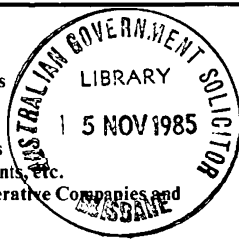

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GENERAL INFORMATION

General issues of the *Gazette* contain notices under the following headings: *Special information* (i.e. notices in connection with the Office of the Governor-General; the Federal Executive Council; the Parliament; the Judiciary; the Executive Government; and honours, decorations and awards); *Proclamations*; *Legislation* (Acts of Parliament assented to; Statutory Rules; By-laws; Ordinances; Regulations); *Government departments* (i.e. notices not placed in other categories, alphabetically listed under departments administering particular legislation or functions); *Defence Force appointments, promotions, etc.*; *Notices under the Co-operative Companies and Securities Scheme*; *Bankruptcy Act*; *Private notices*. Copies of each week's Special issues are supplied with General issues which are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and sold at \$3.60 each plus postage or on subscription of \$182.00 (50 issues), \$91.00 (25 issues), or \$44.00 (12 issues). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Notices are accepted for publication in the next available issue, unless otherwise specified.

Except where a standard form is used, all notices for publication must have a covering instruction setting out requirements. A typewritten original or good copies are to be provided, wherever possible double-spaced, with a margin surrounding the typewritten matter. Copy is to be confined to one side of the paper, sheets are to be of uniform size (preferably A4), numbered consecutively and fastened securely together. Dates, proper names and signatures particularly are to be shown clearly.

Copy will be returned unpublished if not submitted in accordance with these requirements.

CLOSING TIMES. Notices for publication should be lodged at the Gazette Office, unless otherwise specified, by the following times (except at holiday periods for which special advice of earlier closing times will be given).

General Gazette all copy: Monday at 2 p.m. in the week before publication.

PRIVATE NOTICES are charged at the rate of \$10.60 for the first twenty words or less and 18c per word thereafter. Remittances may be forwarded with the copy for publication, otherwise payment is due immediately on presentation of invoice.

SUBSCRIPTIONS are payable in advance and are accepted for a maximum period of one year. All subscriptions are on a firm basis and refunds for cancellations will not be given. Rates include surface postage in Australia and overseas. Other carriage rates are available on application.

OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service and the Services of the Australian Postal Commission, Australian Telecommunications Commission and Commonwealth Teaching Service. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and sold at \$7.25 each plus postage or on subscription of \$350.00 (50 issues), \$175.00 (25 issues) or \$84.00 (12 issues).

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Officers responsible for arranging the gazettal of urgent notices should refer to Gazette Office Circular of 18 April 1980 on this subject. Single copies are available on the day of issue and priced according to size. They are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Tariff concessions issues contain notices of tariff concessions proposed, granted or revoked in accordance with the provisions of Part XVA of the *Customs Act 1901*. These issues are published each Wednesday and are available on subscription only at \$100.00 for 2000 pages (approximately one year's issues) including surface postage.

FOI issues contain statements required to be made under section 9 of the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* by principal officers of departments and prescribed authorities about documents available for inspection and purchase. They also contain notices by Ministers of the addresses to which requests made in pursuance of the Freedom of Information Act may be sent or delivered in accordance with section 19 of the Act, and

any other notices required under the Act to be published in the *Gazette*. FOI issues are published at irregular intervals throughout the year. They are not available on subscription but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Unclaimed deposits and moneys; Australian Public Service Conditions of Entry and Advancement; Appointments to the Australian Public Service; Holders of Import Licences and Tariff Quotas. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Purchasing and Disposals issues of the *Gazette* provide information on Commonwealth purchases and disposals and other matters of general interest to persons buying from or selling to the Commonwealth. These issues are published each Wednesday and sold at \$1.60 plus postage or on subscription of \$92.60 including postage for 2500 pages.

Index issues contain references to a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues and all entries in General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and sold at 35c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise on subscription.

