OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

IT is notified for general information that His Excellency the Governor-General has varied the conditions of eligibility of service by members of the Australian Defence Force with the multinational military deployment in the Persian Gulf for the awards of the Australian Active Service Medal and the Australian Service Medal with Clasps "KUWAIT" as detailed in the following Declarations:

COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA

AUSTRALIAN SERVICE MEDAL REGULATIONS

DECLARATION UNDER REGULATION 3

DETERMINATION UNDER SUBREGULATION 4(2)

I, WILLIAM GEORGE HAYDEN, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Minister of State for Defence Science and Personnel, hereby:

- (a) revoke the Declaration and Determination made on 20 November 1990 under regulation 3 and subregulation 4(2) respectively of the Australian Service Medal Regulations set out in the Schedule to Letters Patent dated 13 September 1988;
- (b) under regulation 3 of those Regulations, declare the multinational military deployment in the Persian Gulf in the period that commenced on 2 August 1990 and ended on 16 January 1991, and in the period that commenced on 1 March 1991, to be a prescribed operation for the purposes of those Regulations; and
- (c) under subregulation 4(2) of those Regulations, determine that the conditions for the award of the Australian Service Medal in respect of that prescribed operation are:
 - (i) the Medal may be awarded to a member of the Australian Defence Force who rendered military service as such a member in the prescribed operational area of the Persian Gulf while posted to or serving in connection with the military deployment for a period of not less than an aggregate of 60 days during the prescribed eligibility periods;

- (ii) the Medal may be awarded to Australian Defence Force personnel who are serving on exchange or secondment with Foreign Defence Forces and who render military service in the prescribed operational area of the Persian Gulf while posted to or serving in connection with the military deployment for a period of not less than an aggregate of 60 days during the prescribed eligibility periods;
- (iii) the qualifying period of service as described in subparagraph (c)(i) or (ii) may be deemed by the Chief of the Defence Force or his delegate to have been established notwithstanding that the member has been posted to or has served in the prescribed operational area of the Persian Gulf in connection with the military deployment for a period of less than an aggregate of 60 days during the prescribed eligibility periods;
- (iv) the Medal shall be awarded to members qualifying under subparagraphs (c)(i) or (c)(ii) or (c)(iii) with the clasp 'Kuwait';
- (v) the Chief of the Defence Force in exercising his discretion to deem under subparagraph (c)(iii) shall take into account whether the member's service with the military deployment in the Persian Gulf:
 - (A) was terminated owing to death, evacuation owing to illness or injury or other disability due to service;
 - (B) was terminated due to Government or Defence Force reasons; or
 - (C) was terminated due to Foreign Government or Foreign Defence Force reasons;
- (vi) a reference in this paragraph to the prescribed operational area is a reference to the operational area referred to in Clause 2 of Determination 3989 Gulf Allowance made under Section 58B of the Defence Act 1903, as in force at the date of this instrument; and

- (vii) a reference in this paragraph to the prescribed eligibility periods is a reference to the period that commenced on 2 August 1990 and ended on 16 January 1991 and the period that commenced on 1 March 1991.

COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA

AUSTRALIAN ACTIVE SERVICE MEDAL REGULATIONS

DECLARATION UNDER REGULATION 3

DETERMINATION UNDER SUBREGULATION 4(2)

I, WILLIAM GEORGE HAYDEN, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Minister of State for Defence Science and Personnel, hereby:

- (a) revoke the Declaration and Determination made on 26 February 1991 under regulation 3 and subregulation 4(2) respectively of the Australian Active Service Medal Regulations set out in the Schedule to Letters Patent dated 13 September 1988;
- (b) under regulation 3 of those Regulations declare the multinational military deployment in the Persian Gulf in the period that commenced on 17 January 1991 and ended on 28 February 1991 to be a prescribed warlike operation for the purposes of those Regulations; and

