### Attorney-General

An arrangement made this 22nd day of February 1988 by the DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC PROSECUTIONS with the SECRETARY TO THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL'S DEPARTMENT

Whereas by section 32 of the Director of Public Prosecutions Act 1983, the Director of Public Prosecutions may make an arrangement with the Secretary to the Attorney-General's Department to perform or exercise in a State or Territory, in the name of the Director, subject to such conditions and restrictions as are specified in the arrangement, all or any of the Director's functions and powers under that Act.

Now it is hereby arranged as follows:

#### 1. Operation of Arrangement

- 1.1 This arrangement shall come into force on the date of this document and shall continue in force, subject to any variation under sub-clause 1.5, until terminated in accordance with sub-clause 1.6.
- 1.2 Subject to sub-clause 1.5, clause 3 of this arrangement applies solely to the States of South Australia and Tasmania and to the Northern Territory.
- 1.3 Subject to sub-clause 1.5, clause 4 of this arrangement applies solely to the States of New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, Western Australia, the Australian Capital Territory and the external Territories.
- 1.4 All former arrangements made pursuant to section 32 of the Director of Public Prosecutions Act are hereby terminated by mutual agreement.
- 1.5 This arrangement may be varied from time to time by further arrangement.
- 1.6 This arrangement may be terminated by mutual agreement or by either party giving the other party not less than one month's notice to that effect.

#### 2. Interpretation

- 2.1 In this arrangement, unless a contrary intention appears:
  - (a) words and expressions shall have the same meaning as in the Director of Public Prosecutions Act 1983;
  - (b) 'the Act' means the Director of Public Prosecutions Act 1983; and
  - (c) 'relevant person' means a person authorised under sub-section 55E (4) of the Judiciary Act 1903.

#### 3. Functions and Powers—Prosecutions Generally

3.1 Subject to sub-clauses 3.2 and 3.3 and clause 5, in a State or Territory referred to in sub-clause 1.2 a relevant person may perform all the functions and exercise all the powers of the Director under the Act other than the functions and powers conferred under the following provisions of the Act:

sub-section 5 (4)
paragraphs 6 (1) (j) and (m)
sub-sections 9 (3), 9 (5), 9 (6), and 9 (7)
sections 11, 12 and 13
sub-section 27 (2)
sections 28, 31, 32.

- 3.2 A relevant person may exercise the power under subsection 9 (4) of the Act subject to the following conditions and restrictions:
  - (a) Subject to sub-clause 3.2 (b) or 3.2 (c), where a relevant person is of the opinion that the prosecution of a person under commitment or who has been indicted in respect of a Commonwealth offence should be discontinued, the matter is to be referred for the determination of the Director or the First Deputy Director.

- (b) Subject to sub-clause 3.2 (c), where an application is communicated to a relevant person, by or on behalf of a person under commitment or who has been indicted in respect of a Commonwealth offence, that the prosecution be discontinued, the application is to be referred by the relevant person for the determination of the Director or the First Deputy Director unless:
  - (i) in the opinion of the relevant person there is insufficient time to consult with the Director or First Deputy Director; and
  - (ii) the relevant person considers that the application should be refused.

#### (c) Where:

- (i) a committal has been obtained on a Commonwealth charge and on a State charge which substantially covers the same factual situation as the Commonwealth charge;
- (ii) the State charge is determined before the Commonwealth charge; and
- (iii) having regard to the disposition of the Statecharge, including any penalty imposed, the relevant person is of the opinion that to proceed with the Commonwealth charge would not be justified,

the relevant person may make the decision to discontinue the prosecution on the Commonwealth charge without reference to the Director or the First Deputy Director.

- 3.3 Where the power under sub-section 9 (4) of the Act is exercised by a relevant person in accordance with sub-clauses 3.2 (b) or (c) the relevant person shall provide to the Director a short written report recording the decision taken.
- 3.4 Nothing in this arrangement enables a relevant person to authorise a person to sign indictments for and on behalf of the Director pursuant to sub-section 9 (2) of the Act.
- 4. Functions and Powers—Prosecutions under the Quarantine Act
- 4.1 Subject to clause 5, in a State or Territory referred to in sub-clause 1.3, a relevant person may perform the functions of the Director to institute and/or carry on proceedings for the summary conviction of persons for offences against the Quarantine Act 1908, in all matters connected with a Customs prosecution as defined in section 244 of the Customs Act 1901 instituted in a court of summary jurisdiction.
- 4.2 Subject to clause 5, a relevant person who performs a function of the Director pursuant to sub-clause 4.1 may exercise all powers of the Director necessary or convenient for the proper performance of that function other than the powers conferred under the following provisions of the Act:

sub-section 5 (4) sub-sections 9 (5), 9 (6) and 9 (7) sections 11, 12 and 13 sub-section 27 (2) sections 28, 31 and 32.

