DEFINITION OF LIMITS OF NAVAL WATERS IN NEW SOUTH WALES

I, WILLIAM GEORGE HAYDEN, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council and pursuant to section 3B of the Control of Naval Waters Act 1918, hereby:

- a. revoke paragraphs one to eighteen of the instrument made on 31 October 1969 by the Governor-General pursuant to section 3 of the Control of Naval Waters Act 1918 and published in Commonwealth Gazette No 100 dated 4 December 1969 which defined the limits of naval waters in the State of New South Wales; and
- b. define as naval waters those tracts of waters adjacent to or in the vicinity of defence land or installations as specified in the first column in the Schedule hereto, to the limits set out in the second column of the Schedule and which are depicted in the plans following the Schedule.

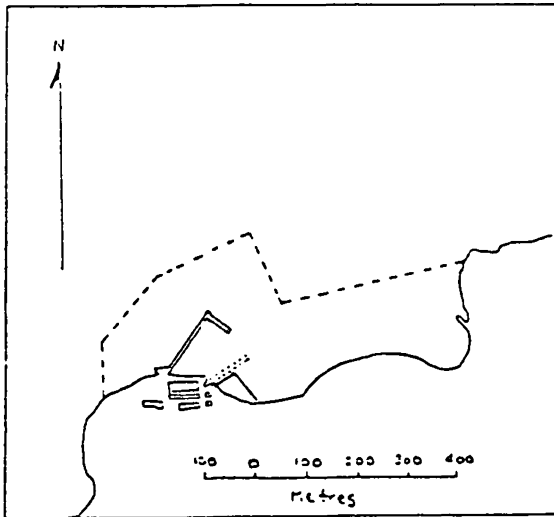

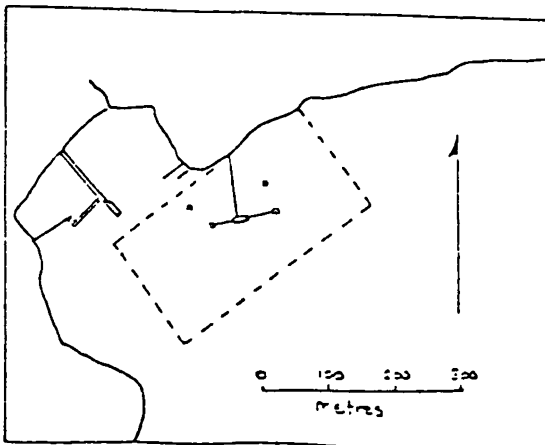
DEFINED LIMITS OF NAVAL WATERS

The following plans show generally the limits of naval waters defined in pursuance of section 3B of the Control of Naval Waters Act 1918:

