- (7) that the Applicant will employ no more than one assistant for the purpose of conducting or carrying on the business on the land without the prior approval of the Minister;
- (8) that only one room in the house and the garage to be used for the conduct of the business;
- (9) that the business will only be conducted on the land between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Monday to Sunday;
- (10) that the Applicant will conduct the business strictly by appointment, and that such appointments will be organised to ensure that no more than two clients are in attendance at any one time;
- (11) that this approval will terminate on the thirtieth day of April 1989 or on such earlier date as the Minister determines in accordance with condition 12;
- (12) upon any failure to comply with any or all of the foregoing conditions the Minister or his Delegate under the said Ordinance may give written notice requiring the Applicant to show cause within a period of fourteen days why this approval should not be revoked. INFORMATION PROVISION INCENTIVE PAYMENT RULES UNDER SECTION 99AAA

Part I - General

I, PETER RICHARD STAPLES, Minister of State for Housing and Aged Care, for and on behalf of the Minister of State for Community Services and Health, pursuant to section 99AAA of the National Health Act 1953, hereby make the following information provision incentive payment rules:

- These Rules shall come into operation on 18 March 1988.
- 2. In these Rules:

"the Act" means the National Health Act 1953;

"the Regulations" means the National Health (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations;

"the Department" means the Department of Community Services and Health;

"the Secretary" means the Secretary to the Department of Community Services and Health;

"approved supplier" has the same meaning as in sub-section 84(1) of the Act;

"prescription" includes a prescription written on an authority approved by the Minister under regulation 13 of the Regulations or by the Secretary under paragraph 14 of the Declaration made under sub-section 85(2) of the Act, a repeat authorization, a deferred supply authorization, an order form under regulation 16 of the Regulations or a notification form under regulation 18A of the Regulations;

"ready-prepared pharmaceutical benefit" means a drug or medicinal preparation in respect of which there is in force a determination under sub-section 85(6) of the Act;

"extemporaneously-prepared pharmaceutical benefit" means a pharmaceutical benefit other than a ready-prepared pharmaceutical benefit;

"Standard Formulae List" means the list of those standard formulae, taken from formularies in common use, which are included as pre-priced extemporaneously-prepared pharmaceutical benefits in the Schedule of Pharmaceutical Benefits for Approved Pharmacists published by the Department.

Part II - Method of Providing Information

- For the purpose of paragraph 99AAA(4)(a) of the Act, the method of providing information (hereinafter called "the preferred method") is a pharmacy computer dispensing system which complies with the requirements set out in these Rules and the Schedule hereto and which is used to submit data to the Department for the purpose of payment for the supply of pharmaceutical benefits.
- 4. An approved supplier using the preferred method may provide prescription data either by forwarding to the Department a diskette containing the information or by transmitting the information to the Department's computer by use of a modem.
- 5. An approved supplier who transmits prescription information to the Department's computer by use of a modem is required to use software supplied by the Department for this purpose.
- 6. Prescription information transmitted by an approved supplier to the Department's computer by use of a modem shall comply with the specifications for file structure set out in the Schedule to these Rules.
- 7. An approved supplier using the preferred method who provides prescription information by forwarding a diskette to the Department shall comply with the following diskette specifications:

Diskette Size : 5 1/4 inches

Sectors/track : 8 or 9

Operating System : MS DOS Compatible

File Format : Standard ASCii File

File Name : PBPDDE.DSK

provided that the approved supplier may use a format which has been agreed to by the Department and which can be converted to the above format.

- 8. Computer software systems producing diskettes shall comply with the specifications for file structure set out in the Schedule to these Rules and shall contain sufficient audit controls to ensure the accuracy of payments of claims.
- 9. In respect of the file structure for prescription information the specifications for each field named in column 1 of the Schedule shall be those set out in column 2 of the Schedule opposite the name of the field.

- An approved supplier using the preferred method is required to enter in the computer system, in respect of each prescription written by a medical practitioner, the prescriber number of the medical practitioner, wherever such prescriber number is available to the approved supplier at the time of supply.
- 11. Where the prescriber number of the prescribing medical practitioner is not available to the approved supplier at the time of supply, the approved supplier is permitted not to enter a prescriber number in the computer system in respect of that prescription.
- 12. An approved supplier using the preferred method is required to enter in the computer system, in respect of each prescription written by a participating dental practitioner, the prescriber number of the participating dental practitioner.
- 13. An approved supplier using the preferred method is required to enter in the computer system in respect of each concessional prescription or pensioner or entitlement card prescription the number of the Health Care Card, Pharmaceutical Benefits Concession Card, Pensioner Health Benefits Card, Health Benefits Card, Dependant Treatment Entitlement Card, Service Pensioner Benefits Card or Pharmaceutical Benefits Entitlement Card which applies to the person for whom the prescription is written, and in respect of each general prescription the unique identification held by the approved supplier for the person for whom the prescription is written.

