*Brief particulars of terms and reasons:* Determination of the following formula for setting economy air fares over routes operated with F27 and F28 aircraft by East-West Airlines (EWA), with effect from 23 September 1987:

Fare (\$) = A + BX + CX<sup>2</sup> + DX<sup>3</sup> where:

A is the flag-fall (value 40.55)

B, C, D are the distance coefficients

(values B = 204.16; C = -35.22; D = 3.68)

X is the journey distance expressed in thousands of kilometres.

For multi-stage journeys the distance rate for kilometres in excess of 2500, where applicable, will be calculated at 9.674 cents per kilometre.

The formula applies to all routes except Sydney/Norfolk Is. where, because of the particular operating characteristics, the Committee determined a one-way economy fare of \$310.00.

The determination represents an average increase of 8.0% in EWA's economy fares.

Estimates submitted by EWA for the financial year ending 30 June 1988, indicated that EWA was likely to incur significant increases in operating costs generally, the effect of which would be ameliorated by anticipated increased levels of activity, mainly through the introduction of two additional F28 jet aircraft.

Arising from its validation process, the Committee made some adjustments to specific cost items and, in addition, made both negative and positive adjustments where the airline's levels of efficiency varied from those assessed by the IAFC. In addition, the Committee gave EWA notice that it expected in the future an improvement in the provision of data as requested by the IAFC.

The Committee concluded that a fare increase at the level requested by EWA was justified taking account of all the circumstances.

## STATEMENT UNDER SECTION 106AA

ON the 14th day of November 1986, I, NEAL BLEWETT, Minister of State for Community Services and Health, made a Determination under section 106 of the *Health Insurance Act 1973*, in respect of Dr Dane Kenneth Sutton of 143-145 George Street, Launceston, Tasmania.

On 15 December 1986 Dr Sutton requested a review of my Determination by the Medical Services Review Tribunal. However, by a letter dated 12 March 1987 Dr Sutton withdrew his request for review and the Tribunal affirmed my Determination accordingly on 9 June 1987.

**Particulars of Determination**

A copy of the Determination is at Attachment 'A'.

**Reasons for Determination**

The Determination was made in accordance with a report made under sections 104 and 105 of the *Health Insurance Act 1973* by the Medical Services Committee of Inquiry for the State of Tasmania, after its inquiry into the practice of Dr Sutton.

The Committee was of the opinion that, in respect of the patients under reference, certain of the services were excessive, as they were not reasonably necessary for the medical care of the patients concerned.

Accordingly, the Committee recommended that Dr Sutton be reprimanded, and that he be required to repay the amount of \$7072.55 to the Commonwealth of Australia. I accepted the findings and recommendations set out in the Committee's report.

**Comments**

The Government is seriously concerned by the practice of doctors like Dr Sutton who provide services which are not reasonably necessary for the adequate medical care of the patients concerned. Excessive services are a drain on public funds and every effort is being made to reduce the magnitude of the problem.

- (f) sub-section 106 (1) of the Act provides that the Minister may make a determination in writing in accordance with the said Committee's recommendations.

Now therefore I, Neal Blewett, Minister of State for Health, hereby determine that, in accordance with the said Committee's recommendations:

- (i) under paragraph 105 (2) (c) of the Act, the said Dane Kenneth Sutton be reprimanded and I do so reprimand him; and
- (ii) under paragraph 105 (2) (f) of the Act, the amount of Medicare benefits referred to in paragraph (c) herein be payable by the said Dane Kenneth Sutton in the case of an amount of Medicare benefits paid by the Commonwealth of Australia, to the Commonwealth of Australia being as specified hereunder:

**STANDARD FOR RADIOCOMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT USED IN THE CITIZEN BAND RADIO SERVICE AND OPERATING ON FREQUENCIES EXCEEDING 30 MHz****Part 1—Preliminary****Citation**

