NEW SPECIAL GAZETTE RATES

The Special Gazette surcharge has been revised. The new rate will be \$100.00 per printed page. This replaces the previous charge of \$100.00 per issue, and will be effective from 1 July 1989.

Inclusion of a surcharge is necessary to cover the costs of reproducing Special Gazette issues at the back of the Government Notices Gazette, to allow total dissemination of the information. Prior to the last revision of the Gazette advertising rates Special issues were consistently one to two pages in length. Since this time there has been an increase in the demand for multi-paged Special issues and therefore the rate of \$100.00 per page no longer covers associated production costs.

It is suggested that multi-paged notices could be published in the Government Notices or Periodic issues of the *Gazette*, rather than a Special issue, if time constraints permit.

On the 7th day of February 1989, I, NEAL BLEWETT, Minister of State for Community Services and Health, made a determination under section 106 of the Health Insurance Act 1973 (the Act), in respect of Dr Leslie Sumanasinghe Kotagama, Consultant Physician of 215 Beecroft Rd, Cheltenham, New South Wales.

Particulars of Determination

A copy of the determination is at Attachment A.

Reasons for Determination

The determination was made by me on the basis of a report made under section 104 of the Act by the Medical Services Committee of Inquiry for the State of New South Wales. after its inquiry into the practice of Dr Kotagama.

The Committee was of the opinion that in respect of the patients under reference, certain of the services were excessive, in that they were not reasonably necessary for the adequate medical care of the patients concerned. The committee arrived at this opinion by referring to all the evidence before it and bringing to bear the knowledge and experience of its members.

Comments

The Government is seriously concerned by the practice of doctors like Dr Kotagama who provide services which are not reasonably necessary for the adequate medical care of the patients concerned. Excessive services are a drain on public funds and every effort is being made to reduce the magnitude of the problem.

If any person is convicted for a third or subsequent offence, that person (not being a company) becomes liable to a penalty not exceeding \$5000 or imprisonment for a period of not more than 12 months, or both. A company may be fined \$25 000. Alternatively:

the person may, in relation to an income tax return, become liable to pay, as a penalty, additional tax equal to double the amount of the tax payable by that person for the year;

the company or trustee of a corporate trust estate may, in relation to a franking account return, become liable to pay, as a penalty, additional tax equal to double the amount of the franking deficit tax payable by that company or corporate trust estate for the franking year.

SODIUM TRIPOLYPHOSPHATE FROM BELGIUM, ISRABL, JAPAN AND YUGOSLAVIA

CUSTOMS ACT 1901 - NOTICE UNDER SUB-SECTION 269TC(4)

The Australian Customs Service (ACS) has accepted for investigation a dumping complaint submitted by the Australian industry producing sodium tripolyphosphate. The complaint alleges material injury is being caused and threatened to the Australian industry by exports of sodium tripolyphosphate from Belgium, Israel, Japan and Yugoslavia to Australia at dumped prices.

The ACS has also accepted for investigation an application for a countervailing duty notice submitted by the Australian industry producing sodium tripolyphosphate. The complaint alleges material injury is being caused and threatened to the Australian industry by exports of sodium tripolyphosphate from Israel to Australia at subsidised prices.

Albright and Wilson (Australia) Limited is the applicant and is the sole producer of sodium tripolyphosphate in Australia.

The goods under complaint are classified within sub-paragraph 2835.31.00 (statistical code 22) of Schedule 3 of the Customs Tariff Act 1987. The rates of duty are general 17.5% and developing country 12.5%.

The ACS will prepare a preliminary finding on the complaint within 120 days of the publication of this notice. If the finding is that there are sufficient grounds for publication of a dumping and/or countervailing notice, provisional measures (involving the taking of securities under Section 42 of the Customs Act 1901) may be imposed. A positive preliminary finding would be referred to the Anti-Dumping Authority for further investigation and report to the Minister (within 120 days) on whether dumping and/or countervailing duties should be imposed.

The ACS has published Australian Customs Notice (ACN) No. 89/70 notifying initiation of the investigation and the procedures involved. Copies of the ACN are available from the Publications Section, Customs House, Canberra, or regional offices of the Australian Customs Service in each capital city.

All interested parties are invited to lodge written submissions with Mr John McDermott, Dumping Operations, Australian Customs Service, Customs House, 5 Constitution Avenue, Canberra, ACT 2601, no later than 22 July 1989. This notice is deemed to be effective from 14.6.89.

 - (ii) specified in subparagraphs (b) (ii) and (iii) of this determination,

are non-reimbursable liabilities;

- (d) for the purposes of paragraph 29C (1) (d), that the following instruments to which this Part applies are non-transferring instruments, namely:
 - (i) all instruments (not being instruments referred to in paragraph (e) being, evidencing, coming into existence for the purpose of or relating to:
 - (aa) each foreign exchange transaction, currency features transaction, interest rate futures transaction, interest rate option or forward rate agreement in existence, in each case,

immediately before the re-organisation day;
