STAMP DUTY (SURRENDER AND RE-GRANT) DETERMINATION

Under subsection 99 (1) of the Taxation (Administration) Ordinance 1987 I determine that the amount of stamp duty payable under the Stamp Duties and Taxes Ordinance 1987 on a Crown lease first referred to in paragraph 17 (1) (ca) of that Ordinance, and the method by which that amount is to be calculated, are as follows:

- 1. The amount of duty is the amount (if any) by which the amount of duty which would, if the amendments effected by section 4 of the Stamp Duties and Taxes (Amendment) Ordinance (No. 2) 1988 had not been made, have been payable on the Crown Lease exceeds the amount of duty which would have been payable on the previous Crown lease if it had been transferred on the date of surrender.
- 2. For the purposes of this determination:
 - (a) it shall be assumed that the value of the interest in a Crown Lease is, subject to paragraph (b), the unimproved value of the parcel of land held under that lease for the purposes of the Rates and Land Tax Ordinance 1926; and
 - (b) section 5 of that Ordinance shall be read as if the reference to 'the relevant date' in that section were a reference to:
 - (i) as regards the Crown lease—the date of grant;
 - (ii) as regards the previous Crown lease-the date of surrender.

City Area Leases Ordinance 1936

INSTRUMENT OF APPROVAL UNDER SECTION 10

In pursuance of section 10 of the City Area Leases Ordinance 1936, 1, PETER ROBERT GRIFFITHS, being the officer for the time being occupying an office to the occupant of which the Minister has by instrument in writing under section 12C of the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910 delegated his powers under section 10 of the said Ordinance hereby approve of Krishnasamy Udhaya Chandran ('the Applicant') carrying on the profession, trade, occupation or calling of paediatrician ('the business') on Block 37, Section 1, Division of Chapman known as 52 Monkman St, Chapman ('the land') subject to the following conditions relating to the use of the land being observed by the Applicant in carrying on the business:

- (1) that this approval will remain valid only while the Applicant continues to be a bona fide resident of the land:
- (2) that the Applicant will ensure that the conduct of the business does not cause an annoyance, a nuisance or danger and is not offensive to any tenants or occupiers of adjoining lands;
- (3) that the Applicant will not erect or permit or suffer to be displayed or erected upon the land or any building thereon any advertising sign or hoarding whatever without the consent in writing of the National Capital Development Commission and the Building Controller;

DECLARATION OF A CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY STANDARD

MOTOR VEHICLE CHILD RESTRAINTS

- I, NICK BOLKUS, Minister of State for Consumer Affairs, pursuant to section 65E (1) of the *Trade Practices Act* 1974, hereby:
 - (a) Revoke the consumer product safety standard in respect of motor vehicle child restraints published in Gazette No. S 9 of 22 January 1982;
 - (b) Declare that, in respect of goods of a kind specified in Division 1 of the Schedule to this notice, the Standard approved by the Standards Association of Australia specified in Division 2 of the Schedule to

this notice, as varied by the variations specified in Division 3 of the Schedule to this notice, is a consumer product safety standard for the purposes of section 65C of the *Trade Practices Act 1974*.

THE SCHEDULE

Division 1: Particulars of goods

- Child restraints for use in motor vehicles, being devices to reduce the risk of bodily injury to a child passenger in the event of a motor vehicle impact.
- (2) Components to restrain a child in a child restraint, components to anchor a child restraint to a motor vehicle and, where supplied, components to restrain a vehicle seat.

- (3) Chaises for use in motor vehicles, being devices for raising a child's position in a motor vehicle and/or adapting an adult seat belt for use as a child restraint and having a back above the seating plane.
- (4) Cushions for use in motor vehicles, being devices for raising a child's position in a motor vehicle and/or adapting an adult seat belt for use as a child restraint and having no back above the seating plane.

The goods do not include:

- (1) Child restraints suitable for a range of children whose mass lies within nominated limits up to 9 kilograms and corresponding supine length lies within nominated limits up to 700 millimetres, where such restraints were imported into Australia, or were manufactured or assembled in Australia, before 1 January 1989; and
- (2) child restraints designed, constructed or marketed specifically for handicapped children.

Division 2: The Standard

Australian Standard 1754-1975, 'Child Restraints for Passenger Cars and Derivatives', approved by the Standards Association of Australia on 17 March 1975, as amended by Amendment No. 1 of February 1976, Amendment No. 2 of March 1978, Amendment No. 3 of July 1979, the Corrigendum of October 1979 and Amendment No. 4 of July 1985. Division 3: Variations

The standard specified in Division 2 is varied by:

- (1) deleting from the first sentence of clause 1.2 the words 'covered by this specification'; and
- (2) deleting from the first sentence of clause 4.4 the words 'purporting to comply with this specification'.

In this context it will be considered whether Mr Bond and companies associated with him are fit and proper persons to hold the above licences.
- 2A. Whether certain tapes supplied to the Tribunal during a licence renewal inquiry for commercial radio stations 6KA and 6NW in August 1987 were contemporaneous recordings of actual broadcasts; if not,
 - (a) whether the tapes were accurate recordings of material actually broadcast;
 - (b) the circumstances in which those tapes were produced;

- (c) how those tapes came to be supplied to the Tribunal;
- (d) whether the licensees made any representations to the Tribunal concerning those tapes;
- (e) whether the licensees intended to mislead the Tribunal in respect of those tapes.
- 2B. Whether anything connected with the production and supply to the Tribunal of those tapes has any implications as to the suitability of companies associated with Mr Alan Bond to hold the above broadcasting licences.
