PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS
DETERMINATION UNDER SECTION 99L**

No. PB 1 of 1991

I, PETER RICHARD STAPLES, Minister of State for Aged, Family and Health Services, pursuant to section 99L of the National Health Act 1953, hereby make the following Determination:

Commencement

1. This Determination shall come into operation on the date on which it is notified in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette.

Interpretation

2. In this Determination:

"the Act" means the National Health Act 1953;

"the Regulations" means the National Health (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations;

"the Authority" means the Pharmacy Restructuring Authority established under section 99J of the Act;

"pharmacist" has the same meaning as in subsection 4(1) of the Act;

"approved pharmacist" has the same meaning as in subsection 84(1) of the Act;

"PBS prescription" means a prescription for a pharmaceutical benefit supplied in accordance with the Act, the Regulations and the declarations and determinations made under the Act and the Regulations, and includes -

- (a) a prescription written on an authority form pursuant to regulation 13 of the Regulations, subparagraph 14(d) of the declaration made under subsection 85(2) of the Act or subparagraph 10(d) of the determinations made under sections 85, 85A and 88 of the Act; and
- (b) a repeat authorization under regulation 26 of the Regulations; and
- (c) a deferred supply authorization under regulation 26A of the Regulations; and
- (d) an order form under regulation 16 of the Regulations for the supply of a pharmaceutical benefit to a medical practitioner for the purpose of section 93 of the Act;

"RPBS prescription" means a prescription for a pharmaceutical benefit supplied in accordance with a scheme given effect to by an instrument made pursuant to section 91 of the Veterans' Entitlement Act 1986 and includes -

- (a) a prescription written on a prior approval form; and
- (b) a repeat authorization; and
- (c) a deferred supply authorization.

Applications for Approval to Supply Pharmaceutical Benefits

3. For the purposes of paragraph 99K(1)(b) of the Act, the following are guidelines with which the Authority must comply in making a recommendation on an application by a pharmacist under section 90 of the Act:
- (a) approval of a pharmacist shall not be recommended in respect of premises located within 5 kilometres by normal access routes from other premises in respect of which a pharmacist is already approved;
 - (b) approval of a pharmacist in respect of particular premises shall not be recommended unless the pharmacist demonstrates to the Authority that there is a definite unmet public need for that approval;
 - (c) approval of a pharmacist in respect of particular premises shall not be recommended (except in the circumstances provided for in subparagraph (d)) if those premises are situated within 5 kilometres by normal access routes of other premises in respect of which there has been granted financial assistance under section 99ZD or 99ZE of the Act;
 - (d) approval of a pharmacist in respect of particular premises shall be recommended where those premises are located not more than 500 metres from other premises in respect of which that pharmacist is already approved under section 90 of the Act and from which the pharmacist proposes to cease supplying pharmaceutical benefits;
 - (e) approval of a pharmacist in respect of particular premises shall be recommended where those premises are located more than 500 metres but not more than 5 kilometres by normal access routes from other premises in respect of which that pharmacist is already approved under section 90 of the Act and from which the pharmacist proposes to cease supplying pharmaceutical benefits, provided that -
 - (i) there has been no grant of financial assistance made under section 99ZD or 99ZE of the Act in respect of any other premises situated within 5 kilometres by normal access routes from the first-named premises; and
 - (ii) the pharmacist demonstrates to the Authority that there is a definite unmet public need for that approval;
 - (f) approval of a pharmacist in respect of particular premises shall be recommended where a pharmacist is approved under section 90 of the Act in respect of those premises and where that approval is to be cancelled immediately prior to the granting of the first-named approval, as a consequence of a change of ownership arrangements of the premises;

- (g) notwithstanding anything contained in subparagraphs (a) to (f), approval of a pharmacist in respect of particular premises shall be recommended where the pharmacist entered into a financial commitment prior to 9 August 1990 (being the date on which the granting by the Secretary of approvals to pharmacists under section 90 of the Act was restricted pending the passage of legislation for pharmacy restructuring) in the expectation that an approval would be granted in respect of those premises, provided that the Authority is satisfied that there was such a prior commitment and the pharmacist produces to the Authority either -
- (i) a bank statement, supported if necessary by an affidavit by the pharmacist's solicitor or accountant; or
 - (ii) details of any contractual arrangements together with an affidavit by the pharmacist's solicitor or accountant attesting to the correctness of the date that commitment was entered into.

