

Pursuant to Regulation 2 of the Therapeutic Goods Regulations (Statutory Rules 1990 No.394) I, DAVID GRAHAM, delegate of the Secretary to the Department of Health, Housing and Community Services for the purposes of the definition of "Therapeutic Goods Advertising Code" (hereinafter referred to as "the Code") under that Regulation, MAKE AND PUBLISH the following changes to the Code:

- (a) the changes described below in Column 2 under the heading "Amendments" that correspond to the description of the provision or provisions of the Code to be amended as set out in Column 1 under the heading "Code as defined under R.2"; and
- (b) replacement of "Addendum 2" to the Code, in operation immediately before the date of this Notice, with the new "ADDENDUM 2" as set out below.

The changes described in paragraphs (a) and (b) above have been approved by the Media Council of Australia on 24 July 1991 and, for the purposes of the Therapeutic Goods Regulations, shall commence to operate from 5 August 1991.

INTRODUCTION

All advertisements for Therapeutic Goods (the definition for which appears as Clause 2 of this Code) must be cleared for publication or broadcast by the designated clearance body for each media. The Broadcasting Act 1942 imposes an additional requirement for advertisements relating to medicines proposed for broadcast on commercial radio or television which must be pre-cleared before submission to the designated clearance body.

ADMINISTRATION OF CODE

AIR MEDIA

Effective March 1, 1991, under Section 100 (7) of the BROADCASTING ACT 1942, the Secretary of the Department of Community Services and Health delegated his power to approve the text of proposed advertisements for commercial radio and television relating to medicines to the PROPRIETARY MEDICINES ASSOCIATION OF AUSTRALIA INCORPORATED (PMAA).

The PMAA will pre-clear scripts for radio and television as follows:

For "medicines" as defined by the Broadcasting Act (i.e. drugs within the meaning of the Therapeutic Goods Regulations for human use).

All advertisements submitted for pre-clearance are subject to a pre-clearance fee. Details can be obtained from the PMAA.

FARB and FACTS reserve the right to refer advertisements submitted for clearance under this Code, other than for medicines, to a body for advice which, for the time being, is the PMAA. ANY FEE ASSOCIATED WITH THAT REFERRAL SHALL BE AT THE ADVERTISER'S COST. THE ADVERTISER WILL BE ADVISED BEFORE ANY REFERRAL IS MADE.

CONFIDENTIALITY

Except as provided below, the PMAA accepts scripts and supporting material on a strictly confidential basis and therefore will not divulge or discuss their contents with anyone outside the PMAA Secretariat other than:

- (a) when advising FACTS and FARB of approval or disapproval of the material submitted
- (b) when participating in the review or appeals process detailed below.

MATERIAL REQUIREMENTS

On all scripts for radio and television, space should be left at the bottom of each page in order that any stamp by the PMAA or any written comments may be inserted without obscuring any of the script.

Each advertisement submitted for approval should be accompanied by a copy of the label, carton and any package insert used in conjunction with the packaging and distribution of the goods. Where the labelling text is printed directly upon a container, a statement of its wording will suffice. If the active ingredients are not shown on the label, details of these should also be supplied.

Radio scripts must be submitted to the PMAA. When the script is approved the original will be held by the PMAA and copy stamped "approved" will be returned to the advertiser. This script, bearing the original PMAA approval stamp, together with a duplicate script and a reel-to-reel tape if recorded, must be then submitted to FARB for clearance prior to broadcast.

Television scripts and, if possible storyboards must be submitted to the PMAA in triplicate. When the script is approved the originals will be held by the PMAA, one copy stamped "Approved" will be returned to the advertiser and one copy stamped "Approved" will be forwarded to FACTS.

Television materials should be submitted in a form that allows the relationship of visual and audio - one to the other - to be readily understood and to clearly indicate the intended interpretation. When the script is returned to the advertiser and FACTS their attention may be drawn to any scenes which the PMAA feels may be open to "misinterpretation" by dramatisation in the video, or any amendments required in audio.

When finished advertisements are submitted in the ordinary course of approval to FACTS or FARB, they will be reviewed in the light of any of the PMAA's comments on the approved script. If FACTS or FARB believe a "misinterpretation" has occurred, FACTS or FARB may at their discretion withhold acceptance of the commercial until necessary adjustments have been made by the advertiser.