1. This standard may be cited as 'Ministerial Standard 250'.

**Commencement**

2. This standard shall come into operation on ..... 1987.

**Interpretation**

3. (1) In this standard unless the contrary intention appears—  
 'dB' means decibel;  
 'dBm' means decibels relative to one milliwatt;  
 'device' means a device to which this standard applies;  
 'emission' means radiation produced, or the production of radiation, by a radiocommunications transmitter;  
 'Hz' means hertz;  
 'kHz' means kilohertz;  
 'MHz' means megahertz;  
 'MS' means Ministerial Standard;  
 'out-of-band emission' means an emission which results from the modulation process on a frequency or frequencies outside the permitted bandwidth, but excluding spurious emissions;  
 'permitted bandwidth' means the 16 kHz band centred on the radiocommunications transmitter operating carrier frequency;  
 'radiation' means the outward flow of energy from any source by means of radio transmission;  
 'radio transmission' has the same meaning as in section 3 of the *Radiocommunications Act 1983*;  
 'radiocommunications transmitter' has the same meaning as in section 3 of the *Radiocommunications Act 1983*;  
 'receiver' has the same meaning as in section 3 of the *Radiocommunications Act 1983*;  
 'repeater station' means a radiocommunications transmitter and receiver established at a fixed location for the reception and retransmission of radio signals;  
 'spurious emission' means an emission on a frequency or frequencies which are outside the permitted bandwidth and the level of which may be reduced without affecting the corresponding transmission of information;  
 'standard device' means a device which complies with this standard;  
 'standard modulating signal (A)' means a sinusoidal input signal of 1000 Hz at a level to produce a frequency deviation of  $\pm 3$  kHz at the transmitter output;  
 'transmitter' means a radiocommunications transmitter;  
 'unwanted emission' means a spurious emission or an out-of-band emission;  
 'W' means Watts; and  
 '°C' means degrees Celsius.

**Devices to which this standard applies**

4. (1) Subject to sub-clause 4 (2) this standard applies to radiocommunications transmitters and receivers designed or intended for use in the Citizen Band Radio Service and operating on frequencies exceeding 30 MHz.  
 (2) This standard shall not apply to radiocommunications transmitters and receivers designed or intended for use as repeater stations in the Citizens Band Radio Service.  
 (3) Where a device to which this standard applies is designed or intended to be used in a service other than the Citizen Band Radio Service, that device is not to be taken to be sub-standard when it is operating in accordance with the standard applicable to that other service.

**Part 2—General**

5. (1) Subject to sub-clause 5 (3), there shall be displayed on the device:  
 (a) a compliance statement in the form set out in item 1 of the schedule:  
 (i) indicating that the device complies with this standard; and  
 (ii) citing the type approval number shown on the compliance statement certificate issued in respect of the device under section 12 of the *Radiocommunications Act 1983*; and  
 (b) its type or model designation which shall be distinctively different from that of imported equipment requiring modification before it complies with this standard.  
 (2) A statement or marking displayed on a device in accordance with sub-clause 5 (1) shall be clearly visible on the exterior surface of the device, indelible, tamper proof and affixed in such a manner as not to be removable except by destruction or defacing.

- (3) The requirement of paragraph 5 (1) (a) does not apply to a device unless the importer, manufacturer or supplier of the device, as the case may be, has been issued with a compliance statement certificate in respect of the device.

#### **Adjustment Mechanisms**

6. (1) For the purpose of this clause an 'adjustment mechanism' is a mechanism which enables the operation of a standard device to be altered so that the device no longer complies with this standard.  
(2) An adjustment mechanism shall be contained within the housing of a device and shall be accessible only with the use of tools such as screwdrivers and spanners.

#### **Modulation**

7. The transmitter shall only be capable of operation in the angle modulation mode.

#### **Nominal carrier frequency**

8. A transmitter shall, subject to clause 10, only be capable of operating on a channel designated in the first, third or fifth column of the table set out in item 2 of the schedule, being a channel whose nominal carrier frequency is specified opposite that channel.

#### **Conditions of operation**

9. The requirements of Parts 3 and 4 shall be met by a device when it operates at:  
(a) ambient temperatures of between 0°C and 55°C inclusive; and  
(b) primary supply voltages within  $\pm 10\%$  of that declared by the manufacturer.

#### **Part 3—Transmitter**

##### **Frequency Error**

10. The carrier frequency error of a transmitter shall not exceed  $\pm 3.0$  kHz.

##### **Channel Switching**

11. During channel switching operations emissions from a transmitter shall be inhibited until the operating carrier frequency has stabilized within the limit specified in clause 10.

##### **Carrier power**

12. The output carrier power of a transmitter shall not exceed 5 W.

##### **Modulation limiting**

13. (1) Under any modulation conditions the maximum frequency deviation of a transmitter shall not exceed  $\pm 5$  kHz.  
(2) With a sinusoidal signal in the frequency range 300 Hz to 3000 Hz inclusive applied to the transmitter input at a level required to establish standard modulating signal (A), a step increase of 20 dB in the level of the modulating signal shall not cause the transient or steady-state frequency deviation to exceed  $\pm 5$  kHz.

