PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of By His Excellency the Australia Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Governor-General Australia

I, SIR NINIAN MARTIN STEPHEN, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council and after consideration by the Federal Executive Council of a report by the Director of National Parks and Wildlife in accordance with subsection 7 (11) of the National Parks and Wildlife Conservation Act 1975, pursuant to sub-section 7 (2) of that Act and for the purposes of paragraph 7 (6) (a) and 7 (6) (c) of that Act, hereby:

- (a) declare the area constituted by the areas specified in the Schedule to be a park;
- (b) assign the name "Ningaloo Marine Park (Commonwealth Waters)" to that park;

- (c) specify the depth of 1000 metres below the surface of any land within the area so declared to be a park as the depth to which the subsoil beneath that land shall be taken within that park; and
- (d) specify the depth of 1000 metres below the sea-bed beneath any sea within the area so declared to be a park as the depth to which the subsoil beneath that sea-bed shall be taken to be within that park.

SCHEDULE

Description of areas*

1. (1) In clause 2:

"baseline" means the line determined, by Proclamation made pursuant to section 7 of the Seas and Submerged Lands Act 1973 and published in Gazette No. S 29 of 9 February 1983, to be the baseline from which the breadth of the territorial sea adjacent to the mainland of Australia is measured;

"nautical mile" means an international nautical mile, being a distance of 1852 metres;

"territorial sea" means the territorial sea of

- (2) All latitudes and longitudes referred to in clause 2 are latitudes and longitudes determined by reference to the Australian Geodetic Datum.
- (3) Where, for the purposes of clause 2, it is necessary to determine the position on the surface of the
 - Earth of a point, line or area by reference to the Australian Geodetic Datum: (a) that position shall be determined by reference
 - to a spheroid having its centre at the centre of the Earth and a major (equatorial) radius of 6,378,160 metres and a flattening of 100/29825 and by reference to the position of the Johnston Geodetic Station in the Northern Terri-
 - tory; and (b) the Johnston Geodetic Station shall be taken to be situated at Latitude 25°56'54.5515" South and at Longitude 133°12'30.0771" East and to have a ground level of 571.2 metres above the spheroid referred to in paragraph (a).
- 2. The specified areas are:
 - (a) the area bounded by an imaginary line:
 - (i) commencing at the point of Latitude 21°40'00" South, Longitude 114°00'00" East;
 - (ii) running thence south along the meridian of Longitude 114°00'00" East to its intersection by the parallel of Latitude 21°45'00" South:
 - (iii) thence west along that parallel to its intersection by the meridian of Longitude 113°55'00" East:
 - (iv) thence south along that meridian to its intersection by the line every point on which is three nautical miles seaward of the baseline;
 - (v) thence generally south-westerly along that line to its intersection by the parallel of Latitude
 - 21°55'00" South; (vi) thence west along that parallel to its intersection by the meridian of Longitude 113°46'51" East:
 - (vii) thence north-easterly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 21°47'00" South, Longitude 113°50'00" East; and
 - (viii) thence north-easterly along the geodesic to the point of commencement; and
 - (b) the area bounded by an imaginary line:
 - (i) commencing at the point of Latitude 21°59'41" South, Longitude 113°45'00" East;
 - (ii) running thence south along the meridian of Longitude 113°45'00" East to its intersection by the parallel of Latitude 22°05'00" South;

- (iii) thence east along that parallel to its intersection by the line every point on which is three nautical miles seaward of the baseline;
- (iv) thence generally south-westerly along that line to its intersection by the parallel of Latitude 22°15'00" South;
- (v) thence west along that parallel to its intersection by the meridian of Longitude 113°40'00"
- (vi) thence south along that meridian to its intersection by the line every point on which is three nautical miles seaward of the baseline;
- (vii) thence generally south-westerly, southerly, south-easterly, southerly and south-westerly along that line to its intersection by the parallel of Latitude 23°34'00" South;
- (viii) thence west along that parallel to its intersection by the meridian of Longitude 113°34'00"
- (ix) thence north along that meridian to its intersection by the parallel of Latitude 23°06'00" South:
- (x) thence north-easterly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 22°57'00" South, Longitude 113°37'00" East;
- (xi) thence north-westerly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 22°40'00" South, Longitude 113°29'00" East; and
- (xii) thence north-easterly along the geodesic to the point of commencement. * Offshore waters, continental shelf; North West Cape Re-



- (10) that this approval will terminate on the thirty-first day of May 1988 or on such earlier date as the Minister determines in accordance with condition 11;
- (11) upon any failure to comply with any or all of the foregoing conditions the Minister or his Delegate under the said Ordinance may give written notice requiring the Applicant to show cause within a period of fourteen days why this approval should not be revoked. At the expiration of this period the Minister or his Delegate may revoke the approval.