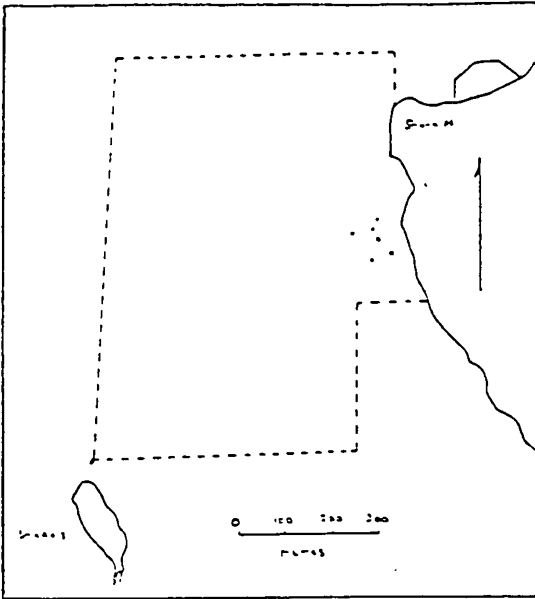

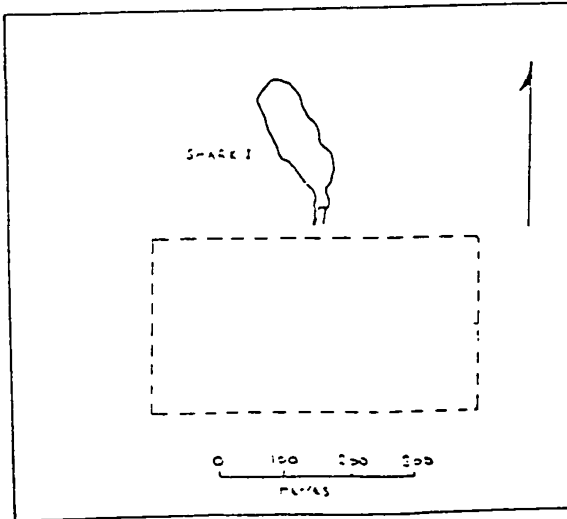
CHANDER BAY



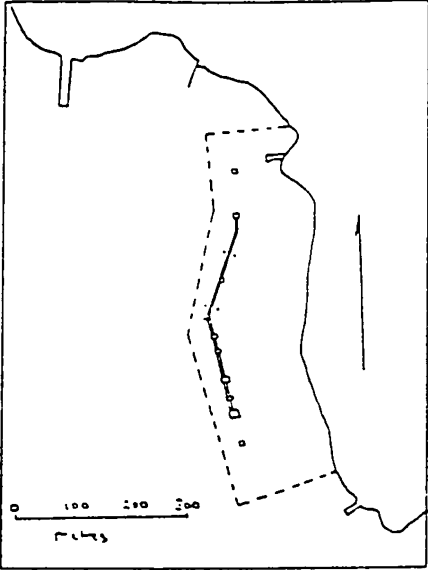
SHARK POINT



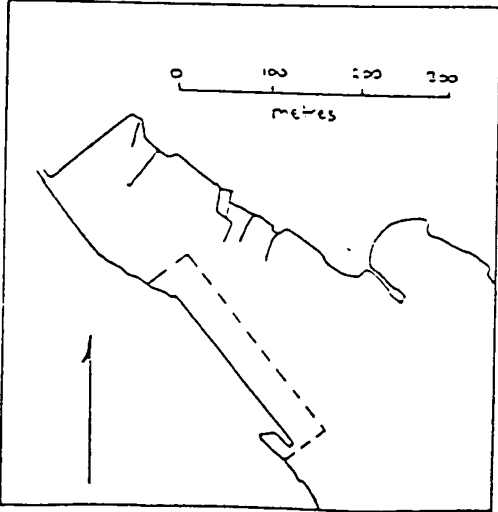

FRADLEY'S HEAD

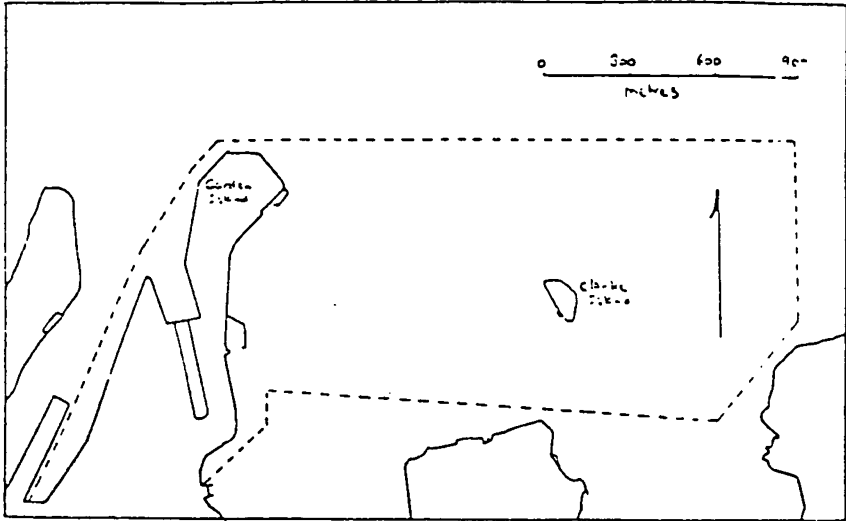

PUBLIC SUGGESTIONS AND COMMENTS

Members of the public, political parties and other organisations are invited to make suggestions to the Redistribution Committee for Tasmania on changes to the boundaries and names of Electoral Divisions for the House of Representatives. Comments are also invited on these public suggestions.

WHY A REDISTRIBUTION?

Every seven years the electoral boundaries in each State and Territory in Australia are reviewed. Tasmania's current electoral boundaries were created on 12 September 1984. As seven years have now elapsed, the Australian Electoral Commission has directed that a redistribution be held to review the boundaries of Tasmania's five Electoral Divisions. A Redistribution Committee has been appointed to prepare a proposed redistribution.

WHO IS ON THE REDISTRIBUTION COMMITTEE?

The Redistribution Committee for Tasmania consists of the Electoral Commissioner (Mr Brian Cox), the Australian Electoral Officer for Tasmania (Mr Nick Tall), the Surveyor General of Tasmania (Mr Christopher Rowe) and the Acting Auditor-General of Tasmania (Mr David Forster). The Committee has the task of producing a proposed set of boundaries and names of Electoral Divisions for the House of Representatives for Tasmania.

THE REDISTRIBUTION PROCESS

The redistribution is carried out in accordance with the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918*. There is a number of stages and opportunities for public participation.

Step 1 - Public suggestions

Before the Redistribution Committee makes its proposal, any interested persons or organisations who wish to make suggestions regarding the redistribution, and in particular possible boundaries or names of Divisions, are given 30 days to forward them in writing to the Redistribution Committee. The Committee will formally invite public suggestions in the *Commonwealth Government Gazette* on Monday 30 September 1991. Suggestions must be received by **Wednesday 30 October 1991**.

Step 2 - Comments on the public suggestions

These suggestions will then be made available for public inspection. Any comments on the suggestions must be lodged in writing within 14 days. The closing date for comments is **Wednesday 13 November 1991**.

Step 3 - The first proposed redistribution

The Committee considers the public suggestions and comments before making a proposed redistribution. Maps showing the proposed boundaries and names of Divisions will then be published and exhibited at Offices of the Australian Electoral Commission.