Applications for Essential Pharmacy Allowance

4. For the purposes of paragraph 99K(1)(c) of the Act, the following are guidelines with which the Authority must comply in making a recommendation on an application by an approved pharmacist for the payment of an essential pharmacy allowance under section 99ZB of the Act:
- (a) payment of an essential pharmacy allowance to an approved pharmacist shall be recommended in respect of approved premises -
 - (i) for which the average monthly prescription volume was not more than 1,250 during the year commencing on 1 July 1989 and ending on 30 June 1990; and
 - (ii) at which services for the supply of pharmaceutical benefits are available for not less than 20 hours per week; and
 - (iii) which are situated not less than 10 kilometres by normal access routes from the nearest other premises in respect of which a pharmacist is approved;
 - (b) for the purposes of subparagraph (a)(i) "prescription volume" means the aggregate of the number of PBS prescriptions and the number of RPBS prescriptions processed by the Health Insurance Commission on behalf of the Commonwealth during the relevant period, but excludes any prescription for a pharmaceutical benefit the supply and receipt of which is deemed, by virtue of subsection 99(2A), (2AB) or (2B) of the Act, to be a supply and receipt otherwise than under Part VII of the Act (except for the purposes of Division 1A of that Part);
 - (c) the provisions of subparagraph (a) shall be subject to annual review by the Minister and the Pharmacy Guild of Australia;
 - (d) an approved pharmacist to whom the payment of an essential pharmacy allowance has been approved shall be required to make an annual application under subsection 99ZB(1) of the Act for the continued payment of the allowance;
 - (e) the payment of an essential pharmacy allowance may be recommended to be made to an approved pharmacist who is also receiving an isolated pharmacy allowance under section 100 of the Act in respect of the same premises;

- (f) an approved pharmacist who receives an essential pharmacy allowance under section 99ZB of the Act shall not be eligible for a grant of financial assistance under section 99ZD or 99ZE of the Act;
- (g) notwithstanding the provisions of subparagraph (a), the Authority may take special circumstances into account in considering an application under subsection 99ZB(1) of the Act.

Applications for Amalgamation and Closure Payments

5. For the purposes of paragraph 99K(1)(d) of the Act, the following are guidelines with which the Authority must comply in making a recommendation on an application by approved pharmacists for financial assistance under section 99ZD of the Act in consequence of an agreement for the amalgamation of the premises in respect of which they are approved, or on an application by an approved pharmacist for financial assistance under section 99ZE of the Act in consequence of a proposal to cease supplying pharmaceutical benefits from the premises in respect of which the pharmacist is approved:
- (a) a grant of financial assistance under section 99ZD or 99ZE of the Act shall be recommended only in respect of each cancellation of approval of a pharmacist resulting in a reduction in the number of premises in respect of which pharmacists are approved under section 90 of the Act;
 - (b) a grant of financial assistance under section 99ZD or 99ZE of the Act shall not be recommended to be made to an approved pharmacist unless the pharmacist agrees in writing to make redundancy payments to staff in accordance with the staff redundancy arrangements agreed to by the Minister and the Pharmacy Guild of Australia and advised to the Australian Council of Trade Unions;
 - (c) a grant of financial assistance under section 99ZD or 99ZE of the Act shall not be recommended where the pharmacist approved in respect of the premises was granted that approval after 30 June 1989;
 - (d) a grant of financial assistance under section 99ZD or 99ZE of the Act shall not be recommended in respect of premises for which an essential pharmacy allowance has been approved under section 99ZB of the Act;
 - (e) a grant of financial assistance under section 99ZD or 99ZE of the Act shall not be recommended in respect of premises which would qualify, in accordance with subparagraph 4(a) of this determination, for the payment of an essential pharmacy allowance under section 99ZB of the Act;
 - (f) the grant of financial assistance under section 99ZD or 99ZE of the Act will be made to the pharmacist approved in respect of the premises from which pharmaceutical benefits will no longer be supplied;

