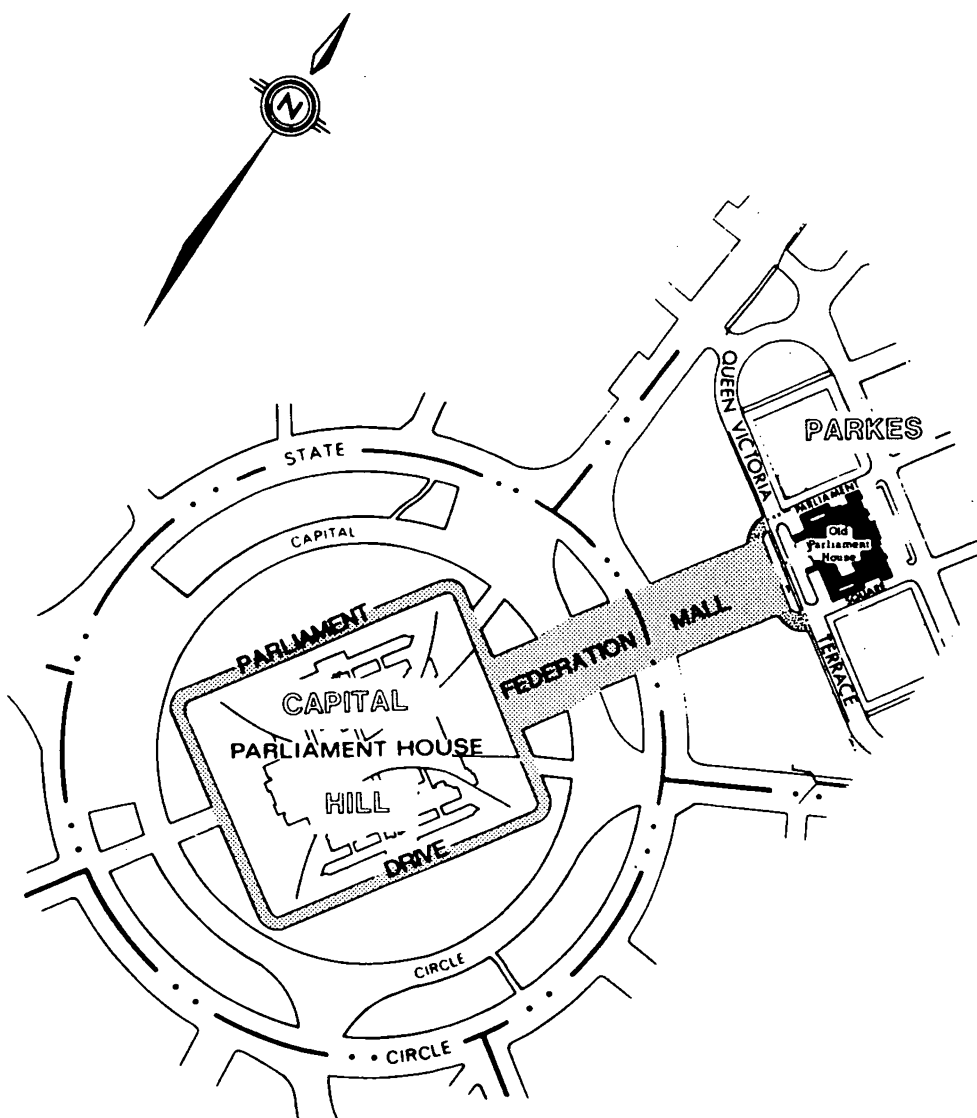

EXERCISE OF TRIBUNAL POWERS UNDER ANY OR ALL OF SECTIONS 85, 99, 101, AND 119, OF THE BROADCASTING ACT 1942 AS A RESULT OF BREACHES OF THE STANDARDS AND THE ACT ARISING FROM BROADCASTS BY MR RON CASEY AND MR LES THOMPSON ON 2KY

The Australian Broadcasting Tribunal is inquiring into whether to exercise its powers under any or all of sections 85, 99, 101 and 119 of the *Broadcasting Act 1942* (the Act) as a result of breaches of the Standards and the Act arising from broadcasts by Ron Casey and Les Thompson on 2KY. Written submissions are invited.

The inquiry follows a joint application from the Anti-Discrimination Board, the Ethnic Communities Council of New South Wales, the Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission, the Ethnic Affairs Commission of New South Wales and the Federation of Ethnic Communities Councils of Australia, Inc. Their application arose from concern at remarks broadcast by Ron Casey on 2KY in February of this year.