- (c) under subregulation 4(2) of those Regulations, determine that the conditions for the award of the Australian Active Service Medal in respect of that prescribed warlike operation are:
- (i) the Medal may be awarded to a member of the Australian Defence Force who rendered service as such a member for a prescribed period in the prescribed operational area while posted to a ship or unit of the Australian Defence Force which is assigned for duty of a continuing nature within that area in connection with the multinational military deployment;
 - (ii) the Medal may be awarded to a member of the Australian Defence Force who served on exchange or secondment with a Foreign Defence Force and who rendered service as such a member for a prescribed period in the prescribed operational area while posted to a ship or unit assigned for duty of a continuing nature within that area in connection with the multinational military deployment;
 - (iii) the Medal may be awarded to a member of the Australian Defence Force who rendered service during the period that commenced on 17 January 1991 and ended on 28 February 1991 by performing one operational sortie over the prescribed operational area as a member of the crew of a military aircraft on a combat mission operating in connection with the multinational military deployment;
 - (iv) the Medal may be awarded to a member of the Australian Defence Force who rendered service as such a member for a period of 30 days, or for periods amounting in the aggregate to 30 days, for official visits, inspections or other occurrences of a temporary nature on duty in the prescribed operational area during the period that commenced on 17 January 1991 and ended on 28 February 1991;
 - (v) the Medal may be awarded to accredited members of approved Australian philanthropic organisations attached to the multinational military deployment forces in the prescribed operational area in an official capacity for full time duty in uniform if they have rendered service for a prescribed period with forces engaged in the operations;


- (vi) the qualifying period of service as described in subparagraph (c)(i), (ii), (iii) or (iv) may be deemed by the Chief of the Defence Force or his delegate to have been established notwithstanding that the member has not met the qualifying periods described;
- (vii) the Medal shall be awarded to members of the Australian Defence Force qualifying under subparagraphs (c)(i) or (c)(ii) or (c)(iii) or (c)(iv) with the clasp 'KUWAIT';
- (viii) the Chief of the Defence Force in exercising his discretion to deem under subparagraph (c)(vi) shall take into account whether the member's service with the military deployment in the Persian Gulf:
 - (A) was terminated owing to death, evacuation owing to illness or injury or other disability due to service;
 - (B) was terminated due to Government or Defence Force reasons; or
 - (C) was terminated due to Foreign Government or Foreign Defence Force reasons;
- (ix) eligibility for the award of the Medal shall not be affected by the grant of any other award for service in the prescribed operational area;
- (x) a reference in this paragraph to the prescribed operational area is a reference to the operational area referred to in Clause 2 of Determination 3989 Gulf Allowance, made under section 58B of the Defence Act 1903, as in force at the date of this instrument; and

- (xi) a reference in this paragraph to a prescribed period is a reference to a period of one day or more during the period that commenced on 17 January 1991 and ended on 28 February 1991.

Summary of Reasons for Proposed Publication:

1. The Trade Practices Act 1974 provides that where:
 - (a) a period of 18 months has elapsed after the date of publication of a notice in the Gazette declaring goods to be unsafe goods; and
 - (b) there is not a prescribed consumer products safety standard in respect of the goods,
 the Minister may, by notice in writing published in the Gazette, impose a permanent ban on the goods.
2. A notice imposing an eighteen month ban on the supply of chewing tobacco and snuffs intended for oral use under section 65C(5) of the Trade Practices Act 1974 was published in Gazette No.S324 of 12 October 1989.
3. There is no consumer product safety standard prescribed in respect of the goods.
4. The International Agency for Research on Cancer and the Advisory Committee to the US Surgeon-General have concluded that users of oral smokeless tobacco products have greatly increased risks of contracting oral cancers.
5. The World Health Organisation has recommended a global and pre-emptive ban on all smokeless tobacco products on the basis of studies showing that these products cause cancer of the oral cavity.
6. The National Health and Medical Research Council has noted that medical and toxicological data clearly associated smokeless tobacco products with tumours of the mouth and jaw.