##### **Out-of-band emission suppression**

14. The power of each out-of-band emission, from a transmitter modulated with a 1 kHz sinusoidal signal at a level of 20 dB above that required to establish standard modulating signal (A), shall not exceed:
- (1) 17 dBm where the frequency of the emission differs from the operating carrier frequency by greater than 8 kHz but not greater than 16 kHz;
  - (2) 7 dBm where the frequency of the emission differs from the operating carrier frequency by greater than 16 kHz but not greater than 25 kHz;
  - (3) -9 dBm where the frequency of the emission differs from the operating carrier frequency by greater than 25 kHz but not greater than 50 kHz;
  - (4) -23 dBm where the frequency of the emission differs from the operating carrier frequency by greater than 50 kHz.

##### **Spurious emissions**

15. The power of each spurious emission from a transmitter shall not exceed -30 dBm.

#### **Part 4—Receiver**

##### **Conducted spurious radiation**

16. The power of each spurious radiation from a device which is a receiver shall not exceed -57 dBm.

**STAMP DUTIES (CONVEYANCES) DETERMINATION (NO.3)**

I, **WILLIAM JOHN HARRIS**, Delegate of the Minister of State for the Arts, Sport, the Environment, Tourism and Territories, pursuant to section 99(1) of the Taxation (Administration) Ordinance 1987, make the following determination:

**Citation**

1. This determination may be cited as the Stamp Duties (Conveyances) Determination 1987 (No.3).

**Revocation**

2. The Stamp Duties (Conveyances) Determination (No.2) 1987 made on 9th September, 1987 is hereby revoked.

**Interpretation**

3. In this determination:

"Crown Lease" means a lease of land granted by or in the name of the Commonwealth;

"Lease" means a lease of land other than a Crown Lease;

"the Ordinance" means the Stamp Duties and Taxes Ordinance 1987; and

"Schedule" means a Schedule to this determination.

**Use of Schedules**

4. A reference in this determination to an amount set out in a Schedule means an amount calculated by applying the formula appearing in Column 2 of the relevant Schedule, opposite and in relation to the appropriate range of value or consideration specified in Column 1 of that Schedule, to the value of the interest transferred or agreed to be transferred or to the consideration given or agreed to be given, as the case may be, in respect of:

Delegate's Initials

- (a) a transfer, or an agreement for a transfer, of an estate in fee simple;
- (b) a Crown lease, or a transfer or an agreement for a transfer of a Crown lease; or
- (c) a transfer or assignment, or an agreement for a transfer or an assignment of a lease, as the case may be.

### Conveyance of fee simple

5. The determined amount of stamp duty for the purposes of section 17(a) of the Ordinance for a transfer, or an agreement for a transfer, of an estate in fee simple is the amount set out in Schedule 1.

### Crown Lease or Transfer of Crown Lease

6. The determined amount of stamp duty for the purposes of section 17(b) of the Ordinance for a Crown lease, a transfer or an agreement for a transfer of a Crown Lease is the amount set out in Schedule 1.

### Lease of Land

7. The determined amount of stamp duty for the purposes of section 17(c) of the Ordinance for a lease is an amount calculated by multiplying the sum of \$0.35 by the number of amounts of \$100.00 (including a single remaining part of \$100.00) included in the amount of the consideration payable for the lease.

### Transfer of lease

8. The determined amount of stamp duty for the purposes of section 17(d) of the Ordinance for a transfer or an assignment, or an agreement for a transfer or assignment of a lease, is the amount set out in Schedule 2.



*Health Authority Ordinance 1985*

**HEALTH AUTHORITY (A.C.T.) DETERMINATION OF FEES AND CHARGES**

**No. 3 of 1987**

I, JOHN BROWN, Minister of State for the Arts, Sport, the Environment, Tourism and Territories, in pursuance of section 78 of the *Health Authority Ordinance 1985* hereby cancel the Determination dated the 10th day of July 1987 and published in *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* No. S165 of 14 July 1987 and make the following Determination:

1. (1) In this Determination, unless the contrary intention appears:

'A right to recover from any person, by way of compensation or damages' does not include a right to recover compensation pursuant to the *Criminal Injuries Compensation Ordinance 1983*;

