DETERMINATION OF RATES OF TRAINING ALLOWANCE FOR THE PURPOSES OF SUBSECTION 24 (2) AND THE RATE OF LIVING-AWAY-FROM-HOME ALLOWANCE FOR THE PURPOSES OF SUBSECTION 24 (4)

I, NEAL BLEWETT, the Minister of State for Community Services and Health, pursuant to subsections 24 (2) and 24 (4) of the *Disability Services Act 1986* (the Act) hereby determine that on and from 1 January 1989:

1. For the purposes of subsection 24 (2) of the Act, the rate of training allowance for a person undergoing on-the-job employment on vocational training with an employer is:
 - (i) in the case of a person who has attained the age of 18 years and is undertaking full-time training, \$46.35 per week;
 - (ii) in the case of a person who has attained the age of 18 years and is undertaking part-time training, \$23.20 per week;
 - (iii) in the case of a person who has not attained the age of 18 years and is undertaking full-time training, \$23.20 per week; and

- (iv) in the case of a person who has not attained the age of 18 years and is undertaking part-time employment or vocational training, \$15.30 per week.
2. For the purposes of subsection 24 (2) of the Act, the rate of training allowance for a person undergoing a formal course of vocational training is:
 - (i) in the case of a person who is undertaking full-time training, \$30.00 per week;
 - (ii) in the case of a person who is undertaking part-time training, \$20.00 per week.
3. For the purposes of subsection 24 (4) of the Act, the rate of living-away-from-home allowance is \$57.90 per week.
4. The determination made for the purposes of subsections 24 (2) and 24 (4) of the Act dated 31 May 1987 is hereby revoked.



AND CERTAIN EXPORTERS FROM JAPAN**

CUSTOM ACT 1901 - NOTICE UNDER SUB-SECTION 269TC(4)

I, LARRY JOHN ROUX, delegate of the Comptroller-General of the Australian Customs Service (ACS) have accepted an application under sub-section 269TB(1) of the Customs Act 1901, that there are reasonable grounds to initiate an investigation into the alleged injurious dumping of spark ignition piston engined outboard motors of 0.93 kW (1.2 HP) to 168 kW (225 HP), ICOMIA Standards, from Belgium, the United States of America, and certain exporters from Japan.

Outboard Marine Australia Pty Ltd is the applicant and is the manufacturer of spark ignition piston engined outboard motors in Australia. The investigation will cover the goods under reference exported from Belgium, the United States of America, and those goods exported from Japan under the Mariner, Mercury, Suzuki, Tohatsu and Yamaha brand names.

The goods under complaint are classified within sub-heading 8407.21.00 (statistical codes 35 to 57) of Schedule 3 of the Customs Tariff Act 1987. The rate of duty is general 10%.

The ACS will prepare a preliminary finding on the complaint within 120 days of the publication of this notice. If this finding is that there are sufficient grounds for publication of a dumping notice, provisional measures (involving the taking of securities under Section 42 of the Customs Act 1901) may be imposed. A positive preliminary finding would be referred to the Anti-Dumping Authority for further investigation and report to the Minister (within 120 days) on whether dumping duties should be imposed.

The ACS has published Australian Customs Notice (ACN) No. 89/5 notifying initiation of the investigation and the procedures involved. Copies of the ACN are available from the Publication Section, Customs House, Canberra or regional offices of the ACS in each capital city.
