

Brambles applied to export up to 2000 tonnes of mostly polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB) solids and liquids and some redundant pesticides and herbicides during 1991.





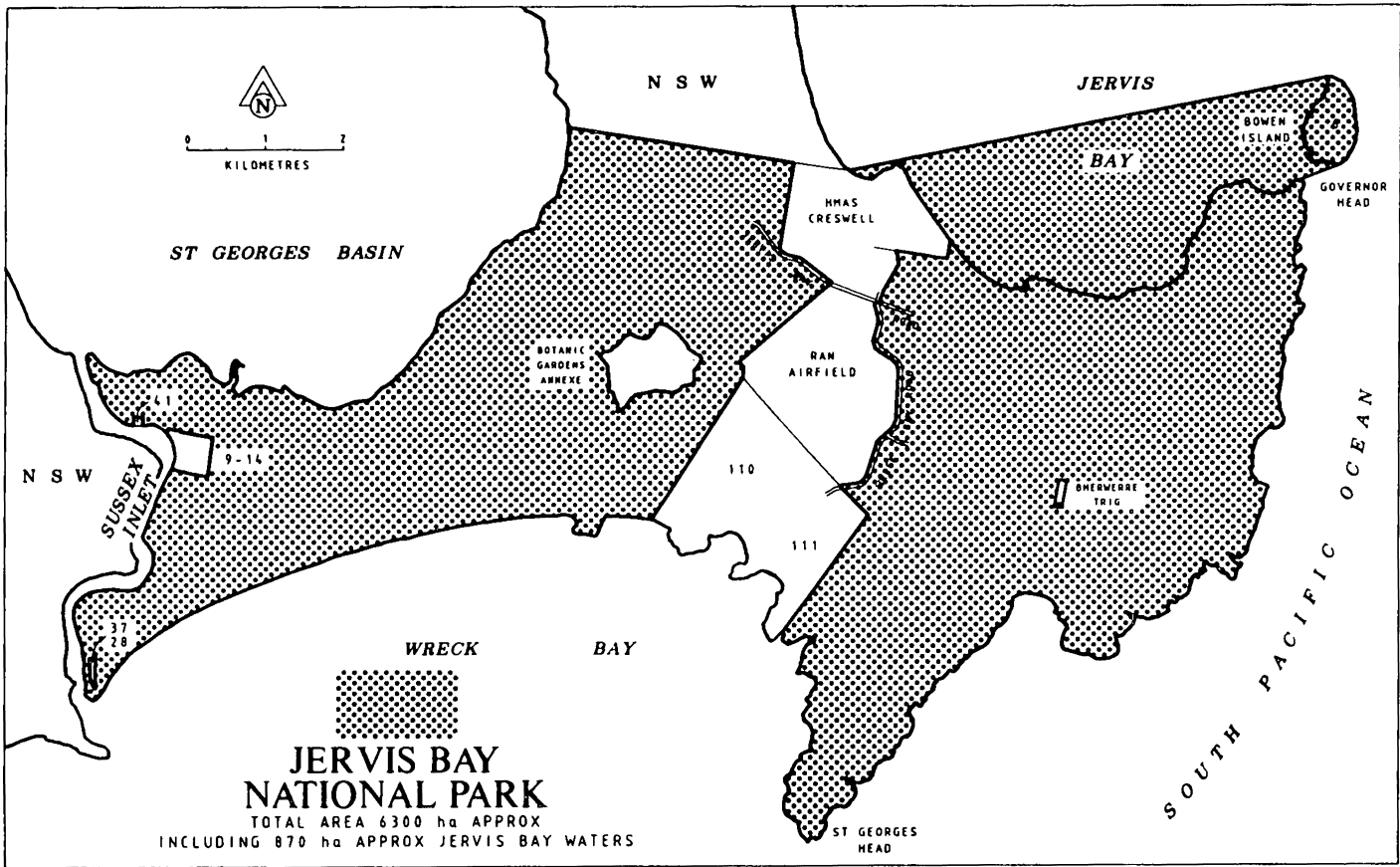

(D No. 30020 of 1991)

NOTICE is given that an application has been made under the Industrial Relations Act 1988 for consent to an alteration of the eligibility rules of the Australian Flight Attendants' Association.

