OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Special issues include notices which require urgent publication. All costs associated with producing Specials will be borne by the responsible department or authority. General distribution of these notices will be by their inclusion in the next published issue of the Government Notices Gazette or Business Gazette as well as in the next published issue of the series of the Gazette in which the notice would normally have been published.

I, LIONEL FROST BOWEN, Attorney-General of Australia, hereby declare pursuant to sub-section 9 (2) of the Crimes (Foreign Incursions and Recruitment) Act 1978, that it is in the interests of the defence of Australia to permit the recruitment in Australia of persons who are qualified flying instructors by the Republic of Singapore Air

Force to serve in or with the Republic of Singapore Air Force in that capacity, subject to the following conditions:

- (1) that the Republic of Singapore Air Force does not cause to be published in Australia any advertisement for the purpose of recruiting persons to serve in or with the Republic of Singapore Air Force, or any advertisement containing any information relating to the recruitment of persons to serve, or with respect to service, in or with the Republic of Singapore Air Force;
- (2) that the Republic of Singapore Air Force shall not recruit in Australia to serve in or with the Republic of Singapore Air Force, a person who is a member of the Permanent Naval Forces, the Australian Regular Army, the Regular Army Supplement or the Permanent Air Force.

This declaration shall take effect on and from the day it is notified in the Gazette.