(g) the amount of a grant of financial assistance under section 99ZD or 99ZE of the Act, from which any staff redundancy payments referred to in subparagraph (b) shall be made, shall be ascertained in accordance with the following table:

<u>Years</u>	<u>Amount of Grant</u>
1 - 3	\$45,000
4 - 5	\$50,000
6 - 7	\$55,000
8 - 9	\$60,000
10 - 11	\$65,000
12 - 13	\$70,000
14 - 15	\$75,000
more than 15	\$80,000

(h) for the purposes of subparagraph (g), "years" means the number of continuous completed years as at 1 January 1991 that the pharmacist has been approved in respect of particular premises or other premises situated not more than 500 metres by normal access routes from the premises in respect of which the pharmacist is approved at that date;

(i) for the purposes of subparagraph (g), "years" in relation to premises in respect of which the approved pharmacist is a partnership means the number of continuous completed years during which the longest serving current member of the partnership has been approved in respect of the premises;

(j) consistent with the procedures of the Authority, the grant of financial assistance under section 99ZD or 99ZE of the Act shall be made within 30 days of the date on which the approval of the pharmacist is cancelled.



1. This Notice may be cited as Fisheries Notice No. GAB 1.

REVOCATION OF FISHERIES NOTICES 187 AND 187A

2. Fisheries Notice No. 187, published in *Gazette* No. S173 dated 10 July 1987 and Fisheries Notice No. 187A published in *Gazette* No. S393 dated 30 December 1989 are revoked.

INTERPRETATION

- 3.1 In this Notice, unless the contrary intention appears, words have the same meaning as in the *Fisheries Act 1952* and "the Act" means the *Fisheries Act 1952*
- 3.2 Where for the purposes of this Notice it is necessary to determine the position on the surface of the Earth of a point, line or area, that position shall be determined by reference to the Australian Geodetic Datum, that is by reference to a spheroid having its centre at the centre of the Earth and a major (equatorial) radius of 6,378,160 metres and a flattening of 1/298.25 and by reference to the Johnston Geodetic Station in the Northern Territory of Australia. That station shall be taken to be situated

at Latitude 25°56'54.5515" South and at Longitude 133°12'30.0771" East and to have a ground level of 571.2 metres above the spheroid referred to above.

PROHIBITION OF TRAWLING OR DREDGING

- 4.1 Pursuant to paragraph 8(1)(c) of the Act, the taking of fish in the areas of proclaimed waters specified in parts 1 and 2 of Schedule 1 of this Notice by the method known as trawling is prohibited.
- 4.2 Pursuant to paragraph 8(1)(c) of the Act, the taking of fish in the areas of proclaimed waters specified in parts 1 and 2 of Schedule 1 of this Notice by the method known as dredging is prohibited.

ENDORSEMENT OF LICENCES

5. Pursuant to paragraph 8(4D)(b) of the Act, the activities prohibited by subparagraph 4.1 of this Notice in the area of proclaimed waters specified in part 1 of Schedule 1 to this Notice are activities in respect of which an endorsement may be made under subsection 9(4) of the Act.

EXEMPTIONS FROM PROHIBITION

6. Pursuant to paragraph 8(2)(d) of the Act the taking of scallops in the area specified in Schedule 2 of this Notice by persons holding a licence granted pursuant to the Fisheries Act 1905 of Western Australia which is endorsed under Western Australian Fisheries Notice No. 363 by the method known as trawling with the use of a boat and a trawl net the mesh of which is 100 millimetres or greater when measured in accordance with either Manner A or Manner B specified in Schedule 3 to this Notice is exempt from the prohibition in paragraph 4 of this Notice in the area of proclaimed waters specified in part 1 of Schedule 1 to this Notice during the period from 1 March to 30 November in each year.