'Australian resident' means a person who is ordinarily resident in Australia and includes a person domiciled in Australia but does not include a person who is:

- (a) the head of a diplomatic mission, or the head of a consular post, established in Australia;
- (b) a member of the staff of a diplomatic mission, or a member of the consular staff of a consular post, established in Australia;
- (c) a member of the family of a person referred to in paragraph (a) or (b), being a member who forms part of the household of that person;
- (d) employed on a full-time basis to perform domestic or other private services for a person referred to in paragraph (a), (b) or (c);

being a person who is not an Australian citizen or is not a person domiciled in Australia;

'Authority' means the Australian Capital Territory Health Authority;

'compensable patient', in relation to a hospital, means an in-patient of the hospital who, in the opinion of the Deputy General Manager, Hospital Services Division of the Authority, has, or may have, a right to recover from any person, by way of compensation or damages, the cost of hospital accommodation;

'compensable person' means a person:

- (a) (i) to whom a pathology service is provided at a hospital; or  
(ii) who is conveyed by means of an ambulance service to or from a hospital; and
  - (b) who, in the opinion of the Deputy General Manager, Hospital Services Division of the Authority, has, or may have, a right to recover from any person, by way of compensation or damages the cost of the service;
- 'day care patient' means a person other than a compensable patient or a non-eligible person who occupies a bed in a hospital for a period that does not include part of an overnight stay for the purpose of permitting the provision of professional attention to the person;

'extended-stay resident' means a person who has not attained the age of 16 years who has been admitted to a health services hostel for continuous or intermittent accommodation at the hostel during a specific period exceeding 28 days or indefinitely;

'extensive care patient' means a patient who requires extensive nursing care;

'extensive invasive diagnostic procedure' means a diagnostic procedure of more than 30 minutes duration that involves the insertion of an instrument into the body of the patient through cutaneous or mucous tissue or through a bodily orifice;

'extensive nursing care' means care of the type given in a nursing home to a person:

- (a) who, by reason of infirmity, or any illness, disease, incapacity or disability, is bedridden or virtually bedridden and is wholly or substantially dependent on nursing care; or
- (b) who is undergoing treatment for any illness, disease, incapacity or disability and, for the purposes of that treatment, is wholly or substantially dependent on nursing care;

'health services hostel' means a hostel conducted by the Authority as a health services hostel and includes Ward 10A of the premises known as the Woden Valley Hospital;

'hospital' means:

- (a) the premises known as the Royal Canberra Hospital, and
- (b) the premises known as the Woden Valley Hospital, other than Ward 10A.

'hospital patient' in relation to a hospital, means an in-patient of the hospital other than a private patient;

'medical practitioner' means a person registered as a medical practitioner under the *Medical Practitioners Registration Ordinance 1930*;

'multiple-bed room' means a room in which 2 or more beds are situated;

'non-eligible person' means:

- (a) a person who is not an Australian resident; or
- (b) a person in respect of whom, or a person included in a class of persons in respect of which, there is in force an order under sub-section 6 (2) of the *Health Insurance Act 1973*;

'non-inpatient' with respect to a hospital means a patient, other than an inpatient of the hospital who receives any examination(s) consultation(s) or treatment(s) or other service(s) from an individual functional unit of a Health Services facility;

'nursing-home type patient' means a nursing-home type patient for the purposes of the *Health Insurance Act 1973* but does not include a compensable patient or a non-eligible person;

'Ordinance' means the *Health Authority Ordinance 1985*;

'ordinary patient' means a patient other than an extensive care patient;

'outpatient service' means any examination(s) consultation(s) or treatment(s) or other service(s) provided to a non-inpatient or non-eligible person not being an inpatient of the hospital at a Health Services facility other than a Community Health Centre;

'pathology service' means a professional service in respect of which a fee is specified in an item in Part 7 of the Standard Medical Benefits Table, being an item that includes the symbol '(OP)' or the symbol '(HP)';

'person domiciled in Australia' means a person whose domicile is in Australia, other than a person in respect of whom the Minister for Health is satisfied that the person's permanent place of abode is outside Australia;

'physiotherapy service' means any treatment or other service provided to a compensable patient at a Community Health Centre conducted by the Authority and which falls within the definition of physiotherapy in the *Physiotherapists Registration Ordinance 1977*;

'private patient', in relation to a hospital, means an in-patient of the hospital who:

(a) has made an election to be treated as a private patient, and who has not revoked that election;  
or

(b) is accommodated in a single room in the hospital at his request;

'professional service' means a service that is a professional service within the meaning of the *Health Insurance Act 1973*;

'short-stay resident' means a person who has not attained the age of 16 years who has been admitted to a health services hostel for continuous or intermittent accommodation at the hostel during a specific period not exceeding 28 days;

'single room' means a room in which 1 bed is situated;

'standard medical benefits table' means the table of medical services set out in the Schedule to the Health Insurance (Variation of Fees and Medical Services) (No. 31) Regulations;

'standard patient', in relation to a hospital, means an in-patient of the hospital, other than:

(a) a day care patient; or

(b) a nursing-home type patient.