Step 4 - Objections to the proposed redistribution

Following the publication of the first proposed redistribution there will be 28 days within which initial objections to the proposed redistribution may be lodged by members of the public or organisations.

Step 5 - Objections considered by the augmented Electoral Commission

The objections are considered by the augmented Electoral Commission for Tasmania. The augmented Electoral Commission comprises the Chairperson of the Electoral Commission (the Hon. Mr Justice Trevor Moring) and the third Commissioner (Mr Ian Castles, Australian Statistician) sitting together with the members of the Redistribution Committee.



Step 6 - The second proposed redistribution

After it has considered all the initial objections lodged, the augmented Electoral Commission makes (within 60 days) a second proposed redistribution.

Step 7 - Further objections

If this second proposed redistribution is significantly different from the proposal made by the Redistribution Committee, the augmented Electoral Commission will invite further objections from the persons or organisations who made suggestions, comments or initial objections.

Step 8 - Final determination

The augmented Electoral Commission will then consider any further objections and make a final determination of boundaries and names of the Electoral Divisions in the State.

GUIDELINES FOR PUBLIC SUBMISSIONS

Written suggestions relating to the redistribution in Tasmania must be lodged with the Redistribution Committee on or before **30 October 1991**.

It would assist the Redistribution Committee if persons or organisations proposing to make suggestions in the form of maps could do so on standard electoral maps, available from the Office of the Redistribution Committee.

Copies of all suggestions received by the Committee will be available for public inspection at that office from **31 October 1991**.

Written comments relating to any of the suggestions lodged may be made at this stage. Comments must be lodged with the Committee by **13 November 1991**.

Legal requirements for a redistribution

In making its proposed redistribution, the Redistribution Committee is bound by section 66(3) of the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918*, which provides that the Redistribution Committee -

“(3) . . .

- (a) *shall, as far as practicable, endeavour to ensure that, if the State or Territory were redistributed in accordance with the proposed redistribution, the number of electors enrolled in each Electoral Division in the State or Territory would not, 3 years and 6 months after the State or Territory had been redistributed, be less than 98% or more than 102% of the average divisional enrolment of that State or Territory at that time; and*
- (b) *subject to paragraph (a), shall give due consideration, in relation to each proposed Electoral Division, to:*
- (i) *community of interests within the proposed Electoral Division, including economic, social and regional interests;*
 - (ii) *means of communication and travel within the proposed Electoral Division;*
 - (iv) *the physical features and area of the proposed Electoral Division; and*
 - (v) *the boundaries of existing Divisions in the State or Territory”*

and that no proposed Division may have in it a number of electors which differs from the State average enrolment, to be calculated as at 13 November 1991, by more than 10%.

Persons or organisations making submissions to the Redistribution Committee are urged to take account of the requirements of the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918*. Copies of the *Commonwealth Electoral Act* can be obtained from Commonwealth Government Bookshops.

More Information

The Australian Electoral Commission is making available electoral enrolment information for use by interested persons and organisations. Statistics relating to current enrolment and projected enrolment at 3 years and 6 months after the expected completion date of the redistribution are being made available at the Census Collection District, Statistical Local Area and Electoral Division levels. This information can be obtained in booklet form or on computer magnetic tape.

Statistics, electoral maps and any other information related to the redistribution can be obtained from the Redistribution Committee secretariat at the above address.



I, THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR RESOURCES, pursuant to section 86E of the Quarantine Act 1908, hereby make the following determinations.

Revocation earlier determinations

1. Determinations No 2 of 1991 made pursuant to section 86E of the Quarantine Act 1908 and published in the Gazette No GN 23, 19 June 1991, are hereby revoked.

Date of effect of these determinations

2. These determinations are to take effect on the 1 October 1991.

Fees payable for services

3. Subject to paragraphs 4, 5 and 6, the fee payable in respect of a service specified in an item in Column 2 of the Schedule is the amount specified in Column 3 of the Schedule adjacent to that item.

Minimum fee

4. Where a fee specified in Column 3 of the Schedule is expressed to be subject to a minimum fee, the fee payable shall not be less than the amount of that fee.

Maximum fee

5. Where a fee specified in Column 3 of the fee Schedule is expressed to be subject to a maximum fee, the fee payable shall not exceed the amount of that fee.



Multiple fees

6. Where more than one fee in Column 3 of the Schedule is applicable to a service, the fee payable shall be calculated by adding together the fees that are applicable to that service.

Date due for payment

7. A fee imposed by these determinations is due for payment upon the expiration of twenty-eight days after the date of the debit note issued in relation to that service.

Determinations not to apply to certain services

8. These Determinations do not apply in relation to services provided:
 - a. to diplomatic staff of a country other than Australia;
 - b. to foreign vessels and equipment undertaking joint exercises with the Australian defence forces;
 - c. for examination of personal luggage arriving in Australia aboard the same vessel as the owner or importer of the goods;
 - d. for surveillance of parcel post items containing goods that are for private/non-commercial use.