SAVING

7. Pursuant to subsection 8(4DAA) of the Act, notwithstanding the revocation of the Fisheries Notices No 187 and No 187A, any endorsement made under subsection 9(4) of the Act which would have effect in relation to the prohibitions contained in those notices shall continue to have effect until which time as an endorsement is issued pursuant to this Notice or until such time as the endorsement would otherwise have ceased to have effect.

MANNER A

Manner of measuring mesh of net:

1. Immediately before a measurement is taken, the part of the net to be measured shall be soaked in fresh or salt water for not less than five minutes.
2. The part of the net to be measured shall then be suspended vertically and a weight of 3170 grams shall be suspended from one knot of that part of the net.
3. The distance between the surface of the knot from which the weight is suspended and the surface of the knot in the diagonally opposite corner of the mesh immediately above the first-mentioned knot shall be measured with a metal rule to the nearest millimetre.
4. The measurement of the mesh shall be taken to be the average measurement of ten adjacent meshes at any place in the net.

MANNER B

Manner of measuring the mesh of a net:

1. Immediately before a measurement is taken, the part of the net to be measured shall be soaked in fresh or salt water for not less than five minutes.
2. The part of the net to be measured shall be suspended vertically. The distance between the surface of a knot and the surface of the knot diagonally opposite the first-mentioned knot in the same mesh shall be measured by means of a device designed for measuring the mesh of nets by means of two arms, the upper of which, when the device is in use, shall be fixed to the body of the device and the lower of which, when the device is in use, shall-
 - (a) be directly below the upper;
 - (b) move freely in relation to the upper; and
 - (c) have a weight of 3170 grams acting on it.
3. The device shall be suspended in such a manner as to ensure that the upper edge shall remain in a fixed position and that the lower edge may move freely in relation to the upper edge, within the confines of the mesh to be measured.

4. The device shall be equipped with a scale from which the distance between the upper edge of the upper arm and the lower edge of the lower arm can be ascertained at any time to the nearest millimetre.
5. The measurement of the mesh shall be taken to be the average measurement to ten adjacent meshes at any place in the net.

NOTICE OF INQUIRY

SUBMISSIONS INVITED

The Australian Broadcasting Tribunal has commenced an inquiry into the acquisition by Kimshaw Pty Ltd ("Kimshaw") of Radio 2UE Sydney Pty Ltd ("Radio 2UE"), licensee of commercial radio station 2UE.

Radio 2UE was previously 100% owned by TCN Channel 9 Pty Ltd. The Kimshaw acquisition took place on 27 September 1990, one day before the restructuring of Bond Media Ltd and the gaining of control of the Nine Network by interests associated with Mr Kerry Packer.

The issues to be considered in the share transaction inquiry are whether, if the application were for consent to the transfer of the licence under s.89A of the Broadcasting Act 1942, the Tribunal should refuse consent having regard particularly to:

- (a) whether it would be advisable in the public interest to refuse to approve the transaction because:
 - (i) the applicant is not a fit and proper person to hold the licence;
 - (ii) the applicant does not have the necessary financial, technical and management capabilities;
 - (iii) the applicant is not otherwise capable of complying with the conditions of the licence;

- (b) whether, if consent was given, contraventions of s.90C (limitation of interests), s.90F (limitations of directorships), s.90G (foreign ownership provisions), s.92JB (limitation of cross media interests), or s.92JD (limitations of cross media directorships) would occur; One matter relevant to this issue is whether the structure by which Kimshaw has acquired 2UE has successfully distanced 2UE from the control of TCN Channel 9 Pty Ltd which in turn is controlled by Mr Packer and interests associated with him. If these persons are found to control both TCN Sydney and 2UE, then any common directors would appear to be in contravention amounting to offences of the relevant cross-media directorship provisions of the Act (s.92JD(1) and s.92JD(4)).

(c) whether the Tribunal is satisfied that the giving of consent would be contrary to a provision of the Act.