Part III - Eligible Prescriptions

- 14. For the purpose of paragraph 99AAA(4)(b) of the Act, an eligible prescription, subject to rules 15 and 16, means a prescription included in a claim submitted by the approved supplier to the Department during the incentive payment period as defined in rule 17.
- 15. A prescription is not an eligible prescription unless it is written in accordance with, and the pharmaceutical benefit to which it relates is supplied in accordance with, the relevant provisions of the Act and the Regulations.
- 16. A prescription for a pharmaceutical benefit the supply and receipt of which by virtue of sub-section 99(2A) or 99(2B) of the Act is deemed to be a supply and receipt otherwise than under Part VII of the Act (except for the purposes of Division 1A of that Part) is not an eligible prescription.

Part IV - Incentive Payment Period

17. For the purpose of paragraph 99AAA(4)(c) of the Act, the incentive payment period in relation to each approved supplier who under these Rules qualifies to use the preferred method is a period of two years commencing on the date on which the approved supplier's claim standard is assessed as satisfactory to the Department under these Rules, and concluding on the day prior to the second anniversary of that date.

4.

Part V - Additional Conditions

- 18. Subject to these Rules, the incentive payment under sub-section 99AAA(2) of the Act applies to an approved supplier who on or before 1 November 1987 submitted prescription information to the Department by the preferred method.
- 19. An approved supplier who wishes to use the preferred method shall give notice of that intention to the Department, indicating the type of computer software system proposed to be used.
- 20: Computer software systems producing diskettes shall be subject to operational testing by the Department.
- 21. Computer software systems which produce data which do not comply with the specifications set out in the Schedule to these Rules shall not be used to provide prescription information.
- 22. An approved supplier is not permitted to change the pharmaceutical benefit item description or code in the computer software system, except with the approval of the Department.
- 23. Prescription information contained in claims is subject to operational testing by the Department and must meet operational audit requirements to ensure the accuracy of payments of claims.
- 24. An approved supplier who uses a computer software system which ceases to be acceptable to the Department under these Rules shall not be entitled to claims processing by the preferred method or to the incentive payment until such time as the system again becomes acceptable to the Department.
- 25. An approved supplier who fails to maintain claims at a standard acceptable to the Department under these Rules may be suspended from claims processing by the preferred method and will not be entitled to the incentive payment during the period of suspension.
- 26. An approved supplier suspended under rule 25 from using the preferred method shall not be reinstated until at least six months have elapsed since the date of suspension.
- 27. Where an approved supplier ceases under rule 24 or 25 to be entitled to claims processing by the preferred method, the incentive payment period in relation to that approved supplier will remain that period specified in rule 17.
- An approved supplier who wishes to cease using the preferred method 28. shall give notice in writing to the Secretary of that intention, to take effect from the day specified in the notice, being a day occurring at least four months, or such lesser period as the Secretary, in special circumstances, approves, after the day on which notice is given.

- 29. An approved supplier who voluntarily ceases to use the preferred method and who subsequently wishes to resume using the preferred method shall not be entitled to any further incentive payments.
- 30. An approved supplier using the preferred method may provide prescription information in respect of a claim in up to 99 parts.
- 31. Prescription data in respect of a claim will not be processed for payment until all data in respect of the claim and the supporting documents have been received by the Department.
- 32. Payments to an approved supplier using the preferred method shall be subject to the conditions in the Determinations made by the Minister under sub-sections 98C(1) and 99(4) of the Act and regulation 18 of the Regulations as applicable.