The alteration is sought from the following:

4 - DESCRIPTION OF INDUSTRY

The industry in connection with which the Association is registered is the Airline Industry with respect to the persons referred to in Clause 5 hereof.

5 - PERSONS ELIGIBLE FOR MEMBERSHIP

The Association shall consist of an unlimited number of persons who are employed or are usually employed as Flight Attendants, or in carrying out duties associated with and ancillary to Flight Attendants, including supervisory and promotional positions, within Australia or on overseas flights on Australian Airlines. Provided that no person employed on an annual salary other than persons employed to perform as their predominant function the duties of cabin crew or employed to perform as their predominant function the checking on board aircraft of persons performing cabin crew duties shall be eligible for membership. Nothing in the above proviso shall render ineligible for membership the person performing the duties of line controller for Qantas Airlines Limited.

5 - PERSONS ELIGIBLE FOR MEMBERSHIP

The Association shall consist of an unlimited number of persons:



SCHEDULE 2

PRICE-CAP ARRANGEMENTS APPLYING TO THE TELECOM AND OTC
CARRIER CHARGES SPECIFIED IN SCHEDULE 1

1. In this Schedule:

"relevant percentage", in relation to a financial year, means the percentage that represents $[(A-B)/B] \times 100$ where:

- (a) "A" is the all groups consumer price index number for the weighted average of the eight capital cities published by the Australian Statistician in respect of the financial year immediately preceding that financial year; and
- (b) "B" is that number in respect of the financial year immediately preceding the financial year referred to in paragraph (a);

"relevant period" means the period commencing on 1 July 1989 and ending at the end of 30 June 1992;

"carrier charge" means a carrier charge that is specified in Schedule 1.

2. For the purposes of this Schedule, in respect of a financial year, the weighted average of:

- (a) the Telecom carrier charges is to be calculated by reference to the proportion that the revenue raised from each of those charges bears to the revenue of Telecom attributable to carrier charges in the immediately preceding financial year; and
- (b) the OTC carrier charges is to be calculated by reference to the proportion that the revenue raised from each of those charges that was paid in Australia bears to the revenue of OTC attributable to carrier charges in the immediately preceding financial year.

3. In the relevant period:

- (a) subject to clause 4, Telecom must not increase a charge in a financial year for non-business rentals or local calls by a percentage that is greater than the relevant percentage; and
- (b) subject to clause 5, the weighted average of the Telecom or OTC carrier charges is not to increase in respect of a financial year by a percentage that is greater than the relevant percentage less 4 per cent.

4. Where, in a financial year, Telecom does not increase a charge from non-business rentals or local calls by the maximum percentage ascertained in accordance with this

Schedule, it may increase the charge in a following financial year in the relevant period:

- (a) in accordance with paragraph 3(a); and
- (b) in addition to that increase, by a percentage that is not greater than the difference between that maximum percentage and the actual percentage increase of that charge.

5. Where, in respect of a financial year, the weighted average of the Telecom or OTC carrier charges does not increase by the maximum percentage ascertained in accordance with this Schedule, the weighted average of those respective charges may increase in respect of a following financial year in the relevant period:

- (a) in accordance with paragraph 3(b); and
- (b) in addition to that increase, by a percentage that is not greater than the difference between that maximum percentage and the actual percentage increase of the relevant weighted average.

6. Where, in respect of a financial year in the relevant period, the relevant percentage less 4 per cent is a negative percentage that is not less than 1, Telecom and OTC must reduce their respective carrier charges in that financial year so that the weighted average of those respective charges is reduced by a percentage that is not less than that negative percentage.

7. Where:

- a) in respect of a financial year, the relevant percentage less 4 per cent is a negative percentage that is less than 1; and
- b) Telecom or OTC does not reduce its carrier charges in that financial year so that the weighted average of those respective charges is reduced by that negative percentage;

the weighted average of the Telecom or OTC carrier charges may increase in respect of a following financial year in the relevant period by a percentage that is not greater than the sum of that negative percentage and the relevant percentage less 4 per cent.

8. Where international considerations affect the revenue of OTC, OTC may request AUSTEL to report to me whether, in the light of productivity gains available to OTC, the reference in this Schedule to 4 per cent should be substituted by a reference to another percentage and, if so, what the last-mentioned percentage should be.

