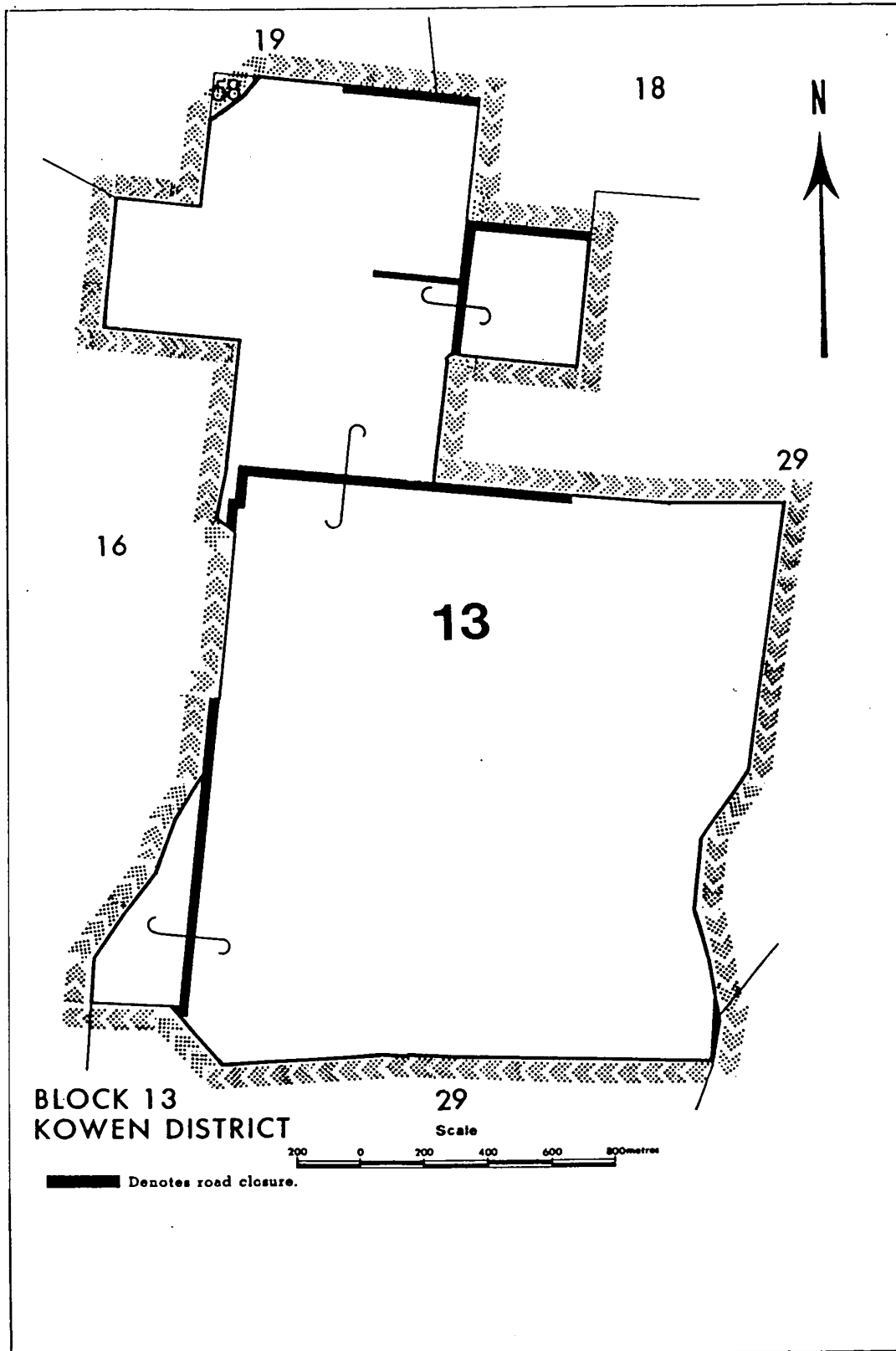

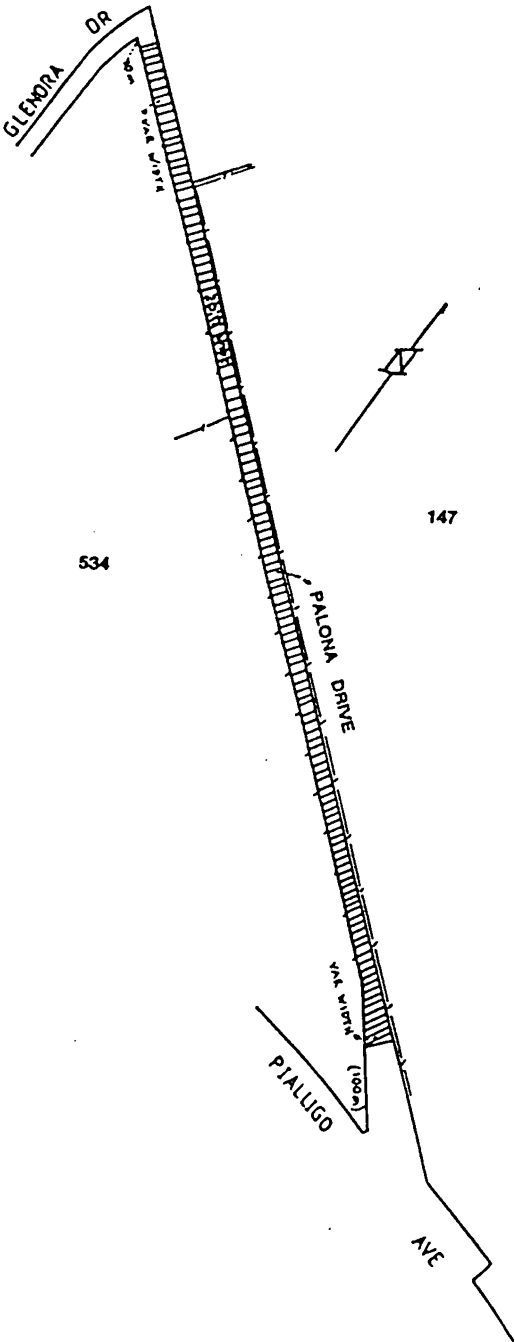

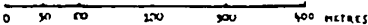

I, PETER FRANCIS SALMON COOK, Minister of State for Resources, in pursuance of sub-section 6 (2) of the *Petroleum Excise (Prices) Act 1987*, hereby specify that each oil producer of excisable crude oil entered for home consumption during any month shall provide to the Department of Primary Industries and Energy such information as is prescribed in regulation 4 of the Petroleum Excise (Prices) Regulations in the following form and at the following times:

- (a) The information is to be provided in computer-readable form on floppy disk and in printed form, certified as true and correct by an appropriate officer of the oil producer where, in accordance with sub-regulation 4 (2) of the Petroleum Excise (Prices) Regulations, the amounts given in respect of a transaction are actual amounts rather than estimated amounts.
- (b) The information in respect of a transaction in a month is to be provided on or before the fifteenth day of the immediately following month. Where, in accordance with sub-regulation 4 (2) of the Petroleum Excise (Prices) Regulations, the information so provided comprises amounts which are estimates, the actual amounts are to be provided on or before the fifteenth day of the sixth month after the end of the month in which the transaction took place or, if it is not reasonable practicable for the producer to give the actual amounts, the producer is to provide the producer's best estimates of the amounts at that time, certified as such by an appropriate officer of the oil producer.