COST ALLOCATION REVIEW: SKYWEST AIRLINES

Air Fare Concessions for Blind Persons, Students and Children

IN accordance with the provisions of section 13 (8) of the IAFCA Act, Skywest Airlines Pty Ltd has provided the following details, current at October 1985, concerning air fare concessions made available on its services in respect of travel by blind persons, students and children.

BLIND PERSONS' FARES

- Available on all routes.
- If travelling with attendant, blind passenger and attendant both pay 50% of the published full fare.
- If travelling without an attendant, blind passenger must be accompanied by a guide dog and pay 50% of the published fare.

STUDENTS' FARES

- Must be under 26 years of age.
- 25% discount off the published full adult fare.
- Available on all routes except Telfer, Bunbury and Rottneet.
- Must be a full time student enrolled at Tertiary Institution, Teachers College, Technical School or Theological College.
- A current student I.D. card with photo is required to be sighted at time of ticket purchase.
- Retrospective claims cannot be made for students' fares

CHILDREN'S FARES

Children (under 3 years of age)

- No charge provided child is nursed by an adult.
- Limit of 1 child (under 3 years) per adult.
- Available on all routes.
- Children under 3 years occupying a seat travel at half the published full adult fare.

Children (3 years — under 15 years)

- 50% discount off the published full adult fare.
- available on all routes.
- Children 3 years and under 5 years must be accompanied by a person 12 years or older or a company attendant. The attendant will accompany the child at the applicable fare.
- Children 5 years and older may travel unaccompanied.
- Airline requires receiver and sender details for children under 5 accompanied by company escort and unaccompanied children under 12.

Children (15 years and under 19 years)

- 50% discount off the published full adult fare.
- Available on all routes.
- Must be enrolled as a full time day student at an approved High School or Secondary School.
- Such students are required to present a form or letter stamped by the school and signed by the principal indicating they are a full time day student.

- (1) sub-section 94 (4) of the code were modified or varied by inserting "and any other prospectus that differs from the registered prospectus in a manner approved by the Corporate Affairs Commission of the State of South Australia" after "that prospectus";
- (2) sub-section 96 (1) of the Code were modified or varied by inserting "a document that, but for the fact that it differs in a manner approved by the Corporate Affairs Commission of the State of South Australia is" before "a copy of the prospectus";
- (3) paragraphs 98 (l) (d), (e), (ea), (f), (h), (j), (k), (l), (m) and (n) of the Code were omitted;
- (4) sub-section 99 (1) and section 100 of the Code were modified or varied by including the following definition after the definition of "publish":
" 'registered prospectus' means a prospectus that, but for the fact that it differs in a manner approved by the Corporate Affairs Commission of the State of South Australia is a copy of a document registered under the Companies (South Australia) Code";
- (5) sub-section 103 (1) of the Code were modified or varied by inserting:

- (a) "a document that, but for the fact that it differs in a manner approved by the Corporate Affairs Commission of the State of South Australia, is" after "unless"; and

- (b) "and a copy of the prospectus has been lodged with the Corporate Affairs Commission of the State of South Australia" after "under this Code";
- (6) sub-section 103 (3) of the Code were modified or varied by inserting "a document that, but for the fact that it differs in a manner approved by the Corporate Affairs Commission of the State of South Australia, is" before "a copy of the prospectus"; and
- (7) section 103 of the Code were modified or varied by omitting sub-section (4) and substituting the following sub-section:
"(4) A company or a foreign company in respect of which a document referred to in sub-section (1) has been registered under this section shall cause a true copy of every document referred to in paragraph (2) (d) to be deposited, within 7 days after registration of the document referred to in sub-section (1), at the registered office of the company or foreign company in the State of South Australia and shall keep such copy for a period of at least 6 months after the registration of the document referred to in sub-section (1) for the inspection of any person without charge."
- (8) section 110 of the Code were varied or modified by inserting the following sub-section after sub-section (13):