CUSTOMS ACT 1901

CUSTOMS TARIFF ACT 1982

BY-LAWS NO. 8740012, 8740013 and 8740014.

I, Colin F. Vassarotti, delegate of the Comptroller-General of Customs for the purposes of section 271 of the Customs Act 1901, hereby make the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

In a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto -

'security' means that security shall be given to and to the satisfaction of the Collector and that the giving of such security is a condition subject to which that by-law item applies to the goods or the class or kind of goods so conditioned.

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of that description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Schedule 3 to the Customs Tariff Act 1982, that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Schedule 3 to the Customs Tariff Act 1982, that applies to those goods to which that reference in that by-law applies.

For the purposes of these by-laws, 'the Customs Tariff Act 1982' shall mean the Customs Tariff Act 1982, as amended from time to time.

THE SCHEDULE

BY-LAW NO. 8740012

Item 15 Part I of Schedule 4

- This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. 8740012
- 2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 1 July 1987.
- 3. Item 15 in Part I of Schedule 4 to the Customs Tariff Act 1982 applies, subject to the next succeeding paragraphs, to goods that are specified in Column 1 of a Part of the Table hereunder and subject to such provisos (being conditions, qualifications, exceptions or exclusions), if any, as are set out in Column 2 of that Part and opposite those goods.
- 4. Goods to which this by-law applies shall be imported by an arriving person, that is to say a person who is -
 - (a) a passenger arriving in Australia from overseas; or
 - (b) a member of the crew of a ship or aircraft arriving from overseas, being a person who -
 - (i) is ordinarily domiciled in Australia; and
 - (ii) has not availed himself or herself of the concessions accorded under any of the provisions of this by-law in the 12 month period commencing on the first day of the year in which the goods are imported.
- Subject to the next succeeding paragraph, Parts I and II of the Table hereunder apply in relation to goods that -
 - (a) are personal goods;
 - (b) are non-commercial goods; and
 - (c) except for the goods specified in paragraph 6(4), accompany the arriving person.

2 Customs Tariff Act 1982

- 6. In this by-law:
 - the expression 'overseas' has the same meaning as 'parts beyond the seas' as defined in section 4 of the Customs Act 1901.
 - (2) 'personal goods' means goods that -
 - (a) are the arriving person's property or, for the purposes of clause 4 of Part I of the lable hereunder, are owned by the migrant; and
 - (b) except in respect to goods specified in Part II of the Table hereunder, are suitable and are intended for the arriving person's own use.
 - (3) 'non-commercial goods' means goods that -
 - (a) are not intended to be used by the arriving person for any commercial purpose, including sale, lease, hire or exchange; and
 - (b) are not goods that have been imported in such a quantity that, having regard to their nature or durability, that quantity represents a commercial quantity.
 - (4) the following goods are specified for the purposes of paragraph 5(c) -
 - (a) goods specified in clauses (2), (3), (4), (5) or (8) of Part I of the Table hereunder; or
 - (b) goods brought to Australia by migrants.
 - (5) in the calculation of the weight of tobacco products, 250 cigarettes are to be taken to equal 250 grams weight.
 - (6) 'family' means a husband, wife, and, if any, their child who is, or children who are, aged less than 18 years.
 - (7) 'used' in relation to the expression "personally owned and used" means available for use by the arriving person on a continuing basis in each country in which that person was residing on a long term basis.
 - 8) 'use' or 'used', for the purposes of clause 4 of Part I of the Table hereunder means use or used for the purpose of motoring and available for such use by a person in relation to which that expression is used, or a member of that person's family, in any place in which that person, or a member of that person's family, and the vehicle imported into Australia were located.