REVIEW PROCEDURES

Section 100 (9) of the BROADCASTING ACT 1942 gives any advertiser the right to appeal to the Minister for Transport and Communications against a decision of the PMAA not to approve an advertisement for medicines.

As an integral part of the pre-clearance process for advertisements for medicines, the PMAA makes available to advertisers a "review process" which involves the Therapeutic Goods Advertising Code Council (TGACC). An advertiser may elect to use the TGACC "review process" before considering a more formal appeal to the Minister as provided above.

If after full discussion with the advertiser or agency the PMAA Advertising Services Manager forms the view that the PMAA could not approve the script of a proposed advertisement, the advertiser will be advised within 10 working days of the receipt of the application for approval.

At that stage the advertiser may decide to have the PMAA refer the script and supporting material to the TGACC for review by giving written notice to the PMAA within 5 working days. Any additional written material provided to the TGACC by the PMAA will also be provided to the advertiser.

If within 5 working days of being advised of the PMAA's preliminary view, a notice is not received of the advertiser's intentions, the PMAA will make a final decision based upon the preliminary view.

Within 15 working days of the receipt of all formal documentation (or at the discretion of the Chairman, oral submissions) the TGACC will advise the PMAA and the advertiser of the results of its review.

If the TGACC review suggests the script should not be approved, the PMAA must within 60 days of the receipt of the original application, proceed to a final decision and advise the advertiser accordingly.

If the TGACC review suggests that the script in its original form (or with appropriate amendments) should be approved, the PMAA will take into account the TGACC views, and must within 60 days of the receipt of the original application proceed to a final decision and advise the advertiser accordingly.

None of the above review process will in any way limit the advertiser's statutory right of appeal to the Minister for Transport and Communications, following a final decision of the PMAA.

In the event of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have the casting vote. Such committee shall give the advertiser and the relevant clearance body reasonable notice of the date of the meeting at which such appeal is to be determined which notice shall invite written submissions to be lodged with the Executive Director of the Advertising Standards Council before such date. In reaching a decision, the committee shall have regard to the written submissions if any, made by the relevant clearance body and the advertiser or its advertising agent as the case may be, and any other matter it considers relevant. Such committee shall deliberate in camera and shall maintain strict confidentiality in relation to its proceedings. The committee shall not receive oral submissions unless directed by the Chairman. Such direction shall only be given if the Chairman considers the circumstances to be exceptional. In that event, the committee shall give

the advertiser and the relevant clearance body reasonable notice of the time and place of the meeting.

LEGAL OBLIGATIONS

All advertisers of goods for therapeutic use should familiarise themselves with all Acts, Regulations and Standards of the Commonwealth, States and Territories to ensure that their advertisements conform.



- A The Federation shall consist of an unlimited number of persons howsoever described who are employed, usually employed or qualified to be and desirous of being employed or seeking to be employed in or in connection with the industry or industries, and/or occupation, and/or calling, and/or vocations, and/or industrial pursuits of:
- (a) teachers, teacher-librarians and librarians including persons exercising supervisory and/or counselling and/or advisory functions at schools and colleges conducted anywhere in Australia, its Territories and States by any person, body, corporation, religious institution, or group or combination of persons other than schools and colleges conducted by the Government of a State or Territory or by the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia or conducted by a public body established by a Government of a State or Territory or the Commonwealth;
 - (b) without limiting the generality of the foregoing, any person in Victoria and South Australia acting in any capacity as an assistant, aide or helper to any person described in paragraph (a) herein;
 - (c) any person employed as an advisor, supervisor or educational officer by any Authority responsible for the conduct or supervision of a non-government school or any group of such schools (excluding, however, all employees of the Government of any State, Territory or of the Commonwealth, and any Public or Statutory Authority, Board or Commission established by such Governments);