#### 5. Conditions and Restrictions

- 5.1 A relevant person acting pursuant to clause 3 shall not perform a function under paragraph 6 (1) (g) or (h) of the Act or exercise a power under sub-section 9 (9) or (10) of the Act without first informing the Director of the intended performance or exercise and he shall keep the Director informed as to the performance of that function or the exercise of that power.
- 5.2 A relevant person carrying on a prosecution in the name of the Director pursuant to clause 3 shall not exercise or cause to be exercised a right of appeal without first obtaining the approval of the Director or a person designated by him.

- 5.3 A relevant person who has instituted or is carrying on proceedings pursuant to clause 4 shall inform the Director if for any reason these proceedings cease to be connected with actual or proposed summary proceedings under the Customs Act and the Director may thereupon take such action as he considers appropriate notwithstanding any provision of this arrangement.
- 5.4 All functions performed or powers exercised pursuant to this arrangement shall be performed or exercised:
  - (a) in the name of the Director;
  - (b) subject to any directions given under paragraph 11 (1) (b) of the Act; and
  - (c) consistently with the guidelines for the making of decisions in the prosecution process set out in a paper entitled 'Prosecution Policy of the Commonwealth: Guidelines for the Making of Decisions in the Prosecution Process' presented to Parliament in February 1986 by the Attorney-General or, if guidelines are issued in substitution for those set out in that paper, consistently with those later guidelines.
- 5.5 Where, in relation to the performance of a function or the exercise of a power by a relevant person pursuant to this arrangement, a question arises whether a function or power of the Director, not being one which may be performed or exercised by a relevant person pursuant to this arrangement, should be exercised, the relevant person concerned shall forthwith raise the question with the Director for his decision.

### COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA HEALTH INSURANCE ACT 1973 DETERMINATION UNDER SUB-SECTION 3C(1)

- I, NEAL BLEWETT, Minister of State for Community Services and Health, pursuant to sub-section 3C(1) of the <u>Health Insurance Act 1973</u> ("The Act"), HEREBY DETERMINE -
- (1) that a health service specified in Column 2 of the Schedule to this determination, not being a service specified in the table of general medical services, shall be treated (in the circumstances specified in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this determination) for the purposes of -
  - (a) Section 4 of the National Health Act 1953;
  - (b) sub-sections 3(5) and 3(6) and sections 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, 19(6) and 20(A) of the Act;
  - (c) regulation 2ADA of the Health Insurance Regulations, as amended; and
  - (d) Rule 9 of the Rules for the interpretation of the table of general medical services prescribed in the Health Insurance (Variation of Fees and Medical Services) (No. 47) Regulations, as amended,

as if that health service were a medical service and there were an item in the table of general medical services that -

(a) related to that health service; and

- (b) specified, in respect of that health service, the fee for each State specified in the column opposite to that health service;
- (2) that a health service specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this determination shall be treated as described in paragraph 1 above when and only when it is rendered at an establishment included in the following list:-

### Attendance at less than four sessions in each week

- 3. Where:
  - (a) the Authority accepts a child for enrolment for less than four sessions in any week; and
  - (b) the child does not have any siblings who attend or are to attend preschool at the same time,

the fee payable in respect of the attendance of that child shall be the amount calculated in accordance with the following formula:

 $F \times S/4$ 

Where F = the fee which would, but for this clause, be payable for that child for attendance at a preschool; and

S = the average number of sessions to be attended by the child at a preschool during each week (rounded upwards to the next whole number).

1. This Order may be cited as the Rifle Clubs (Firearms) Order.

#### **Definitions**

2. In this Order:

'club' means a rifle club affiliated with the National Rifle Association of Australia; and

'member' means a member of a club.

### General

3. Except to the extent of its explicit provisions, this Order is not intended to affect the rules and safety procedures of clubs.

### Application

- 4. (1) This Order applies in relation to firearms owned by members, but only to a maximum of four firearms for each member.
- (2) This Order does not apply to automatic or semi-automatic firearms.

### Licencing requirement not to apply

- 5. It shall not be necessary for a member under or by reason of any law of a State or Territory to obtain or have any licence or permission for:
  - (a) the use of a firearm on a rifle range during a meeting organised by a club at that range for the purpose of competition or practice;
  - (b) the carriage of a firearm so used to and from the rifle range and its place of storage; and
  - (c) the possession of such firearm, provided it is kept in secure storage.
