

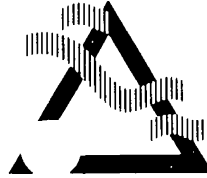



HEALTH INSURANCE ACT 1973

Statement Under Section 106AA

On the twentieth day of July 1988, the Honourable Dr Neal Blewett then Minister of State for Community Services and Health, made a determination under section 106 of the Health Insurance Act 1973, in respect of Dr Lin Fatt Kenneth SOO of 122c Waterloo Corner Road, Paralowie in South Australia.

Particulars of Determination

A copy of the determination is attached.

Reasons for Determination

The determination was made by the Minister on the basis of recommendations made under section 105 of the Act by the Medical Services Committee of Inquiry for the State of South Australia, after its inquiry into the practises of Dr Soo.

The Committee was of the opinion that in respect of the services under inquiry, 584 of the medical services provided were excessive in that they were not reasonably necessary for the adequate medical care of the patients concerned. The Committee arrived at this opinion by referring to the information before it including the statements given by prominent medical practitioners in the field of acupuncture, Dr Soo's evidence and bringing to bear the knowledge and experience of its members.

As was his right, Dr Soo sought a review of the determination by the Medical Services Review Tribunal. The Tribunal affirmed the original determination.

Comments

The Government is seriously concerned by the practice of doctors like Dr Soo who provide services which are not reasonably necessary for the adequate medical care of the patients concerned. Excessive services are a drain on public funds and every effort is being made to reduce the magnitude of the problem.

- (i) under paragraph 105(2)(c) of the Act, the said Lin Fatt Kenneth Soo be reprimanded and I do so reprimand him;
- (ii) under paragraph 105(2)(ca) of the Act, the said Lin Fatt Kenneth Soo be counselled; and

(iii) under paragraph 105(2)(f) of the Act, the amount of Medicare benefits referred to in paragraph (c) herein be payable by the said Lin Fatt Kenneth Soo to the Commonwealth of Australia, being as specified hereunder:

INQUIRY INTO THE GIVING OF DIRECTIONS UNDER SUB-SECTION 92N(1) OF THE BROADCASTING ACT 1942

PUBLIC SUBMISSIONS INVITED

On 31 May 1991, the Australian Broadcasting Tribunal advertised the commencement of an inquiry into whether it should issue directions to Nine Network Australia Limited (NNAL) for the divestiture of part of NNAL's shareholding interest in Telecasters North Queensland Ltd, the licensee of commercial television service TNQ Regional Queensland.

At the time of commencement of that inquiry, NNAL held approximately 21% of the issued shares in TNQ. In addition, NNAL had an agreement with Rockhampton Television Limited (RTL), the licensee of commercial television service RTQ Regional Queensland, for the provision of programs to RTQ. NNAL and RTL entered into this agreement on 27 December 1990.

In relation to the agreement of 27 December 1990, the Tribunal determined that an apparent contravention of sub-s.92(1A) of the Act had been incurred by NNAL as a result of NNAL's controlling interests in TNQ (through its shareholding) and RTQ (through the program supply agreement). Sub-s.92(1A) provides that a person shall not have a prescribed interest in each of two or more commercial television licences in the same approved market.

ISSUES CONSIDERED

The Tribunal's notice of commencement of inquiry advised that, having regard to NNAL's prescribed interest in both TNQ and RTQ, the Tribunal would consider whether it should direct NNAL to reduce its shareholding interest in Telecasters North Queensland Ltd to 15% or less of the paid up value of shares in that company. (A shareholding of 15% or less does not constitute a controlling interest in a licensee company in terms of the Broadcasting Act 1942).

On 28 May 1991, NNAL and RTL entered into a new program supply agreement; this agreement subsists as long as NNAL holds a prescribed interest in TNQ.

NEW ISSUES TO BE CONSIDERED

Pursuant to regulation 12(2) of the Australian Broadcasting Tribunal (Inquiries) Regulations, the Tribunal has determined that it should consider new issues in this inquiry. The Tribunal will consider:

- (a) whether, by virtue of arrangements for the supply of programs by NNAL to RTL, NNAL is in a position to exercise control of the licence for commercial television service RTQ; and
- (b) if NNAL is found to be in a position to exercise control of the RTQ licence, whether the Tribunal should direct NNAL to reduce its shareholding in TNQ to 15% or less of the paid up value of the shares of TNQ in order to end the apparent contravention of sub-s.92(1A) of the Act.

