NOTICE OF GRANT OF EXEMPTION

Notice is hereby given of a decision of the Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission made on 19 October 1989 pursuant to sub-section 44 (1) of the Sex Discrimination Act 1984 (SDA) in the following terms.

'The Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission grants to the Commissioner of the Australian Federal Police (hereafter referred to as the AFP) an exemption from the provisions of section 14 (2) (a) and (b) of the SDA for a period of six months from 19 October 1989 to 19 April 1990.

- A. The Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission's findings on material questions of fact relating to the application are as follows:
 - (1) The UNFICYP Commander permits the AUSTCIVPOL contingent to contain only one female officer and permits that female officer to engage in administrative duties only (to the exclusion of field/operational duties).
 - (2) In selecting AFP officers for service with AUSTCIVPOL in Cyprus, the Commissioner AFP restricts the number of female officers to one, and restricts the duties of that female officer to administrative duties only.
 - (3) The Commissioner AFP has not engaged in any further negotiations with the UNFICYP Commander since the status of the matter was established (as stated in paragraphs (1) and (2)).
 - (4) The AFP is required at law to comply with the equal employment opportunity provisions of the federal Public Service Act 1922 and the anti-discrimination provisions of the SDA and the Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission Act 1986.

(5) That on 8 March 1989, Mr Roy Farmer (Deputy Commissioner/AFP Operations) made a formal application (on behalf of the Commissioner AFP) to this Commission for an exemption under s.44 of the SDA to enable the Commissioner AFP to continue to select one woman only to serve in an administrative capacity only in the AFP's AUSTCIVPOL contingent.

- B. These findings were based on the following evidence:
 - (1) A copy of a cablegram from the federal Department of Foreign Affairs/Canberra ('DFA', as it then was) to DFA/New York dated 29 July 1986.
 - (2) A copy of a letter from the Director, Office of the Under Secretaries General for Political Affairs (UN/New York) to the Charge d'Affairs of the Permanent Mission of Australia to the UN dated 24 June 1987.
 - (3) The letter of application for an exemption under the SDA from Mr Roy Farmer (Deputy Commissioner/AFP Operations, on behalf of the Commissioner AFP) to the Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission dated 8 March 1989.
- C. The Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission's reasons for granting the exemption are as follows:
 - (1) By adopting the practice of limiting female participation in the AUSTCIVPOL force to a maximum of one out of twenty positions and restricting the duties of that female officer to administrative duties only, the Commissioner AFP is prima facie discriminating against female AFP employees under the SDA, and therefore that practice is one for which an exemption from the operation of specified SDA provisions may be sought.
 - (2) By granting the exemption for a period of six months the Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission believes that the AFP is thereby afforded an opportunity to bring its selection practices into accord with the Sex Discrimination Act and the international Convention on the Elimination of Discrimination Against Women.

Subject to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal Act 1975, application may be made to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal for review of this decision by or on behalf of any person or persons whose interests are affected by it.

- (f) thence north-easterly along the geodesic to a point of Latitude 38°26'South, Longitude 140°53'East;
- (g) thence north-easterly along the geodesic to a point of Latitude 38^o15'South, Longitude 140^o57'East; and
- (h) thence north-easterly along the geodesic to the point of commencement.