 - "extemporaneously-prepared pharmaceutical benefit" means a pharmaceutical benefit other than a ready-prepared
- pharmaceutical benefit. 4. Part VII of the Act applies in relation to each of the drugs and medicinal preparations as are specified in Schedule 1. 5. A medicinal preparation composed of a compound that includes a pharmaceutical benefit specified in column 1 of
- Schedule 2, other than a compound specified in column 2 of that Schedule opposite to that pharmaceutical benefit, is not a medicinal preparation to which Part VII of the Act applies, unless that pharmaceutical benefit is also specified in Schedule 3, in which case the provisions of paragraphs 7 and 8 apply. 6. Part VII of the Act does not apply in relation to a medicinal preparation composed of a compound that includes a ready-prepared pharmaceutical benefit, other than Water for Injections or a pharmaceutical benefit specified in
- column 1 of Schedule 2. 7. Part VII of the Act applies in relation to medicinal preparations composed of one or more of the drugs or medicinal preparations specified in Schedule 3.
- 8. Part VII of the Act applies in relation to medicinal preparations composed of one or more of the drugs or medicinal preparations specified in Schedule 3 with the addition of one or more of the substances specified in Schedule 4. 9. The substances specified in Schedule 4 are additives for the purposes of paragraph 85 (2) (b) of the Act.
- 10. Part VII of the Act applies in relation to each of the drugs and medicinal preparations as are specified in Schedule 5. 11. The drugs and medicinal preparations specified in Schedule 5 are additional pharmaceutical benefits made available
- under arrangements provided for by section 100 of the Act.
- 12. Where circumstances are specified in column 2 of Schedule 1 or Schedule 3 opposite the name of a pharmaceutical benefit specified in column 1 of either of those Schedules, that pharmaceutical benefit is a relevant pharmaceutical benefit for the purposes of section 88A of the Act.
- 13. Where circumstances are specified in column 2 of Schedule 3 opposite the name of a pharmaceutical benefit specified in column 1 of that Schedule, those circumstances are also specified in relation to any medicinal preparation containing that pharmaceutical benefit.
- 14. The following circumstances are specified in relation to each relevant pharmaceutical benefit for the purposes of section 88A of the Act:
- (a) Where a class of persons is specified in column 2 of Schedule 1 or Schedule 3—that the pharmaceutical benefit is to be supplied for the treatment of a person included in that class of persons;
 - (b) Where a disease or condition is specified in column 2 of Schedule 1 or Schedule 3—
 - (i) if sub-paragraph (ii) does not apply—that the pharmaceutical benefit is to be supplied for the treatment of that disease or condition in relation to any person; or
 - (ii) if the disease or condition is specified in relation to a specified class of persons—that the pharmaceutical benefit is to be supplied for the treatment of that disease or condition in a person included in that class of persons:
 - (c) Where a purpose is specified in column 2 of Schedule 1 or Schedule 3—that the pharmaceutical benefit is to be supplied for that purpose;
 - (d) Where it is specified in column 2 of Schedule 1 or Schedule 3 that the written authority of the Secretary is required-that an application for the written authority of the Secretary in relation to the supply of the pharmaceutical benefit has been made by a medical practitioner and the Secretary has approved the application.
- 15. Where a medical practitioner makes an application under sub-paragraph 14 (d) and the Secretary approves the application, the Secretary shall record the approval on a numbered authority and-
- (a) where, in the approval, the Secretary requires the medical practitioner to vary the prescription for the supply of the pharmaceutical benefit-return the approval to the medical practitioner; or
 - (b) in any other case-return the approval to the medical practitioner or, if the medical practitioner so requests, forward the approval to the person to whom the pharmaceutical benefit is to be supplied.

DETERMINATION UNDER SECTIONS 85. 85A AND 88

I, JOHN STEWART DEEBLE, Acting First Assistant Secretary, Health Benefits Division, Department of Community Services and Health and Delegate of the Minister of State for Community Services and Health, pursuant to sections 85, 85A and 88 of the National Health Act 1953, hereby

- make the following Determination: 1. This Determination shall come into operation on the first day of April 1988.
- 2. The Determination under sections 85, 85A and 88 of the Act made with effect from 1 December 1987, as amended with effect from 1 February 1988 and 1 March 1988, is hereby revoked.
 - 3. In the Schedules to this Determination:

'amp.' means ampoule;

'cm' means centimetre;

'fl oz' means fluid ounce of 480 minims;

'g' means gram;

'I.M.' means intramuscular; 'I.U.' means international unit; 'I.V.' means intravenous;

'kg' means kilogram;

'L' means litre;

'lb' means pound of 16 ounces;

'm' means metre;

'M.' means million of organisms;

'mg' means milligram;

'mL' means millilitre;

'mm' means millimetre:

'mmol' means millimole; 'S.C.' means subcutaneous;

'Sch. 2' means the Second Schedule to this Determination; 'Sch. 3' means the Third Schedule to this Determination.

