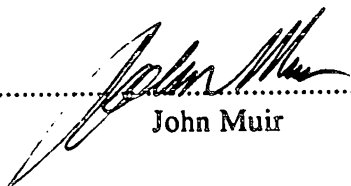

2. In this Determination:

"exit day", in relation to a transferee, means the day before the transferee became a member of the Fund;

"PST unit" means a unit in the CFM Pooled Superannuation Trust administered by Commonwealth Funds Management Limited;

"the Act" means the Superannuation Act 1976;

"the Fund" means the Federal Airports Corporation Superannuation Fund;

Superannuation (CSS) Assets Transfer
(Federal Airports Corporation Superannuation Fund)
Determination No.1

"the transfer day" means the day following the day when this Determination commences;

"transferee" means a person referred to in paragraph 240(1) (a) of the Act who became a member of the Fund in the period from the beginning of 1 December 1990 to the end of 30 June 1991.

Transfer of assets

3. (1) For the purposes of paragraph 240(1) (a) of the Act, assets comprising PST units that, at the end of the day before the transfer day, represent as nearly as is practicable the relevant assets identified by subclause (2) are to be transferred on the transfer day to the person or body administering the Fund.

(2) Subject to subclause (3), the relevant assets are:

- (a) assets of the Fund as at the end of 30 June 1990 that, after deduction of all known liabilities relating to those assets, fairly and equitably represented the accumulated contributions, as at the end of 30 June 1990, of all transferees, being assets that had a value as at the end of that day of \$9,163,904; and

The National Food Authority received an application on 30 March 1992 from the Queensland Department of Health to amend the Food Standards Code by varying Standard D1 - Fish - to clarify the country of origin labelling requirements applying to imported unpackaged fish.

Standard D1 was amended with effect from 28 February 1992 to introduce a requirement that, where imported unpackaged fresh, chilled, smoked or frozen fish (other than fish originating in New Zealand) is displayed for retail sale, a label must be displayed with the fish indicating the country of origin or stating that the fish is imported.

The applicant states that there are several anomalies in this amendment and has requested that the standard be varied to:

- . require country of origin labelling of imported unpackaged fish which has been frozen but is offered for sale in a thawed state;
- . clarify that the provisions do not apply to cooked fish other than imported unpackaged cooked prawns displayed for retail sale;
- . clarify that the provisions do not apply to fish which has been coated with another food.

The Authority has made a preliminary assessment of the application, has accepted the application and will make a full assessment of the application.

The National Food Authority has before it a proposal to amend the Food Standards Code by varying Standard H1 - Milk and Liquid Milk Products - to delete the minimum milk solids non-fat requirement from the compositional standard for milk.

Standard H1 currently contains a requirement that milk must contain not less than 85g/kg of milk solids non-fat or 31g/kg of milk protein. These current alternative requirements mean that enforcement authorities need to test both criteria before being able to conclude that a sample of milk fails to meet the compositional standard. Omitting the minimum milk solids non-fat requirement would leave the compositional requirement for milk as 32g/kg minimum milk fat and 31g/kg minimum milk protein.

The proposal was prepared by the National Health and Medical Research Council prior to the commencement of the National Food Authority Act and continues in force by virtue of section 71 of the Act.

The Authority has decided not to omit any of the matters required by the Act, and will now make a full assessment of the proposal. To assist in the process, the Authority invites written submissions on matters relevant to the proposal. 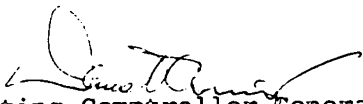

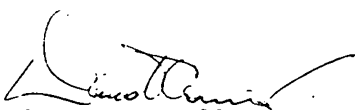

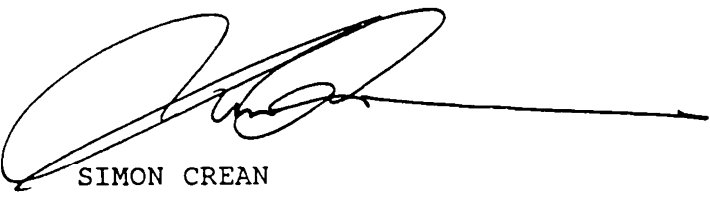

The Australian Broadcasting Tribunal has commenced an inquiry into the acquisition of an additional 11,420,000 shares of Harbour Radio Ltd by The Uniting Church in Australia. The transactions took place on 10 March (7,420,001 shares), 16 March (2,999,999 shares) and 20 March 1992 (1,000,000 shares). The licence affected by this transaction is commercial radio service 2GB Sydney.