"(14) Any listed corporation ("the company") which allots or issues, or any officer of the company who authorizes or permits the allotment or issue, of shares in Elders IXL Employee Share Incentive Plan ("the employee share plan") shall make readily available to all persons eligible to apply for shares under the employee share plan, at such place or places as the Corporate Affairs Commission of the State of South Australia approves, a copy of:—

- (a) the current rules of the employee share plan;
- (b) the latest accounts and group accounts of the company which are available to shareholders of the company; and
- (c) any other information which has been sent to shareholders of the company since dispatch of the latest accounts and group accounts of the company;

And Pursuant to sub-section 215C (2) of the *Companies Act 1981* of the Commonwealth and the corresponding laws of the participating States (collectively "the Code") Corporate Affairs Commission of South Australia ("the Delegate"), delegate of the National Companies and Securities Commission ("the Commission") hereby exempts the person named in Schedule A in the case referred to in Schedule B from compliance with sub-section 110 (4) of the Code.

DETERMINATIONS

I, JOHN CHARLES KERIN, Minister of State for Primary Industry, pursuant to section 86E of the *Quarantine Act 1908*, hereby—

- (a) revoke the determinations in the notices published in the *Gazette* pursuant to that section on 30 April 1985 and 1 October 1985;
- (b) subject to paragraph (c), determine that, in respect of a specified service relating to animals included in a class of animals specified in column 2 of an item in Part I of the Schedule, the amount, if any, specified in column 4 of that Part opposite to that item is the fee payable for the service;
- (c) determine that, where, in respect of a specified service relating to animals included in a class of animals specified in column 2 of an item in Part I of the Schedule—
 - (i) an amount is not specified in column 4 of that Part opposite to that item; or
 - (ii) the amount specified in column 3 of Part I of the Schedule opposite to that item exceeds the amount specified in column 4 of that Part opposite to that item,the amount specified in column 3 is the fee payable for the service;
- (d) determine that, in respect of a specified service relating to animals included in a class of animals specified in column 2 of an item in Part II of the Schedule, the amount specified in column 3 of that Part opposite to that item is the fee payable for the service; and
- (e) determine that—
 - (i) subject to sub-paragraph (ii), in respect of a specified service relating to animals that are not included in a class of animals specified in column 2 of Part I or II of the Schedule, an amount calculated by multiplying \$4.50 by the relevant number of charge periods is the fee payable for the service; and
 - (ii) where, in accordance with sub-paragraph (i), an amount of less than \$9 would be payable for a specified service, an amount of \$9 is the fee payable for the service.

2. In this notice, "day-old-chicks" means poultry that is not more than 72 hours old.

3. In this notice, "specified service" means a service in relation to a consignment within the meaning of regulation 86D or 86E of the Quarantine (Animals) Regulations.

4. A reference in paragraph 1 (c) to the amount in column 3 of Part I of the Schedule that is applicable to a class of animals specified in an item in column 2 of that Part is a reference to—

- (a) where a rate is specified in column 3 in that item, or, where 2 rates are so specified but only one of them is applicable to a consignment of animals—the amount calculated by multiplying the rate, or the applicable rate, as the case may be, by the number of animals in the consignment;
- (b) where 2 rates are specified in column 3 in that item and both of them are applicable to a consignment of animals—the amount calculated by multiplying each of those rates by the number of animals in the consignment to which each of the rates is applicable and adding the sum of the products;
- (c) where an amount is specified in column 3 in that item or where 2 or more amounts are so specified but only one of them is applicable to a consignment of animals—the amount or the applicable amount, as the case may be; or
- (d) where 2 or more amounts are specified in column 3 in that item and 2 or more of those amounts are applicable to a consignment of animals—the amount calculated by adding together the amounts that are applicable to the consignment.

