The Commission has been asked to inquire and report within 45 days on whether assistance accorded the production of disodium carbonate (soda ash) should be varied, consequent upon the implementation from 1 July 1989 of the amendments to the Customs Act 1901 made by the Customs and Excise Legislation Amendment Act 1989.

CUSTOMS ACT 1901 - NOTICE UNDER SUB-SECTION 269TC(4)

I, JOHN MELVILLE THOMPSON, delegate of the Comptroller-General of the Australian Customs Service (ACS) have accepted an application made under sub-section 269TB(1) of the <u>Customs Act 1901</u>, which alleges matters that would, if established, constitute reasonable grounds for the publication of a countervailing duty notice for dried currants and sultanas exported from Greece.

The goods the subject of this inquiry are currants and sultanas classified within subheading 0806.20.00 of Schedule 3 to the Customs Tariff Act 1987, statistical codes 29 and 30 respectively and dutiable at 23 percent General.

The Australian Dried Fruits Association Inc is the applicant and represents a major proportion of the Australian industry.

The ACS will prepare a preliminary finding on the application within 120 days of the publication of this notice. If the preliminary finding is that there are sufficient grounds for publication of a countervailing duty notice, provisional measures (involving the taking of securities under section 42 of the Customs Act 1901) may be imposed. The matter would then be referred to the Anti-Dumping Authority for further investigation and report to the Minister (within 120 days) on whether a countervailing duty notice should be published.

The ACS has published Australian Customs Notice (ACN) No. 89/62 notifying the investigation and the procedures to be followed. Copies of the ACN are available from the Publications Section, Customs House, 5 Constitution Avenue, CANBERRA ACT 2601 or ACS regional offices.
