that they manufacture goods suitably equivalent to the goods described in the Table may apply to the Department, quoting the relevant file number, for consideration of revocation of the determination.

Prospective importers of goods may lodge a by-law application on the approved form, quoting the relevant file number, in respect of the desired concession. This does not necessarily mean that all goods covered by that description will obtain similar concessions. Prospective applicants must establish that suitably equivalent goods are not reasonably available from Australian manufacturers.

THE Australian Telecommunications Commission, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Telecommunications Act 1975*, hereby makes the following determination—

1. The determination of rentals and charges made by the Commission on 21 August 1975\*, as varied to date†, is further varied as follows—

## CUSTOMS (IMPORT LICENSING) REGULATIONS

### EXCEPTION NOTICE No. M57

I, JOHN COLINTON MOORE, the Minister of State for Business and Consumer Affairs, in pursuance of the power conferred upon me under Regulation 17 of the Customs (Import Licensing) Regulations, do hereby:

- (a) revoke all subsisting exceptions made in pursuance of that regulation; and
- (b) exempt from the application of those regulations the goods specified in the Schedule to this Notice.

For the purpose of this Notice:

'Customs Tariff Act' means the *Custom Tariff Act 1966* as proposed to be altered

'Schedule 1' means Part II of Schedule 1 to the Customs Tariff Act

'Schedule 2' means Schedule 2 to the Customs Tariff Act

'Value for Duty' means the value for duty purposes as defined in the *Customs Act 1901*

'Developing Country' shall have the same meaning as 'developing country' in section 6 of the Customs Tariff Act.

1. Goods not otherwise excepted from those regulations when imported in the one consignment of which the total value for duty does not exceed \$100 and which are not entered to be used for any commercial purpose including sale, lease, hire or exchange.

3. Samples to which Item 35 in Schedule 2 applies.
4. Goods to which Items 29, 30, 31, 32, 33 or 36 in Schedule 2 applies.

  - (a) used, secondhand or disposals earthmoving or excavating vehicles, machinery or equipment (e.g. rock buggies, dumpers, graders, draglines, mechanical shovels, loaders, ditchers, excavators, scrapers, bulldozers) and parts thereof

  - (c) used, secondhand or disposals material handling equipment (e.g. cranes, forklift trucks) and parts thereof
  - (d) used, secondhand or disposals four-wheel drive vehicles having a gross vehicle weight of less than 10.16 tonnes, excluding public service type passenger vehicles, of a kind falling within Items 87.02, 87.03 or 87.04 in Schedule 1
  - (e) footwear of a kind falling within sub-item 64.01.9, 64.02.9, 64.03.9 or 64.04.9, parts for footwear falling within Item 64.05, in Schedule 1, other than hand made footwear with outer soles and uppers of leather having an FOB price not exceeding \$3.00 per pair the product of a developing country.
  - (f) passenger motor vehicles of a kind falling within sub-paragraph 87.02.119 in Schedule 1, but not including vehicles over five years of age
  - (g) double edged safety razor blades falling within sub-item 82.11.2 in Schedule 1, but not including those goods the produce or manufacture of and shipped direct to Australia from Papua/New Guinea or New Zealand.
  - (h) new battery operated trucks of a kind falling within sub-paragraph 87.07.111 in Schedule 1, but not including the following goods:
    - (i) trucks having a lifting capacity of 2501 kilograms or greater at a load centre of 600 mm;
    - (ii) die handling trucks, being trucks designated to handle dies and no other products;
    - (iii) narrow aisles trucks, being battery-operated trucks designed for the purpose of the trucks picking up and setting down their loads without turning in the aisles.
    - (iv) side loading trucks, being trucks designed to store and retrieve loads in aisles with a width less than the load length;
    - (v) goods the produce or manufacture of and shipped direct to Australia from Papua/New Guinea.
  - (i) New pallet trucks of a kind falling within paragraph 87.07.31 in Schedule 1, but not including those goods the produce or manufacture of and shipped direct to Australia from Papua/New Guinea.
  - (j) Stackers of a kind falling within sub-paragraph 84.22.991 of Schedule 1, but not including those goods the produce or manufacture of and shipped direct to Australia from Papua/New Guinea.

This Notice shall have effect from the first day of April 1981.

SCHEDULE 2

**By-law No. S2539**

I, the delegate of the Minister of State for Business and Consumer Affairs, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI of the *Customs Act 1901*, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-law set out in the Schedule hereto.

Unless the contrary intention appears, in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto a reference to:

- (a) an item;
- (b) a sub-item;
- (c) a paragraph; or
- (d) a sub-paragraph

shall be read as a reference to that item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph, as the case may be, in Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered.

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of the description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered, that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered, that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.

THE SCHEDULE

**By-law No. S2539**

Item 40  
Schedule 2

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S2539.
2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 1 April 1981.
3. Item 40 in Schedule 2 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1966*, as proposed to be altered applies to goods, other than goods the produce or manufacture of New Zealand, that are of a class or kind set out in the Table hereunder.

- (A) Goods the produce or manufacture of and shipped direct from a territory of Australia.

  - (D) Goods excepted from application of Customs (Import Licensing) Regulations by application of Item No. 1 in the Schedule to Exception Notice M57.
  - (E) Used, secondhand or disposals battery operated trucks falling within sub-paragraph 87.07.111.
  - (F) Used, secondhand or disposals pallet trucks falling within paragraph 87.07.31.
  - (G) New trucks falling within sub-paragraph 87.07.111 as follows:
    - (i) trucks having a lifting capacity of 2501 kilograms or greater at a load centre of 600 mm;
    - (ii) die handling trucks, being trucks designed to handle dies and no other products;
    - (iii) narrow aisles trucks, being battery operated trucks designed for the purpose of the trucks picking up and setting down their loads without turning in the aisles;
    - (iv) side loading trucks, being trucks designed to store and retrieve loads in aisles with a width less than the load length.
  - (H) Goods for which import licences in the number series 439101C to 439300H inclusive are issued.
4. Customs By-law No. S2534 published in *Gazette* No. S 216 of 24 September 1980 is hereby revoked.
