**OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE**

## ARRANGEMENT IN RELATION TO THE TUNA FISHERY BETWEEN THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA AND THE STATE OF QUEENSLAND

AN ARRANGEMENT entered into between the Commonwealth of Australia of the one part ("the Commonwealth") and the State of Queensland ("the State") of the other part.

### WHEREAS:

- (a) paragraph 12H (4) (a) of the *Fisheries Act 1952* of the Parliament of the Commonwealth, ("the Act"), provides that the Commonwealth may make an Arrangement with a State with respect to a particular fishery in waters adjacent to the State, not being a fishery to which an Arrangement under sub-section 12H (1) applies, that the fishery (being a fishery wholly or partly in the coastal waters of the State) is to be managed in accordance with the law of the Commonwealth;
- (b) no Arrangement has been entered into under sub-section 12H (1) of the Act with respect to the fishery for which this Arrangement provides ("the fishery");
- (c) under sub-section 12J (1) of the Act an Arrangement under, inter alia, paragraph 12H (4) (a) shall be made by an instrument in writing approved by the Governor-General and the Governor or Governors of the State or States concerned;

2. The fishery is to be managed in accordance with the law of the Commonwealth.
3. This Arrangement shall, upon being executed on behalf of the Commonwealth and of the State and upon being approved by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth and the Governor of the State, take effect in accordance with both the Act and the State Act.

    - (vi) thence south along that meridian to its intersection with the parallel of Latitude 13° South;
    - (vii) thence southerly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 15° South, Longitude 146° East;
    - (viii) thence southerly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 17°30' South, Longitude 147° East;
    - (ix) thence south-easterly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 21° South, Longitude 152°55' East;
    - (x) thence southerly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 24°30' South, Longitude 154° East;
    - (xi) thence south along the meridian of Longitude 154° East to its intersection with the parallel of Latitude 28°10' South;
    - (xii) thence west along that parallel to its intersection with the eastern shore of Australia; and
    - (xiii) thence generally northerly along that shore to the point of commencement; and

    - (i) commencing at the intersection of the southern shore of the Gulf of Carpentaria with the meridian of Longitude 138° East;
    - (ii) running thence north along that meridian to its intersection with the line, every point on which is 25 nautical miles seaward of the nearest point on the baseline from which the coastal waters of Queensland are measured;
    - (iii) thence easterly and northerly along that line to its intersection with the parallel of Latitude 10°48' South;

- (iv) thence east along that parallel to its intersection with the western shore of Cape York Peninsula; and
  - (v) thence southerly and westerly along the shore of the Gulf of Carpentaria to the point of commencement;

- (d) paragraph 24H (2) (b) of the *Fisheries Act 1959* of the Parliament of Tasmania, ("the State Act"), empowers the State, in accordance with section 12J of the Act, to enter into an arrangement referred to in sub-section 12H (4) of the Act, with respect to a particular fishery in waters adjacent to the State (being a fishery other than one to which an arrangement under sub-section 24 (H) (1) of the State Act applies) that, in the case of a fishery wholly or partly in waters on the seaward side of the coastal waters of the State, the fishery is to be managed in accordance with the law of Tasmania; and
- (e) both the Commonwealth and the State are desirous of exercising their powers to conclude an Arrangement in relation to the fishery.

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the provisions of the Act and the State Act and of all other powers so enabling, it is mutually arranged as follows:

1. The fishery to which this Arrangement applies is the fishery in the area of waters adjacent to the State described in clause 3—
  - (a) for crustaceans of the family Palinuridae (commonly known as rock lobsters), with the use of any kind of equipment for taking fish or by diving (with or without the use of mechanical or self-contained underwater breathing apparatus) and collection by hand or with the use of an implement held in the hand; and
  - (b) for all species of fish of the Superclass Pisces other than—
    - (i) such of the species within the family Scombridae (commonly known as tuna and tuna-like fish) as are not of the genera *Scomberomorus* and *Scomber*; and



- (ii) the species *Arripis trutta* (commonly known as Australian salmon),

with the use of a boat licensed under a law of Tasmania to take rock lobsters and equipment for taking fish used from such a boat and consisting of—

- (iii) demersal gillnet of which the total headline length does not exceed 150 metres;
- (iv) trolling lines;
- (v) not more than two fish traps; or
- (vi) one demersal or pelagic long line not exceeding 1,000 metres in length to which not more than 200 snoods and hooks are attached or are capable of being attached.

