## INTER-STATE COMMISSION VOLUMETRIC LOADING OF LIVESTOCK— HEARINGS RECOMMENCE

## NOTICE OF PERMIT GRANTED UNDER THE ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION (SEA DUMPING) ACT 1981

- (7) that the Applicant will not employ any more than one assistant for the purpose of conducting or carrying on the business on the land without the prior approval of the Minister;
- (8) that the Applicant will not conduct retail sales from the land:
- (9) that the business will only be conducted on the land between the hours of 3.00 p.m. and 7.00 p.m. Monday to Friday;
- (10) that the Applicant will conduct the business strictly by appointment, and that such appointments will be organised to ensure that only one client is in attendance at any one time;
- (11) that this approval will terminate on the thirty-first day of October 1989 or on such earlier date as the Minister determines in accordance with condition 12;


