OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service and the Services of the Australian Postal Commission, Australian Telecommunications Commission. Commonwealth Teaching Service and Defence Force appointments etc. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and sold at \$8.95 each or on subscription of \$395.00 (50 issues), \$206.00 (25 issues) or \$103.00 (12 issues).



- (ii) in the case of materials partly manufactured and exported from Australia to New Zealand for incorporation in a final product for export to Australia from New Zealand, the cost of those imported materials into New Zealand will
 - (A) wholly of qualifying area content provided that in their imported form they qualified under the rules of origin on importation into New Zealand for incorporation in the final product;
 - (B) totally without qualifying area content if in their imported form they did not qualify under the rules of origin on importation into New Zealand and incorporation in the final product; or
- (iii) in the case of materials partly manufactured in New Zealand, the value shall be the proportion of the cost of manufacture of those materials incurred in New Zealand or in New Zealand and Australia, but not including any duties or other taxes paid or payable in the country of manufacture of the goods in respect of such materials:
- (b) manufacturing wages;
- (c) factory overhead expenses; and
- (d) the cost of inside containers of the manufacture of New Zealand or of Australia, or of New Zealand and Australia.

For the purpose of this notice 'materials' means those goods which, had they been exported from Australia and were later imported into Australia would have had at the time of such importation the same identity for the purposes of the Customs Tariff Act 1987 as they had at the time of their prior exportation.

QUARANTINE PROCLAMATION No. 136A

Commonwealth of Australia N. M. STEPHEN Governor-General By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia

I, SIR NINIAN MARTIN STEPHEN, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby vary Quarantine Proclamation No. 76A made under section 13 of the Quarantine Act 1908 and published in the Gazette on 28 July 1966 by inserting after item 8 in the First Schedule the following item:

'8A. Alpacas, camels, guanacas, llamas and vicunas;

- 1. The animals shall not be imported from any country other than Canada, Chile, New Zealand or the United States of America
- 2. The animals shall not be imported from those countries unless, in the case of a particular animal:
- (a) the Director Quarantine, or a person authorised by him or her in writing, having regard to any documents furnished to him or her and to the circumstances of the case, being satisfied that the importation is not likely to introduce disease into Australia, grants a permit to import the animal into Australia; and
- (b) that permit is produced to a quarantine officer, or to a Collector within the meaning of the Customs Act 1901, at the port of entry into Australia'.
