

Jancassco Pty Ltd was granted a permit on 28 August 1991 to export 500 tonnes of waste PCBs and stable organochlorine pesticides over a six month period from and including 26 August 1991 from the ports of Melbourne, Sydney, and Fremantle. Jancassco will export waste for incineration in the Cleanaway high temperature thermal oxidation facility at Ellesmere Port in the United Kingdom.







NOTICE UNDER SUBSECTION 269TC(4)**

I, Richard John Hunt, delegate of the Comptroller-General of Customs, have accepted an application made under subsection 269TB(1) of the Customs Act 1901, which alleges that there are reasonable grounds to initiate an inquiry into the dumping of exports of raw and blanched peanut kernels (peanuts) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (PRC).

The goods the subject of the application are peanuts, and are classified within subheading 1202.20.00 (statistical code 03) in Schedule 3 to the Customs Tariff Act 1987. The rate of duty is 5 per cent for PRC.

The application was lodged by Roger D. Simpson & Associates on behalf of The Peanut Marketing Board; trading as PMB Australia. The application identifies the Australian industry producing like goods as: PMB Australia; Barron (Interstate) Pty Ltd; Ciesiolka Nominees Pty Ltd; Clifton Farming Company Pty Ltd; G Crumpton & Sons; Cuda & Sons Pty Ltd; Graded Peanuts Pty Ltd; Inter-Produce Pty Ltd; and Whiterocks Interstate Trading Pty Ltd.

In accordance with Customs Regulation 183AB a preliminary finding will be made within 100 days after the publication of this notice as to whether there are sufficient grounds for the publication of a dumping duty notice in respect of the goods the subject of the application.

A preliminary finding that there are sufficient grounds for the publication of a dumping duty notice may result in the imposition of provisional measures including the taking of securities under section 42 of the Customs Act 1901 for the period specified in subsection 45(2) of the Customs Act 1901 in respect of dumping duty that may become payable on the importation of the goods the subject of the application.

A preliminary finding that there are sufficient grounds for the publication of a dumping duty notice would be referred to the Anti-Dumping Authority for further investigation and report to the Minister for Small Business and Customs (within 120 days) on whether dumping duties should be imposed.

Australian Customs Notice (ACN) No 91/148 outlines the procedures for the Customs inquiry. It is in the interest of parties concerned with this inquiry to obtain a copy of the ACN. Copies will be available from the Publications Section, Customs House, Canberra or Customs Houses in each capital city.

All interested parties are invited to lodge written submissions with Rory Carroll, Australian Customs Service, Customs House, 5 Constitution Avenue, Canberra City, ACT, 2601, by no later than 4 November 1991.






