DECLARATION UNDER SUB-SECTION 9 (2)

I, LIONEL FROST BOWEN, Attorney-General of Australia, hereby declare pursuant to sub-section 9 (2) of the *Crimes (Foreign Incursions and Recruitment) Act 1978*, that it is in the interests of the defence of Australia to permit the recruitment in Australia of persons who are qualified flying instructors by the Republic of Singapore Air

Force to serve in or with the Republic of Singapore Air Force in that capacity, subject to the following conditions:

- (1) that the Republic of Singapore Air Force does not cause to be published in Australia any advertisement for the purpose of recruiting persons to serve in or with the Republic of Singapore Air Force, or any advertisement containing any information relating to the recruitment of persons to serve, or with respect to service, in or with the Republic of Singapore Air Force;
- (2) that the Republic of Singapore Air Force shall not recruit in Australia to serve in or with the Republic of Singapore Air Force, a person who is a member of the Permanent Naval Forces, the Australian Regular Army, the Regular Army Supplement or the Permanent Air Force.

This declaration shall take effect on and from the day it is notified in the *Gazette*.

- (b) my powers under section 15 of that Act to grant permits authorising the doing of an act or thing in the Northern Territory or in waters (including waters above the continental shelf adjacent to the coast of that Territory).