SCHEDULE 3

**PRINCIPLES TO BE APPLIED BY TELECOM AND OTC IN MAKING
ALTERATIONS TO THEIR RESPECTIVE CARRIER CHARGES**

Telecom and OTC shall not propose alterations to the carrier charges which do not accord with:


- (a) the need to maintain investment and employment, including the influence of profitability on investment and employment; and
- (b) the need for Telecom and OTC to refrain from the use of market power in setting prices; and
- (c) the need to discourage cost increases arising from increases in wages and changes in conditions of employment inconsistent with principles established by relevant industrial tribunals; and
- (d) the Government's policy that increases in executive remuneration in excess of those permitted under wage fixation principles and decisions announced by the Australian Industrial Relations Commission in National Wage Cases should generally not be accepted as a basis for price increases.

1. Charges for connection to Telecom's public switched telephone network (including connection of eligible services to Telecom's public switched telephone network).

10. Charges for access rental and calls for telex, teletex and faxstream services.
11. Charges for access rentals and calls in respect of the cellular mobile telephone service and the public automatic mobile telephone service.
12. Charging rates for recoverable works, for example, relocation of network cables to accommodate road widening associated with the provision of carrier services identified in Schedule 1 and Schedule 4.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Issued by the Authority of the
Minister for Transport and Communications

Determination of price control arrangements under the Australian and Overseas Telecommunications Corporation Act 1991

The Determination is made under the Australian and Overseas Telecommunications Corporation Act 1991 (the AOTC Act) and revokes an earlier Determination made by the Minister for Transport and Communications on 23 January 1991, which gave effect to the price control arrangements for telecommunications services outlined in the Ministerial Statement of 25 May 1988 "Australian Telecommunications Services: a new framework". The Determination of 23 January 1991 was made under the Telecommunications Act 1991 and continued to have effect under a transitional provision (section 25) of the AOTC Act.

Under the AOTC Act, the Minister has certain powers of price regulation over charges for telecommunications services or facilities supplied by the carriers Telecom and OTC. These price regulation powers enable the Minister to determine price-cap arrangements for specified carrier charges, in order to limit price increases to a specified maximum level each year. The Minister also has the power to determine that alterations in the charges for specified carrier services are subject to notification and disallowance procedures. The Minister can also determine principles which carriers are to apply when making alterations to specified carrier charges.

The Determination is made under the following sections of the AOTC Act:

- . subsection 20(1), which provides that the Minister may determine that a specified carrier charge is to be subject to price control arrangements;
- . paragraph 21(1)(a), which provides that the Minister may determine price-cap arrangements and other price control arrangements that are to apply in relation to a carrier charge that is subject to price control arrangements;
- . paragraph 21(1)(b), which provides that the Minister may determine principles in accordance with which a carrier is to make alterations to a carrier charge that is subject to price control arrangements; and
- . subsection 23(1), which provides that the Minister may determine that a specified carrier charge is subject to notification and disallowance.

The services which are subject to price-cap arrangements are listed in Schedule 1 of the Determination. The price-cap

arrangements for these services are specified in Schedule 2. The prices surveillance principles to be applied by the carriers are at Schedule 3. Carrier charges subject to notification and disallowance are listed at Schedule 4.

The new Determination has broadly the same effect as the Determination of 23 January 1991. The changes that have been made to the previous Determination are that:

- . the Determination is made under the Australian and Overseas Telecommunications Corporation Act 1991;
- . references to some terms have been altered to reflect the language and definitions in the new legislation: for example, "reserved service charge" becomes "carrier charge";
- . the Determination explicitly states that carrier charges specified in Schedule 1 require the consent of AUSTEL before any alteration to those carrier charges can be made, and also requires AUSTEL to give or refuse its consent within a period of 30 days of being notified of the proposed alteration
 - a similar provision was not included in the previous Determination as, under section 64 of the Telecommunications Act 1989, all alterations to reserved service charges required notification to, and consent of, AUSTEL. Section 22 of the AOTC Act draws a distinction between charges that require AUSTEL consent before they can be altered, and charges that do not require AUSTEL consent before they can be altered;
- . it has been made clear (in item 1 of Schedule 4) that the charges for connection to Telecom's public switched telephone network which are subject to notification and disallowance include charges for connection of an eligible service;
- . the charges levied on OTC by Telecom for certain calls and services will be subject to notification and disallowance only until the merger of Telecom and OTC occurs; and
- . the wording of item 2 of Schedule 4, "Charges for provision of telephone calls from public payphones" remains unchanged from the previous Determination. However, the definition of "public" in the Telecommunications Act 1991 differs from the definition in the Telecommunications Act 1989. As a result, the term "public payphones" no longer includes payphones in certain places, for example, places to which the public can be denied entry, such as shopping malls. This means that Telecom payphones in such areas are no longer subject to price control arrangements.