An application has been lodged by the prescribed party to the transaction, The Uniting Church in Australia.

The issues to be considered in the inquiry derive from the criteria for the transfer of a commercial licence which are set out in section 89A(8) of the Broadcasting Act 1942 ('the Act'). The issues are whether the Tribunal should refuse consent to the transfer having particular regard to:

- (a) whether the applicant has given an undertaking to comply with the conditions of the licence, to provide an adequate and comprehensive service pursuant to the licence, to encourage the provision of Australian programs and to use and encourage the use of Australian creative resources;
- (b) whether the giving of consent would be contrary to a provision of the Act;
- (c) whether it would be advisable in the public interest to refuse consent, because the Tribunal is not satisfied that:
 - (i) the applicant is a fit and proper person to hold the licence;
 - (ii) the applicant has the financial, technical and management capabilities necessary to provide an adequate and comprehensive service;

- (iii) the applicant is otherwise capable of complying with the conditions of the licence;
- (d) whether it would be advisable in the public interest to refuse consent because of the need to avoid undue concentration of influence;
- (e) whether, if consent was given;
 - (i) a contravention, amounting to an offence of s.90C (limitations of radio interest) or s.92JB (limitations of cross-media interests) would likely occur;
 - (ii) a person would be contravening s.90F (limitations of directorships) or s.92JD (limitations of cross-media directorships);
 - (iii) a condition specified in s.90G (foreign control provisions) would be contravened.

As a result of the transactions The Uniting Church in Australia Property Trust (NSW) has increased its shareholding in Harbour Radio Ltd, licensee of commercial radio service 2GB Sydney, from 3,000,000 shares (15.00%) to 14,420,000 shares (72.10%), thus acquiring a prescribed interest in the 2GB licence.

The Church also holds an interest, amounting to a prescribed interest, in the licensee company of 2CH Sydney, Radio 2CH Pty Ltd. As a result of its acquisition of a prescribed interest in Harbour Radio Ltd the Church acquired interests exceeding 15% in two commercial radio licences, 2GB and 2CH, with a substantial market in common. Section 90C(2) of the Act states that a person contravenes this section if the person has a prescribed interest in each of a pair of commercial radio licences with a substantial market in common. The question of whether a breach of s.90C(2) of the Act exists will be considered in the inquiry into the transactions.

If you want to make a submission on these issues you may lodge it with the Tribunal by 12 August 1992.

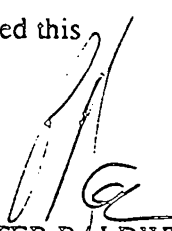

- (1) liquefied petroleum gas to be notified goods for the purposes of the Act;
- (2) Wesfarmers Kleenheat Gas Pty. Ltd., to be, in relation to those goods, a declared person for the purposes of the Act; and
- (3) a supply of goods described in (i) being a supply in a manner, of a kind, or in a circumstance specified below to be an exempt supply for the purposes of the Act:
 - (a) a supply of goods from a retail site;
 - (b) a supply of goods to a declared person or a subsidiary of a declared person;
 - (c) a supply of goods in pursuance of a written agreement concluded by a declared person after the person has responded to a public request for tender for the supply of those goods; and
 - (d) a supply of goods to a locality other than in the State of Western Australia.

Citation

1. This Determination may be cited as Superannuation (CSS) Assets Transfer (Superannuation Fund No.1) Determination No.1.

Interpretation

2. In this Determination:

"BF unit" means a unit in the CFM Balanced Fund;

"class" means any of the following classes of units:

(a) in relation to BF units:

- (i) Managed Growth Class;
- (ii) Capital Stable Class;

(b) in relation to PST units:

- (i) Cash Management Trust Class;
- (ii) Fixed Interest Trust Class;
- (iii) International Equities Fund Class;
- (iv) Property Fund Class;
- (v) Rural Investment Fund Class;

"combined Funds" means the total net assets of Commonwealth Superannuation Fund No.1 established under the *Superannuation Act 1990* and Commonwealth Superannuation Fund No.2 established under the Act;