5. A reference in paragraph 1 (e) to the relevant number of charge periods to be multiplied by an amount to calculate the fee payable for a specified service is a reference to the number of charge periods that, in accordance with paragraph 6 (a), (b) or (c), is applicable to the period comprising the total of—

- (a) the time during which a quarantine officer (animals) is occupied for the purpose of performing the service; and
- (b) the time during which the officer is reasonably occupied in proceeding to and from the place where that service is to be performed.

6. For the purposes of clause 5, where the period referred to in that clause—

- (a) is less than 15 minutes—one charge period is applicable to that period;
- (b) is a period of minutes the number of which, when divided by 15, yields a whole number—the number of charge periods that is the same as the number so yielded is applicable to that period; or
- (c) is a period of minutes the number of which, when divided by 15, yields a whole number and a fraction—the number of charge periods that is one more than the whole number so yielded is applicable to that period.

Quarantine Act 1908

DETERMINATIONS

I, JOHN CHARLES KERIN, Minister of State for Primary Industry, pursuant to section 86E of the *Quarantine Act 1908*, hereby determine—

- (a) that, in respect of a specified service relating to animals included in a class of animals specified in an item or a sub-item in column 2 of Part I of the Schedule, the amount specified in column 3 of that Part opposite to that item or that sub-item, as the case may be, is the fee payable for the service;
- (b) that, in respect of a service specified in an item or a sub-item in column 2 of Part II of the Schedule, the amount specified in column 3 of that Part opposite to that item or that sub-item, as the case may be, is the fee payable for the service;
- (c) that, in respect of a service referred to in a provision of the Quarantine (Animals) Regulations as in force on 29 April 1985, being a service that is specified in column 2 of an item in Part III of the Schedule, the amount specified in column 3 of that Part opposite to that item is the fee payable for the service; and
- (d) that, in respect of a service referred to in a provision of the Quarantine (Plants) Regulations as in force on 29 April 1985, being a service that is specified in column 2 of an item in Part IV of the Schedule, the amount specified in column 3 of that Part opposite to that item is the fee payable for the service.

In this notice—

“day-old-chicks” means poultry that is not more than 72 hours old;

“specified service”, means a service performed by a veterinary officer or a quarantine officer (animals), other than a veterinary officer, under the supervision of a veterinary officer and—

- (a) includes a veterinary examination; but
- (b) does not include such a service with respect to an animal imported solely for exhibition purposes by the owner of any premises or travelling circus registered under sub-regulation 52 (1) of the Quarantine (Animals) Regulations as an “A” class zoological garden.

FISHERIES NOTICE No. 154

PROHIBITION RELATING TO THE TAKING OF PRAWNS OFF NORTHERN AUSTRALIA

I, JOHN CHARLES KERIN, the Minister of State for Primary Industry:

- (a) hereby revoke the instrument made in pursuance of sub-section 8 (1) of the *Fisheries Act 1952* and known as—
 - (i) Fisheries Notice No. 131, dated 15 November 1984 and published in *Gazette* No. S 486 on 19 November 1984; and
 - (ii) Fisheries Notice No. 131A, dated 28 March 1985 and published in *Gazette* No. S 117 on 4 April 1985;
- (b) in pursuance of paragraph 8 (1) (a) of the *Fisheries Act 1952*, hereby prohibit the taking of prawns (family Penaeidae)—
 - (i) from the area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 1, during the period commencing at 0200 hours Greenwich mean time on 15 December 1985 and finishing at 0200 hours Greenwich mean time on 7 April 1986;
 - (ii) from the area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 2, during the period commencing at 0200 hours Greenwich mean time on 1 December 1985 and finishing at 0200 hours Greenwich mean time on 7 April 1986;
 - (iii) from the area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 3; and
- (c) in pursuance of paragraph 8 (1) (e) of the *Fisheries Act 1952*, hereby prohibit persons from having in their possession or charge, in a boat in an area of proclaimed waters referred to in sub-paragraph (b) (i) or (b) (ii) during the period specified in that sub-paragraph, equipment for taking fish, being equipment of a kind specified in Schedule 4 unless that equipment is stowed and secured.