Briefly, the effect of the Determination is:

- . specified Telecom and OTC carrier charges are capped by a formula limiting annual increases in the weighted average price of each carrier's specified services to 4 percentage points below the rate of inflation (CPI-4). The specified services include business and non-business rentals and local, trunk and international telephone calls;
- . annual percentage increases in non-business rental and local call charges are limited to the percentage increase in the consumer price index over the preceding financial year, while still requiring that the weighted average price of Telecom's specified services falls by CPI minus 4 per cent;
- . Telecom and OTC are required to apply certain prices surveillance principles when making alterations to the carrier charges; and
- . the carrier charges specified in Schedule 4 are subject to notification and disallowance under section 23 of the AOTC Act.

Notification and disallowance procedures are set out in section 24 of the AOTC Act and provide that the carriers are to give the Minister written notice of any proposed alteration to a notifiable carrier charge at least 30 days before the proposed alteration is to take effect.

Subsection 24(2) of the AOTC Act provides that within 30 days of receiving this notice, the Minister may request AUSTEL to give a report on whether the alteration should be disallowed in the public interest and may direct the carrier not to proceed with the alteration until the Minister has received and considered the report.

Subsection 24(3) of the AOTC Act provides that the report by AUSTEL shall be given to the Minister within 30 days of AUSTEL receiving the request.

Subsection 24(4) of the AOTC Act provides that, if the Minister, after taking AUSTEL's report into account, is of the opinion that the proposed alteration is not in the public interest, then the Minister may, within 30 days after receiving the report, direct the carrier not to make the alteration.

DETAILED NOTES ON SCHEDULES

Schedule 1 lists the carrier charges subject to the price-cap arrangements specified in Schedule 2. The charges include business and non-business rentals, local and trunk call fees and international voice telephony charges.

Schedule 2 prescribes the following price-cap arrangements:

- . Clause 1 defines the consumer price index percentage to be applied in any one financial year as the percentage increase from the immediately preceding financial year and defines the period for which the price-cap is to apply as the three year period commencing on 1 July 1989; it also prescribes that the price-cap applies only to those charges listed in Schedule 1;
- . Clause 2 provides that, for calculating the average price of the Telecom and OTC services listed in Schedule 1, each service shall be weighted by its proportional share of total revenue attributable to each carrier's Schedule 1 services in the previous financial year and that, for OTC Limited, only revenue from calls paid for in Australia will apply;
- . Paragraph 3(a) provides that, in any one financial year, the percentage increase in local call and non-business rental charges must not exceed the percentage increase in the consumer price index in the previous financial year, subject to the carry-forward arrangements provided for in Clause 4;
- . Paragraph 3(b) limits annual increase in the weighted average price of the specified Telecom and OTC services to 4 percentage points below the percentage increase in the consumer price index in the previous financial year (CPI-4), subject to carry-forward arrangements provided for in Clause 4;
- . Clause 4 provides that any unused allowable annual increase in the carrier charges for non-business rentals and local calls may be carried forward to later years in which the price-cap applies;
- . Clause 5 provides that any unused allowable annual increase in the weighted average price of the specified Telecom and OTC services may be carried forward to later years in which the price-cap applies;
- . Clause 6 provides that, if the CPI-4 figure to be applied in any one financial year is negative by a number equal to or greater than one, the carriers shall be required to reduce the weighted average price of their specified services by that percentage within the year;

- . Clause 7 provides that negative annual outcomes for CPI-4 of less than one per cent may be carried forward to later years in the price-cap period;
- . Clause 8 provides that OTC may request AUSTEL to report to the Minister on the need to adjust the value of 4 in the CPI-4 formula for OTC in any one year where international factors affecting OTC's revenue require consideration.

Schedule 3 lists the Government's prices surveillance principles which Telecom and OTC are to apply in making alterations to their respective carrier charges.