1. This Notice may be cited as Fisheries Notice No. GEM 3

SAVING OF FISHERIES NOTICES

2. This notice does not revoke any prohibitions contained in Fisheries Notices:
 - (a) Nos. 142 and 143, published in Gazette No. S180 dated 28 May 1985; and
 - (b) Nos. SET 1, SET 2 and SET 3.

INTERPRETATION

- 3.1 In this Notice, unless the contrary intention appears, words have the same meaning as in the Fisheries Act 1952 and "the Act" means the Fisheries Act 1952.
- 3.2 Where for the purpose of this Notice it is necessary to determine the position on the surface of the Earth of a point, line or area, that position shall be determined by reference to the Australian Geodetic Datum, that is by reference to the spheroid having its centre at the centre of the Earth and a major (equatorial) radius of 6,378,160 metres and flattening of 1/298.25 and by reference to the

Johnston Geodetic Station in the Northern Territory of Australia. That station shall be taken to be situated at latitude 25 56'54.5515" South and at Longitude 133 12'30.0771" East and to have a ground level of 571.2 metres above the spheroid referred to above.

PROHIBITION OF TAKING OF GEMFISH

4. Pursuant to paragraph 8(1)(c) of the Act, the taking of gemfish (Rexea solandri) from the area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 1 of this Notice by any method is prohibited.

EXEMPTION

5. A person who is the holder of a licence which permits the taking of fish in the area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 1 is exempted from the prohibition specified in paragraph 4, provided that the person does not take more than 100 kilograms of gemfish (Rexea solandri) during the same fishing trip.

SCHEDULE 1

AREA OF GEMFISH FISHERY

The area of proclaimed waters contained within the area bounded by a line:

- (1) commencing at the intersection of the meridian of Longitude 146 22' East by the southern shore of Australia at low-water mark;
 - (2) running thence south along that meridian to its intersection with the shore of northern Tasmania at low-water mark;
 - (3) thence generally westerly and southerly along the shore of Tasmania at low-water mark to its intersection with the parallel of latitude 43 South;
 - (4) thence west along that parallel to its intersection by the boundary of the Australian fishing zone;
 - (5) thence generally southerly, easterly, northerly, easterly, westerly and northerly along the boundary of the Australian fishing zone to its intersection east of Australia, by the parallel of Latitude 33 35' South;
 - (6) thence west along that parallel to its intersection by the eastern shore of Australia at low-water mark; and
 - (7) thence generally southerly and westerly along the shore of Australia at low-water mark to the point of commencement.

**DUMPING INVESTIGATION PLASTER OF PARIS BANDAGES FROM THE
FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY**

**CUSTOMS ACT 1901
NOTICE UNDER SUB-SECTION 269 TC(4)**

I, Richard John Hunt, delegate of the Comptroller-General of Customs have accepted an application under sub-section 269TB(1) of the Customs Act 1901, which alleges that there are reasonable grounds to initiate an investigation into the alleged injurious dumping of exports of plaster of Paris bandages from the Federal Republic of Germany.


The application was lodged by Smith & Nephew (Australia) Pty Ltd.

The goods under reference are classified under sub-heading 3005.90.90 (statistical code 34) in Schedule 3 to the Customs Tariff Act 1987. The rate of duty is 5 per cent.

The Australian Customs Service (Customs) will prepare a preliminary finding on the application within 120 days of the publication of this notice. If the finding is that there are sufficient grounds for publication of a dumping duty notice, provisional measures (involving the taking of securities under section 42 of the Customs Act 1901) will be imposed. A positive preliminary finding would be referred to the Anti-Dumping Authority for further investigation and report to the Minister (within 120 days) on whether dumping duties should be imposed.

Australian Customs Notice (ACN) No.91/9 is to be published notifying initiation of the investigation and the procedures involved. Copies of the ACN are available from the Publications Sections, Customs House, Canberra or Customs offices in each capital city.

All interested parties are invited to lodge written submissions with Mr Jim Sundstrom, Dumping Operations, Australian Customs Service, Customs House, 5 Constitution Avenue, Canberra ACT 2601, no later than 27 February 1991.