CUSTOMS ACT 1901

PRELIMINARY FINDINGS INTO THE ALLEGED DUMPING OF POLYVINYL CHLORIDE FROM THE ARGENTINE REPUBLIC, THE FEDERATIVE REPUBLIC OF BRAZIL, THE REPUBLIC OF HUNGARY, ISRAEL, THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA, MEXICO, THE REPUBLIC OF POLAND, SINGAPORE, TAIWAN PROVINCE AND THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

On 8 May 1991 a notice was published under sub-section 269TC(4) of the Customs Act 1901 notifying an inquiry into the alleged dumping of polyvinyl chloride (PVC) from the Argentine Republic (Argentina), the Federative Republic of Brazil (Brazil), the Republic of Hungary (Hungary), Israel, the Republic of Korea (Korea), Mexico, the Republic of Poland (Poland), Singapore, Taiwan Province (Taiwan) and the United States of America (USA). Notification was made following an application by ICI Australia Operations Pty Ltd (ICI) and BFGoodrich Chemical Ltd (BFG) for the publication of a dumping duty notice.

I have considered the application, taking into account submissions received and any other matters considered relevant.

NOTICE UNDER SUB-SECTION 269TD(2) OF THE CUSTOMS ACT 1901

I have made a preliminary finding that there are sufficient grounds for the publication of a dumping duty notice in respect of PVC exported from Argentina, Brazil, Israel, Mexico, Taiwan and the USA.

I will within seven days of the publication of this Notice, refer to the Anti-Dumping Authority the question as to whether the publication of a dumping duty notice for PVC exported from Argentina, Brazil, Israel, Mexico, Taiwan and the USA sought by ICI and BFG is so justified, as required by paragraph 269TD(2)(b) of the Customs Act 1901.

I consider it appropriate to require and take securities under section 42 of the Customs Act 1901 in respect of any dumping duty that may become payable on entry for home consumption on or after 17 August 1991 of PVC from Argentina, Brazil, Israel, Mexico, Taiwan and the USA.

NOTICE UNDER SUB-SECTION 269TD(3) OF THE CUSTOMS ACT 1901

In respect of PVC exported from Hungary, Korea, Poland and Singapore, I have made a preliminary finding that there are not sufficient grounds for the publication of a dumping duty notice.

ANTI-DUMPING AUTHORITY

**REVIEW OF THE AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS SERVICE'S
NEGATIVE PRELIMINARY FINDING ON DIOCTYL PHTHALATE
FROM THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA**

The Anti-Dumping Authority (Authority) has completed its review of the above Customs finding.

In its report of June 1991, Customs concluded that dumping had not occurred from Korea during the period the local industry had suffered injury. Customs also concluded that there was no threat of material injury to the Australian industry from dumped exports of dioctyl phthalate from Korea.

Following its review of the Customs finding, the Authority has concluded that there was more dumping from Korea than was found by Customs. The Authority has also concluded that the dumping has caused or at least contributed significantly to the material injury evident in the Australian industry.

The Authority has therefore rejected the Customs negative finding and substituted a positive Preliminary Finding that there are sufficient grounds to publish a dumping duty notice against exports from Korea.

Copies of the non-confidential version of the Authority's report, No. 43, will be available in due course. Inquiries for copies should be addressed to Margaret McLeod at the Authority by telephoning (06) 276 1742.

The Authority will now hold an inquiry to reach a final finding and will report to the Minister by 17 December 1991.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Authority as soon as possible, but certainly no later than 1 October 1991.

Following receipt of submissions, it is possible that a meeting of parties will be arranged to explore issues raised. After that meeting, a further opportunity will be afforded parties to make submissions to the Authority on those issues.

The Authority has adopted the "public file" system used by Customs and explained in Australian Customs Notices 87/169 and 89/162. Briefly, this means that a submission containing confidential material should be accompanied by another version, omitting the confidential material but containing a non-confidential summary, which can be made available to other parties to the inquiry. Three copies of each version are required.