Schedule 4 lists the carrier charges subject to notification and disallowance under section 23 of the AOTC Act. Some of the charges included are for services such as: connection to Telecom's public switched telephone network; provision of telephone calls from Telecom public payphones; provision of calls from mobile telephone services; and provision of telephone calls received by 008 services.

**INITIATION OF INQUIRIES INTO THE ALLEGED DUMPING OF LOW
VOLTAGE AERIAL BUNDLED ELECTRIC CABLE INSULATED WITH
CROSS LINKED POLYETHYLENE FROM THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA**

**CUSTOMS ACT 1901
NOTICE UNDER SUBSECTION 269TC(4)**

I, Richard John Hunt, delegate of the Comptroller-General of Customs, have accepted an application made under subsection 269TB(1) of the Customs Act 1901, which alleges that there are reasonable grounds to initiate an inquiry into the dumping of exports of low voltage aerial bundled electric cable exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea.

The goods the subject of the application are aerial bundled electric cable, insulated with cross linked polyethylene, 0.6/1 kV, and are classified within subheadings 8544.51.00 (statistical code 02) and 8544.59.00 (statistical code 06) in Schedule 3 to the Customs Tariff Act 1987. The rates of duty relevant to this inquiry are 12 per cent and 6 per cent respectively.

The application was lodged by ITC Australia on behalf of the Australian Electrical and Electronic Manufacturers' Association. The Australian industry producing like goods comprises MM Cables, Olex Cables and Pirelli Cables Australia Limited.

In accordance with Customs Regulation 183AB a preliminary finding will be made within 100 days after the publication of this notice as to whether there are sufficient grounds for the publication of a dumping duty notice in respect of the goods the subject of the application.

A preliminary finding that there are sufficient grounds for the publication of a dumping duty notice may result in the imposition of provisional measures including the taking of securities under section 42 of the Customs Act 1901 for the period specified in subsection 45(2) of the Customs Act 1901 in respect of dumping duty that may become payable on the importation of the goods the subject of the application.

A preliminary finding that there are sufficient grounds for the publication of a dumping duty notice would be referred to the Anti-Dumping Authority for further investigation and report to the Minister for Small Business and Customs (within 120 days) on whether dumping duties should be imposed.

Australian Customs Notice (ACN) No 91/136 outlines the procedures for the Customs inquiry. It is in the interest of parties concerned with this inquiry to obtain a copy of the ACN. Copies will be available from the Publications Section, Customs House, Canberra or Customs Houses in each capital city.

All interested parties are invited to lodge written submissions with Michael Roche, Australian Customs Service, Customs House, 5 Constitution Avenue, Canberra City, ACT, 2601, by no later than 15 October 1991.

NOTICE UNDER SUB-SECTION 269TD(2)**

**PRELIMINARY FINDING INTO THE ALLEGED DUMPING OF
TRIETHANOLAMINE FROM THE FEDERATIVE REPUBLIC OF BRAZIL AND
THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**

Notices appeared in Commonwealth of Australia Gazette No.S 129 and in the Financial Review of 23 May 1991 advising of the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of triethanolamine exported from the Federative Republic of Brazil (Brazil) and the United States of America (USA).

The notices were published following an application by ICI Australia Operations Pty Ltd for the imposition of a dumping duty notice. The application has now been considered taking into account submissions received and other matters considered relevant and a report on the investigation has been prepared.


I, John Melville Thompson, delegate of the Comptroller-General of Customs, have made a preliminary finding under sub-section 269TD(2) of the Customs Act 1901, there being reasonable grounds to conclude that:

- (a) triethanolamine has been exported to Australia from Brazil and the USA at dumped prices;
- (b) the Australian industry producing like goods has suffered material injury from the triethanolamine exported from Brazil and the USA at dumped prices; and
- (c) there is threat of material injury to the Australian industry producing like goods.

Within seven (7) days of the publication of this notice, the question as to whether the publication of the dumping duty notice sought by ICI Australia Operations Pty Ltd is so justified will be referred to the Anti-Dumping Authority as required by paragraph 269TD(2)(b) of the Customs Act 1901.



It is considered that there is a threat of material injury to the Australian industry producing triethanolamine pending finalisation of this matter. Accordingly, provisional anti-dumping measures in the form of cash or documentary securities pursuant to section 42 of the Customs Act 1901 will be imposed on goods entered for home consumption on or after 31 August 1991.


