OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service and the Services of the Australian Postal Commission and Australian Telecommunications Commission. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and sold at \$2.20 each plus postage or on subscription of \$120.00 (50 issues), \$63.00 (25 issues), or \$32.00 (12 issues).

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Officers responsible for arranging the gazettal of urgent notices should refer to Gazette Office Circular of 18 April 1980 on this subject. Single copies are available on the day of issue and priced according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship, Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celeparats; Unclaimed deposits and moneys; Australian Public Service Conditions of Entry and Advancement; Appointments to the Australian Public Service; Holders of Import Licences and Tariff Quotas. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain references to a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and sold at 35c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

QUARANTINE PROCLAMATION No. 103A

Commonwealth of Australia ZELMAN COWEN Governor-General By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section 13 (1) of the Quarantine Act 1908, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may, by proclamation, appoint places on land to be quarantine stations for the performance of quarantine by animals:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable, for the purpose of preventing the introduction into, or spread in, Australia and the Cocos Islands of any disease affecting animals, to appoint a place on land on West Island in the Cocos Islands to be a quarantine station for the performance of quarantine by animals:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir Zelman Cowen, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby appoint the place on land on West Island in the Cocos Islands described in the Schedule to be a quarantine station for the performance of quarantine by animals.

SCHEDULE

Description of animal quarantine station in the Cocos Islands

The place on land on West Island, an island of the Cocos Islands, marked Lot 10 on plan number A1 742 in the Australian Survey Office, Perth, Western Australia, bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the high water mark of the Indian Ocean, bearing successively 331°57′11" for 2189.50 metres, 280°38′44" for 120.227 metres and 280°28′ for 1.5 metres from the aerodrome reference point at the intersection of the parallel 12°11' 19.1372" south latitude and the meridian 96°49' 49.7268" east longitude on the 1972 world geodetic system, thence eastwards bearing 100°27'45" for 122.61 metres, thence southwards bearing 187°32'48" for 198.73 metres, 188°52'17" for 605.90 metres; 168°19'23" for 68.91 metres and 188°28'14" for 46.98 metres, thence westwards bearing 277°28'20" for 122.46 metres to the high water mark of the Indian Ocean, and thence generally northwards along the high water mark of the Indian Ocean to the point of commencement.