(2) For the purposes of this Determination a request by a patient shall, in relation to a patient who has not attained the age of 18 years, be read as including a request by a parent or guardian of the patient.

(3) For the purposes of the services listed at A, C, D, E and F of the Schedule to this Determination, the day on which a person commences to be accommodated in a hospital or an Authority nursing home, or a health services hostel as a patient and the day on which that person ceases to be so accommodated shall be counted together as one day.

(4) For the purposes of the services listed at A, B and C of the Schedule to this Determination, where a child whose age is less than 12 months and the mother of that child are both accommodated in a hospital, they shall be treated as one patient unless the child and the mother both receive treatment.

(5) (a) For the purposes of the service listed at E of the Schedule to this Determination where a person who has been admitted to a health services hostel is absent from the hostel for a period not exceeding 3 days the fees payable pursuant to the service listed at E, shall apply as if the person had been accommodated in the hostel during the whole of the period.

(b) For the purposes of sub-clause (5) (a) of this Determination the day on which the absence of a person from a hostel begins and the day on which he returns to the hostel shall be reckoned as one day.

(6) For the purposes of the service listed at I.3 of the Schedule to this Determination, where an ambulance vehicle is made available for the transport of a person, the service listed at I.1 of the Schedule to this Determination shall apply as if the place at which the event or function was the station referred to in the service listed at I.1.

2. The fee for the purposes of the service listed in Column 1 of the Schedule shall, subject to any description or limitations set out in Column 2 of the Schedule opposite to and in relation to that service, be the amount listed in Column 3 of the Schedule opposite to and in relation to that service.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (1) of section 31 of the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975* that, subject to sub-section (5) of that section, the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, declare an area specified in the Proclamation, being an area within the Great Barrier Reef Region, to be a part of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park and assign a name or other designation to that area:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (3) of that section that, subject to sub-section (4) of that section, the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, revoke a Proclamation made pursuant to sub-section (1) of that section:

AND WHEREAS the Governor-General made a Proclamation on 17 October 1979 which was published in the *Gazette* on 21 October 1979 in which he declared the area specified in that Proclamation, being an area within the Great Barrier Reef Region, to be part of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park and assigned to that area the name 'Great Barrier Reef Marine Park—Capricornia Section':

AND WHEREAS the Governor-General made a Proclamation on 11 October 1984 which was published in the *Gazette* on 15 October 1984 in which he declared the area specified in that Proclamation, being an area within the Great Barrier Reef Region, to be part of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park and assigned to that area the name 'Great Barrier Reef Marine Park—Capricorn Section':

AND WHEREAS it is desirable for the boundaries of the areas declared in those Proclamations to be altered and for the areas so declared to be included in another area:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (4) of section 31 of that Act that a Proclamation under sub-section (3) of that section by virtue of which any area in the Great Barrier Reef Region ceases to be within the Marine Park shall not be made except in accordance with a resolution passed by each House of the Parliament:

AND WHEREAS no area within the Great Barrier Reef Region ceases to be within the Marine Park by virtue of this Proclamation:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (5) of section 31 of that Act that the Governor-General shall not make a Proclamation under that section except after consideration by the Federal Executive Council of a report by the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority in relation to the matters dealt with by this Proclamation:

AND WHEREAS the Federal Executive Council has considered a report by the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority in relation to the matters dealt with by this Proclamation:

NOW THEREFORE I, SIR NINIAN MARTIN STEPHEN, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby—

- (a) revoke the Proclamation made on 17 October 1979 and published in the *Gazette* on 21 October 1979 which established the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park—Capricornia Section;
- (b) revoke the Proclamation made on 11 October 1984 and published in the *Gazette* on 15 October 1984 which established the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park—Capricorn Section;

