OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service and the Services of the Australian Postal Corporation and Defence Force appointments etc. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 am on Thursday, and sold at \$8.95 each or on subscription of \$395.00 (50 issues), \$206.00 (25 issues) or \$103.00 (12 issues).

Business issues, published each Tuesday, containing Notices under the Corporations Law, Bankruptcy Act and Private Notices and sold at \$4.95 each or on subscription of \$220.00 (50 issues), \$116.00 (25 issues).

Australian Securities Commission issues contain Notices under the Corporations Law and are published on the first Tuesday of each month and are sold at \$14.95 each or on subscription of \$132.00 (12 issues).

Special issues include notices which require urgent publication. All costs associated with producing Specials will be borne by the responsible department or authority. A limited number of Special *Gazettes* will be made available for sale from the Commonwealth Government Bookshop, Canberra, on the day of publication. General distribution of these notices will be by their inclusion in the next published issue of the Government Notices *Gazette* or Business *Gazette* as well as in the next published issue of the series of the *Gazette* in which the notice would normally have been published.

Tariff concessions issues contain notices of tariff concessions proposed, granted or revoked in accordance with the provisions of Part XVA of the *Customs Act 1901*. These issues are published each Wednesday and are sold at \$2.95 or on subscription only at \$115.00 for 50 issues including surface postage.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Australian Public Service conditions of entry and advancement; holders of import licences and tariff quotas; notification by Australian Securities Commission of intention to deregister defunct companies. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the Government Notices and Business issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all selected issues.

Purchasing and Disposals issues of the *Gazette* provide information on Commonwealth purchases and disposals and other matters of general interest to persons buying

from or selling to the Commonwealth. These issues are published each Wednesday and sold at \$3.95 or on subscription of \$220.00 including postage for 50 issues.

Index issues contain references to entries in the Government Notices and the related Special and Periodic issues. Index issues are published quarterly, are available over the counter from Commonwealth Government

Bookshops and are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the Government Notices issues.

Chemicals issues of the *Gazette* provide information on the National Industrial Chemicals Notification and Assessment Scheme (NICNAS). These issues are published monthly and the cost is variable.

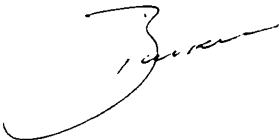

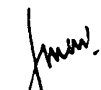

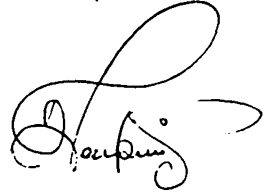

The National Food Authority has before it four applications to amend the Food Standards Code by increasing the print size required for country of origin labelling of packaged foods.

The applications were received from:

- . the Committee of Direction of Fruit Marketing (now known as Queensland Fruit and Vegetable Growers), on 11 October 1991, seeking to have the print size for the country of origin statement on packaged fruit and vegetables increased from 1.5 mm minimum to 3 mm minimum and to require that the statement be placed on the same side of the package as the contents and brand name (Application No 128);
- . the Australian Cane Farmers Association Limited, on 26 March 1992, seeking an increase in the print size for the country of origin statement on packaged foods from 1.5 mm minimum to 3 mm minimum (Application No 134);
- . the Australian Dried Fruits Association Inc, on 30 March 1992, seeking a review of the print size required for the country of origin statement on imported packaged dried fruits (Application No 135);
- . the Canned Fruits Industry Council of Australia, on 1 April 1992, seeking an increase in the print size required for the country of origin statement on packaged fruits and vegetables from 1.5 mm minimum to 3 mm minimum (Application No 136).

The Authority made a preliminary assessment of these applications, accepted the applications and published notices on 20 May 1992 inviting submissions relevant to the applications.

The Authority has now made a full assessment of the applications and has decided to reject them for the following reasons:

2.

The current provisions in the Food Standards Code require the country of origin statement to be written distinctly, legibly and indelibly; so as to be conspicuously visible to a prospective purchaser; in characters of uniform size, style and colour; and in such colour as to afford a distinct contrast to the background. If labels currently in use are not legible and conspicuous, as claimed by the applicants, then this is an enforcement issue rather than a food standards issue.

Only the descriptive name of the food and warning statements are currently required to be in a print size greater than 1.5 mm. Statements required to appear with a minimum print size of 1.5 mm include the name and business address in Australia of the vendor, manufacturer, packer or importer; a list of ingredients; and, in some circumstances, a nutrition information panel. Little evidence has been provided that the country of origin statement is of sufficiently greater importance than other statements required to appear on food labels that it should be given greater prominence through increased print size.

The current print size requirement is a minimum, and there is no restriction on the use of greater print sizes by those food suppliers who believe that highlighting the Australian origin of a food will increase its appeal to consumers. Trade and commerce issues can thus be addressed within the existing framework of the Code.

The current print sizes in the Food Standards Code were established following a process of review by the Industries Commission, the National Health and Medical Research Council and the National Food Standards Council. That process resulted in a rationalisation of the multitude of print size requirements which previously existed in the Code, so that print sizes larger than 1.5 mm minimum are required only for the name of the food and for warning statements. An increase in the print size for country of origin labelling would upset the relativities which have been established between print sizes required for various purposes in the Code.

FOODS ASSOCIATED WITH LISTERIOSIS OUTBREAKS

Notice pursuant to section 22 of the National

Food Authority Act 1991

The National Food Authority has before it a proposal to amend the Food Standards Code to include nil tolerances for the organism Listeria monocytogenes in foods associated with listeriosis outbreaks.

The proposal was prepared by the National Health and Medical Research Council prior to the commencement of the National Food Authority Act and continues in force by virtue of section 71 of the Act.

Most people who come into contact with the organism are not at risk of infection. Surveys have found that between 0.5 and 2.5% of the healthy adult population are asymptomatic carriers. There are two groups of people, however, who are at risk of infection by the organism:

- . pregnant women and new-born babies (in pregnant women, the disease may resemble flu, while the foetus may be lost through miscarriage or stillbirth); and
- . people with deficient immune systems in whom the infection is opportunistic, including the elderly, diabetics, patients receiving cancer therapy and AIDS patients.

The proposal would require pate, soft cheeses, unpasteurised milk and smoked mussels to be free of Listeria monocytogenes.

The Authority will now make a full assessment of the proposal. To assist in the process, the Authority invites written submissions on matters relevant to the proposal. Submissions received on the proposal will be placed on the public register of the Authority unless a claim of commercial confidentiality (either in respect of all or a part of the submission) is made and justified.

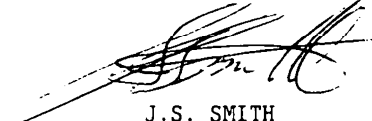

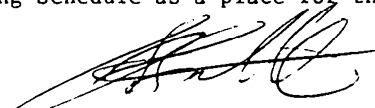

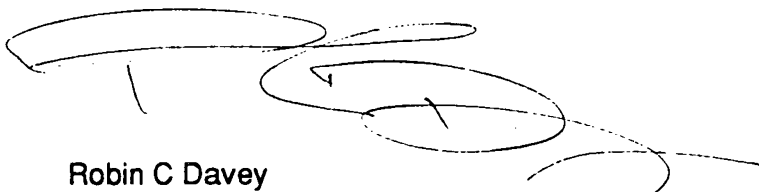
