The ABA is required to renew these licences unless it decides that an applicant is no longer a suitable licensee.

A company is a suitable licensee if the ABA does not decide that sub-section 41(2)(for commercial) or 83(2)(for community) of the Act applies to the company.

The ABA may decide that either section 41(2) or 83(2) of the Act applies to a licensee if it is satisfied that allowing the licensee to provide or continue to provide either a commercial or a community broadcasting service under a licence would lead to a significant risk of:

- (a) an offence against the Act or the regulations being committed; or
- (b) a breach of the conditions of the licence occurring.

In deciding whether these sub-sections apply, the ABA is required by sections 41(3)(commercial) and 83(3)(community) of the Act, to take into account:

- (a) the business record of the company; and
- (b) the company's record in situations requiring trust and candour; and
- (c) (commercial) the business record of each person who is, or would be, if a licence were allocated to the applicant, in a position to control the licence; or (community) the business record of the chief executive and each director and secretary of the applicant; and
- (d) the record in situations requiring trust and candour of each such person; and
- (e) whether the company, or a person referred to in paragraph (c) or (d), has been convicted of an offence against this Act or the regulations.
- Nothing in the provisions of the Act requires the ABA to hold an investigation or a hearing into whether a licence should be renewed.

The declared activity is the institutional incident monitoring pilot project to be conducted in several health care institutions in South Australia, New South Wales and Victoria in accordance with an agreement dated 21 January 1994 between the Commonwealth and the Australian Patient Safety Foundation, a body incorporated under the Associations Incorporation Act 1985 (Registered No. 12963X) for the provision of consultancy services to the Commonwealth. collection of data for institutional incident monitoring contributes to research into the development of preventive strategies for adverse patient outcomes in health care institutions in Australia and will be used to research whether incident monitoring can interface with various systems in risk management and claims management. The activity is to be managed by the Australian Patient Safety Foundation which is a body established partly for the purposes of conducting research into incident monitoring. Non-identifying information about the results of the pilot will be presented to the Minister for Health at the completion of the consultancy service by June 1995.



HEALTH INSURANCE ACT 1973

Statement Under Section 106AA

On the twenty eighth day of December 1993, the then Minister determined under section 106 of the Health insurance Act 1973, that Dr Ignatius Joseph CANNIZZO of Oakdale Medical Centre, 1295 Centre Road. Clayton in Victoria, had provided excessive services and that he be counselled by a medical adviser of the Health Insurance Commission and repay \$3.108.40 to the Commonwealth of Australia for services found to be not reasonably necessary for the adequate medical care of the patients concerned.

Reasons for Determination

The determination was made on the basis of recommendations, made under section 105 of the Health Insurance Act 1973, by the Medical Services Committee of Inquiry for the State of Victoria, after its inquiry into the practices of Dr Cannizzo. A Committee consists of five medical practitioners, four of whom are appointed after consultation with the Australian Medical Association.

The Committee found that Dr Cannizzo's provision of excessive services occurred in three areas of his practice. These areas were: the provision of large numbers of long and prolonged consultations where the patient's clinical condition and reason for attending did not warrant that length of consultation, the provision of enormous quantities of intramuscular-iron injections to some patients who were only slightly iron deficient and the length of some consultations for the purpose of counselling resulting in minimal benefit to patient.

Dr Cannizzo was advised of the determination, its possible consequences and given opportunity, as required by the legislation, to seek a review. Dr Cannizzo chose not to seek a review of the determination and consequently as the statutory appeal period has passed the determination is now effective.

Comments

The Government is seriously concerned by the practices of medical practitioners like Dr Cannizzo who are providing services which are not reasonably necessary for the adequate medical care of the patients concerned. Excessive services are a drain on public funds and every effort is being made to reduce the magnitude of the problem.

The members of the Association have agreed and adopted this alteration by way of special resolution at the Annual General Meeting of the Association in the interests of the Articles of the Association truly reflecting the operation of the Association.

The Association seeks to clarify the definition, not to conflict with, nor add to that which is contained in its Certificate of Registration.

the effect of the proposal:

The Association respectfully submits that the insertion of the definition "Authorised Newsagent" does not alter the eligibility rules of the Association. Rather the insertion of a definition specifies a term which is contained in the eligibility rule but which previously was not defined in the rules of the organisation being its Articles of Association.

The Association considers it beneficial for the term "Authorised Newsagent" to be defined in its rules of Association and accordingly its members agreed to that change. It was intended that the insertion of the definition would merely specify in the Articles of Association a meaning for the term "Authorised Newsagent" as it was understood by the organisation and its members.