- (c) declare so much of the area specified in the Schedule as is within the Great Barrier Reef Region to be a part of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park;
- (d) assign the name 'Great Barrier Reef Marine Park—Mackay/Capricorn Section' to the area so declared in paragraph (c);
- (e) specify the depth of 1000 metres below the sea-bed beneath any sea within the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park—Mackay/Capricorn Section as the depth below that sea-bed to which the sub-soil beneath that sea-bed shall be taken to be in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park;
- (f) specify the depth of 1000 metres below the surface of any land within the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park—Mackay/Capricorn Section as the depth below that surface to which the sub-soil beneath that land shall be taken to be in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park; and
- (g) specify the height of 915 metres above the surface of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park—Mackay/Capricorn Section as the height above that surface to which the airspace above those areas shall be taken to be in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park.

## SCHEDULE

### DESCRIPTION OF GREAT BARRIER REEF MARINE PARK—MACKAY/CAPRICORN SECTION

- (12) thence south-easterly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 21°03.75' South, Longitude 149°17' East; East;
- (13) thence southerly along the geodesic to the easternmost point of intersection of the parallel of Latitude 21°10.55' South by the coastline of Round Top Island at low-water;
- (14) thence south-easterly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 21°15' South, Longitude 149°20' East;
- (15) thence south-easterly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 21°23.69' South, Longitude 149°22' East;
- (16) thence west along the parallel of Latitude 21°23.69' South to its intersection by the coastline of the mainland at low-water, in the vicinity of Perpetua Point;
- (17) thence generally southerly along that coastline at low-water to its intersection by the parallel of Latitude 21°54.4' South, in the vicinity of Carmila Creek;
- (18) thence east along that parallel to its intersection by the meridian of Longitude 149°33' East;
- (19) thence south-easterly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 21°56.98' South, Longitude 149°34.53' East;
- (20) thence south-westerly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 21°59.36' South, Longitude 149°32.9' East;
- (21) thence south-easterly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 22°03.06' South, Longitude 149°35.35' East;
- (22) thence south-westerly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 22°07.84' South, Longitude 149°33.69' East;
- (23) thence south-easterly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 22°15' South, Longitude 149°38' East;

- (31) thence generally southerly along that 5 kilometre line to its intersection by the geodesic which passes through the point of Latitude 23°25.5' South, Longitude 150°54.5' East and through the southernmost point on Arch Rock at low-water;
- (32) thence north-easterly along that geodesic to the southernmost point on Arch Rock at low-water;
- (33) thence south-easterly along the geodesic to the intersection of the coastline of Curtis Island at low-water by the meridian of Longitude 151°03.21' East, in the vicinity of Cape Keppel;
- (34) thence generally easterly and southerly along that coastline of Curtis Island at low-water to its intersection by the parallel of Latitude 23°42.89' South, in the vicinity of Connor Bluff;
- (35) thence south-easterly along the geodesic to the intersection of the coastline of Facing Island at low-water by the meridian of Longitude 151°20' East, in the vicinity of North Point;
- (36) thence generally south-easterly and southerly along that coastline of Facing Island at low-water to its intersection by the parallel of Latitude 23°52.62' South, in the vicinity of Settlement Point;
- (37) thence north-easterly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 23°51' South, Longitude 151°27.5' East;
- (38) thence south-easterly along the geodesic to the point of Latitude 23°52.5' South, Longitude 151°33' East;
- (39) thence south along the meridian of Longitude 151°33' East to its intersection by the parallel of Latitude 23°56' South;
- (40) thence south-westerly along the geodesic to the intersection of the coastline of Hummock Hill Island at low-water by the meridian of Longitude 151°26.6' East, in the vicinity of Tiber Point;
- (41) thence generally south-easterly along that coastline of Hummock Hill Island at low-water to its intersection by the parallel of Latitude 24°02.13' South, in the vicinity of Norton Point;
- (42) thence north-easterly along the geodesic to the point of intersection of the coastline of the mainland at low-water by the parallel of Latitude 24°00.61' South, in the vicinity of Spit End;
- (43) thence generally northerly, easterly and south-easterly along that coastline at low-water to its intersection by the parallel of Latitude 24°01.45' South, in the vicinity of Pancake Point;

- (49) thence west along that parallel to its intersection by the coastline of the mainland at low-water;
- (50) thence generally south-easterly along that coastline at low-water to its intersection by the parallel of Latitude 24°30' South; and
- (51) thence east along that parallel of Latitude to the point of commencement.