2. The fishery is to be managed in accordance with the law of Tasmania.

3. The area of waters referred to in clause 1 is that bounded by a line—

- (a) commencing at the point of Latitude 40° South, Longitude 140°57.9' East;
- (b) running thence south along the meridian of Longitude 140°57.9' East to its intersection with the outer limit of the Australian fishing zone;
- (c) thence generally southerly, easterly and northerly along that outer limit to its intersection with the parallel of Latitude 39°12' South;
- (d) thence west along that parallel to its intersection east of the Hogan Group of islands with the outer limit of coastal waters;
- (e) thence westerly along that outer limit and to the south of the parallel of Latitude 39°12' South, to the intersection, west of the Hogan Group of islands, of that outer limit with that parallel;
- (f) thence west along that parallel to its intersection east of the Moncoeur Group of islands with the outer limit of coastal waters;
- (g) thence westerly along that outer limit and to the south of the parallel of Latitude 39°12' South to the intersection, west of Wilson's Promontory, of that outer limit with that parallel;
- (h) thence west along that parallel to its intersection with the meridian of Longitude 143°40' East;
- (i) thence south along that meridian to its intersection with the parallel of Latitude 40° South; and
- (j) thence west along that parallel to the point of commencement.

4. This Arrangement shall, upon being executed on behalf of the Commonwealth and of the State and upon being approved by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth and the Governor of the State, take effect in accordance with both the Act and the State Act.

# ARRANGEMENT IN RELATION TO THE ABALONE FISHERY BETWEEN THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA AND THE STATE OF TASMANIA

AN ARRANGEMENT entered into between the Commonwealth of Australia of the one part ("the Commonwealth") and the State of Tasmania ("the State") of the other part.

## WHEREAS:

- (a) paragraph 12H (4) (b) of the *Fisheries Act 1952* of the Parliament of the Commonwealth, ("the Act"), provides that the Commonwealth may make an Arrangement with a State with respect to a particular fishery in waters adjacent to the State, not being a fishery to which an Arrangement under sub-section 12H (1) applies, that the fishery (being a fishery wholly or partly in waters on the seaward side of the coastal waters of the State) is to be managed in accordance with the law of the State;
- (b) no Arrangement has been entered into under sub-section 12H (1) of the Act with respect to the fishery for which this Arrangement provides ("the fishery");
- (c) under sub-section 12J (1) of the Act an Arrangement under, inter alia, paragraph 12H (4) (b) shall be made by an instrument in writing approved by the Governor-General and the Governor or Governors of the State or States concerned;
- (d) paragraph 24H (2) (b) of the *Fisheries Act 1959* of the Parliament of Tasmania, ("the State Act"), empowers the State, in accordance with section 12J of the Act, to enter into an arrangement referred to in sub-section 12H (4) of the Act, with respect to a particular fishery in waters adjacent to the State (being a fishery other than one to which an arrangement under sub-section 24H (1) of the State Act applies) that, in the case of a fishery wholly or partly in waters on the seaward side of the coastal waters of the State, the fishery is to be managed in accordance with the law of Tasmania; and
- (e) both the Commonwealth and the State are desirous of exercising their powers to conclude an Arrangement in relation to the fishery.

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the provisions of the Act and the State Act and of all other powers so enabling, it is mutually arranged as follows:

1. The fishery to which this Arrangement applies is the fishery in the area of waters adjacent to the State described in clause 3 for molluscs of the family *Haliotidae* (commonly known as abalone) by diving (with or without the use of mechanical or self-contained underwater breathing apparatus) and collection by hand or with the use of an implement held in the hand.
2. The fishery is to be managed in accordance with the law of Tasmania.

3. The area of waters referred to in clause 1 is that bounded by a line—
- (a) commencing at the point of Latitude 40° South, Longitude 140°57.9' East;
  - (b) running thence south along the meridian of Longitude 140°57.9' East to its intersection with the outer limit of the Australian fishing zone;
  - (c) thence generally southerly, easterly and northerly along that outer limit to its intersection with the parallel of Latitude 39°12' South;
  - (d) thence west along that parallel to its intersection east of the Hogan Group of islands with the outer limit of coastal waters;
  - (e) thence westerly along that outer limit and to the south of the parallel of Latitude 39°12' South, to the intersection, west of the Hogan Group of islands, of that outer limit with that parallel;
  - (f) thence west along that parallel to its intersection east of the Moncoeur Group of islands with the outer limit of coastal waters;
  - (g) thence westerly along that outer limit and to the south of the parallel of Latitude 39°12' South to the intersection, west of Wilson's Promontory, of that outer limit with that parallel;
  - (h) thence west along that parallel to its intersection with the meridian of Longitude 143°40' East;





WHEREAS by section 57 of the Constitution it is provided that if the House of Representatives passes any proposed law, and the Senate rejects or fails to pass it, or passes it with amendments to which the House of Representatives will not agree, and if after an interval of three months the House of Representatives, in the same or the next session, again passes the proposed law with or without any amendments which have been made, suggested, or agreed to by the Senate and the Senate rejects or fails to pass it, or passes it with amendments to which the House of Representatives will not agree, the Governor-General may dissolve the Senate and the House of Representatives simultaneously:

AND WHEREAS the conditions upon which the Governor-General is empowered by that section of the Constitution to dissolve the Senate and House of Representatives simultaneously have been fulfilled in respect of the proposed law intituled *Australia Card Bill 1986*:

NOW THEREFORE I, SIR NINIAN MARTIN STEPHEN, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my proclamation dissolve the Senate and the House of Representatives at 5.00 o'clock in the afternoon on Friday, 5 June 1987.