The inquiry also follows Tribunal decisions that the Ron Casey and Les Thompson programs broadcast on 2KY on 19 and 22 October 1987 respectively and by Ron Casey on 18 February 1988 were in breach of Radio Program Standard 3, and therefore that 2KY was in contravention of section 99 (1A) of the Act.

The issues to be considered in the inquiry are:

1. Whether the Tribunal should exercise its power under section 85 to impose a condition or conditions on the licence for 2KY requiring the adoption of management procedures with relation to 'talkback' shows in order to prevent further breaches of section 99 (1A);
2. Whether the Tribunal should exercise its power under section 99 (2) to give directions to the licensee of 2KY for the purpose of ensuring that the program standards are complied with in relation to the broadcasting of programs by the licensee and in relation to the program to be broadcast by the licensee;
3. Whether the Tribunal should exercise its power under section 101 to issue a written reprimand or admonishment to the licensee of 2KY;
4. If a written reprimand or admonishment is issued whether the Tribunal should direct the licensee of 2KY to publish the reprimand or admonishment, and if so, in what form and manner;
5. Whether the Tribunal should exercise its power under section 119 to issue directions:
 - (i) prohibiting Ron Casey from presenting programs in live broadcasts, or
 - (ii) imposing restrictions on the presenting by Ron Casey of programs in live broadcasts;
6. Whether any person has passed or selected for broadcasting the whole or a part of a program (being a program which was subsequently broadcast), in respect of which, or in respect of the broadcasting of which, the program standards were not complied with or this Act

was contravened. If so, whether the Tribunal should exercise its power under section 119 to issue directions imposing restrictions on the passing or selecting by the person of programs for broadcasting.

7. If the Tribunal issues a direction under section 119 for what period should it be determined to have effect.

Insurance Act 1973

ORDER UNDER SUB-SECTION 113 (2A)

I, PETER MORRIS, Minister of State for Transport and Communications Support, acting for and on behalf of the Treasurer of the Commonwealth, pursuant to sub-section 113 (2A), hereby order as follows:

1. In this order 'overseas insurer' means a person outside Australia who is not authorised under the Act to carry on insurance business.
 2. The person whose name appears hereunder is exempted from compliance with sub-section 113 (1):
IC Insurance Australia Limited
 3. The exemption granted by this order to a person is subject to the condition that the person shall not, in Australia, enter into a contract of insurance as the agent of an overseas insurer unless:
 - (a) the contract is a contract of reinsurance; or
 - (b) in the case of a contract entered into on or after the date of this order, the person to whom insurance cover is to be granted under the contract has acknowledged in writing that that insurance cover may be provided in whole or in part by an overseas insurer; or
 - (c) in the case of a contract for the provision of professional indemnity insurance cover, for members of a profession, under an insurance policy issued to an association or body on behalf of its members, the association or body has acknowledged in writing that the insurance cover may be provided in whole or in part by an overseas insurer;
 - (d) that he shall lodge with the Insurance and Superannuation Commissioner a copy of any agency agreement entered into with an overseas insurer to which this exemption applies and of any change to the agreement within twenty-one days of such agreement or change taking place;
 - (e) that he shall not enter into a contract of insurance as an agent for an overseas insurer unless that contract contains a condition that the proper law of the contract is the law of an Australian State or Territory;
 - (f) that, no later than 31 August in each year, he shall furnish to the Insurance and Superannuation Commissioner in a form approved by him for the purpose, a statement showing, for each class of business prescribed in Regulation 9 of the Insurance Regulations and for each country of domicile of the overseas insurers dealt with, in relation to contracts to which this exemption applies:
 - (i) the amount of premiums received by him on behalf of overseas insurers;
 - (ii) the amount of premiums remitted by him to such overseas insurers;
 - (iii) the amount received by him from overseas insurers for payment of claims; and
 - (iv) the amount paid by him on behalf of overseas insurers in settlement of claims
- during the preceding year ended 30 June.

- (b) pursuant to sub-section 21 (4) of that Act, hereby determine that Colin Gordon Ball shall hold office on such terms and conditions, other than terms and conditions provided for by that Act, as would be applicable to him if he were an officer of the Australian Public Service and:

- (i) any action required or authorised by those terms and conditions to be taken by the Public Service Commission were required or authorised to be taken by the Minister; and
- (ii) any action required or authorised by those terms and conditions to be taken by a Secretary of a Department were required or authorised to be taken by the Chairman of the Australian Electoral Commission.