"exit day", in relation to a transferee, means the day before the transferee becomes a member of the Public Sector



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Superannuation Scheme established under the
Superannuation Act 1990;

"EQD unit" means a unit in the CFM Australian Equities Fund;

"Fund assets" means the holdings by the Board in the
following categories of investments:

- (a) CFM Balanced Fund managed by
Commonwealth Funds Management Limited;
- (b) CFM Australian Equities Fund managed by
Commonwealth Funds Management Limited;
- (c) CFM Pooled Superannuation Trust managed by
Commonwealth Funds Management Limited;
- (d) cash and short term money market investments;
- (e) inflation linked bonds;
- (f) international bonds;
- (g) international money market investments;
- (h) moneys held by agents or sub-custodians.

"PST unit" means a unit in the CFM Pooled Superannuation
Trust;

"the Act" means the Superannuation Act 1976;

"the PSS" means the superannuation scheme established under
the Superannuation Act 1990 and known as the Public Sector
superannuation scheme;

"the transfer day" means 30 June 1992;

"transferee" means a person referred to in section 245 of the
Act who became a member of the PSS in the period from the
beginning of 1 July 1990 to the end of 30 June 1991.

Transfer of assets

3. (1) For the purposes of paragraph 248(1)(a) of the Act,
relevant assets comprising Fund assets that, at close of
business on the transfer day, fairly and equitably
represent as nearly as is practicable the sum of the
transfer amounts calculated in accordance with the
formula in subclause (2) are to be transferred as at the
end of the transfer day to Board No. 1.

- (2) The formula for calculation of a transfer amount
is:

$$((A+B) \times C) - D$$

Where:

"A" is calculated by the formula

$$fs \times (1 + r)$$

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in which:

"fs" is the share of Commonwealth Superannuation Fund No. 2 as at the end of 30 June 1990, after deduction of all known liabilities other than advances made under section 249 of the Act, that represented the accumulated contributions specified in Column 3 of the Schedule, attributable to the number of transferees specified in Column 2 of the Schedule who became members of the PSS on the day following the exit day specified in Column 1 of the Schedule;

"r" is the internal rate of return of the combined Funds for the period beginning on 1 July 1990 and ending on the exit day;

"B" is the value, as specified in Column 4 of the Schedule, of the share of Commonwealth Superannuation Fund No. 2 as at the end of the exit day specified in Column 1 of the Schedule, after deduction of all known liabilities other than advances made under section 249 of the Act, that represented the sum of the accumulated contributions and the accumulated employer contributions in respect of the period beginning on 1 July 1990 and ending on the exit day specified in Column 1 of the Schedule, of the number of transferees specified in Column 2 of the Schedule who became members of the PSS on the day following the exit day specified in Column 1 of the Schedule;

"C" is calculated by the formula

$$1 + rr$$

in which "rr" is the internal rate of return of the combined Funds for the period beginning on the day following the exit day specified in Column 1 of the Schedule and ending on the transfer day;

"D" is calculated by the formula

$$ad \times C$$

in which "ad" is the amount specified in Column 5 of the Schedule, being the liability equal to accumulated contributions and accumulated employer contributions that have been advanced by the Board to Board No. 1 under the provisions of section 249 of the Act in respect of the number of transferees specified in Column 2 of the Schedule who became members of the PSS on the day following the exit day specified in Column 1 of the Schedule.

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(3) The relevant assets in relation to the transfer day are made up of Fund assets in each category of investment the value of which is calculated in accordance with the relevant formula:

(a) In respect of the CFM Pooled Superannuation Trust and the CFM Balanced Fund, the relevant formula is

$$\frac{\text{Sum of the Transfer Amounts}}{\text{Value of Funds}} \times \text{Value of class units}$$

(b) In respect of the CFM Australian Equities Fund, the relevant formula is

$$\frac{\text{Sum of the Transfer Amounts}}{\text{Value of Funds}} \times \text{Value of EQD units}$$

(b) In respect of cash and short term money market investments , international bonds, international money market investments and moneys held by agents or sub-custodians, the relevant formula is

$$\frac{\text{Sum of the Transfer Amounts}}{\text{Value of Funds}} \times \text{Value of investment category}$$

where:

"Value of Funds" means the total value of the investments of Commonwealth Superannuation Fund No. 1 and Commonwealth Superannuation Fund No. 2 as at the transfer day;

"Value of class units" means the value of PST units or BF units in that class as at the transfer day;

"Value of EQD units" means the value of EQD units as at the transfer day;

"Value of investment category" means the value of all holdings in a particular investment category as at the transfer day.