- (ii) employed in or by any institution being a College of Advanced Education as defined by the Remuneration Tribunals Act 1973 (as amended) and the Tertiary Education Commission Act 1977 (as amended) or any Act replacing either such Act; or who is employed in or by the Victorian College of Agriculture and Horticulture, the Australian Film and Television School, the Australian Maritime College, the West Australian College of Performing Arts, the Victorian College of the Arts, or McAuley College, other than school teachers who are employed on a part-time (non-fractional) basis in the supervision and/or co-ordination of student teachers during their periods of practice teaching in schools.
- (iii) employed or usually employed in or by any university or university college, other than school teachers who are employed on a part-time (non-fractional) basis in the supervision and/or co-ordination of student teachers during their periods of practice teaching in schools.
- (iv) employed in teaching or supervising teaching in day training centres registered pursuant to the Mental Health Act 1959 (Vic) or any Act in substitution or amendment thereof;
- (v) employed in houses of religious and clerical formation;
- (vi) in the State of Victoria any person who is employed in the occupation of a Kindergarten Teacher or who is employed in such other occupation for which a necessary condition of employment is to be qualified as a Kindergarten Teacher or who is employed in the occupation of a Pre-School Play Leader at any Government subsidised pre-school centre;

caretaking; child minding centres; cleaners; day nursery; dentists; dental mechanics; dental therapists; dental assistants and attendants; domestic work; domestic workers; domestic staff; groundsman or yardman of denominational schools; gardening; gatekeeping; greenkeeping; laundry workers and/or laundrettes; messengers; motor car cleaning, washing or greasing; parking attendants; hospitals; cooks, kitchen hands, waitresses, housemaids, and like workers directly engaged in the provision of food and board in the conduct of boarding establishments, hostels or any other type of accommodation and/or catering; persons designated as attendants and/or assistants and performing work which is otherwise covered by the foregoing listed ancillary industries and/or industrial pursuits.

- (2) No person, firm or company shall be eligible for membership of the Association if -
- (a) Such person, firm or company is principally concerned in a manufacturing or fabricating business or undertaking; or
- (b) He/she, or in the case of a firm or company, a partner, director or proprietor of such firm or company is a member of an organisation of employees registered in or in connexion with an industry which is substantially connected with any part of the industry defined in rule 3 hereof.





INITIATION OF INQUIRIES INTO THE ALLEGED DUMPING AND
SUBSIDISATION OF DRIED EGG WHITE FROM THE NETHERLANDS AND
ITALY AND THE ALLEGED DUMPING OF DRIED EGG WHITE FROM SWEDEN

I, BRIAN GALLAGHER, delegate of the Comptroller-General of Customs have examined an application made by the Victorian Egg Marketing Board, under sub-section 269TB(1) of the Customs Act 1901, and am satisfied there are reasonable grounds to initiate an inquiry into the allegation that dumped and subsidised exports of Dried Egg White (DEW) from the Netherlands and Italy and dumped exports from Sweden are causing and threatening material injury to the Australian industry.

The goods under inquiry are Dried Egg White (spray dried or dried by any other method) classified under sub-heading 3502.10.00 (statistical code 03) in Schedule 3 to the Customs Tariff Act . 1987. The rate of duty is free.

Known producers of the goods in Australia are the Victorian Egg Marketing Board (Farm Pride Products) and Good Foods Australia Limited.

The Australian Customs Service (Customs) will make a preliminary finding on the application as soon as possible and within 100 days after publication of this notice. If the finding is that there are sufficient grounds for the publication of a dumping and/or a countervailing duty notice, provisional measures (including the taking of securities under section 42 of the Customs Act 1901) may be imposed. A positive preliminary finding would be referred to the Anti-Dumping Authority for further investigation and report to the Minister (within 120 days) on whether duties should be imposed.

Customs has published Australian Customs Notice (ACN) No. 91/121 notifying the initiation of the inquiry and the procedures involved. Copies of the ACN are available from the Publications Section, Australian Customs Service, Customs House, 5 Constitution Ave, Canberra City, ACT 2601 or from regional offices of Customs in each capital city.

To facilitate the inquiry all interested parties are invited to make submissions in writing in accordance with the appropriate dumping questionnaire. Confidential and non-confidential submissions must be lodged with the Director, Dumping Operations 3, Australian Customs Service, Customs House, 5 Constitution Avenue, Canberra City, ACT 2601, no later than 18 September 1991.

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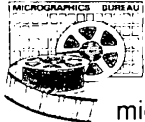
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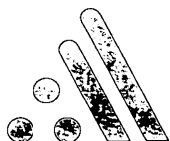
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