FISHERIES NOTICE NO. 163ASOUTHERN SHARK FISHERY - MINIMUM SIZES, GEAR RESTRICTIONS AND
ENDORSEMENT REQUIREMENTS

I, JOHN CHARLES KERIN, the Minister of State for Primary Industries and Energy, hereby revoke Fisheries Notice No. 165, published in Gazette No. S.160 on 10 April 1986 and Fisheries Notice No. 172, published in Gazette No. S.438 of 1 September 1986, and hereby vary Fisheries Notice No. 163, published in Gazette No. S.74 on 27 February 1986 by removing all words after 'hereby' and substituting:

- "(a) provide that this notice may be cited as Fisheries Notice 163A and that in this notice -

"controlled gillnet" has the same meaning as in the plan;

"gillnet" has the same meaning as in the plan;

"shark" has the same meaning as in the plan;

"the Act" means the Fisheries Act 1952; and

"the plan" means the Southern Shark Fishery Management Plan as in force from time to time;

- (b) pursuant to paragraph 8(1)(b) of the Act, prohibit the taking of -

(i) gummy shark (*Mustelus antarcticus*) which measure less than 45 centimetres; and

(ii) school shark (*Galeorhinus galeus*) which measure less than 40 centimetres -

in a straight line from the middle of the posterior edge of the aftermost gill-slit to the ventral insertion of the caudal fin;

- (c) pursuant to paragraph 8(1)(c) of the Act, prohibit the taking of sharks by the use of a gillnet;

- (d) pursuant to paragraph 8(1)(da) of the Act, prohibit a person from having a controlled gillnet in that person's possession or charge in a boat;

- (e) pursuant to paragraph 8(2)(d) of the Act, exempt from the prohibition in paragraph (d) a person who is in possession or in charge of a gillnet in a boat which is authorized under the law of a State to be equipped with or to use gillnets while in coastal waters or in a fishery managed under that law, and which is in transit with the gillnet stowed and secured in the boat;
- (f) pursuant to paragraph 8(4D)(b) of the Act, specify that the activities prohibited by paragraphs (c) and (d) are activities in respect of which an endorsement may be made under subsection 9(4) of the Act; and
- (g) pursuant to paragraph 8(4B)(b) of the Act, specify 'managed waters', within the meaning of the Plan, as the area in respect of which the prohibitions in this notice are to have effect."

NORTH WEST SHELF DEEP-WATER TRAWL FISHERY - PROHIBITION ON
TRAWLING WITHOUT ENDORSEMENT

I, JOHN CHARLES KERIN, the Minister of State for Primary
Industries and Energy, hereby:

- (a) provide that this Notice may be cited as Fisheries Notice
No. 204 and that in this Notice-

"fish" has the same meaning as in the Act; and

"the Act" means the Fisheries Act 1952;

- (b) revoke Fisheries Notice Nos. 196 and 197 published in
Gazette No. GN24 on 14 October 1987;
- (c) pursuant to paragraph 8(1)(c) of the Act, prohibit from
1 May 1988, the taking of fish in the area of proclaimed
waters specified in the Schedule by the method known as
trawling;
- (d) pursuant to paragraph 8(1)(e) of the Act, prohibit from
1 May 1988, a person from having possession or charge, in a
boat in the area of proclaimed waters specified in the
Schedule, equipment of a kind included in a class of
equipment known as trawls, unless that equipment is carried
by the boat so that all parts of each trawl are unshackled
from the warps and brought on deck; and
- (e) pursuant to paragraph 8(40)(b) of the Act declare that, the
activities to which the prohibitions contained in this
Notice and in Fisheries Notice No. 44 published in Gazette
No. 57E on 15 July 1974, as in force from time to time,
relate are activities in respect of which an endorsement
may be made under subsection 9(4) of the Act.

SCHEDULE

AREA OF THE NORTH WEST SHELF DEEP-WATER TRAWL FISHERY

The area of proclaimed waters contained within the area bounded
by a line:

- (a) commencing at the point of intersection of the meridian of
Longitude 114°00' East by the 200m isobath off the north
west coast of Australia;
- (b) running thence generally north-easterly along that isobath
to its intersection by the meridian of Longitude 124°00'
East;

- (c) thence north along that meridian to its intersection by the outer limit of the Australian fishing zone;
- (d) thence generally south-westerly along that outer limit to its intersection by the meridian of Longitude 114° East; and
- (e) thence south along that meridian to the point of commencement.
