#### OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Sydney:

Special issues include notices which require urgent publication. All costs associated with producing Specials will be borne by the responsible department or authority. A limited number of Special Gazettes will be made available for sale from the Commonwealth Government Bookshop, Canberra, on the day of publication. General distribution of these notices will be by their inclusion in the next published issue of the Government Notices Gazette or Business Gazette as well as in the next published issue of the series of the Gazette in which the notice would normally have been published.

Tariff concessions issues contain notices of tariff concessions proposed, granted or revoked in accordance with the provisions of Part XVA of the Customs Act 1901. #### Submissions Invited

On 15 March 1989, the Australian Broadcasting Tribunal advertised the commencement of an inquiry into the licence renewal of STV Mildura, which expired on 30 June 1989.

On 4 July 1989, Ballarat and Victoria Television Pty Ltd (Ballarat) acquired 100 per cent of the issued capital of Burnbay Investments Pty Ltd (Burnbay), licensee of STV. Ballarat is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Associated Broadcasting Services Ltd (ABS), which is in turn a wholly-owned subsidiary of ENT Ltd.

The Tribunal has received applications for approval of this transaction from Ballarat and from others who have acquired an indirect interest in the licence.

The Tribunal has also now received an amended renewal application following the acquisition of the STV licensee company by Ballarat.

The Tribunal has decided to join the share transaction inquiry to the existing renewal inquiry.

#### Issues to be considered

Issues the Tribunal must consider during the rehewal inquiry include:

- (a) whether the licensee has complied with its undertaking to provide an adequate and comprehensive service pursuant to the licence, to encourage the provision of Australian programs and to use and encourage the use of Australian creative resources;
- (b) whether the licensee has given a rew undertaking for the forthcoming licence period;
- (c) whether the licensee is a fit and proper person to hold the licence;
- (d) whether the licensee has the necessary financial, technical and management capabilities;
- (e) whether the conditions of the licence have been complied with;
- (f) whether the service is commercially viable;
- (g) whether there have been any contraventions of the ownership and control provisions;
- (h) whether the licensee has unreasonably or repeatedly delayed paying fees; and
- where an implementation plan is applicable, whether the licensee has complied with its obligations in relation to its plan.

The issues to be considered in the share transaction inquiry are set out in section 92FAA of the *Broadcasting Act 1942*. The Tribunal must approve the transaction unless there are grounds under section 92FAA to refuse consent. Section 92FAA requires the Tribunal to take into account the following matters:

- (a) whether it would be advisable in the public interest to refuse consent because:
  - (i) the applicants are not fit and proper persons to hold the licence;
  - (ii) the applicants do not have the necessary financial, technical and management capabilities to provide an adequate and comprehensive service pursuant to the licence;
  - (iii) the applicants are not capable of complying with the conditions of the licence;
- (b) the applicant's compliances with undertakings to provide adequate and comprehensive service, and to use and encourage the use of Australian creative resources;
- (c) whether, if consent was given, contraventions of section
   92 (limitation of interests), section 92C (limitation of directors), or section 92D (foreign ownership provisions) would occur;

- (d) whether, if consent was given, contraventions of section 92JB (cross-media ownership), or section 92JD (cross-media directorships) would occur;
- (e) any other matter which the Tribunal sees fit to consider.
