OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

General distribution of these notices will be by their inclusion in the next published issue of the Government Notices Gazette or Business Gazette as well as in the next published issue of the series of the Gazette in which the notice would normally have been published.

NOTICE OF PERMIT GRANTED UNDER THE **ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION (SEA DUMPING)** ACT 1981

Pursuant to section 25 of the Environment Protection (Sea Dumping) Act 1981, notice is given that a general permit has been granted to the Bundaberg Port Authority, PO Box 75, Bundaberg Queensland 4670, to dump at sea for a period of twelve months commencing on 22 September 1989, up to 300 000 tonnes of spoil arising from Bundaberg Harbour Queensland.

The dumping of material is to take place within a circular area, centre 24°43'42"S, 152°26'12"E, radius 0.5 nautical miles.

The general permit specifies monitoring requirements related to the dumping of dredge spoil.

NOTICE OF PERMIT VARIATION GRANTED UNDER THE ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION (SEA **DUMPING) ACT 1981**

Pursuant to section 25 of the Environment Protection (Sea Dumping) Act 1981, notice is given that a special permit granted to the New South Wales Roads and Traffic Authority, PO Box 51, Milsons Point New South Wales 2061, to dump at sea for a period of twelve months commencing on 29 August 1989, up to 102 000 tonnes of spoil arising from the dredging of marine sediments (to allow construction of embankments at Glebe Island), has been varied at Annex A clauses 2 and 7. The variation relates to specific monitoring requirements and takes effect from 22 September 1989.

PRINCIPLES FOR THE CLASSIFICATION OF NURSING HOME PATIENTS

AND REPATRIATION NURSING, HOME PATIENTS

<u>Title</u>

1. These principles may be cited as the <u>Nursing Homes</u>
Patients Classification Principles 1989.

Interpretation

- 2. In these principles, unless the contrary intentions appears -
 - (a) 'Act' means the National Health Act 1953;
 - (b) 'approved algorithm' means the algorithm set out in the Schedule: and
 - (c) 'eligible patient' means a patient to whom section 40AFB of the Act applies.

Assessment of eliqible patients

- 3. For the purposes of subsection $40\,\mathrm{AFA}$ (5) of the Act, the Secretary shall give a classification to an eligible patient in the following manner -
 - (a) the Secretary shall have regard to the authorised form completed pursuant to subsection 40AFC(3) or 40AFD(4) of the Act;
 - (b) the Secretary shall apply the approved algorithm to the responses provided in the authorised form and shall determine an aggregate figure in accordance with that algorithm; and
 - (c) the Secretary shall give to the eligible patient the classification which is appropriate to that aggregate figure.

Categories

- 4(1) There shall be five categories, to take effect from 1 July 1988, into which eligible patients shall be classified.
 - (2) The categories shall be established -
 - (a) by identifying the number of patients in approved nursing homes (other than Government nursing homes) in November 1987;
 - (b) by applying the approved algorithm to those patients as if they were eligible patients and as if, for the purpose of this principle, the results obtained were aggregate figures; and
 - (c) by identifying figures which represent -
 - (i) the lowest aggregate figure of the highest 10 percent of aggregate figures obtained under paragraph (b) (which in this principle shall be called 'figure A');
 - (ii) the lowest aggregate figure of the next 20 percent of aggregate figures which follow figure A (which in this principle shall be called 'figure B');
 - (iii) the lowest aggregate figure of the next 30 percent of aggregate figures which follow figure B, (which in this principle shall be called 'figure C'); and
 - (iv) the lowest aggregate figure of the next 20 percent of aggregate figures which follow figure C (which in this principle shall be called 'figure D').
- (3) The five categories to take effect from 1 July 1988 shall be called -
 - (a) <u>Category 1</u>, which will comprise every aggregate figure equal to or greater than figure A;
 - (b) <u>Category 2</u>, which will comprise every aggregate figure equal to or greater than figure B but less than figure A;
 - (c) <u>Category 3</u>, which will comprise every aggregate

figure equal to or greater than figure C but less than figure B;

- (d) <u>Category 4</u>, which will comprise every aggregate figure equal to or greater than figure D but less than figure C; and
- Category 5, which will comprise every aggregate (e) figure less than figure D.

Amendments to the Categories

- The Secretary may, at any time after 1 July 1988, alter one or more of the figures identified for the purposes of subprinciple 4(3).
- (2) An eligible patient who has been given a classification which has not expired shall not have that classification altered by force of an alteration to a figure pursuant to subprinciple (1).
- An eligible patient who has not been given a classification, or an eligible patient whose classification has expired, shall be given a classification in accordance with the categories specified in subprinciple 4(2) as modified by any alteration made pursuant to subprinciple (1).

Period of effect

- Subject to subprinciple (2), the period of effect of a classification shall be 12 months from the date of effect of the classification.
- Where an eligible patient has been discharged from a nursing home, and the patient has not been admitted to a nursing home for a period of 90 consecutive days after the date of that discharge, the classification of that patient shall be terminated with effect from the end of the ninetieth day of that period.