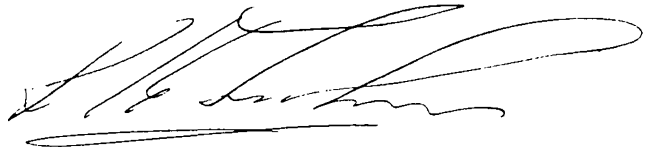

 - (iii) the form of logbook TLO4 in which information can be entered in respect of tuna and tuna like species, including billfish taken by the longline method by foreign vessels in proclaimed waters; and
 - (iv) the form of logbook TPO5 in which information can be entered in respect of tuna and tuna like species, including billfish taken by the pole and line method in proclaimed waters; and
 - (v) the form of logbook TPO6 in which information can be entered in respect of tuna and tuna like species, including billfish taken by the pole and line method in proclaimed waters that lie to the west of Longitude 127° East; and
 - (vi) the form of logbook SFO5 in which information can be entered in respect of tuna and tuna like



- species, including billfish taken by the purse seine method in proclaimed waters; and
- (vii) the form of logbook OT01 in which information can be entered in respect of tuna and tuna like species, including billfish taken by methods other than, the longline method, the pole and line method or the purse seine method in proclaimed waters.
- (b) pursuant to subregulation 17(2) of the Fisheries Regulations hereby determine:
- (i) that subregulations 18(1), 18(2) and 18(3) of those Regulations shall apply in respect of the forms of logbooks referred to in paragraph (b) of this Notice, during the period beginning on 15 July 1992 and ending on 30 June 1995; and

ANTI-DUMPING AUTHORITY

FINAL FINDING

**INQUIRY INTO CERTAIN FORKLIFT TRUCKS
EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM**

The Anti-Dumping Authority has completed its inquiry into certain forklift trucks from the United Kingdom.

In its report, the Authority concluded that:

- . forklift trucks have been exported from the United Kingdom by Hyster Europe Ltd at dumped prices;
- . the Australian industry has suffered material injury; and
- . forklift trucks exported by Hyster Europe Ltd from the United Kingdom at dumped prices have caused material injury to the Australian industry.

In the light of these conclusions the Authority recommended to the Minister for Small Business, Construction and Customs that dumping duties be imposed on certain forklift trucks, exported from the United Kingdom by Hyster Europe Ltd.

The Minister has accepted the Authority's recommendation.

1. The Livestock Export (Merino) Orders are amended by modifying the definition of "designated export auction" in suborder 4.1 to read as follows:

"designated export auction" means an export auction designated as such by the Australian Association of Stud Merino Breeders Ltd, as published in the "Guidelines and Conditions for Export Sales as at 17 June 1992", prior to the coming into effect of the Livestock Export Orders No 1 of 1992 in respect of the 1992 ram selling season.

2. The Livestock Export (Merino) Orders are amended by deleting the definition of "merino ram" in suborder 4.1 and substituting the following definition:

"merino" means:

- (a) in the case of a live animal – a ram or ewe that is, or could be, registered as a merino ram or ewe in the Australian Stud Merino Flock Register under the rules of the Australian Association of Stud Merino Breeders Ltd; and
- (b) in the case of an embryo, an ovum or semen – an embryo, an ovum or semen that derives from a merino animal;"

3. The Livestock Export (Merino) Orders are amended by deleting the definition of "reproductive material" in suborder 4.1 and substituting a new definition as follows:

"reproductive material" means the semen of a merino ram.

4. The Livestock Export (Merino) Orders are amended by incorporating the definition of "semen" in suborder 4.1 as follows:

"semen" is that which comes from a merino ram.

5. The Livestock Export (Merino) Orders are amended by incorporating the definition of "embryos" and "ova" in suborder 4.1 as follows:

"embryos" and "ova" are those which come from a merino ewe.

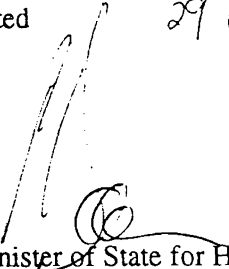
