

A notice appeared in both the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette No. GN 23 and the Australian Financial Review of 19 June 1991 advising of the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of facsimile and other thermal coated papers less than 100 grams per square meter (gsm) in rolls exported from Japan, the Republic of Korea (Korea) and the United States of America (USA).

The notice was published following an application lodged by Tony O'Shannessy and Associates Pty. Ltd. on behalf of Mark Sensing (Aust) Pty. Ltd. Subsequently, the applicant requested that the goods under inquiry be limited to facsimile papers between 40gsm and 70gsm in rolls. Customs has now considered the application, taking into account submissions received and any other matters considered relevant and has prepared a report on its inquiry.

I, Marion Estelle Grant, delegate of the Comptroller-General Customs, have made a preliminary finding under sub-section 269TD(3) of the Customs Act 1901, there being reasonable grounds to conclude that:

- there have been no exports of facsimile paper from the USA to Australia during the period of injury claimed by the applicant.
- the single shipment of facsimile paper exported from Korea to Australia was at a dumped price.
- some facsimile papers exported from Japan to Australia were at dumped prices.
- there has been material injury to the Australian industry producing facsimile paper.
- material injury to the Australian industry cannot be causally linked to dumped exports from Japan and Korea to Australia.
- there is no imminent or foreseeable threat of material injury to the Australian industry from the exportation at dumped prices of facsimile paper from Japan, Korea or the USA.

Accordingly, a preliminary finding has been made that sufficient grounds do not exist for the publication of a dumping duty notice in respect of facsimile papers between 40gsm and 70gsm in rolls exported from Japan, the Republic of Korea or the United States of America.



REVIEW OF THE AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS SERVICE
NEGATIVE PRELIMINARY FINDING ON CANNED PEACHES FROM SPAIN,
GREECE AND CHINA AND CANNED PEARS FROM SPAIN

The Anti-Dumping Authority has completed its review of the above Customs finding.

In its report of 27 June 1991, Customs found that canned peaches from China were neither dumped nor subsidised; canned peaches from Greece had been both dumped and subsidised; canned peaches from Spain were subsidised but not dumped; and canned pears from Spain were both dumped and subsidised. However, Customs found that while the Australian industry had suffered material injury in the canned peach market, it could not be causally linked to subsidised or dumped imports. In the canned pear market, Customs found that the local industry had suffered material injury but there was no causal link to imports from Spain because of the small volumes concerned.

Following its review of the Customs finding, the Authority has concluded that:

- canned peaches from Spain, Greece and China have been dumped during the period under review;
- canned pears from Spain have been dumped during the period under review;
- canned peaches from Spain and Greece and canned pears from Spain were subsidised during the period under review;
- the Australian industry producing like goods has suffered material injury;
- imports of canned peaches from Spain, Greece and China and canned pears from Spain at dumped prices have caused material injury to the local industry; and
- for these reasons there are sufficient grounds for a positive Preliminary Finding in respect of the goods under review.

The Authority has therefore revoked the Customs negative Preliminary Finding and has substituted a positive Preliminary Finding.

The Authority will now undertake an inquiry to reach a final finding on this matter and will report to the Minister by 18 January 1992.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Authority as soon as possible, but certainly no later than 4 November 1991.

Following receipt of submissions, it is possible that a meeting of parties will be arranged to explore issues raised. After that meeting, a further opportunity will be afforded parties to make submissions to the Authority on those issues.

The Authority has adopted the "public file" system used by Customs and explained in Australian Customs Notices 87/169 and 89/162. Briefly, this means that a submission containing confidential material should be accompanied by another version, omitting the confidential material but containing a non-confidential summary, which can be made available to other parties to the inquiry. Three copies of each version are required.