- 4. Where the strength, type of unit, size of unit or other particulars of form are specified in the column headed 'Form' in the First Schedule to this Determination in relation to a drug or medicinal preparation referred to in subsection 85 (2) of the National Health Act 1953 the name of which is specified in that Schedule, those particulars refer to the form or forms of the drug or medicinal preparation that is or are allowable for the purposes of Part VII of that Act to the effect that the drug or medicinal preparation in that form or in each of those forms is a pharmaceutical benefit when prescribed by a medical practitioner.
- 5. Where the strength, type of unit, size of unit or other particulars of form are specified in the column headed 'Form' in the Third Schedule to this Determination in relation to a drug or medicinal preparation referred to in sub-section 85 (2) of the National Health Act 1953 the name of which is specified in that Schedule, those particulars refer to the form or forms of the drug or medicinal preparation that is or are allowable for the purposes of Part VII of that Act to the effect that the drug or medicinal preparation in that form or in each of those forms is a pharmaceutical benefit referred to in sub-section 88 (1A) of that Act for the supply of which a participating dental practitioner is authorized to write a prescription.
- 6. The purposes set out in the column headed 'Purposes' in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this Determination are the only purposes for which a medical practitioner may prescribe the maximum quantities and number of repeats specified in that Part in relation to those pharmaceutical benefits specified in that same Part.
- 7. The manner, if any, in which a pharmaceutical benefit specified in the First and Third Schedules to this Determination is to be administered in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit is set out in those Schedules in the column headed 'Manner of administration'.

- 8. The maximum quantity or number of units of a pharmaceutical benefit that may, in one prescription, be directed to be supplied on any one occasion is:
 - (a) where the name of the pharmaceutical benefit is specified-
 - (i) in Part 1 of the First Schedule to this Determination—the quantity or number, if any, specified in that Part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Maximum quantity' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or
 - (ii) in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this Determination and the pharmaceutical benefit is prescribed in accordance with the provisions of the column headed 'Purposes'-the quantity or number, if any, in that Part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Maximum quantity' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or
 - (iii) if reference is made to the Second Schedule in the column headed 'Maximum quantity' in the First Schedule the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Maximum quantity' in the Second Schedule to this Determination in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit: or
 - (iv) in the Third Schedule to this Determinationthe quantity or number, if any, specified in that Part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Maximum quantity' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or
 - (b) in any other case—the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Maximum quantity in that Second Schedule in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit.
- 9. The maximum number of occasions, if any, on which the supply of a pharmaceutical benefit may, in one prescription, be directed by a medical practitioner to be repeated
 - (a) where the name of the pharmaceutical benefit is specified-
 - (i) in Part 1 of the First Schedule to this Determination—the quantity or number, if any, specified in that Part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Number of repeats' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit: or
 - (ii) in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this Determination and the pharmaceutical benefit is prescribed in accordance with the provisions of the column headed 'Purposes'-the quantity or number, if any, in that Part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Number of repeats' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or
 - (iii) if reference is made to the Second Schedule in the column headed 'Number of repeats' in the First Schedule, the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Number of repeats' in the Second Schedule to this Determination in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit; or
 - (b) in any other case—the number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Number of repeats' in that Second Schedule in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit.
- 10. The name of the manufacturer or the names of manufacturers denoted in accordance with the following table by letters appearing in the column headed 'Brand' in the First and Third Schedules to this Determination in relation to a drug or medicinal preparation the name of which is specified in those Schedules is the brand or brands under which the drug or medicinal preparation may be supplied under Part VII of the National Health Act 1953 as a pharmaceutical benefit:

 - (c) pursuant to paragraph 8 (2) (d) of the Act exempt from the prohibition in paragraph (b), boats in respect of which prior permission has been given in writing, by telex or telegram by the Northern Prawn Fishery Central Co-ordinator, Cairns;

- (c) pursuant to paragraph 8 (1) (a) of the Act, prohibit the taking of prawns in the area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 1; and
- (d) pursuant to paragraph 8 (1) (e) of the Act prohibit persons from having in their possession or charge, in a boat in the area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 1, equipment for taking fish, being equipment of the kind specified in Schedule 2 unless that equipment is carried by the boat in the manner specified in Schedule 3.




